# Cash course in Euro studies

**RANGERS** have thought nothing in recent years of spending the sort of money on one player that most Scottish clubs would spend on their whole squad.

This summer, however, the Ibrox squad have surpassed even their own standards, splashing out on a galaxy of new stars for their bid to make a real impact in Europe.

After nine years at the top in Scotland, chairman David Murray clearly wanted more and

released phenomenal amounts of money to boss Walter Smith.

So the spending started and in came a host of big name buys like Italians Marco Negri, Lorenzo Amoroso and Sergio Porrini. A shrewd bit of business saw another Italian, midfielder **RINO GATTUSO** join the club for free, and he has already shown great potential in the middle of the park.

Everyone knows who striker **MARCO NEGRI** (far right) is after his five-goal blast against Dundee United in Rangers' last league fixture. He single-handedly

destroyed the Tannadice side and showed that, despite a poor performance in the Gothenburg match the previous midweek, he has a lot to offer in front of goal.

Defenders **PORRINI** and **AMORUSO** have had different starts to the season, Porrini being fit to play, and Amoroso out injured since his arrival in Scotland. That is a major blow for the side, who saw the Italian as a replacement for inspirational skipper Richard Gough who left at the end of the term.

Porrini should have no problems winning over the Rangers fans, his class shown by the tally of over 200 appearances made for AC Milan and Juventus in the Italian Serie A, being no mean feat.

**ALEX CLELAND** has been playing well so far this term at full-back and he's pretty much

the only Scot at the back of the park for Rangers. Swede **JOACHIM BJORKLUND** is in his second season with the club, and he has been joined by fellow Scandinavian **STAALE STENSAAS**. The big Norwegian was brought to Ibrox as a replacement for left-back David Robertson who headed south to Leeds. He cost a mere £1.75million, and is reported to be delighted to be playing his football in Scotland.



He is bound to be a help for Rangers in Europe having gained huge experience in the Champions League with his former club Rosenborg who had a great run in the competition last term.

Behind the multinational defence, should be a Scot no-one at Celtic Park doesn't know all about.

The irrepressible **ANDY GORAM** has denied the Bhoys on many occasions with some wonderful goalkeeping. But the former cricketer has found himself on a bit of a sticky wicket in recent weeks, with some uncharacteristic below par performances.

Competing for his place then are Dutchman **THEO SNELDERS** who has found it hard to make an impression since joining Rangers in March 1996, and Finn **ANTTI NIEMI**. Niemi has impressed so far, but broke a finger recently, allowing Goram some grace.

Rangers' midfield contains two of their most highly-rated players, **PAUL GASCOIGNE** and new signing, Swedish ace **JONAS**

**TERN**. Gazza needs no introduction to anyone, so we'll talk about Thern. The Swede made use of the Bosman ruling to arrive at Rangers free of charge and helped along by Joachim Bjorklund he chose the Ibrox men over Fiorentina, Bologna, Parma and Internazionale. He has already shown his class and will be one to watch tonight for sure.

**CHARLIE MILLER** may feel a little outdone in the middle of all this, the young Scot certainly in the minority age-wise and nationality-wise, but he has put in some good games and is always difficult to play against.

German **JORG ALBERTZ** is a strong midfielder, who perhaps lacks

that little extra bit of fight, but he can do a job.

**STUART McCALL** is the midfield engine, but he has been missing this term because of serious injury problems however he may feature at some point tonight.

So we've reached the front third of the pitch, and some of the talent on show here isn't bad. Of course there is Negri who looks like being a new hero, but then there are two of the biggest heroes of the Rangers' fans, **ALLY MCCOIST**, who showed he won't be pushed

out that easily by scoring a hat-trick in Rangers Coca-Cola Cup win over Falkirk recently and Dane **BRIAN LAUDRUP**.

Laudrup has been missed, the unfortunate star picking up a dose of chicken pox of all things, and missing out of the Champions League qualifiers.

But he could be back tonight. On his game, Laudrup can cause even the best defenders problems with his quick thinking and skill.

So, as Celtic pulled off a great win, Celtic Pools proved it makes great winners!

