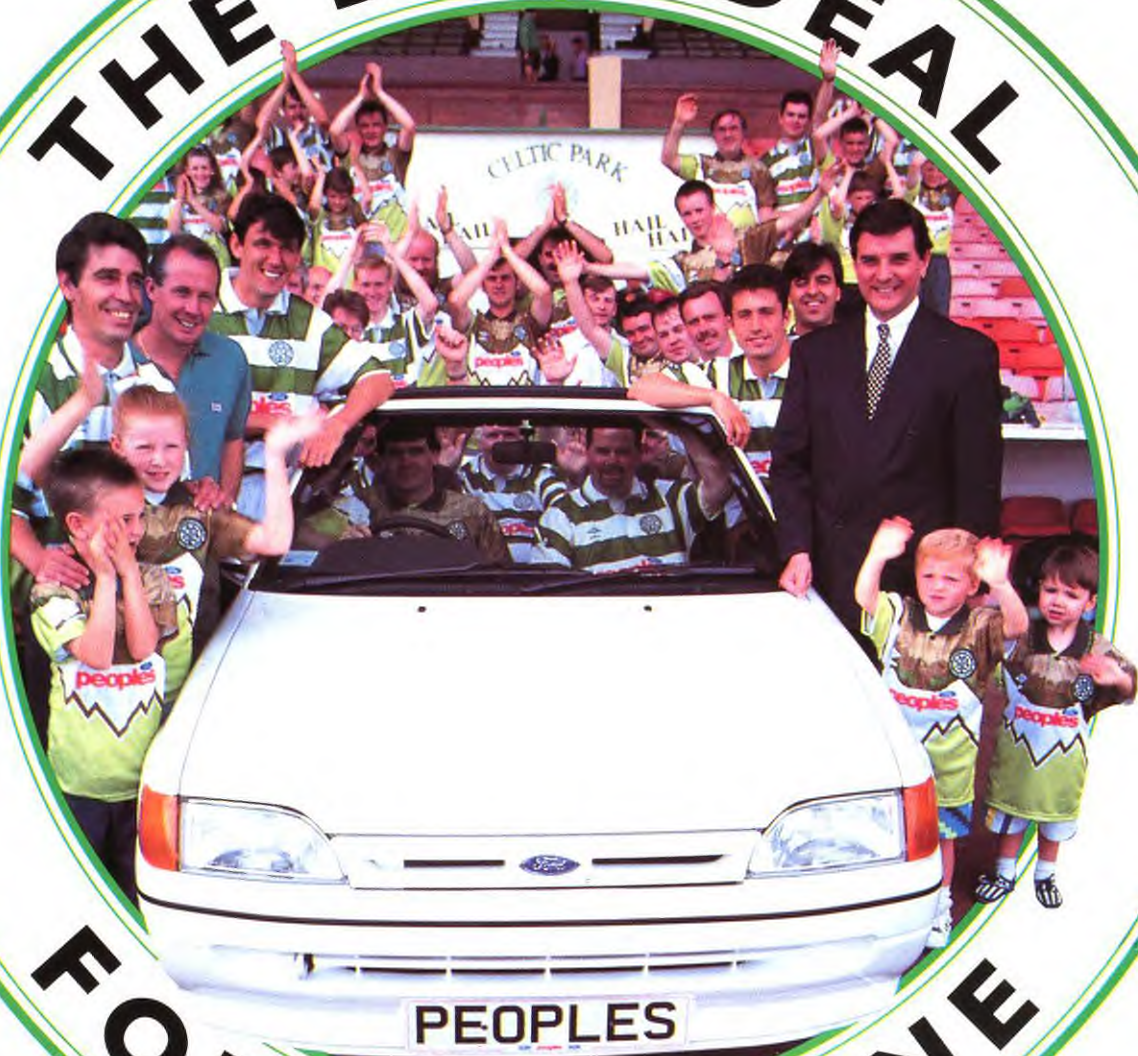

IT is my great pleasure to welcome you all to tonight's match which will see European football return to Celtic Park after an absence of almost two years.

I know that everyone at the club worked very hard last season to ensure that this was the case and it is tremendous to be competing at this level.

It is also very important that we make the most of the efforts that gained our entry to the UEFA Cup by eliminating our first round opponents Germinal Ekeren.

