New Year and new

hope for McStay

IT'S THAT time of year again when resolutions fill the air and people set stock for the coming 12 months.

And Paul McStay is no different, only his wishes may be a lot more resolute than others – and in the long run they will affect thousands of people.

For the club captain only appeared for the opening three games of this season and had to endure the agony of sitting out the following months on the sidelines.

Meanwhile the team had to carry on without the classy midfielder in the most important season of the decade.

The victories still rolled in but vital points were dropped at crucial times as the support turned their eyes towards the midfield in hope.

But it wasn't only McStay that was missing, Phil O'Donnell also had to drop out for a lengthy spell due to injury and added to that was the loss of the influential John Collins who moved to Monaco in the summer.

That meant that Celtic lost three of last season's midfield in one swoop – a devastating blow for any team.

But in the closing weeks of 1996 even during the bleakness of winter, the sun began to shine for McStay and O'Donnell as they took the first tentative steps back into Tommy Burns' more immediate plans.

And McStay is in no doubt concerning his top wish for 1997 – getting back to doing the job for which he is paid for.

He said: "The one thing I want is to get back to full fitness and positively reclaim my place in the first-team.

"That is on a personal level but that obviously involves the team going on to challenge for this league title and the Scottish Cup which is due to start soon.

"I have only lifted one trophy as captain of Celtic and needless to say I don't want that to be my last – not by any manner of means.

"So I've got a lot to look forward to in 1997 and I aim to be involved as much as I can as I want to look on this as the start of my season.

"I look on it as a fresh beginning even though I've already put in a lot of hard work over the past six months.

"And I'm definitely looking forward to the rest of this season for both myself personally and the rest of the team and club as a whole.

"It's not just me that has had a hard time as I wasn't the only one who was injured during the first part of the season.

"Myself and Phil were the only long-term injuries but the team has been hit by many more players having to be dropped for vital games through knocks.

"And we have had more than our fair share of suspensions but I'm hopeful that we have seen the end of that."

McStay took part in 38 games last term with this season's early trio taking him to the 660 mark in total. And next month he begins his 16th year as a

professional with Celtic.

However, the three games he played in at the start of the season had one thing in common – they were all away from home.

The matches, each in different competitions – Kosice (UEFA), Aberdeen (Premier) and Clyde (Coca-Cola) mean that the captain didn't experience the thrill of playing a competitive game in front of the newly upgraded stadium.

He said: "The completion of the East End of the ground means that the team have been playing to crowds of over 50,000.

"So that is something I missed out on but at the same time I was still able to savour the atmosphere created by the support.

"The atmosphere in the ground has been amazing and you can sense the excitement and hope coming from the stands.

"But I miss sampling that from the pitch and that is another thing I am looking forward to feeling during the rest of the season."

Celtic steeled for revenge on Fir Park men

LIKE many clubs around the country, Motherwell have been strapped for cash this season.

And their plight was highlighted recently in a bid to sign Lee Powers.

The Norwich City player was available on a free transfer and despite manager Alex McLeish's efforts, Fir Park chairman John Chapman reneged on the move.

However, McLeish came out and publicly backed the chairman in spite of his desire to strengthen the Motherwell squad - there simply wasn't enough money in the coffers to finance the move.

The need is evident when you consider that just two seasons ago the Lanarkshire side finished in second place.

Last term they didn't maintain that momentum and dropped to eighth position, just two above the relegation zone.

And they have finished the first half of this season in a similar

position - something they are desperately keen to improve upon.

However, it won't be lost on anyone at Parkhead today that the last time today's teams met it was Motherwell who came out on top, recording a 2-1 home win over Celtic.

That was done

without adding to the pool - so Tommy Burns knows his team will

have their work cut out this afternoon.

And hoping to keep the Celts out at the back is **STEPHEN WOODS** who is keen to show what he can do in the absence of

regular No.1 **SCOTT HOWIE.**

Howie, was of course injured in that 2-1 win for the Fir Park side and his long-term

JOHN PHILLIBEN, SHAUN McSKIMMING, BRIAN MARTIN, JAMIE DOLAN and MITCHELL VAN DER GAAG.

A defensive grouping with more than a fair smattering of experience, especially with the cool heads of Martin and McCart.

Martin only missed three league matches in last year's campaign and McCart, just last month, celebrated 12 years with the club he signed for from Celtic Boys' Club in 1984.

Dolan picked up some more experience in the last meeting between today's teams - he took over from Howie in goal but it is doubtful if he will want to go through the same routine this afternoon.

