# United to get back **on track**

**WE intend to bounce right back to winning form tonight following our disappointing result at Tannadice on Saturday.**

It was upsetting to drop three vital points, especially after losing a goal so late on, but we can't fault the players for their attitude.

The amount of effort they put in during the second half was amazing – as was the number of chances they created.

That made United's last-gasp goal particularly hard to take. In the past we've usually left the goals til late on and tonight's visitors know all about that as the last time we took on Raith we popped up with a last-gasp winner.

That just goes to show that you can't take anything for granted and tonight we will take no notice of Raith's bottom-of-the-table position.

It doesn't matter who you play these days – you're in for a tough 90 minutes and we are well prepared for that.

The players know they have to do the right thing at the right time and that their attitude has to be first class.

After tonight we have Scottish Cup action against Hibernian and because of the way the fixtures scan we have a 16-day break from league action.

So this will be the

ideal time to work on any knocks and strains that we've picked up and it will also give the players a wee break after a difficult and very busy start to the year.

A total of nine games were played in a very tough January schedule but to be fair to our lads they battled away and played football at the right times.

But we have to get tonight's match out the way first and close the gap on Rangers before we talk about Hibs or rest periods.

We have a terrific opportunity to move to within four points of the top of the table with Rangers not playing until Saturday. Chances like this don't come around too often as it is usually the other way around and Rangers seem to play before us.

They were able to build up a 17-point gap but we have now cut that back to just seven and it could have been less if we'd got a break on Saturday.

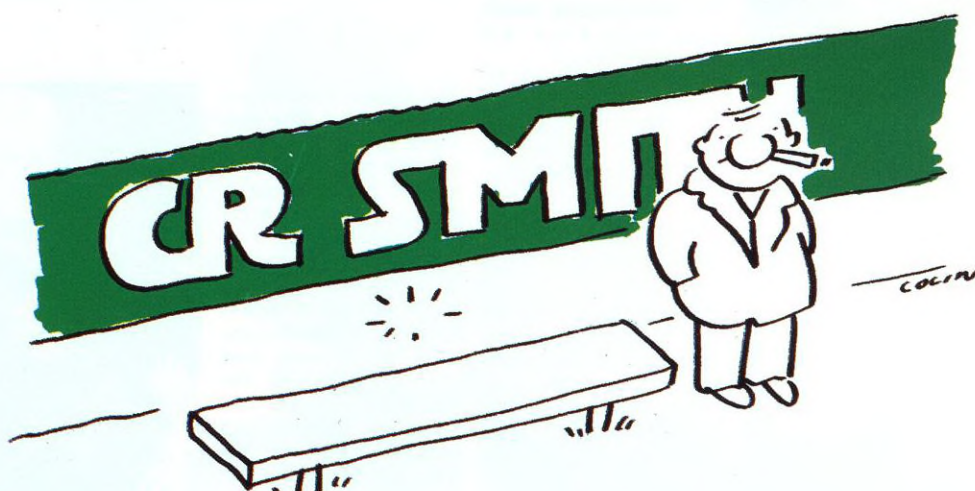
But we still have 11 league games to go to make-up and overcome the difference and we remain as defiant as ever.

**TONIGHT'S** visitors Raith Rovers may still be propping up the league table but they are certain to put up a strong challenge for the points today.

Ian Munro's Raith gave Celtic a real fright in January at Stark's Park and it took a last gasp strike from Chris Hay to seal the points.

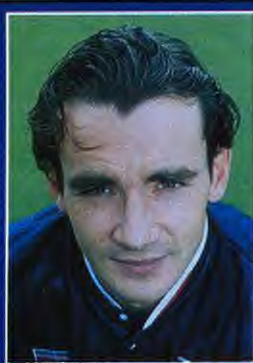
Rovers took the lead in that match through Danish import **SOREN ANDERSEN**.

Along with fellow Dane **KARSTEN HALLUM** and Norwegian **VETLE ANDERSEN**, he has made a huge difference to Raith.

Hallum and Soren Andersen are both on loan from Danish side Hvidovre but Rovers are currently attempting to secure both Danes on

longer term contracts as both have impressed.

Vetle Andersen will be hoping to help Raith keep up their impressive record of being the only club - apart from Rangers - to keep a clean sheet at Parkhead since Celtic returned in August 1995.