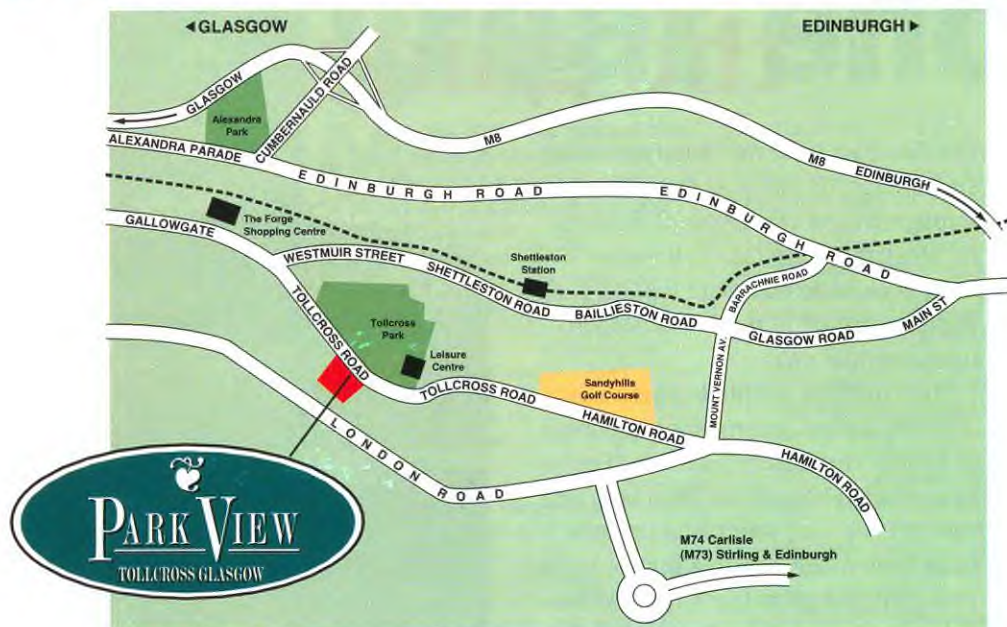

# MacLeod's late great show

**M**urdo MacLeod scored five goals in his career for Celtic against Rangers, and each of them ended up being the last goal of the match.

The games were: 1978/79 4-2 Celtic Park, 1981/82 2-0 Ibrox, 1981/82 3-3 Celtic Park, 1982/83 3-2 Celtic Park, and 1985/86 4-4 Ibrox.

The last time a team came from behind to win an Old Firm league match was on October 30, 1993 when Celtic won 2-1 at Ibrox.

Brian O'Neil headed a last minute winner in Lou Macari's first match in charge.

The last time Rangers came from behind to win an Old Firm league match was on January 3, 1989 at Ibrox when they won 4-1.

They have only ever achieved this once at Celtic Park in the Premier Division, on August 23, 1980 when they won 2-1 thanks to a last minute Alex Miller goal. In the last 14 Old Firm league matches Rangers' all-time leading scorer against Celtic, Ally McCoist, has scored just one goal. That came in the 3-3 draw at Ibrox

on November 19, 1995.

Celtic's loss to Dunfermline two weeks ago was the first league defeat at Celtic Park by a team other than Rangers since March 26, 1994.

Motherwell were the visitors and Dougie Arnott scored the only goal of the game. Rangers victory at Celtic Park in March put them ahead of Celtic in the Premier Division victories by 31 - 30.

It is the first time since 1979/80 that they have been ahead of Celtic.

If Rangers avoid defeat tonight they will equal their longest unbeaten run in Old Firm Premier Division matches of nine games from between 1988 and 1991. Rangers 1-0 win in March was also their fourth clean sheet in a row at Celtic Park, the first time they have ever achieved this.

Last season Celtic scored just one goal in the four Old Firm league meetings equalling their previous low from 1989/90, and they lost all four league matches against Rangers.

It was the first time that this had happened against any team.

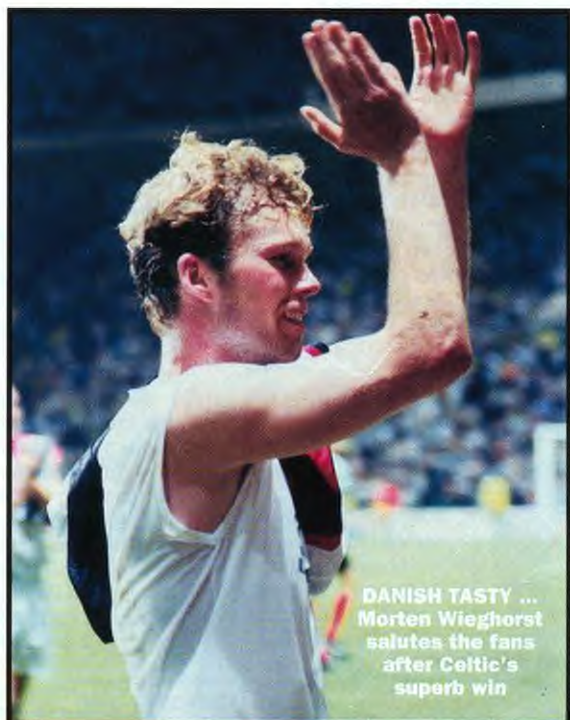

# Auld flame roars back

**I**t would of course be an insult to the ten other men who appeared in Lisbon to say that Bertie Auld was the architect of the triumph.

It is sufficient to say that Bertie was as good as any of that great team which is still the best to have graced Scottish football, and likely to remain so for ever.

