# PROFILE



**THE DREAM TEAM...** Chief scout David Hay has teamed up with Tommy Burns and Billy Stark to bring some of Europe's best players to Celtic Park, including Italian pair Enrico Annoni and Paolo Di Canio



**BACK in the 1960s, Celtic carved a name for themselves in rearing home-grown talent that went on to topple the best in Europe.**

And now the tables have turned as Davie Hay, who joined the club provisionally as a fresh-faced 17-year-old in 1965 and bloomed into a world-class midfielder as part of that ground-breaking policy, is now scouring the continent to bring the best to Celtic from abroad.

In his role as chief scout the Celt has certainly clocked up the air miles since re-joining the club for a second time in July 1994.

So much so that HE doesn't know exactly how far he has travelled in his search for quality players!

He said: "Let's just say that I'm now heading for Gold Membership of British Airways. After starting at Bronze I'm now in Silver and the Gold card isn't all that far away.

"Most of the travel is limited to Europe with the bulk of the countries being covered but we do tend to concentrate on certain nationalities.

"By that I mean that there are key countries where, apart from ability, other aspects come in to consideration.

"Players from particular countries find it easier to settle away from home than others and in this job that can be just as vital to spot as their talents.

"In fact, settling foreign players in Glasgow is probably the most important factors of the job and that can be the final facet of a long-drawn out affair.

"Transfers usually start with a tip-off and we generally follow it on from there when I may travel to assess the player.

"These days of course, most of the recommendations come in video format which is a luxury that wasn't afforded to scouts in the past.

"But if I spot what we are looking for then my report will hopefully be followed up with Tommy Burns or Billy Stark going to see the player in action.

"There are also differences in the

level of assessment required by various players depending on which team or country they play in.

"For instance, in signing Paolo Di Canlo, the pedigree of AC Milan and Italian football is well known so that was a relatively easy decision to make.

"But in the case of Pierre van Hooijdonk, he arrived from NAC Breda in the Netherlands so much more contact and scouting work was involved.

"We basically tend to make a move on a player after studying all the reports and we have an in-depth talks to discuss all the pros and cons.

"That is where Eric Riley and then Fergus McCann come in and everything seems to have worked very well with a lot of care and thought going into each signing."

Hay is currently in his third position at Celtic Park – player, manager and now chief scout – and has all the right credentials for knowing exactly what, and who, is required on the playing staff.

He said: "That certainly helps, not too many people can claim to have been a Celtic player, Celtic manager and then chief scout!

"So basically I know what Tommy is looking for in quality performers for the team and the type of player that will be good for Celtic.

"But the bottom line is that Tommy

always has the final say, there is no way I can take credit for any of the signings.

"It is very much a team effort but Tommy and Billy get their heads together to make the decisions."

So it would seem that the air miles are no flights of fancy as Celtic cover the globe in search of the championship-winning team.

And Hay's farthest flung travels have seen him visit Hong Kong and South Africa where he represented the club on official business.

The scout said: "I was over in Hong Kong as guest of the South China Seas CSC, although it wasn't a scouting trip.

"The same could be said of the flying to visit the Johannesburg CSC, but while there I was able to take in the South Africa/Argentina match although I wasn't specifically there to watch a game – but you never miss out on the opportunity to spot some quality talent."

And the Quiet Assassin proved that his humour can be just as cutting as his famous tackles when he laughed:

"One thing is for sure though, all the good signings will be down to Tommy and the bad ones will be my fault!"

# Jim's Jambos aim to tart up season

HEARTS will be desperate to bounce back today from Tuesday night's disappointing cup exit at the hands of Dundee United and continue the progress they have made under Jim Jefferies.

The Hearts boss (pictured below) is a firm believer in keeping his squad fresh, a fact confirmed by his constant dealings in the transfer market, searching



both the continental and domestic markets for affordable talent.

His efforts have not been in vain as in less than two years he has transformed Hearts from relegation candidates to European hopefuls, taking them to two Cup finals on the way.