He joined the club from FC Vigor in October

last year, and back in the 1980s he had a spell with Dunfermline.

In the Raith defence will be **DAVID KIRKWOOD** and former Hearts player **JOHN MILLAR**.

Young **DAVID CRAIG** could complete the defensive line-up, a product of the Dundee United youth side who

moved to Kirkcaldy in May last year. Another candidate is youngster **PAUL BONAR** who is dangerous on the attack.

Defender **ANDY MILLEN** was a former target of Tommy Burns, as it was the Celtic boss who revived his career at Kilmarnock when they both earned a crust in

Ayrshire.

Former Hibs man **DANNY LENNON** netted last week in their draw with Hibs and the attacking midfielder will be out for another goal today.

Raith have pace down both flanks with **TONY ROUGIER** on the left more than capable of beating anyone on his game.

On the other wing, is former St Johnstone man **KEVIN TWADDLE** who gave Stuart Gray a torrid time of it at Stark's Park.

Raith Rovers have two Scott Thomson's on their books - goalkeeper **SCOTT Y THOMSON** who should keep his place ahead of former Ibrox keeper **COLIN SCOTT**, and then there's former Aberdeen striker **SCOTT M THOMSON**.

CELTIC goalkeeper Gordon Marshall is well aware of how costly one mistake can prove to be at the highest level.

A misjudgment against Motherwell last October led to him being sent-off and since that day he hasn't returned to the No.1 position.

Young Stewart Kerr replaced Marshall that day, and has impressed the manager enough to keep his place ever since.

So during the last three months 32-year-old Marshall has sat in the stadium, sat on the bench and played in the reserves – but he hasn't given up hope of regaining his place in the first team.

He is simply biding his time until the call comes, as he has done on previous occasions in his five years at the club.

But he knows the keeper's jersey is one of the hardest to reclaim.

Marshall said: "As a goalkeeper you can only play in one position and that is simply why it sometimes takes a wee bit longer for the goalkeeper to get his place back than it does an outfield player.

"But I still have a job to do, and I know that things can change quickly – as I have found out on numerous occasions in my time here.

"When you play a full league season, as I did last term when we lost only one match, you are entitled to feel you are doing all right.

"But that still doesn't guarantee that everything will fall into place for you further down the line, and now I am back in the position where I have to just play the waiting game. And I have to make sure that when my chance comes I am ready for it.

"That might be in the next game, the next week, next month or, it could be even be that I may never play again. But I just have to prepare

so that I could step in at any minute and that's what I have been doing in the last three months."

Marshall knows that the red-card offence that has put him in his present predicament could have been avoided, but believes it is all too easy to say that with hindsight.

Describing what went through his mind that Saturday afternoon he reveals: "I was thinking that there were 10 minutes to go and to come out and kick the ball into the stand was probably the safest and best bet and I know that is the case now.

"But instead I tried to do something I was not capable of doing, I admit that. I tried to keep the ball in play and switch play to the other side, and then I slipped.

"And when that happened there was only one thing I could do, which was pull the man down. If I hadn't taken that course of action we could have ended up losing.

"So it was a costly mistake personally, but we got the three points that day and at the time that was the most important thing."

Kerr has handled his step-up to the first team well, and Marshall reckons

the young goalie will go far – but he is still planning on taking the No.1 jersey back off him at some point...

He said: "Stewart is as good as anyone and has a great future ahead of him, but I have not lost the will to play and every day I am looking to get my place back from him."

Until Marshall does regain his place, the games he's been playing have been in Tom McAdam's reserve side with a bunch of lads fresh from the youth team.

And he admits it is quite satisfying to help put the youngsters as they learn their trade. Indeed the Edinburgh-born stopper grabbed a bit of glory for himself last Thursday night as he saved three penalties in a shoot-out and helped Celtic defeat Killarnock in the quarter-final of the Reserve League Cup.

He said: "When I am in the reserves I have to set an example to the younger players and at the same time keep myself ready to step back into the first team when needed.

"It's a very young team and I have special responsibilities as an experienced player, and it has been all the more gratifying when I've won reserve games this term, than previous season when I've been in the second string."

Marshall, watched from the stand at Kirkcaldy last month as Celtic narrowly defeated Raith Rovers 2-1 to keep their title hopes alive. And he reckons tonight could be another difficult encounter.

