# Hearts head into fortnight of fate



**M**any thought Hearts' position at the top of the table wouldn't last, but here we are in December and the Edinburgh team are still leading the pack.

Today's match against Celtic and next weekend's clash with Rangers could prove to be the make or break time for the Tynecastle men who have failed, as yet, to defeat either of the Old Firm sides this season.

If they manage it on one or both of their next Saturday afternoons, perhaps they will be given the respect and attention they deserve.

Jim Jefferies has moulded a team out of virtually nothing, making some great bargain signings to add to the stalwarts he already had. "Veteran" defenders **ALAN McMANUS** and **PAUL RITCHIE**, just 23 and 22 respectively, have become an integral part of the Hearts back line in recent years.

Along with **GARY LOCKE**, they are members of the BP Youth Cup winning team from 1993.

Putting his faith in these defenders is French keeper **GILLES ROUSSET**. He has made a few bloomers in his career in Scotland, but has managed to keep impressive youngster **RODDY McKENZIE** out of the first team and is a fans' favourite, having won a number Player of the Year awards

from supporters' clubs.

**DAVID WEIR**, brought by Jefferies to Tynecastle from Falkirk, has recently broken into the Scotland squad and the classy defender has had to wait longer than he may have thought for the recognition he deserves. On the left of defence is full-back **NEIL POINTON**, who captained Hearts well when Gary Locke was out injured.

The 33-year-old Englishman has had an up and down time at Hearts, but this term has proved he is as good as the next man.

Locke could well be the driving force behind the team. They called Gary Mackay "Mr Hearts", but this Gary is definitely his successor - he's crazy about the Gorgie side.

In the midfield this afternoon, Celtic will have to battle it out with two of Hearts' most impressive performers this term so far.

Midfielders **STEFANO SALVATORI** and **STEVE FULTON** have kept the engineroom running brilliantly. Fulton is no stranger to Celtic Park, starting his career here in the 1980s.

He was dubbed "Baggio" by Billy McNeill, possibly the worst tag anyone could ever have bestowed on him. On leaving Celtic, he had a spell at Bolton before Jefferies brought him



to Brockville and then Tynecastle in a swap deal for David Hagen.

Fulton has been a revelation this season and his form has not gone unnoticed by Scotland boss Craig Brown, who looks set to cap him.

Salvatori is a former AC Milan, Fiorentina and Atalanta star, and you won't get a game for clubs of that calibre unless you're a half-decent player! This term the Italian has proved his worth and can play anywhere in the midfield.

Another from foreign climes in the midfield area is Austrian **THOMAS FLOGEL**, brought to Hearts thanks to the Bosman ruling. Flogel, who played over 350 games for Austria Vienna, turned down moves to Holland, Belgium and France to come to Tynecastle.

He had a nightmare start against Rangers, hauled off at half-time in his first game, but has since shown that was a one-off, playing some great football and hitting the net regularly.

Hitting the net a wee bit more regularly than Flogel, or most others for that matter is of course, **JOHN ROBERTSON**. The little striker has been at Tynecastle since leaving school, except for a short-lived nine-month move to Newcastle in 1988. He has been top scorer each season and is the second-top goal scorer in the history of the Premier Division.

Last season he got the one record he wanted, breaking Jimmy Wardhaugh's long standing record as Hearts' top goalscorer with 206 goals, netting twice in a 3-1 win over Rangers in May this year.

**STEPHANE ADAM**, therefore, has a lot to live up to, but the Frenchman who Hearts signed from Metz at the end of last term isn't doing too badly at all and has established himself as a major player in this Hearts team.

Another who can score and turn on the skill is **NEIL McCANN**. This afternoon, the former Dundee winger will be looking to put in much more impressive show than the last against Celtic when he was hardly given room to move in the 2-1 defeat at Tynecastle earlier this year.

If you want a midfielder player who can score goals, than **COLIN CAMERON** is your man. He netted in that 2-1 match and the £350,000-plus-John-Millar buy from Raith Rovers has proved to be another shrewd bit of business on Jefferies' part. An ever-present last term, his running from midfield will always cause problems.

On the subs bench you will be more than likely to find striker **JIM HAMILTON** who has had trouble keeping his place this season, despite doing well last year, and new boy **JOSE QUITONGO**, who has already scored a couple of goals for his new club since joining from Hamilton Acas just a few months ago. Quitongo is already a big favourite with the Hearts fans for his goal against city rivals Hibernian and just his sheer skill and artistry that every football fan admires.

Veteran defender **DAVE McPHERSON** is in his second spell at Hearts and should be back in the reckoning soon, after recovering from injury.