The first of the foreign legion to arrive at Tynecastle was French international keeper **GILLES ROUSSET**.

The Frenchman quickly became a hero with the Jambos' fans and his form this season has been even better than last term.

Italian **PASQUALE BRUNO** arrived from Fiorentina one week after Rousset and has played an important part in the development of young defenders **PAUL RITCHIE** and **ALAN MCMANUS**.

Unfortunately for Bruno he appears to have been rather too successful in his teaching as his proteges are now keeping him out of the team.

Jefferies has also bought superbly at home – especially with the capture of **DAVID WEIR**.

The big defender has been sensational since his bargain move from Falkirk in the summer and inevitably this has led to him being linked with a big money move south.

In recent years Hearts would probably have had to consider selling such an asset, but with their upcoming share issue, the Tynecastle side are now turning the corner off the field as well as on it.

One player who

epitomises Hearts' progress is fit-again skipper **GARY LOCKE**.

The Hearts daft 21-year-old can play anywhere in the defence, as well as in midfield and is rated as one of the most promising youngsters in Scotland.

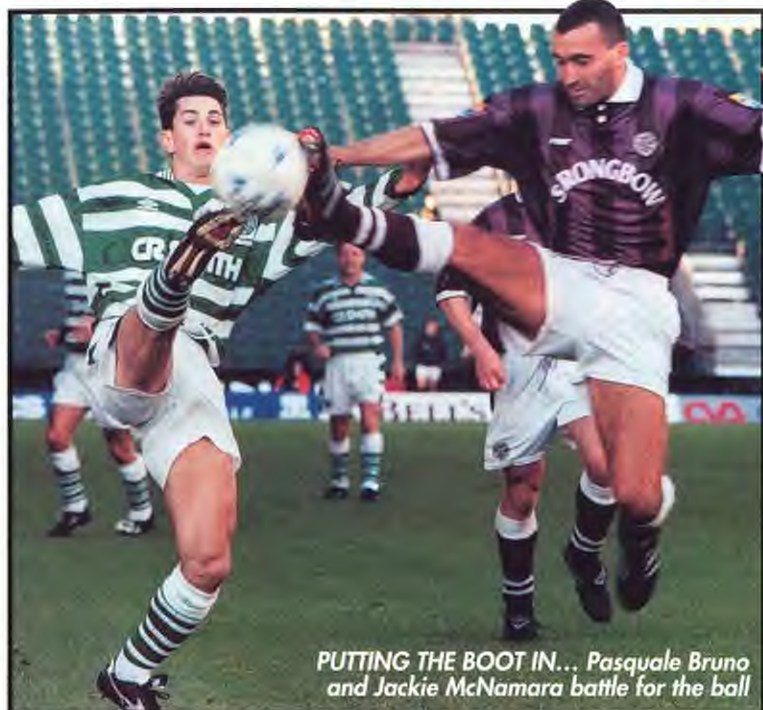
During Locke's absence Hearts were skippered by ex-Ranger **DAVE McPHERSON** and he will be keen to put one over his former Old Firm rivals today.

With **NEIL POINTON** doubtful with a hand injury, Hearts are likely to field 18-year-old left-back **GARY NAYSMITH**,

who has starred for Scotland at both under-18 and under-21 level this season.

When the two sides met in October the standout for Hearts was ex-Milan and Atalanta midfielder **STEFANO SALVATORI**.

Unfortunately the Italian star has been plagued by injury since that match but he has now regained full fitness.

His partner in central midfield will be ex-Celt **STEVE FULTON**, once described by Billy McNeil as the "new Baggio".

Hearts midfield trio is likely to be completed by red-hot winger **NEIL McCANN**.

"Terry" is currently displaying the most

consistent form of his life and if he continues to score quality goals like last week's double against Raith, a Scotland cap surely can't be too far away.

