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**To put together a run of eight straight league wins required us to be doing the right things.**

But defeats, just like victories, are part of the game and the loss to Rangers last Saturday must be treated as the eight league matches that went before it. It happened, it's over and we must look forward. In football you must always look forward but take into consideration what has gone before.

We must get back to playing the way we did in stringing together the Premier wins, and with three home games inside eight days we begin a crucial spell in the championship this afternoon.

Perhaps a few players who haven't been featuring in the starting line-up will be given a chance this afternoon.

It is obviously difficult for members of the squad who haven't been first-team regulars and I understand their disappointment at not being involved. But I must pay tribute to the true

professionalism of those who have been on the fringes in recent months.

The have understood that successful football sides are about far more than 11 players and have been doing all they can to help those who are in possession of starting places. This is a good situation for the club.

We have no thoughts about the visit of Rangers on Wednesday at this moment for all our attentions are fixed on claiming three points today.

It is a surprise to me that Motherwell are at the bottom of the league. They were very tough opponents when we played them in the league at their ground in September and we really had to dig in to fight back from 2-1 down to win 3-2.

Our Coca-Cola Cup match a couple of days earlier was just as tight and I expect just as close a game today.

It was the Premier win over Motherwell that really set us up on a good run and we will be looking for that to be the way of it again.

# One Eck of a



**I**f Motherwell had a point for every one of the hellish problems that have hit them full on, they'd be skooshing this year's championship.

Yeah, yeah, every team could rhyme off a hundred sob stories to explain away why times are so hard for them, but Motherwell's hold more weight than most.

You could be forgiven for thinking that Alex McLeish has been walking under ladders on his way to work these past couple of years, such is the bad luck that has dogged the team he has managed since 1994.

Presently, they are under more of a cloud than ever, propping up the other nine sides in the division and without a victory since they triumphed at Pittodrie in August 28 – all of 10 matches ago.

A return of only eight league points from 12 games is miserable – but the club's injury problems in the past couple of months deserve to be similarly labelled.

They probably will find themselves down to the bare

bones of a first-team squad again today and have to do without HALF a senior side.

You can only feel sorry for McLeish with the Fir Park outfit better than

their form and position in the league would suggest.

Consider the list of unavailables for this afternoon's trip:

- Playmaker **BILLY DAVIES**, who damaged knee ligaments in the 1-0 defeat by Kilmarnock a week ago and appears set to be

sidelined for a month.

- Former Celt **WILLIE FALCONER**, isn't scheduled to return to action for another couple of weeks after breaking his ankle last month.

- Striking stalwart **DOUGIE ARNOTT**, always good for goal, except in the last year or so, when the 36-year-old hasn't featured as the result of a long-term injury.

- New French face, **ERIC GARCIN**, a 32-year-old cultured playmaker signed from Toulouse who is recovering from a hamstring pull.

- Defensive rock **BRIAN MARTIN**, at the age of 34-years-old as important as ever to the Motherwell backline but banned for the Celtic Park encounter.

- Centre-back **GREG DENHAM**, who was red-carded the last time his team met Celtic and who will find himself sitting-out their attempt to gain revenge for that 3-2 defeat as a result of suspension.

- The biggest missing star of all will be the irrepressible **TOMMY COYNE**, still cutting the mustard despite having turned 35 yesterday.

This week however he is on international duty with the Republic of Ireland, preparing for their World Cup play-off with Belgium.

Coyne is the Lanarkshire side's top scorer with seven goals, two of these coming against Celtic in the five-goal thriller in September – and how Well will wish he was in claret and amber today.

All would the above could have laid a claim to a place in Motherwell's starting line-up. Indeed, the injury

He will be depending on a mightily young defence to prevent that happening today with 21-year-olds **KEVIN CHRISTIE**, **STEPHEN McMILLAN** and **STEPHEN CRAIGAN** pressed into action alongside old head **JOHN PHILLIBEN**. They are being forced to grow-up quickly simply because McLeish has so few options.

