# ONE match that matters now

**NOTHING** has changed since we played Hibernian at Easter Road last week.

All our energies are concentrated on making it in to the next round - we are looking no further than that.

Of course, since the quarter-final draw was made everyone talked about the possibility of taking on Rangers in the next round.

But until that is a reality all thought of what a quarter-final might bring will be banished from our minds.

And last week's clash at Easter Road demonstrated the wisdom of that approach.

In this game you can take nothing for granted and we perhaps enjoyed a lucky escape a week past on Monday.

We did not play well after working ourselves into a winning position with a Phil O'Donnell goal early on.

And when Darren Jackson equalised from the penalty spot late on the tie became all about survival for us.

The nature of the cup means we have a chance to make amends tonight and we will certainly take great confidence from Saturday's 1-0 win over Motherwell.

It marked only our second victory in 10

games at Fir Park and despite the wind and state of the pitch making conditions awkward, the number of chances we made was encouraging.

We tailored our play to suit the circumstances - when a pass was on, we passed it, when the ball required to be kicked, we kicked it.

That moves our title challenge on another week and at this stage of the season it is all about going out and competing in order that we're still in there at the death when the league and cup is being decided.

There was a temptation to play new signing Enrico Annoni at the weekend, but we resisted because it would have meant a stop-start beginning to his Celtic career as he is not eligible for tonight's game.

We want to be in a position to put him in for a run of matches and he'll be given time to settle in.

We brought him in because he is a defender who likes to defend, has real presence and is a good organiser.

I'm sure he will be a fine player for the club.

**IN PROFILE**



**DAVID HANNAH** has already tasted Scottish Cup success with Dundee United – but he reckons it would be twice as sweet in the colours of Celtic.

Back in 1994, Hannah was part of the Dundee United side that defeated Rangers 1-0 at Hampden Park.

And although Celtic's 23-year-old midfielder rates that glorious day in May as the highlight of his career, he is hoping to top that this year by helping Celtic to the league and the cup double.

However, he knows that Celtic will have to put in a better display this evening against the Edinburgh side than they did in the first game last Monday night that ended in a 1-1 draw.

But he is sure that with a packed Celtic Park behind them the Bhoys will get the result to take them through to a quarter-final clash against Rangers.

Hannah said: "Last Monday night we played really well in the first half and then in the second 45 Hibs had the far more opportunities, and we were all very disappointed.

"But I am sure it will be a very different game tonight with us having the advantage of our support behind us and the playing surface will be better.

"Since I have been at this club however, I have noticed that everyone raises their game against Celtic, and in the cup there is an extra incentive. Hibs were really up for it, as I know they will be again tonight.

"But we have to make sure that we get the right result this time and get through to that Rangers quarter-final that we all want."

Hannah was only 20 when he lifted the cup with United and still has fond memories of the day.

And he reckons there is nothing quite like being at Hampden in May on cup final day.

# Double will cup that!

He said: "That is definitely the highlight of my career, it was an absolutely fabulous day.

"Our manager at the time, Ivan Golac, was a great motivator and got everyone going and the day itself just flew by in the end.

"I was only 20 and to win something when you are that young is a very nice feeling indeed.

"I came to Celtic to win honours and improve myself as a player and I hope I can do that.

"We want to win the league and the cup, and although Hibs tails will be up, and rightly so after their good performance at Easter Road, I reckon we can get the win this time."

Hannah was given a late Christmas present when Celtic snapped him up from Tannadice and has already settled into the side, making 12 appearances for the club before last weekend.

But he admits he still has a lot to learn at his new club, and is hoping the Celtic supporters will soon see a big difference in him.

He explained: "I am thoroughly enjoying myself, and I have settled in quite quickly I think, with everyone

making me very welcome.

"But the training methods are something I am still getting used to.

"Hopefully I will get better though, and I have had all the help I've needed from Tommy Burns and Billy Stark, and all the other players."

One thing that is annoying Hannah however, is his failure to score in the hoops – but he is sure once he gets that elusive first goal the rest will soon follow.

He said: "Getting settled into the team was my main priority and now I would love to get a goal.

"And I am sure that once the first comes I will get a few more.