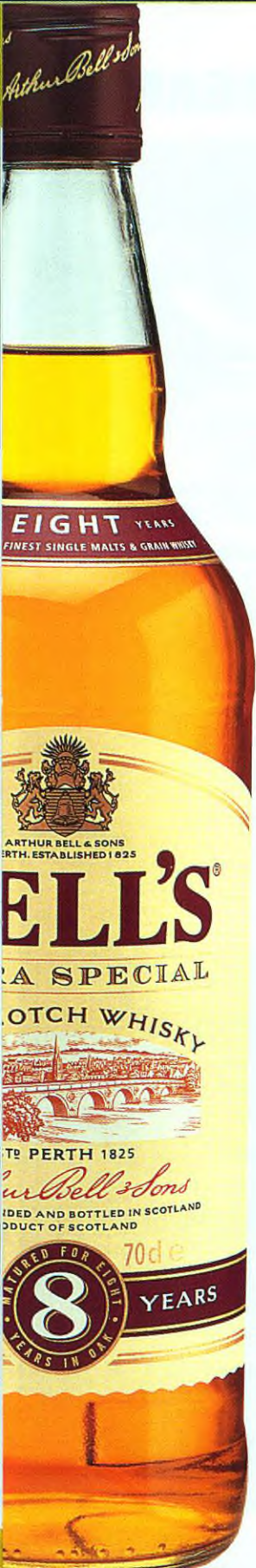

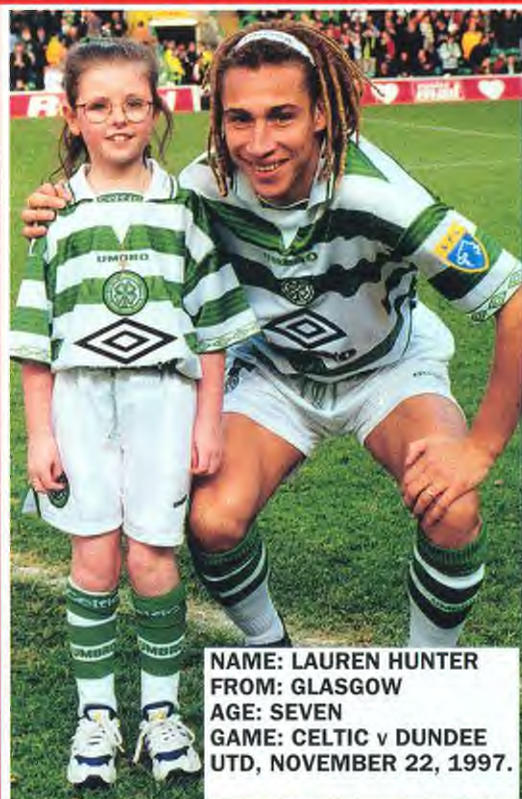

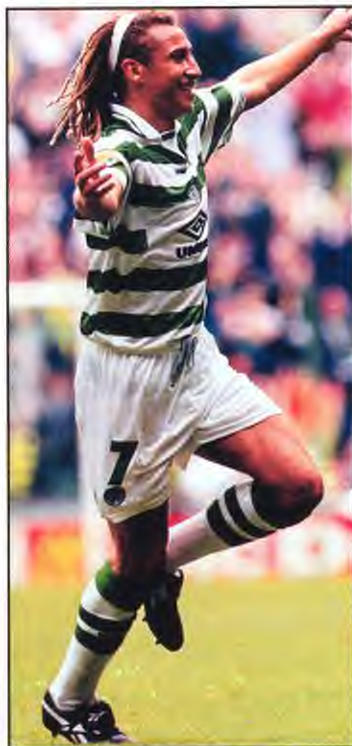

# Bhoys form up for a win



HENRIK LARSSON...700th away goal

- In the last meeting between the two clubs on October 13, Marc Rieper became the 47th and Henrik Larsson the 48th player to score for Celtic against Hearts in the Premier Division.
- Colin Cameron's goal in the above match was his third against Celtic in the last five league meetings.
- The above 2-1 win over Hearts was Celtic's 200th away Premier Division victory in 403 matches.
- Henrik Larsson's strike in the above match was Celtic's 700th away goal in the Premier Division.
- Celtic's 4-0 win over Dundee United was their 250th home Premier Division victory in 405 matches.
- The last time Celtic failed to score against Hearts in the

league was on April 19, 1995, when David Hagen scored the only goal four minutes from time at Hampden Park.