He said: "Raith are always a difficult team to play, you really have to compete with them and then I hope the quality of our players will make a difference the longer the game goes on. We need the points and should have the calibre of player to get it for us tonight."

# Hay's the last minute

★ CELTIC and Raith first met on league duty in 1910/11 season when Celtic won 5-0 at home and lost 3-1 away.

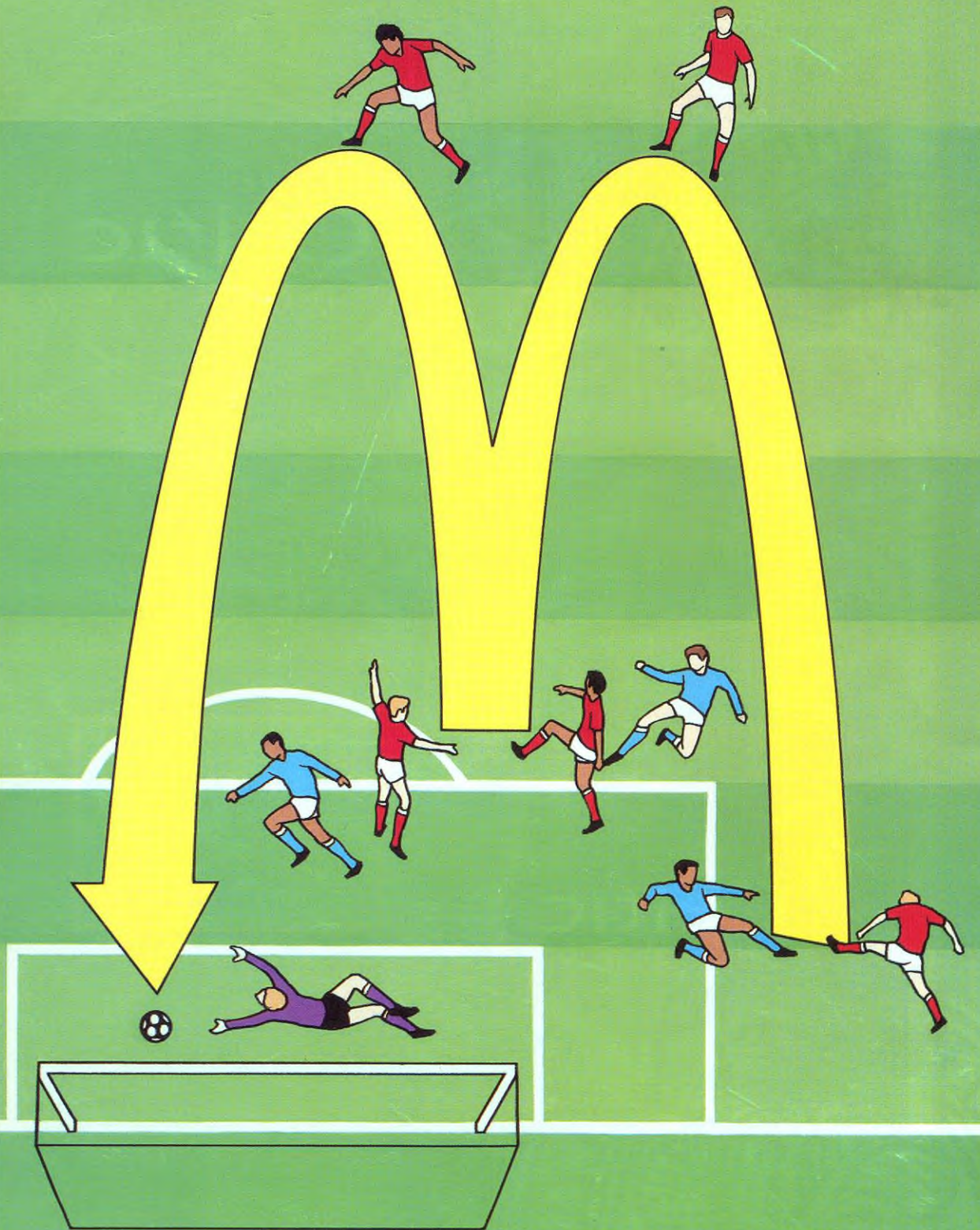

# Coronation

## Mike's career

**LIKE** many another Celt, it could be said that Mike Haughney had Celtic in his blood. He was the great-nephew of Peter Dowds, one of the very early Celts.

