**WE have had some wonderful European evenings here at Celtic Park in recent times but tonight's encounter with Bayern Munich – the champions of Germany – promises to be an occasion to remember.**

There is no doubt that it's a massive game for Celtic. With two matches remaining in this season's UEFA Champions League group stages, our particular section is as closely contested as any of the eight groups.

Only three points separate first from last, with each side still in with a chance of glory. We always felt the group would be tight and that events would unfold in strange and intoxicating ways.

But precious few people, even at this stage, could predict the eventual outcome of the group.

We opened the competition in Munich and played exceptionally well for long periods of the match, even taking the lead, but we eventually lost through two late goals.

We then fought our way back into contention with a splendid performance and victory over Lyon in this very stadium, but unfortunately played below

par in Brussels against Anderlecht. However, we defeated the same opposition in a fabulous night of football a few weeks ago here at Celtic Park.

And so to this evening. Bayern Munich, tonight's opposition, are an exceptional team, full of international star players.

Their recent record in this magical competition bears the closest scrutiny, and they won the UEFA Champions League as recently as 2001.

We don't have to be told that they have the quality of player to hurt any team, home or away, and we know just how dangerous some of their individuals can be. And in Ottmar Hitzfeld, they possess one of the great coaches in world soccer.

Make no mistake, it will take a monumental effort to win this evening, despite our impressive home record.

And on that subject, the record, which can be broken in any given game, has been set by the skill, determination and character of the players. It is not something that we want to give up lightly.

The vocal support you give us on these special nights defies belief. The


understanding and patience shown in recent games gives the players the extra bit of confidence to be able to play their own game.

They, in return, by their own incredible determination, must give you hope that even seemingly impossible tasks are achievable.

All I do know is that both parties, working in unison, form a formidable barrier. Doubtless, all of that will be in abundance this evening.

The atmosphere at both of our previous UEFA Champions League games has been fantastic and has added to the whole occasion. The fact that we have won both of those games only served to make them even more memorable.

Tonight will be another special night and I know everyone will play their part – the players and the supporters – in trying to ensure we achieve our aim of taking three points.

## CELTIC FACTS

- On November 26, 1969, in the European Cup, Celtic surrendered a 3-0 lead from the first leg in the Stadium of Light in Lisbon to Benfica. The tie was decided by the toss of a coin which Celtic won, qualifying to meet Fiorentina in the quarter-finals.

- After a 5-1 thrashing at Parkhead in the European Cup, Red Star Belgrade recovered some pride on November 27, 1968 with a 1-1 draw. 40,000 saw Willie Wallace open the scoring in the 76th minute; with Ostojic replying two minutes before the end.

- Celtic paid a visit to the Nou Camp on November 18, 1964 in the first leg of a Fairs Cup second round tie. Only 25,000 were present to see Barcelona win 3-1, with Celtic playing seven men back in defence. John Hughes was on target for the Hoops.

- Two weeks later, at Parkhead, a surprisingly small turn-out of 43,000 gathered more in hope than expectation. Barcelona gave a very disciplined performance, their defence in particular proving too strong for the Celtic forwards to penetrate. The game finished 0-0.

- Just two days short of a year earlier, the Celtic faithful had experienced a much happier evening at Parkhead, as their heroes beat Dinamo Zagreb 3-0 in a Cup-Winners tie. Steve Chalmers (2) and John Hughes got the vital goals.

In the return in Yugoslavia, Bobby Murdoch put Celtic 4-up on aggregate before Zagreb scored twice to take the game on the night but lost the tie 2-4.

- In a friendly against Amsterdam on December 6, 1989 at Celtic Park, Tommy Burns made his final appearance as a player for the club. In 16 years, he had made 500 appearances and scored 81 goals.



## BAYERN MUNICH FACTS

- FC Bayern Munich was founded in 1900. The home ground- the Olympiastadion- has a capacity of 64,000.

- The Bavarian club had achieved little success before the introduction of the Bundesliga in 1963. Until then, German league competition had been organised on a regional basis, with the local winners playing off for the national title.
- In these competitions, Bayern won one championship, in 1932, and one cup, in 1957.

- This record was not good enough to earn Bayern a place in the inaugural Bundesliga, so they had to fight their way through the promotion play-offs, eventually succeeding in 1965.

- Only a year later, Bayern won the German Cup by beating MSV Duisberg 4-2 in the final; that qualified the club for a place in the following season's European Cup-Winners' Cup, where they went all the way, beating Rangers 1-0 in the final.

- In the ensuing 10 years, Bayern stamped their authority on the European scene. The team had excellent players in every position with stars like goalkeeper Sepp Maier, midfielders Franz Beckenbauer and Paul Breitner plus striker Gerd Muller adding that extra bit of class.

- During these years, Bayern won the European Cup in 1974, 1975 and 1976; and also the World Club Cup in 1976.

- With Beckenbauer back as coach, Bayern won the UEFA Cup in 1996, becoming one of only four clubs- the others being Ajax, Barcelona and Juventus- to have won all the three major European club trophies.