- The last time Hearts scored more than two goals in a league match at Celtic Park was on May 2, 1961 when they won 3-1.
- Hearts have only won twice at Celtic Park in the league since 1969.
- On October 12 1985 they won 1-0, with John Robertson, who else, scoring the only goal.
- Their last win here took place on January 4, 1992 when Scott Crabbe and John Miller scored in a 2-1 victory. John Collins netted a late goal for Celtic.
- In 73 Premier Division meetings, Hearts have only ever beaten Celtic once when the Bhoys opened the scoring.

Here, Arden man Peter explains his choice.

**I didn't see much of the Lisbon Lions in action myself but I've watched many a video and listened to the many tales of their achievements so I've made them the nucleus of my team.**

I think most Celtic supporters of my age would have Ronnie Simpson in goal as he was seen as the father figure of the Lisbon Lions and exuded experience.

To my mind Danny McGrain was the ultimate right-back, solid in defence and brilliant going forward - he was also a great one-club man which I feel is important.

On the other side has to be Tommy Gemmell who was equally adept in defence or attack - he was also a great goalscorer and I think I'm correct in saying he only missed three penalties for Celtic.

Davie Hay is my ideal midfielder as not only was he really effective in stopping the opposition but he was also a great playmaker - the quiet assassin is the ideal nickname for him.

Centre-half and captain has got to be the great Billy McNeill - his very presence won games for Celtic and he effectively epitomised the club's greatness and standing in the world-wide game.

George Connelly never really got a chance to show how great he could be - if things had gone differently for him then he would have become one of the all-time greats as he had so

much skill. Jimmy Johnstone was simply a one-off, he was just about the greatest player I've seen in the hoops and I'm sure nobody could disagree with his inclusion.

Kenny Dalglish is another who comes into that category - Celtic are lucky to have been blessed with so many great players and Kenny is obviously one of the best as he could do just about anything on the ball.

I suppose many people would be surprised with my choice of Frank McAvennie as centre-forward but I'm sure if you asked any of his teammates what they thought of him as a striker, they would be of the same mind as I am. He was great at



making space for others as well as being a fantastic goalscorer in his own right. I've finished off my team with another two of the Lions, Bertie Auld and Bobby Lennox.

Bertie was certainly a player who could turn it on when he needed to - and he could positively torment the opposition with his cheek.

Bobby Lennox gets his place in my team thanks to his electric turn of speed and although I was torn between him and Charlie Tully, he got the nod because of Charlie's similarity with Bertie.

There it is then - another unbeatable Celtic select! - and although I suppose that's what everyone must say, I feel sure my team could stand up and be counted in any company.

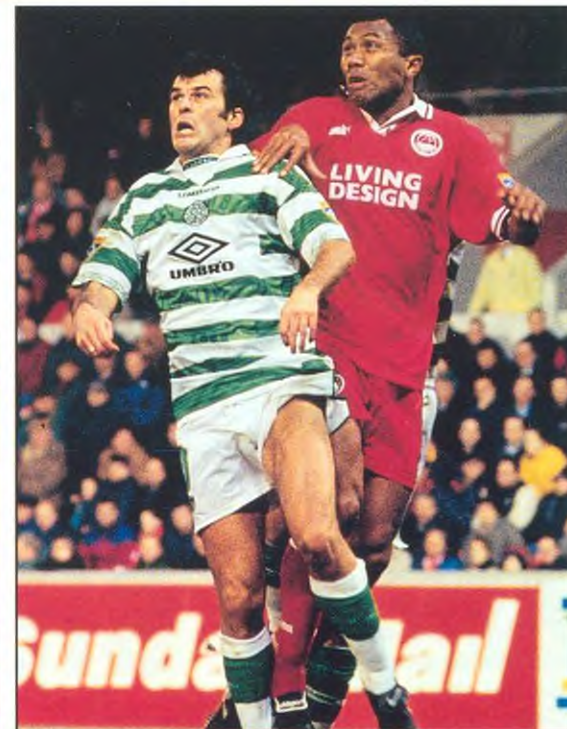

And now that the businessman has caught the Celtic bug he will do his bit towards the club's future success.