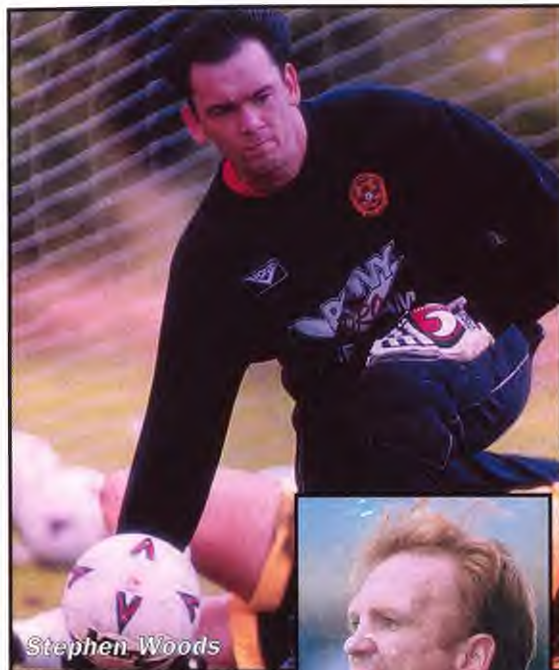
The defence could also feature **EDDIE MAY** and **FRASER WISHART** but in more attack-minded mode on the flanks by pushing up to midfield and beyond.

Coyne, pictured left, hit the heights again recently with a stylish hat-trick against Kilmarnock at Rugby Park in a timely win for Motherwell.

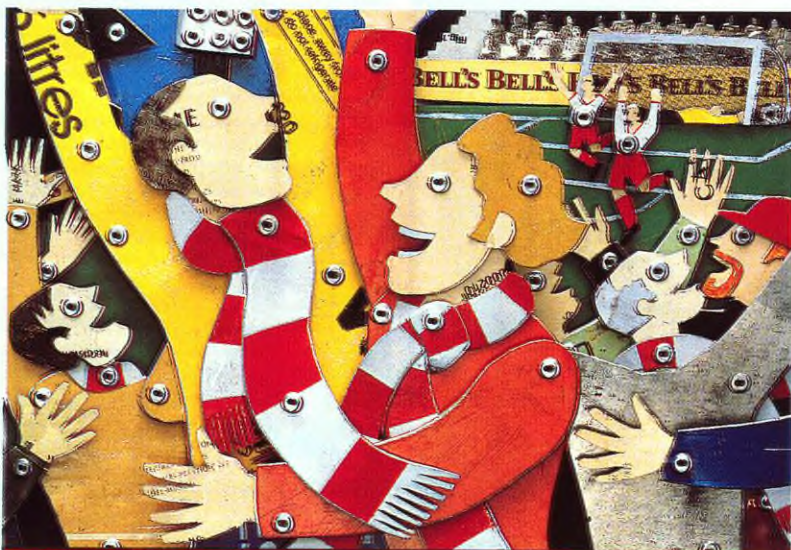

THE SPIRIT OF SCOTTISH FOOTBALL.

Well up Fir it!

★ MOTHERWELL'S 2-1 win over Celtic last month may have been a shock result – but when you look back at the results over the years you find that Motherwell always seem to produce their best form against the Bhoys.

★ CHRIS HAY became the 49th player to score for Celtic against Motherwell in the Premier Division when the home side won 2-1 at Fir Park on December 7, 1996.

★ THE above 2-1 defeat continued Celtic's recent poor run of results at Fir Park.

In the last eight meetings Celtic have won just once.

★ THE 2-1 reversal was also Celtic's first league defeat by a team other than Rangers since Partick Thistle won 3-1 at Hampden on May 2, 1996.

★ MOTHERWELL have failed to score in their last two visits to Celtic Park. The last time this happened was in 1983.

★ THE last time Motherwell were the first footers at Celtic Park

was on January 2, 1978 when a 24th minute Jim O'Rourke goal was enough to give the Lanarkshire men victory.

★ LAST season was the first since 1991/92 that Celtic came out on top of Motherwell in the four league meetings.

★ IF Celtic keep a clean sheet this afternoon it will be the first time Motherwell have failed to score in either of the Celtic Park meetings since the start of the Premier Division.

★ LAST season only five goals were scored in the four league meetings between Celtic and Motherwell, equalling the record low of 1989/90.

★ TOM Boyd has scored just one goal at Celtic Park – and it was for Motherwell in their 2-1 win on March 30, 1991.