The ex-Dundee winger isn't the only product of the Dens Park youth side currently plying his trade at Tynecastle, in December he was joined by **JIM HAMILTON**.

The big Aberdonian has been a resounding success since signing for just £200,000, in fact Hamilton's partnership with **JOHN ROBERTSON** (pictured middle left) is rated by many fans to be the best at Tynecastle since the days of Robbo and Sandy Clark.

Robertson's form this season has been such that many feel he is due an international recall with his vast experience more than compensating for any loss of pace.

Football is very much a squad game these days and Hearts strength in depth is better than most sides outside the Old Firm.

The Jamba's second string are currently romping to the Premier reserve title and it says much for their squad when experienced internationals such as **STEPHANE PAILLE**, **JEREMY GOSS**, **GARY MACKAY** (pictured bottom left) and Pasquale Bruno can't make the side.

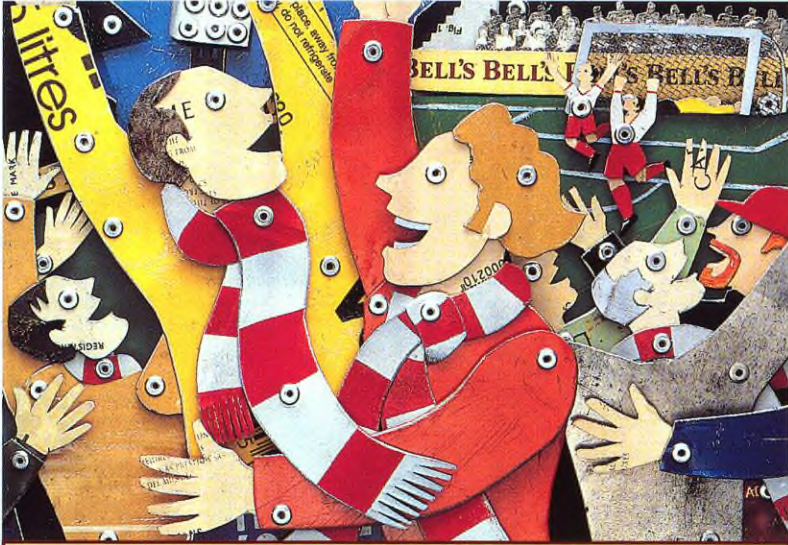

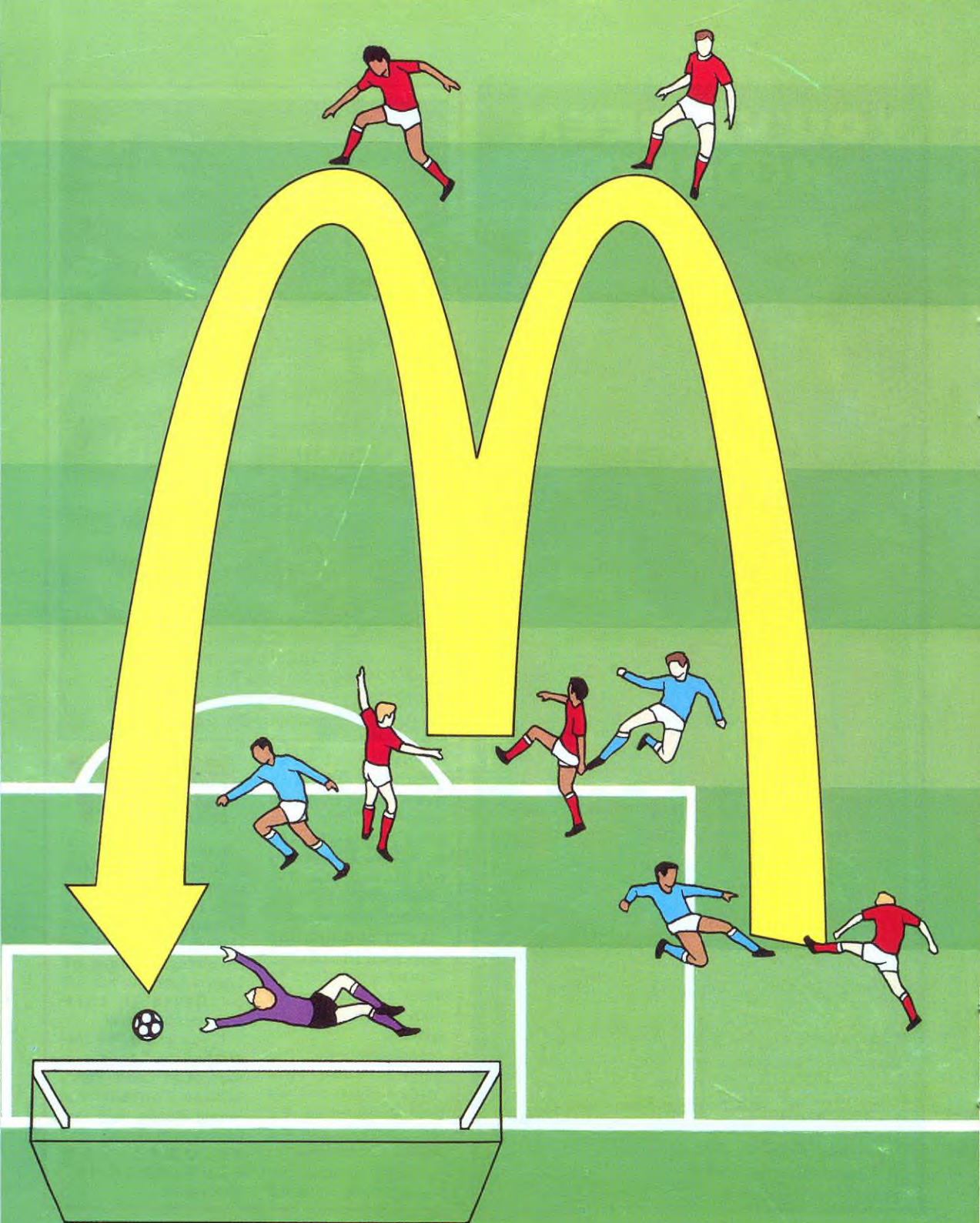

# Brian is the head Bhoy

★ IN the last meeting at Tynecastle in January, Jorge Cadete became the 46th player to score for Celtic against Hearts in the Premier Division.

★ IN the same match Jim Hamilton became the 29th player to score for Hearts against Celtic in the Premier.

★ BRIAN O'NEIL'S header in the last meeting at Celtic Park was Celtic's 400th league goal against Hearts.