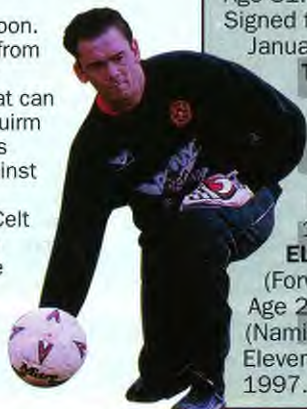

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# The Bhoys have done 'Well



Craig Burley got two against Well

- Motherwell have failed to score in their past three league visits to Celtic Park. The last time this happened was in 1982/83 when they lost five games without scoring.
- Craig Burley became the 33rd player to score for Celts against Motherwell in the Premier Division when he netted two in Celtic's 3-2 win at Fir Park earlier this season.
- Tommy Coyne's two goals in the above match put him third in Motherwell's list of top goalscorers against Celtic in the Premier Division with five goals, behind Steve Kirk (seven) and Dougie Arnott (eight).
- The five goals scored in the first month of the season, was the most netted in a game at Fir Park between Celtic and Motherwell since September 13, 1982 when Celtic won 7-0.
- Celtic have won their last two matches at Fir Park. The last time they achieved this previously was during the centenary season of 1987/88 when they won 2-0 and 1-0.

- Jorge Cadete scored Celtic's 1,500th Premier Division goal when Motherwell last visited Celtic Park on January 4, 1997 when the Bhoys won 5-0.
- The last hat-trick scored in a league meeting between Celtic and Motherwell was netted by Charlie Nicholas on September 15, 1982 in the aforementioned 7-0 win.
- Last season Celtic scored eight goals in the four league meetings with Motherwell. The most they have netted since 1991/92. Their highest ever total is 14 scored in 1932/33.
- On the evening of April 15, 1916 Celtic beat Motherwell 3-1 at Fir Park. Nothing strange in that you might say but that afternoon they also defeated Raith Rovers 6-0 at Celtic Park. Both games were played on the same day due to a fixture congestion. That season Celtic were not only champions but they also scored a club record of 116 league goals.

# THE OUTLANDISH AND OUTSTANDING

There always has been the black side of football. Passions run so high that violence is never too far away from the surface.

Highly motivated players, too highly perhaps can allow their emotions to rule their brains, and find themselves on the receiving end of a red card and the long lonely trudge to the dressing room to explain themselves to managers and practice apologies to team-mates.

Celtic have of course had their moments in this respect, the same as every club. The weirdest however must surely be that of Tony Cascarino.

Tony had been signed amidst a flurry of trumpets in summer 1991 by Liam Brady as the solution to Celtic's goal scoring problems. He had indeed produced the goods for Millwall, Aston Villa and the Republic of Ireland international team, but the start of the 1991/92 season was a poor one, and Tony, amidst head shakings from The Jungle, just could not find the net.

He soon lost his place in the starting line-up and on October 5 for the game against Hearts at Celtic Park, was on the bench.

However in the second half with Celtic 2-1 up, Tony was brought on. Two minutes later, he scored to heartfelt relief all round the ground, and all the cruel sexual jokes about Tony not being able to score had to stop.

But then, five minutes later, Tony was back defending as Hearts piled on the pressure. Inside the penalty area in full view of the officials, he "clashed" (as the newspapers euphemistically put it) with an opponent, was sent off and conceded a penalty as well!

As he reached the dressing room, he may well have heard a huge cheer. Pat Bonner had saved the penalty!

Hardly surprisingly, Old Firm, matches with their intense passion, have had a few sendings off. As early as 1905 Jimmy Quinn's wrongful dismissal (for which he won his

legal case) led to a crowd invasion and the abandonment of the game, and in October 1987, a similar thing seemed likely to happen at Ibrox, leading to several players being charged in court for "conduct likely to provoke a breach of the peace".

Peter Grant however must have the record for the mildest offence leading to a sending off. On March 17 1991 in the Scottish Cup, Peter viciously, violently and with clear evil intent... broke too early from the wall at a Rangers free kick!