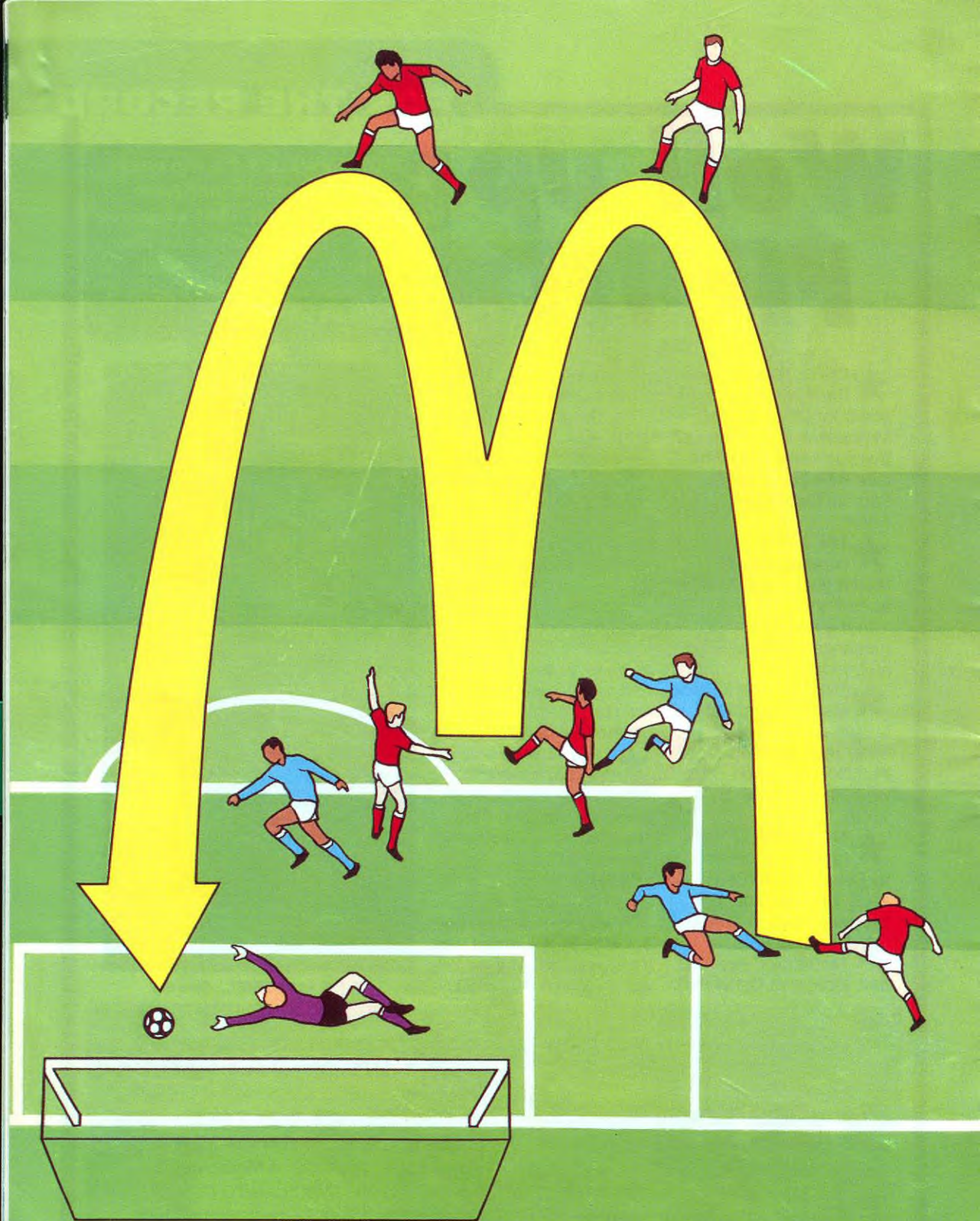

Singing the praises of Celts

WHEN they're not watching Celtic play, brothers Mick and Jim Scanlan from Barlanark are writing and performing songs about their favourite team.

Anyone who is partial to a small pre-match refreshment may have seen their band Charlie and the Bhoys whip up a frenzy in any of the city's traditional Celtic pubs.

Mick, the younger half of the duo, recalls being brought to Celtic Park by his father at the age of six. And after watching Celtic turn over St Mirren 8-2 in a League Cup section match he was hooked for life.

Mick said: "I went through the next nine years never knowing how it felt not to be the champions. Despite others trying to emulate that success, I'm sure that under the present set-up more glory days will come.

"The inspiration for writing Celtic songs such as Inter Milan and Albert Kidd is a direct result of standing among the most passionate and knowledgeable fans in the world."