★ CELTIC'S victory at Tynecastle in the last meeting took them over the 100 point mark against Hearts in the Premier Division. The only other team they have won as many points against is Hearts' city rivals Hibernian. The Bhoys have won an incredible 127 points against the Easter Road side.

★ JOHN COLQUHOUN is the only player to have played and scored for both Celtic and Hearts in Premier Division meetings between the two sides.

★ HEARTS have won only twice at Celtic Park since 1969. In 1985 they won 1-0 and 1992 they won 2-1. They have of course won three times away to Celtic in the Premier Division, the third one being during Celtic's season at Hampden Park when they won 1-0.

★ HEARTS come to Parkhead this afternoon looking to gain their first away win against the Bhoys under Jim Jefferies. They came close in November's 2-2 draw, but historically the east end of Glasgow has not been a happy hunting ground for the jambos.

★ IN 71 Premier Division meetings, Hearts have only ever beaten Celtic once when the Bhoys opened the scoring.

★ TWO of Celtic's last three league hat-tricks have been scored against Hearts. The most recent was Jorge Cadete against Kilmarnock and the two against Hearts were by John Collins and Tommy Coyne.

★ THE last Hearts player to net a hat-trick against Celtic was Willie Gibson on November 20, 1976. All three goals were scored in the first half, but Celtic still managed to win 4-3 with Ronnie Glavin netting the winner three minutes from time.

