Today's game against Parma is a tough one on two counts.

It's tough because, like all Serie A teams, Parma know how to play good football and the fact they managed runners-up spot in their league last year speaks volumes about their quality.

The timing of it also makes it difficult, this afternoon's match sandwiched by our crucial UEFA Cup games against Inter CableTel.

We can go into both today's friendly and Tuesday's return leg against CableTel in good heart after our 3-0 win in Cardiff on Wednesday.

The beauty of the victory was that we scored at the right moments - early on and just before half-time.

In the second half we maybe tired a bit and our performance in the last half-hour was possibly flat. They had many men in the centre of the park and it was our game plan to play the ball out through the flanks but we didn't do it often enough.

We were perhaps more defensive than we should have been - you do not create chances at the back.

should have played at the same pace after the interval. But as a start to our competitive season the result was the one we wanted and I am now looking forward to my first home match in charge.

Celtic Park is a great stadium and I can't wait to soak up the atmosphere created by 40,000 of our fans. The support in Cardiff was lovely.

Although the result is not important today, we will be looking to win - just as we will be out to claim victory every time we play.

It would be pleasing to score a win in my first home match and I am hopeful that we will have many good victories to celebrate here in my time at the club.

My ambition is to put Celtic back among the feared sides in Europe. In that respect, Parma's visit might just give us a hint of what is required to do that.

Palmeiras.

It is Parma,
however, that
have really
benefited from
the injection of
money, having
gone from
strength to
strength in the time
that Parmalat have
been associated with
them.

Indeed, though their
year of formation is
credited as 1913, it is
the financial revolution
of 10 years ago that
has made them what
they are today – one of
Europe's most
formidable clubs.

In the 1990s they
have captured the
Coppa Italia
(Italian
Cup),
UEFA
Cup
and Cup
Winners' Cup.

The prized
Scudetto (Serie A
title trophy) has,
however, eluded
them so far.

But when you
remember that
they have been in
the premier Italian
league for only
10 years, it's not
too much of a

disgrace just to have
finished second last
year!

And that second
place has guaranteed
them entry into the
Champions League
qualifying round.

They look a sure-fire
bet to get to the
league for real –
playing the winner of
Widzew Lodz, of
Poland, v Neftchi Baku,
of Azerbaijan tie.

And you wouldn't
wager too much
against them not
picking up the
European Cup to
complete a hat-trick of
European
trophies.

Parma haven't
been too busy
on the
transfer
front during
the summer
but have
signed a few
new names
in the close
season,
midfielder
Giunti from
Perugia,
Brazilian striker
Adailton from
Guarani who set a
scoring record at
the recent World
Cup youth finals,

Parma owe it all to the dairy king

netting six goals in one match against South Korea. Not surprisingly, he finished top scorer with 10.

Three players were picked up from relegated Verona – keeper Matteo Guardalben, striker Filippo Maniero and midfielder Pierluigi Orlandini.

Orlandini began his career at Lecce in 1992 and has since had spells at Atalanta and Inter. He has been capped at youth level for Italy.

It looked as though Roberto Baggio was about to sign, but coach Carlo Ancelotti – the former AC Milan and Italy star in his own right – reckoned the Italian ace would upset the pattern of his team and the deal came to nothing.

They still have a fearsome line-up however, the stand-out players being young defender Fabio Cannavaro who has recently burst on to the international side and marked Alan Shearer out of the game when England played Italy at Wembley.

Cannavaro started his career with Napoli before joining Parma in 1995.

Despite the loss last term of Zola to Chelsea, strikers Enrico Chiesa and Hernan Crespo from Argentina have formed a formidable partnership.

Crespo joined Parma from River Plate of Argentina in a £2.6million deal in 1996. He's a natural opportunist and a fantastic finisher who

is in Argentina's national side.

Chiesa cost a staggering £10million when Parma bought him from Sampdoria where he had come through the ranks, before going to Modenan and Cremonese, then returning to Samp.

And as they do the work up front, Frenchman Lilian Thuram keeps the shop shut at the back with Cannavaro, and was

last year's Serie A player of the year.