The Inter Milan number speaks for itself. But Mick explains Albert Kidd. He said: "We wrote the song about the Dundee striker following one of the greatest days in my life.

"Although we beat St Mirren that day back in 1986, Albert Kidd was our player of the year after his two goals against Hearts denied them the league and helped bring the title home to Paradise."

Big brother Jim has his own special poignant Celtic memories. He said: "Johnny Doyle was a good friend of mine and shortly before he died was at my home with Tommy Burns.

"Like all Celtic

supporters I was devastated to learn of his death. It was so sad to lose someone so proud to wear the Hoops."

The story of Doyle's time at Celtic is the focus of Charlie and the Bhoys' new song entitled The Man Who Loved The Green.

Jim said: "There is a generation of fans who were never lucky enough to see the man in action and I hope that we can produce more like him."

One of the musician's happiest times was when he was got the chance to meet his heroes.

Jim explained: "I was touring as a solo vocalist over in Ireland in 1983 when I met the team on a close season tour. I realised at this time that the Celtic players were just the same as the fans - passionate and proud.

"I was even happier when Tommy Burns got the drinks in at a certain hotel in Dundalk!"

JIMMY McGRORY'S much quoted statement that he rated Adam McLean higher than Alan Morton ruffled a few feathers down Ibrox way, and it may be that the venerable Jimmy is revealing a touch of bias.

But the fact that Adam can be mentioned in the same breath as the Wee Blue De'el says a great deal for him.

Certainly, Morton was capped more often, but on the three occasions when Adam played in his normal place on the left wing, Scotland won.

His only losing international was at Hampden against England in 1927 when Adam was on the right wing.

He was born in Greenock in 1899, and joined Celtic in 1917.

With so many men away at

the War, Adam was soon given his chance to play a few games for the unavailable Johnnie Browning and clearly impressed by his dribbling skills and accurate crossing.

Browning was a hard man to displace however, and it was not until halfway through season 1918/19 that McLean claimed a regular place.

Soldiers returning from the conflict would be delighted to see the superb wing play of Celtic as they won the championship that season.

It was hardly surprising with Andy McAtee on one wing, Adam McLean on the other and Patsy Gallagher and Jimmy

McMenemy between them.

Adam however was not a showy player, and this was perhaps why he lost out to the more flamboyant Alan Morton.

He was very business like and efficient, had a turn of pace and was better than most at getting to the dead ball line and crossing.

The league was won in a thrilling finale at his native Greenock in 1922, and then for a spell Adam was tried at the inside left position.

Tommy McNally, with whom Adam had developed a great understanding, had gone to Third Lanark, and Paddy Connolly was pressing his claim

for the left wing spot.

McLean's move to inside left was not a total success, and may just have cost him a few international caps, but it was good enough to land the Scottish Cup in 1923.

Adam's finest hour was yet to come in a Celtic jersey however.

It would be in spring 1925 when he scored twice in the famous 5-0 victory over Rangers in the semi-final, but still could not displace Morton from the Scotland squad a fortnight later.

He also played in the Patsy Gallagher Scottish Cup final of that year.

The year 1926 showed everyone how much McLean was a part of Celtic.

The league was won comfortably with McLean an ever-present until the latter part of the season when he began to pick up a few knocks.

These injuries, sustained in part at least from the brutal tackling of defenders, ruled him out of the Scottish Cup final against St Mirren that year.

His absence was significant, for Celtic lost.

By this time, his old partner Tommy McNally was back to form a mighty left wing.

They complemented each

other, for McNally was brilliant, yet irrational and unstable whereas McLean was the very soul of reliability, frequently calming down the hot headed Tommy.

Another Scottish Cup medal was won in 1927, but 1928 saw trouble.

In the wake of the 4-0 defeat from Rangers in the cup final, the normally placid McLean found himself in dispute with the club.

The cause was a dignified protest about terms for a projected tour of the USA but the paranoid Maley saw it as a personal attack, and the left wing pair of McNally and McLean were off to Sunderland.

The supporters were baffled about all this.

McNally's temperament did indeed make him difficult on occasion, but McLean?

In the event everyone lost, for McLean spent only two years at Sunderland before returning to play for Aberdeen (with some success).

He had apparently always cherished a soft spot for Partick Thistle and became their trainer in 1938 and assistant manager in 1962.

His death in 1973 was a cause of much sadness for the older supporters.

They remembered his fine play and contribution to the club, but also his gentlemanly demeanour and shy, almost diffident appearance.

He was a much loved and grossly under-rated old Celt.