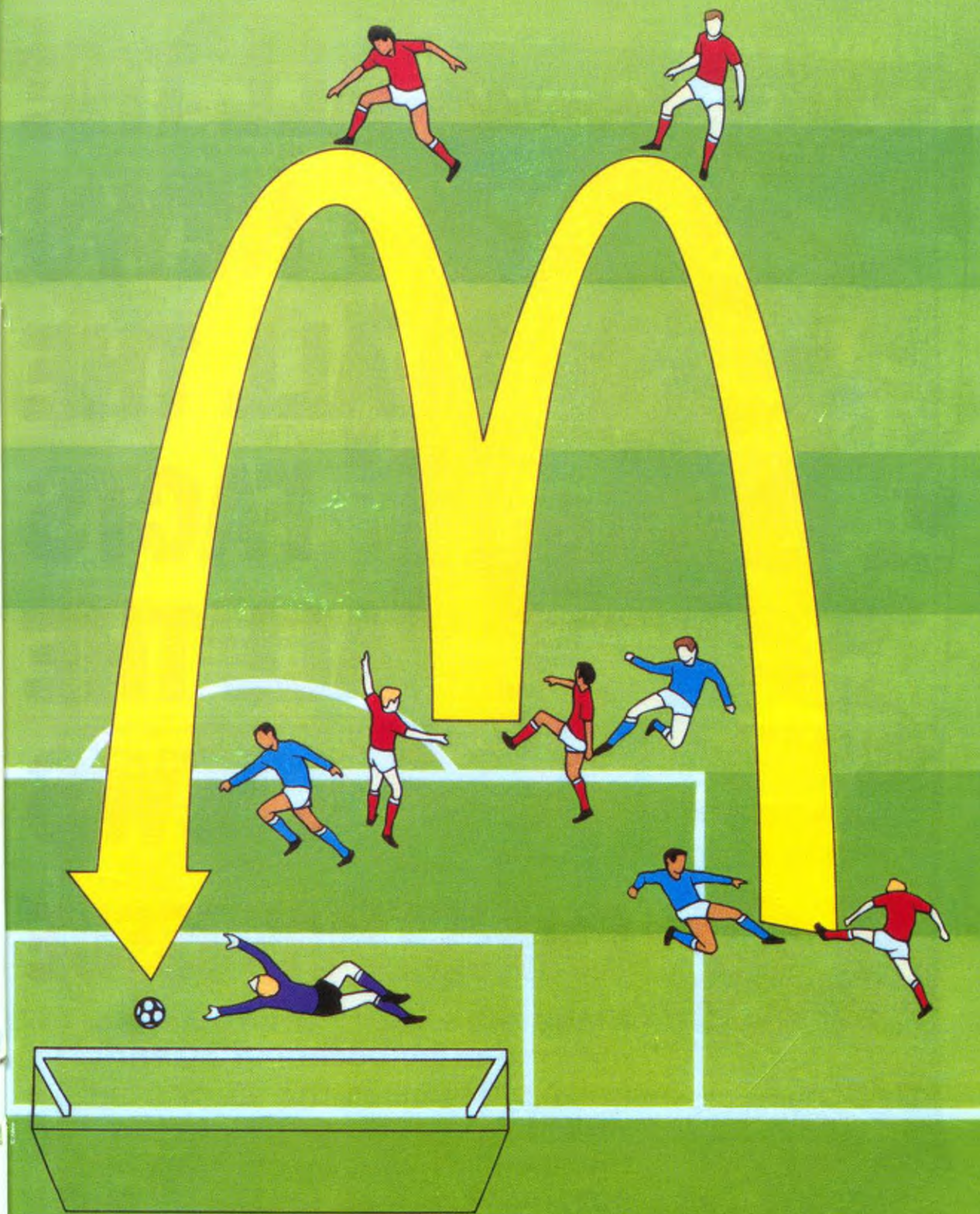
He said: "Even sitting in the temporary stand where I've been most of the season has been electrifying.

# Keeping up appearances

**C**eltic have always had the tradition of amiable eccentrics in goal, but sometimes the way that they were treated was even more eccentric.

Take for example the case of William Goldie. It would be fair to say that even although he had had a couple of seasons with Airdrie his career was not advancing when he joined Celtic on a trial in early 1960.

He was clearly not considered a success at Celtic Park either, for he was released towards the end of the 1959-60 season after only a few reserve outings.

Yet at the start of the following season, such were the injury problems with Celtic's goalkeepers that Willie was signed on again.

On October 1, 1960, Willie had no game, for even the reserves were covered by some other goalkeeper. The first team were playing at Airdrie, and Willie, clad in his Celtic scarf, decided to go and support them.

He was standing waiting for a service coach in London Road to take him to Broomfield, when the team bus passed.

Chairman Bob Kelly was clearly impressed by this great sight of loyalty, and ordered the driver to stop the bus.

We couldn't have one of our staff, albeit on a temporary contract, paying his own money to see the team, could we?

**When it comes to the outlandish and the outstanding you don't have to look much further than keepers to find some memorable anecdotes.**

**In today's match programme DAVID W POTTER takes another look at some of the men who have stood between the sticks at Celtic Park.**

Willie was flattered and embarrassed by all this, but duly accepted the lift. Some time before they reached the ground, on the short trip to Airdrie, Willie was approached and asked if he would like to play instead of John Fallon who was still being blamed for some of Rangers' five goals in the Old Firm game of three weeks previously. (Frank Haffey was still injured).