Thuram was born in the West Indies and moved to France as a youngster, where Monaco spotted him at Fontainebleau youth team. He has been capped by France and cost Parma £4.5million.

Ze Maria should occupy one of the full-back positions, the Brazilian having joined Parma in 1996 from Portuguesa.

And on the right side

of the defence is Antonio Benarrivo who is a pacey full-back, well capable of switching to the left. He joined Parma from Padova in 1991.

In the midfield you'll find Croatian Mario Stanic, who joined Parma from Club Brugge in December last year.

Stanic was capped three times by Yugoslavia before starring for Croatia in Euro '96. Dino Baggio

was a surprise capture by Parma in 1994 when they bought him from Juventus. Before that the lesser known Baggio had spent one season at Inter, and the rest of his time at Torino where he began his career in 1988.

Massimo Crippa is another long-standing Parma player, joining the club in 1993 from Napoli, after spells at Torino, Pavia, Seregno and lower league side Saronno. Crippa has been capped by Italy at all levels.

Pedros is another possibility for the middle of the park, the Frenchman making his name at Nantes and having a brief spell at Marseilles before moving to Italy in January this year.

Fausto Pizzi is in his third spell at Parma. He began his career at Inter in 1981, then had spells at Centese, Vicenza, Parma, back to the San Siro with Inter, back to Parma and then to Napoli.

Argentinian Roberto Nestor Sensini spent five years at Udinese before moving to Parma.

Keeper Gianluigi Buffon was No.2 in the Italian Olympic squad, and is fast establishing himself as No.1 at Parma.

A possible 4-4-2 line-up for Saturday is Buffon; Ze Maria, Thuram, Cannavaro, Benarrivo; Stanic, Dino Baggio, Orlandini, Crippa; Chiesa, Crespo.

Then came SV Veere who fielded two different teams in each half but Celtic still managed to hit the high spots by bagging eight and keeping another clean sheet.

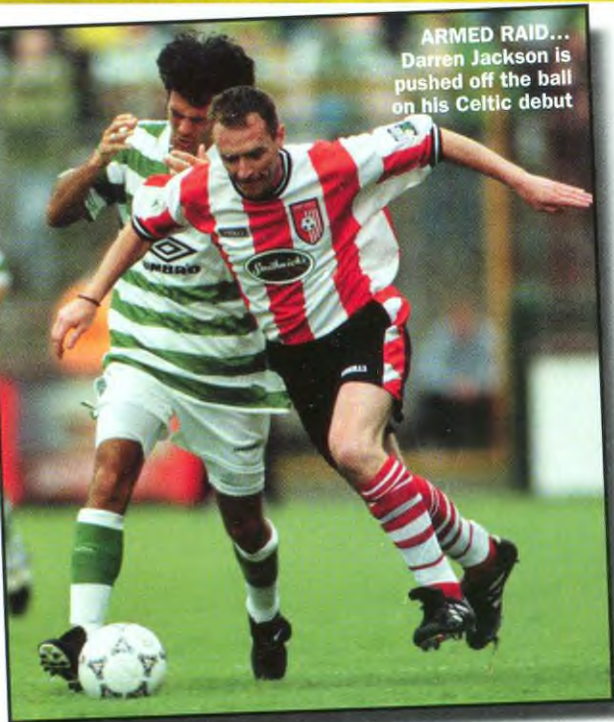
However, there was a set-back with a 3-0 defeat at the hands of FC Groningen before the Celts flew home.

priority and a strong centre player and a striker would not go amiss."

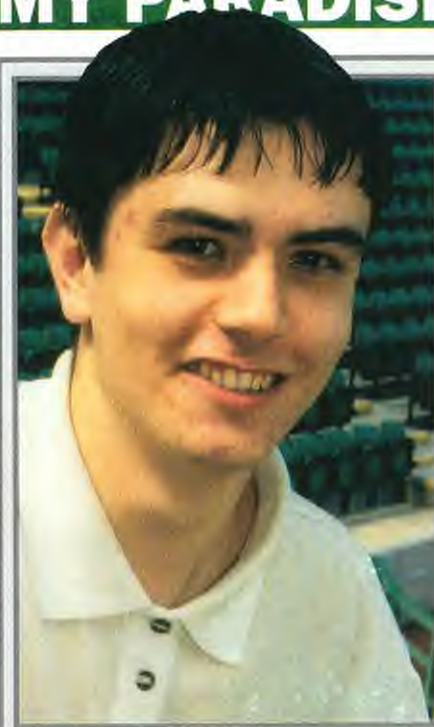
Gerry has other ideas. He said: "I'm happy with the centre of defence as far as Alan Stubbs goes anyway.

