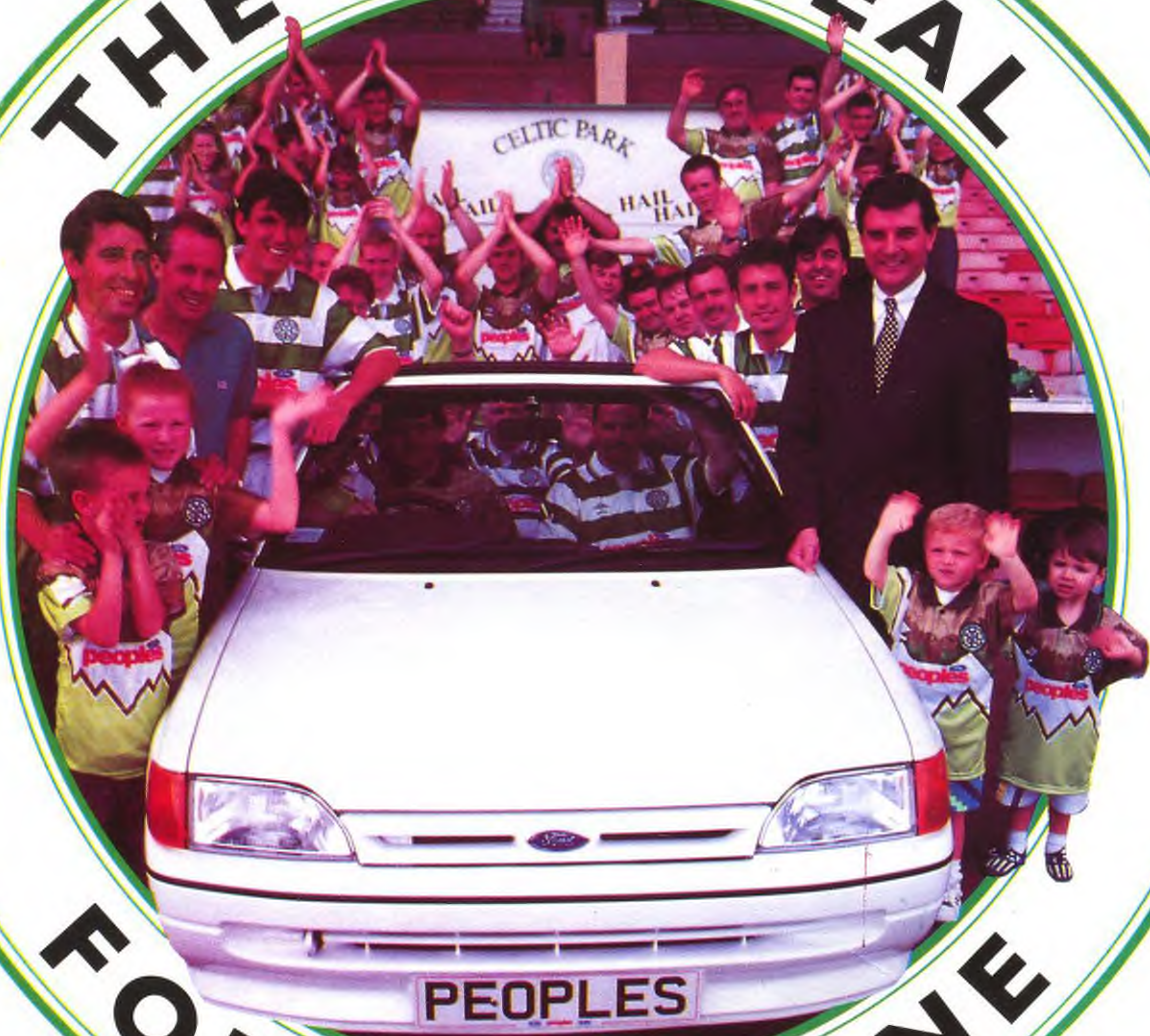

Having thoroughly assessed my options, I believe that the best way forward for the club is to give young talent a chance.

The Celtic fans are the best in the world and the players, coaching staff and I really appreciate the incredible backing they have given us.

Their continued support will help us achieve the success we all seek for Celtic Football Club.

BOOK REVIEW

A HISTORY OF ATHLONE TOWN FC . . . The First 101 Years
by Frank Lynch £7.00.

THIS 400-page volume is literally crammed with information from start to finish. The author clearly researched painstakingly what must be considered The Bible to fans of Athlone Town in particular and a fund of knowledge to those who follow Irish soccer in general.

The first match report dates from February 1897 and the book finishes with the Midlanders, like Celtic, winning two trophies in their centenary year.

Highlights include: being elected to the League of Ireland in 1969; qualifying for Europe and creating something of a shock by holding AC Milan to a 0-0 draw (missing a penalty in the process); and winning the league for the first time in the 1980-81 season.

The book also touches on the fact that the club tried to entice former Celt Duncan McKay to take up the post of player-manager in 1972, while ex-Celt Tony Taylor took over for a short term in the 1976-77 season.

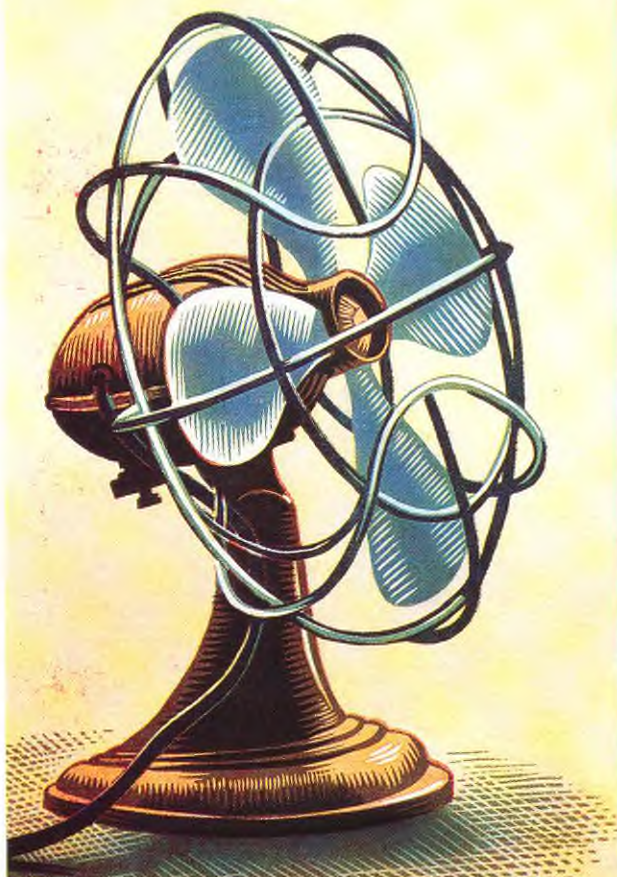