★ THE attendance of 50,034 at the last Celtic Park meeting was the biggest crowd to see a league meeting between Celtic and Hearts since the war.

# Sad McAuley

## club but the wrong time

**HISTORY** has been cruel to Pat McAuley. He was simply born at the wrong time to be a member of a truly great Celtic team.

Yet he was, in the opinion of many, one of the best Celtic left-halves of all time. The fact however that the team did not shine in those days meant that an individual, no matter how talented, found it very difficult to attract the rave headlines, and perhaps more importantly, the attention of the Scottish selectors.

McAuley was born in 1921 and signed for Celtic from Douglas Hawthorn Juneniles in 1940. He was given a few

games, then freed, but brought back again in 1942 – this dithering attitude told us quite a lot about Celtic in war time. Football was generally very chaotic in these years, but McAuley, playing at inside right for most of the 1942/43 season, scored 13 goals.

He could make them as well, and the hope was beginning to be expressed that McAuley could be the springboard for an assault on Rangers' war-time supremacy.

This came to a shuddering halt however on New Year's Day 1943 when Celtic went down 8-1 to a good Rangers side, a

result that scarred many supporters, and not even the encouraging news from North Africa and Stalingrad could cheer them up.

The rest of the war years saw more sporadic appearances for McAuley but by 1946 it did seem to be generally agreed that left half was his best position.

It was also accepted that war-time football, with all its uncertainties and vicissitudes of team selection was not the best team for a youngster to start his career.

Peace saw McGrory installed as manager, huge

crowds at Parkhead but the team not functioning as well as everyone expected.

It was an era of mediocrity, but there were one or two bright lights. One

was goalkeeper Willie Miller, deservedly

earning international caps, but another was the visionary play of McAuley.

He was a superb passer of a ball, he had a turn of speed, he could read a game and he could contain opponents. Sadly,

the Celtic forwards of that era were little more than hard-working triers, and the defenders were all too capable of errors.

The result was that the form of the team was little

more than ordinary. In April 1948, they were less than that and had to rescue themselves from the possibility of relegation by beating Dundee at Dens Park.

McAuley however played that day (he had been suspended for a few games previously, which partially at least explained the predicament) and with Evans at right-half, and McAuley at left-half, Celtic eventually did the needful.

There were the odd moments of greatness

such as on the opening day of season 1949/50 when Celtic beat Rangers 3-2 at Parkhead, and McAuley was outstanding. He "sold more dummies to Findlay than are usually bought in a season".

He teamed up well with Charlie Tully, and it was said that Rangers defenders ran away from him rather than risk being made fools of.

But these were isolated successes, and the simple truth was that Celtic would not spend the necessary

money to support McAuley.

It was a matter of some disappointment that he never achieved a full cap. A game for Scottish League against the Irish League at Parkhead on January 14 1948 (a 3-0 victory) was all he got.

It is hard to see why, for the Scottish left-half position in these days was held by another MacAuley (Archie of Arsenal), Redpath of Motherwell or Aitken of East Fife – good, but none as talented as Celts' McAuley. Once

again, he suffered for playing for a mediocre side.

In 1950, the disheartened McAuley was losing his place at Parkhead to Joe Baillie and left for Luton Town. He subsequently played for Kettering Town and Albion Rovers.

In many ways, McAuley is one of the saddest stories in Celtic's long history. When he died in 1970 at the tragically young age of 48, older supporters shook their heads and reminisced about the play of Pat McAuley, who in different circumstances could have been one of the all-time greats.

# DON'T DARE COUNT OUT SCOTS BHOYS

**REPORTS of the death of Scottish talent are, I feel, somewhat exaggerated.**

There is no question that the best players in the country at present, almost without exception, are ALL non-nationals and this does not reflect well on the home grown crop.