Mike was in the army during World War II and its immediate aftermath, attaining the rank of captain in the Commando unit of the Seaforth Highlanders.

He is one of the comparatively few Celts who joined the club from the east of Scotland, having played for Dalkeith St. David's and Newtongrange Star before arriving at Parkhead in 1949.

He was introduced to the team as a forward, and indeed his debut game was at outside left. It was the opening day of the 1949/50

He marked his debut in the cauldron of an Old Firm clash and emerged triumphant when he netted Celts winning goal. This proved to be something of a false dawn for the Eastend Bhoys and he reverted to

right back from where his form took off. The highlight of his career quickly followed when his rugged defensive qualities helped Celts win the Coronation Cup. Despite gaining international caps his spell at Celts ended abruptly when he emigrated to the States. **DAVID W POTTER** chronicles the Hoops career of an unsung hero.

season and Haughney and Bobby Collins were thrown in at the deep end against Rangers.

Inspired by Pat McAuley, both youngsters were brilliant and Haughney scored the winning goal. Sadly this did not last, but Haughney's cause was not helped by the constant chopping and changing of the forward line.

He was not a full timer, for he was a student taking a Bachelor of Commerce degree at Edinburgh University.

However, he worked hard at his football in spite of being dropped from the first team, and his adaptability and willingness to try anything came to the fore when the Celtic management had one of their extremely rare brainwaves and played Mike at right back.

From here his career never looked back. He started as a tough defender famous for his punt up the field, but soon developed a

little more class and became totally reliable. He became the regular right-back in January 1953. The team was struggling and were invited to take part in the Coronation Cup...

But only because the tournament was being held in Glasgow, still the Empire's second city in 1953, and it would have been financial suicide otherwise.

But Celtic surprised quite a few, not least their own supporters one feels, and in that excruciatingly long blockade in the Final against Hibernian, Haughney played his part in subduing Willie Ormond.

At one point Hibs switched wingers, but Gordon Smith got a few cuttings from Haughney as Ormond had done.

This was one of the finest triumphs in the history of the club, but there was better to come next year. Mike was virtually an ever-present as Celtic, for the first time

in 40 years, won the League and Cup double. He had an outstanding season and was rewarded with his first full international cap against England in early April.

It was a bad day however in the Hampden rain for Scotland lost 4-2, but Mike was at least spared the humiliation of playing in Scotland's disastrous World Cup of 1954.

The following season he picked up a couple of caps for the Scottish League side, and continued to play well for Celtic, playing in every single game and losing another Scottish Cup medal in the most agonising of circumstances - a goalkeeper's

fumble of a last-minute corner kick.

However, 1955/56 was another good season for Haughney, although he was out injured for a spell in the autumn, but the Scottish Cup Final of that year is the one which puzzles Celtic historians.

It puzzled 130,000 people as well, for Celtic's team selection was absolutely bizarre!

Bobby Collins was injured, but there seemed to be adequate reserve cover in Jimmy Walsh and Jimmy Sharkey. However, the management played Haughney in the forward line, placed Frank Meechan a competent left-back on

the opposite berth, put the right-sided Willie Fernie at inside left and then gambled on a youngster called Billy Craig for his third game on the right wing!

Hearts could hardly believe their luck and ran out 3-1 winners. Ironically, Haughney scored Celtic's only goal but even the Celtic end thought that it was a foul on the goalkeeper.

This may have influenced Haughney's sudden decision a year later to give up football and emigrate to the USA.

Yet he was still playing well (he had won a League Cup winner's medal in October 1956) and seemed to have at least a season or two ahead of him.

He thus missed the 7-1 triumph over Rangers in the following League Cup Final, but he also missed a lot of misery as well. Perhaps he was quite wise.