Willie was amazed, agreed as if in a trance, and it would have been interesting to know John Fallon's reaction to such a turn of events.

In such circumstances, it was hardly surprising that Goldie did not play well. The team went down 2-0, and Goldie could be blamed, at least in part, for each of the two goals.

He must have wished that he had been behind the goal with his scarf on, cheering on the team. Indeed, he would soon have loads of opportunities for just that, for he never played for Celtic again and was released at the end of October.

A similarly sad tale can be told about Richard Madden. He was actually the third-team keeper in

March 1963 when injuries to both Haffey and Fallon gave him his chance one Wednesday night at the end of March at Rugby Park, Kilmarnock.

Celtic had a much changed team that night, and supporters were suspicious that several so-called injuries were merely to give the players a rest before a Scottish Cup tie against St. Mirren on Saturday.

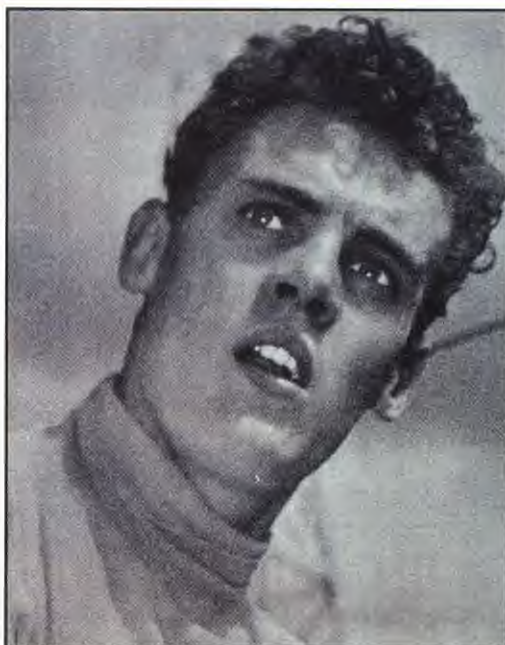
Moreover, it was in the immediate aftermath of the long freeze up of 1963, fixtures were coming thick and fast, Celtic themselves had no chance of the league, whereas the only challengers to Rangers were indeed Killie.

Be that as it may, there was no call for the comprehensive slaughtering that took place. Celtic's defence without McNeill panicked in the face of determined Kilmarnock onslaughts.

Madden coped well with some shots, was less successful with others, but probably did well to keep the score down to 6-0. It was however his one and only first-team encounter.

He also however played at Celtic Park for the reserves on a

famous Friday night. On November 22, 1963 as the players were getting ready for the game, someone came in and said that Kennedy had been shot.

Naturally jokes were cracked about Jim Kennedy, the current left back and his rival Tommy Gemmell was being blamed for it all.

At half time however the grapevine gave the solemn news that President John F Kennedy had died from gunshot wounds.

A more successful goalkeeper was John Fallon. He was at Celtic Park for almost 14 years from 1958 until 1972, and was thus present during all of the momentous decade of the 1960s. Although he didn't play in Lisbon, he was there, jumping off

the bench at full time, and was called in at short notice to play in the World Championship in Buenos Aires after Ronnie Simpson had been felled by a missile thrown by an Argentinian thug.

He won Scottish Cup medals in 1965 and 1969, distinguishing himself on both occasions. He identified himself with the support, even as early as his second game at Arbroath in 1959.

He pulled off a good save, and was seen to turn to the supporters and make a "thumbs-up" sign. Those who believed in the mythical "good old days" claimed that Joe Kennaway and Charlie Shaw never did that, but most of us from then on identified totally with the loveable

red-head who was clearly one of us.

We therefore wept for him in January 1968 when two bad mistakes gave Rangers an undeserved draw, and seemed to give them the title.

Yet when nemesis, the Greek goddess of revenge, appeared for Rangers at the end of the season, Fallon was playing a reserve game at Parkhead, more or less on automatic pilot, as it were, as ballboys brought him news that Rangers were dropping a point at Morton.

The year of 1969 was a great one for John. Breathtakingly courageous in the Scottish Cup Final as he dived at the feet of hysterical Rangers forwards, he was presented to the Celtic End at full time and revelled in the occasion.

In the League Cup Final the following autumn he saved Celtic again and again as St. Johnstone tried to equalise.

John was a quintessential Celtic character, sharing in triumphs and disasters. Presumably as a supporter, he still does.