"I've got myself into positions to score and had a few chances, and if I keep making runs into the box and getting into good positions then the law of averages says that one is bound to go in!

"And it would be very nice to score in the cup tonight and take us into the next round."

Their two trips along the M8 this season have seen them crash 5-0 and 4-1 in the league – and now they face the Celts at home again, this time in the cup.

However their impressive display in Monday night's 1-1 draw at Easter Road must have given Hibs hope and they will be looking to make it difficult for Celtic again tonight.

Jim Duffy and his assistant Jackie McNamara may not have had a great run of results since taking over at the turn of the year.

But they have taken big strides and Celtic fans should see a big difference in the quality of the side from the one that came to Glasgow last month.

And tonight Hibs can also welcome back several players from injury and suspension. So the route to the quarter-final showdown with Rangers will be far from easy.

Despite conceding 13 goals to Celtic already this season **JIM LEIGHTON** has proven time and time again that he is an international class goalkeeper.

So much so that the next time he appears at Celtic Park he may well be wearing the Scotland No.1 shirt when Austria arrive on World Cup duty.

And Hibs also have international class in back-up for Leighton as understudy **CHRIS REID** is no stranger to the Scotland scene thanks to a handful of under-21 appearances.

In front of the keeper,

Hibs have an array of talent to choose from and the likely contenders tonight could come from **WILLIE MILLER, GORDON HUNTER, SHAUN DENNIS, DARREN DODS** and **BRIAN WELSH**.

The most recent arrival from that bunch is Dennis who became Duffy's first signing when he agreed terms in January.

He was outstanding on Monday night and not even a dislocated finger could stop him from collecting the man-of-the-match award.

He linked up with Hunter in the last game, and will probably do so

again tonight.

Young **MICHAEL RENWICK** perhaps keeping his place at right-back where he deputised for Willie Miller in the last match.

At left-back should be former Celt, **JAMIE McQUILKEN** who has done well since moving to the Edinburgh side from Dundee United.

Hibs also have **JOHN HUGHES**, **JOE McLAUGHLIN** and **RAB SHANNON** in the defensive ranks but ex-Celt Hughes hasn't had the best of times through injury and suspension since moving to Easter Road in October.

And he doesn't look like making a return to Celtic Park tonight, other than to sit in the stand.

Hibs' midfield features the talents of **IAN CAMERON**, **PAT**

**McGINLAY**, **CHRIS JACKSON**, **ANDY DOW** and **GRAEME LOVE**.

And the latest arrival in the Hibs ranks, is **CHIC CHARNLEY** who wore the Hoops once in his career, in a testimonial match against Manchester United.

He's on a pay-as-you-play deal at Easter Road, and his former team-mate and good friend Jim Duffy will be hoping the hothead player will show more of his skill than his temper.

Cameron moved to Edinburgh from Partick Thistle at the start of this season after spells with St Mirren and Aberdeen.

McGinlay of course needs no introduction to the Celtic Park crowd after his midfield scoring exploits for the Parkhead club.

But he will want to forget his last counter

here – an own goal in September's 5-0 game.

McGinlay was missing from the original cup game through suspension, but should line-up against his former club this evening.

Jackson and Love came through the ranks at Hibernian while Dow came north from Chelsea and celebrated his arrival by netting against city rivals Hearts on his debut.

And talking of scoring, there is no shortage of goal-grabbers up front with a quartet in the shape of **KEITH WRIGHT**, **DARREN JACKSON**, **KEVIN HARPER** and **GRAEME DONALD**.

Wright has consistently topped the Hibernian goal scoring charts since 1991 when he signed from Dundee.

And Jackson and Harper both have the

knack of finding the net on a regular basis.

Speed is an element used by both players and while Jackson is a current internationalist, the early signs are that Harper will be following in his footsteps in the future.

Jackson was sorely missed from the Hibs – and Scotland – line-up when he was out with a hamstring problem.

But he returned to the action with a bang as he hit a penalty equaliser against Celtic on Monday.

Donald is another product of the Edinburgh side's youth system but he's recently been out of the team after suffering an horrific knee injury which will keep him out of the side for the rest of the season.

Another young striker in with a chance of a game tonight is **GREG MILLER**, son of former Hibeer boss Alex.