It is imperative that we win tonight and take a lead to Belgium for the return leg in two weeks time and over the past few days I have been emphasising to my players how absolutely vital it is that we do not concede a goal in tonight's match.

In my opinion the UEFA Cup has recently become the hardest of the three European competitions in which to succeed.

You will find so many of the club's involved are either presently sitting at the top of their own domestic leagues or will be there come the end of the season, and of course there is an extra round to play in the UEFA Cup.

This year is no exception. All you have to do is look at some of the illustrious competitors with tremendous European pedigrees challenging for the UEFA Cup this season.

Such as the current holders Inter Milan - a name familiar to all Celtic supporters and a club I know well having played for them - Liverpool, Ajax and Bayern Munich.

I am aware that the club has never progressed beyond the third round in this competition and it would be nice to think that this could perhaps be improved upon this year.

For the rich benefits of a run in

Europe are threefold.

Firstly a lengthy involvement provides great satisfaction for the fans for whom Europe holds a very special place and so it would be great to make an impact for their sakes, the club having enjoyed little success in this arena in recent times.

Secondly, a run in the competition is a great confidence booster for the whole club and it gives the players especially the belief to achieve results on the domestic front.

Thirdly, and not insignificantly, the more matches the club plays in Europe the more money is generated for the club.

Gate receipts, television coverage and other commercial spin-offs are knock-on effects of success in this arena.

Our opponents this evening, Germinal Ekeren are perhaps a bit of an unknown quantity in European terms but we have done our homework on them and both Tommy Craig and Mick Martin have gone to Belgium to watch them play.

In addition we have a contact in Antwerp who has been giving us weekly updates on their progress which, to be honest, has been poor this season.

However the strength of Belgian teams should not be under-estimated and that is why we will have to be at our best this evening to record the desired result.

### VIDEO REVIEW

**GREAT SCOTS ... Produced by Braveworld in association with Queen of the South FC. £12.99**

THIS 60-minute video presented by James Cosmo charts the careers of some of the greatest Scottish footballers ever and among the Celts featured are Jimmy Delaney, Tommy Docherty, Jock Stein, Billy McNeill, Jimmy Johnstone, Kenny Dalglish and Paul McStay.

Both international and club matches are shown and the 70-plus goals highlighted contain many classics from the great years of Scottish football.

The predominantly-Scottish Leeds United team of the late 60s and early 70s, along with Denis Law's Manchester United goals and Bill Shankly's Liverpool bring back many memories and go a great way to explaining why Scots are so successful and in demand down south.

Famous victories against the Auld Enemy make for satisfactory viewing even if they are in black and white. The years don't diminish the thrill of watching the goals go in.

Celtic's European Cup-winning performance in Lisbon is reshown along with vintage colour footage of the club's defeat of Leeds United at Elland Road in 1970.

The trip to Leeds is retold fondly by Mark "Taggart" McManus who takes a certain delight in telling his story of standing beside a Yorkshireman on the terracing who was convinced that Leeds would walk all over Celtic. George Connolly scoring in 45 seconds put paid to that.

Some fantastic goals are shown but the best of these will surely bring a smile to the face of our own young Stuart Gray — as it was scored by none other than his father Eddie.

His goal for Leeds against Burnley in the early 70s brought the memories flooding back. The way I remember the goal is that he beat about ten players before placing the ball in the net.

Now, seeing it with the advantage of video he only beat three or four defenders — but he rounded them two or three times each!

It's worth paying the £12.99 for this goal alone.