However, three Rangers were sent off for far less trivial things, and the game finished 2-0 for Celtic, or 10-8 in terms of players. A week later in a league game, Scott Nisbet was also sent off, throwing a lovely tantrum as he went.

On May 21 1979 a mere 10 men won the league when the late Johnny Doyle was sent packing early in the second half, but the team went on to win 4-2 in an epic game.

In the League Cup final of 1986,

following a much-disputed penalty awarded by David Syme, whose sympathies became a matter of much speculation, Maurice Johnston was sent off. Devoutly, he crossed himself as he went, something that he did not seem to do so often in later years. Tony Shepherd was also sent off, but Syme admitted that he had made a mistake and Tony stayed on.

Bertie Auld once did that too. In that dreadful game in Uruguay



in 1967/68 to decide the World Championship, four Celts were sent off, including Bertie who apparently did not understand Spanish all that well and misunderstanding the referee, stayed on. Bobby Lennox was also sent off for an offence that nobody, including Lennox, seemed to know anything about.

A lingering sense of injustice still hangs over the 1984 Scottish Cup final, in particular the sending off of Roy Aitken. Celtic were a goal down to a strong Aberdeen side.

Video evidence will prove at least two and possibly three things wrong with the Eric Black goal, and will also show the role of Gordon Strachan in the dismissal.

He quite clearly tells McGhee to stay down, following the Aitken tackle, and then incites Bob Valentine to send Aitken off.

Our feelings were not assuaged by McGhee's total and immediate recovery, and even when he joined Celtic the following year, this incident remained an obstacle to his total acceptance. Ironically, 11 years later Aitken became manager of Aberdeen!

There were seldom any half measures with Jimmy Johnstone. He did suffer from the "red mist" on several occasions, notably on New Year's Day at Ibrox after Theorelf Beck had provoked him beyond endurance by physical and verbal harassment.

But in Jimmy's defence must be recorded the amount of times that he was chopped down by thugs in football jerseys (particularly in European matches) and did not retaliate.

He was particularly singled out by Atletico Madrid in April 1974 when the Spaniards did enough to make their dictator Francisco Franco, erstwhile ally of Hitler and Mussolini, proud!

Legend does have it however that in the tunnel post-match, more than a little vengeance was visited on the errant Hispanics!

A good quiz question would be "Which is the only ground from which Billy McNeill was dismissed?" Fir's Park, Falkirk against East Stirling in November 1963 where Celtic won 5-1. It was a strange one too, no-body seemed to know why.

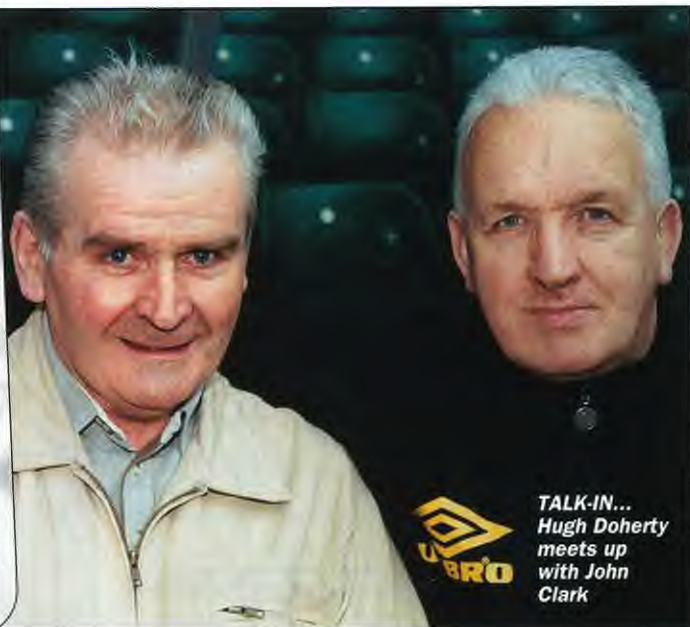

Another great sweeper I had to leave out was the local cleansing man - but he was brushed off the ball too easily and turned out rubbish in the end.



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