However, I'd suggest what we are seeing currently is an augmentation process, rather than one of complete replacement.

Of course the more foreigners we bring in, the fewer Scots will occupy key roles in our top sides.

But you can put that down to the freedom of players' movements in the post-Bosman era as much as any shortcomings in the quality of players coming through.

And Scottish clubs are hardly alone in casting their net overseas – Italy and England have been buying up the cream of the world game for years.

Coming home from last Saturday's game, it was interesting to hear a caller on Radio Clyde's open-line bemoan the influx of continentals into our game and express displeasure at the lack of opportunities for young Scots in the Celtic set-up.

Well, the 1-0 defeat of Motherwell at Fir Park might have been achieved courtesy of a goal from Portuguese striker Jorge Cadete but the contribution of the NINE Scottish players who started in the hoops should not be overlooked.

In Paul McStay, Peter Grant, Stewart Kerr, Simon Donnelly and Malky Mackay, Celts were served by five players that didn't cost them a penny and in the future I'm sure the backbone of the playing staff will continue to be home-grown talent, even if their efforts are likely to be overshadowed by those of the signings from abroad.

Maybe that is an overly optimistic view, but the

troubles at Middlesbrough this season demonstrates that filling your team with star foreigners isn't a sure-fire recipe for success.

The blend must be right and that is where Burns deserves enormous credit.

Youngsters like Donnelly haven't found themselves out in the cold because they are now competing with established internationalists like Andreas Thom for starting places.

The 22-year-old's development has continued at a steady pace and if anything he will become a better player from having worked at close quarters with the foreign players.

Foreigners are viewed as the quick fix, but unless they are given a platform to perform on, to allow them to make the most out of their abilities, their impact can be limited.

*In other words, it takes good Scots to make great imports.*

For Tommy Joyce from Glasgow's south-side claims he was the **FIRST** person to introduce supporters to Celts un-official anthem.

But the field he chose to air the song first was neither in Athenry nor the east end of Glasgow but the unlikely setting of Dortmund in Germany.

Tommy explained: "In 1993 we were drawn against Dortmund in the UEFA Cup. I was determined to go because I'd had such a good time there when we played them in the same competition six years before.

"We arrived at five in the morning on the day of the game and found that thousands of Celtic supporters were already there.

"Amazingly, the Dortmund officials put us up for the night in a gymnasium in the stadium.

"This not only allowed us a place to clean up but it showed that the Germans had appreciated our good behaviour in the previous trip."

All of this was to happen before *A New Celtic Song Was Born*.

Tommy stated: "The city centre in Dortmund was a real carnival that day.

"The authorities set up a huge stage area, a massive PA system and put on a band to entertain the large crowd which was made up of both sets of fans.

"The band invited singers up onto the stage and after we had run through the whole repertoire of traditional Celtic and German tunes I was 'volunteered' for a song.

"I was very nervous about taking the stage as the event was of interest to not only the audience but to the local TV stations.

"My mate suggested that I sing *Putting On The Agony* which is a song about our famous 7-1 victory over Rangers in the League Cup.

"I did eventually sing it but the first choice for me was a song

which I'd heard in Dublin in 1984 called *The Fields of Athenry*.

"The Celtic fans in the crowd joined in at the chorus and it was a brilliant feeling to be singing such a beautiful and poignant song in public."

Tommy felt humbled by the experience and the lyrics penned by Pete St John.

He said: "I believe that this particular song could have been written especially for this club.

"The lyrics about the famine and hardship are synonymous with Celtic and part of the reason this club was formed.

"If ever a song suited a football club like ours, then *The Fields of Athenry* is it."

Tommy, like many other Celtic supporters is grateful to the contribution which Pete St John has made to Celtic, albeit unwittingly.

He said: "I remember reading an article in *The Glasgow Herald* on the day St John performed the song at the park.

"He said he was proud when he heard that the song was being sung at Parkhead and I was delighted that he acknowledged its Celtic roots in that square in Germany."