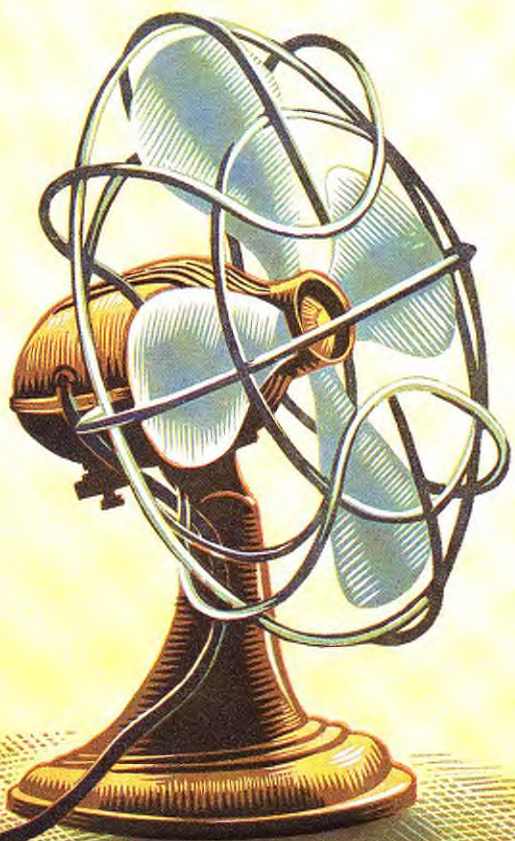

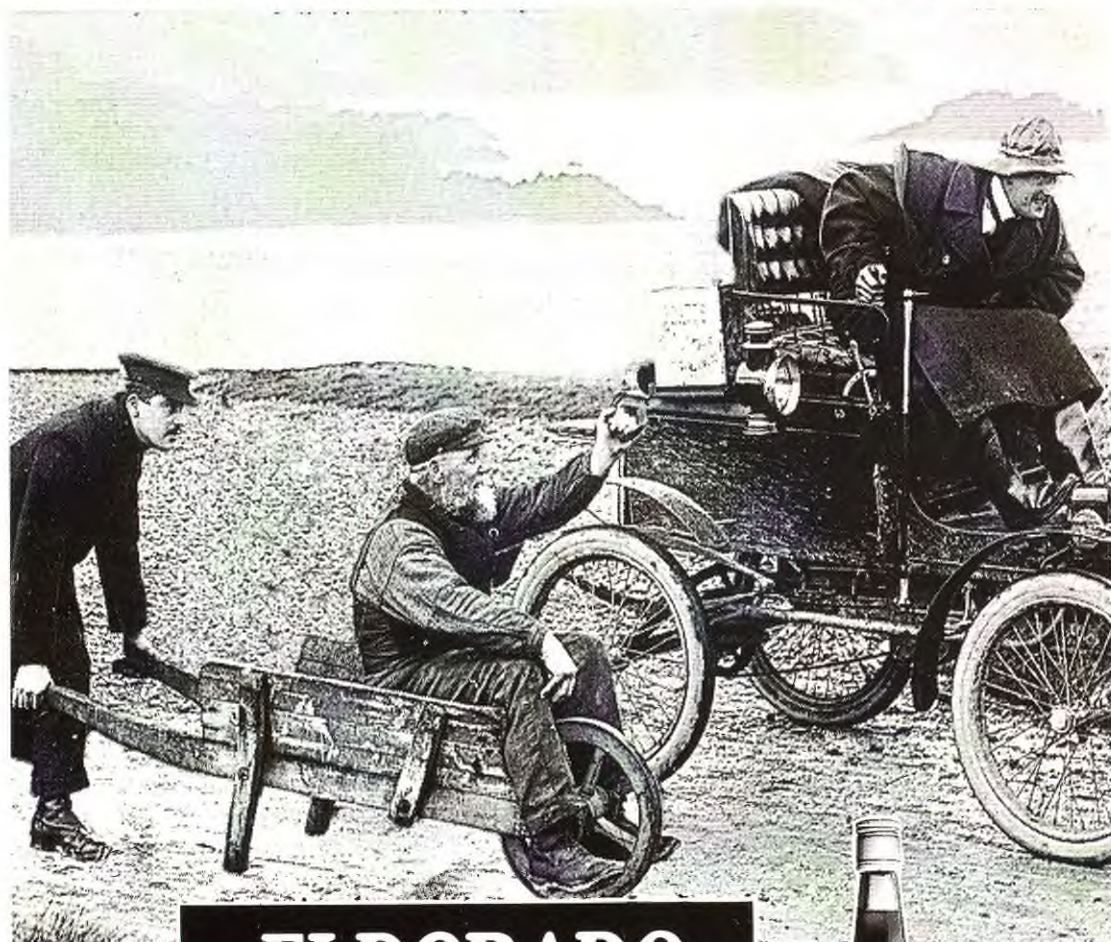