Keepers... all Celtic

Who'd be a keeper? Or for that matter, who would write about them? Well, **DAVID W POTTER** certainly would.

The Celtic historian is back in the programme frame again this season with a new series concentrating on "The Outlandish and the Outstanding".

In today's match programme he features the men who played between the sticks for Celtic.

It is often said that you have to be daft to be a goalkeeper, and Celtic in particular have enjoyed a remarkably colourful relationship with theirs, almost all of them being personalities and cult figures.

There is, for example, John Thomson whose remarkable career and untimely death need no further telling.

Charlie Shaw in the 1910s and early 1920s inspired all sorts of legends. Such was the excellence of the players in front of him that Charlie would go home for a cup of tea, would have a game of cards with a member of the crowd or would wander round to the other goalkeeper and ask if he needed any help.

Such stories are, of course,

One let in ELEVEN goals and his name was Duff

apocryphal, but what is not in doubt is that, in the finest compliment ever paid to an opponent, Rangers supporters sang a song about Charlie on the day that Alan Morton eventually put one past him.

During the Second World War and immediately after it came Willie Miller, a fine keeper at a time when Celtic needed one.

John Bonnar saved the day in the 1953 Coronation Cup Final, but then blotted his copybook two years later by fumbling a harmless cross in the 1955 Scottish Cup Final. There was Dick Beattie whose involvement in a bribery

scandal was a sad end to his career – and then came Frank Haffey.

Unfortunately, Frank will always be associated with the 20th century Flodden when Scotland went down 9-3 to England at Wembley in 1961.

The Rangers fans who showed their true colours by gleefully chanting "Haffey! Haffey!" that day tend to forget that both full-backs were Rangers men, and also that Frank the previous year at Hampden saved a penalty from Bobby Charlton.

And then we have the most romantic character of them all,

they're DAFT!

namely Ronnie Simpson. Schoolboy fiction simply has nothing on this one. The son of a Rangers star, he twice won FA Cup medals with Newcastle, came back to Scotland to play for Hibs and was transferred by Jock Stein to Celtic.

Then at the age of 36 he won everything with Celtic including a European Cup medal and a Scottish cap in that Wembley game when Scotland became the first team to beat the World champions.

Publishers, I'm afraid, would reject that as too far fetched.

There have, of course, been less successful goalkeepers. There was once a colourful Welshman by the name of Leigh Richmond Roose.

He had played several times in goal for Wales, and came to Willie Maley's attention when

he restricted Scotland to a 1-0 win at Rugby Park in 1910.

Celtic's keeper, Davy Adams, had pneumonia, and Maley borrowed Roose from Sunderland for the Scottish Cup semi-final against Clyde at Shawfield the following Saturday.

Clyde won 3-1, Roose had a shocker and did something eccentric which earned him a certain amount of notoriety.

Chalmers scored the third for Clyde, and the devastated Celtic fans were amazed to see "Dick" Roose run out and shake the scorer's hand!

It was his only game for Celtic, but his career continued at Sunderland, Huddersfield, Aston Villa and Arsenal.

In the First World War he attained the rank of Lance Corporal, won the Military Medal but died on the Somme

in October 1916.

Another one-gamer for Celtic was Eamon McMahon. An Irishman who played Gaelic Football, he was signed for Celtic in 1953 but could not displace John Bonnar in the excellent team that won the League and Cup double of 1954.

An injury to Bonnar gave McMahon his chance against the strong-going Queen of the South on October 16, 1954.

He was playing well until a mis-hit shot from a Queens' attacker squirmed below his body and into the net, thereby depriving Celtic of a good win.

Eamon never played again for Celtic and disappeared anonymously in the end of the season free transfer list.