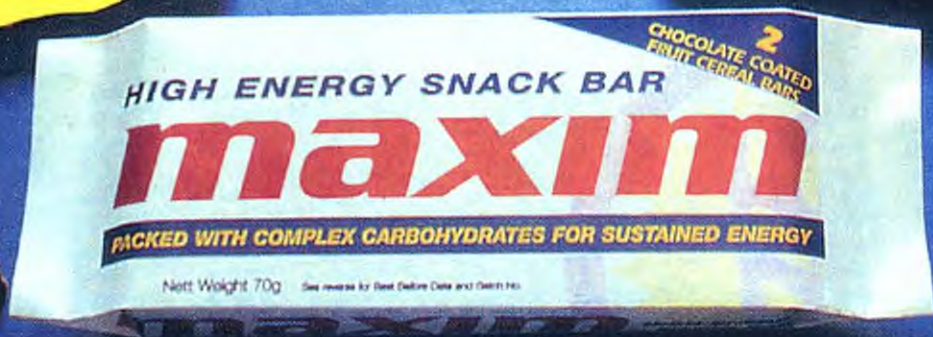

# Cashing in on the Celts

**BANKING officer Maureen Addison really cashes in when Celtic play abroad. For trips to the continent to watch her team compete in Europe is what she loves most about being a Hoops fan.**

And Germany hold special memories for Maureen, a jaunt to watch Celts take on Borussia Dortmund nine years ago a particular favourite.

She said: "Going on European trips is very special, the atmosphere is like a big party and the home teams' fans are normally friendly and interested in the great Celtic tradition.

"I've been to Dortmund twice, the first time was when we were beaten 2-0 in September 1988. There was a great rapport between both sets of supporters.

"Despite going out of the competition so early I was pleased when we were drawn against them in the UEFA Cup in 1993.

"We arrived in Germany to a great welcome from some of the people we had met a few years previously. They put on a street party for us and it was a brilliant few days."

Maureen was one of the thousands of Celts who made the journey to Hamburg last year – a trip that wasn't without the odd mishap.

The season book holder explained: "Our bus took a wrong turning just outside Dunkirk in France and we ended up lost and stranded, and this was just us getting there.

"The bus we were travelling on, as difficult as it may be to believe, actually got stuck on a nudist beach and some of our members had to get off the bus and push it back on to the road in the middle of the night."

And things didn't get any better on the journey home!

Maureen continued: "The bus engine blew up in a small town in Belgium and we spent the night waiting for two mechanics to arrive.

"They managed to patch it up until we got a new part for it in Dover.

"Once back on this side of the Channel we thought the worst was over, until the exhaust fell off the bus! I had exams to sit three days after the game had ended and I wasn't even back in time for those.

"The return journey plus the score from the game added up to a

trip I'd rather forget."

Maureen is just a keen Celtic supporter here as she is abroad, despite her love of the club creating a few waves in the family home.

She said: "I used to come to the jungle when I was a kid to my mother's disapproval and before that when I wasn't old enough to travel through on my own my father would bring me.

"When my father's work prevented him from coming to the games, I would come with his friend Pat Kelly. Pat was a proud Celt and I'm sorry he isn't alive today to see the changes which have taken place here."

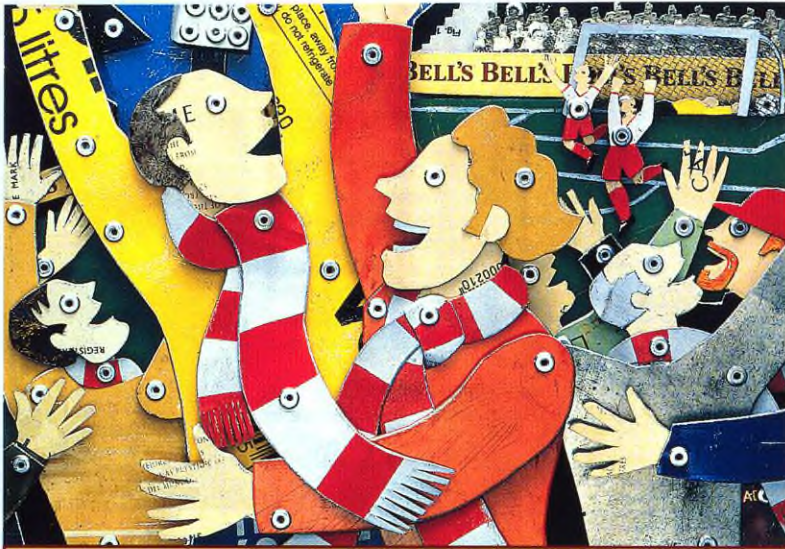