Yet Bertie was special. He was the powerhouse in midfield, the creative ball purveyor, the fetch and carry man, the ball winner, the ball distributor... In short, everything a great team needs.

More important even than that was the confidence that he gave to everyone. Jim Craig is right in saying that the team was "gallus"

– that lovely Glaswegian word for being carefree, confident, unafraid and naive all rolled into one. There was no-one more "gallus" than Bertie who started singing "Sure it's a grand old team to play for" as they came along the tunnel that bright May night in 1967 to the obvious discomfiture of the Italians who had seen nothing like this before.

Yet Auld might very easily have vanished without trace from the game. His first spell at Parkhead between 1955 and 1961 was characterised by two things. One was his undoubted talent, and the

other was a cockiness and self-confidence that is so much an essential part of all professional football players' armoury. But Parkhead in the late 1950s was a strange place. Bertie was introduced to the first team as part of the youth policy. But policy was hardly the word, for players were introduced, discarded, brought back in again in a totally confusing manner, such was the haphazard and quixotic way of things in those days. The other problem that Bertie had to cope with was the brooding, dictatorial style of Chairman Bob Kelly.

Mr. Kelly did not take kindly to the cheeky lad from Maryhill who argued with his elders and betters and got himself into trouble with referees on the field.

Being sent off in his international debut against Holland in May 1959 was probably what sealed his Parkhead fate, for it reflected badly on the club – a potent factor in the thinking of Mr Kelly.

It was ironic that Auld was transferred to Birmingham City,

having been out of favour for some time, a matter of days after one of Celtic's saddest results, namely the defeat by Dunfermline Athletic in the 1961 Cup Final.

Auld could have won that game for Celtic, but he had played for less than half of that 1960-61 season.

At Birmingham, he played well, but never attracted enough attention to be recalled to the Scotland team. He did, however, play in the final of the Inter Cities Fairs Cup, now known as the UEFA Cup.

He pined for his native city, but nothing like to the extent that the Celtic fans pined for his return. The unspeakable horrors of 1962 and 1963 might just have been avoided with a flash of what we all knew Bertie Auld had – ability and a touch of the devil.

Desperation, coupled with the persuasive powers of Sean Fallon, eventually persuaded Mr Kelly to relent and Bertie was bought back in January 1965 to the delight of the supporters. The master stroke of teaming him up on the left with Bobby Lennox was actually

McGrory's, but it would be Stein who would refine his role and make him the anchor man of the left part of the field with Bobby Murdoch the counter-balance on the right.

Just over three months after Auld's return, the Scottish Cup was won. Auld scored twice, the second a masterpiece of co-operation with Lennox, and the crowd were reminded of Tully and McNally by his trickery, cheek and confidence. And like McNally of old, the prodigal son had returned. It was now time to indulge ourselves in the fatted calf. Stories began to circulate about him that summer. A supporter arrived late for a game to tell his friend that the friend's wife had been seen with the milkman. "Dinnae bother me wi' trivialities, Pat," came the reply. "Bertie Auld's no' playin the day!"

Even the Umpire at Wimbledon seemed to be getting in on the act when announcing the score as "30 all" - in fact, he was expressing his admiration for 'Bertie Auld'.

There was something about "Ten-thirty" as he was nicknamed that allowed the supporters to identify with him.

Celtic were now a football team on the march. The dreadful days of slave mentality were over. Celtic

were the masters now and Bertie was the one that would give ample evidence of that every Saturday night on the TV screen.

Frequently singled out by opposing supporters, Bertie enjoyed every minute of their booing, as it proved the old adage that hate was primarily fear, somewhat disguised.

He did have his brushes with authority, however, not least with the mighty Stein. Yet Stein was shrewd enough to realise that, as long as Bertie was doing the job (and how!), there was no point in being too heavy handed. Bertie's popularity with the supporters was always high, and there were several times when we were convinced that his glittering career was coming to an end and that he was to be put out to graze in dignity.

Yet he came back - As late as 1970, he played his part in the demolition of Revie's Leeds United, and although he and Tommy Gemmell disgraced themselves on that dreadful American tour of that summer, he still played the following season, including a memorable game at

Dens Park played symbolically as the sun was setting, in which he orchestrated a marvellous 8-1 victory over a team who still possessed a European pedigree.

His final appearance for Celtic was on the first day of May 1971 as the Lisbon Lions took to the field for the last time together when they defeated Clyde 6-1, just one day after he had been given a free transfer. Five days later he signed for Hibs and later went on to coach the Easter Road side before becoming manager of Partick Thistle.

Another spell at Easter Road, this time as manager, followed with Hamilton, Dumbarton and Partick Thistle again, coming under his managerial wing.

"At 2-2 we were all down but the players never gave in and came back in the second half to give us a night which will be talked about over many gallons of beer for years to come."

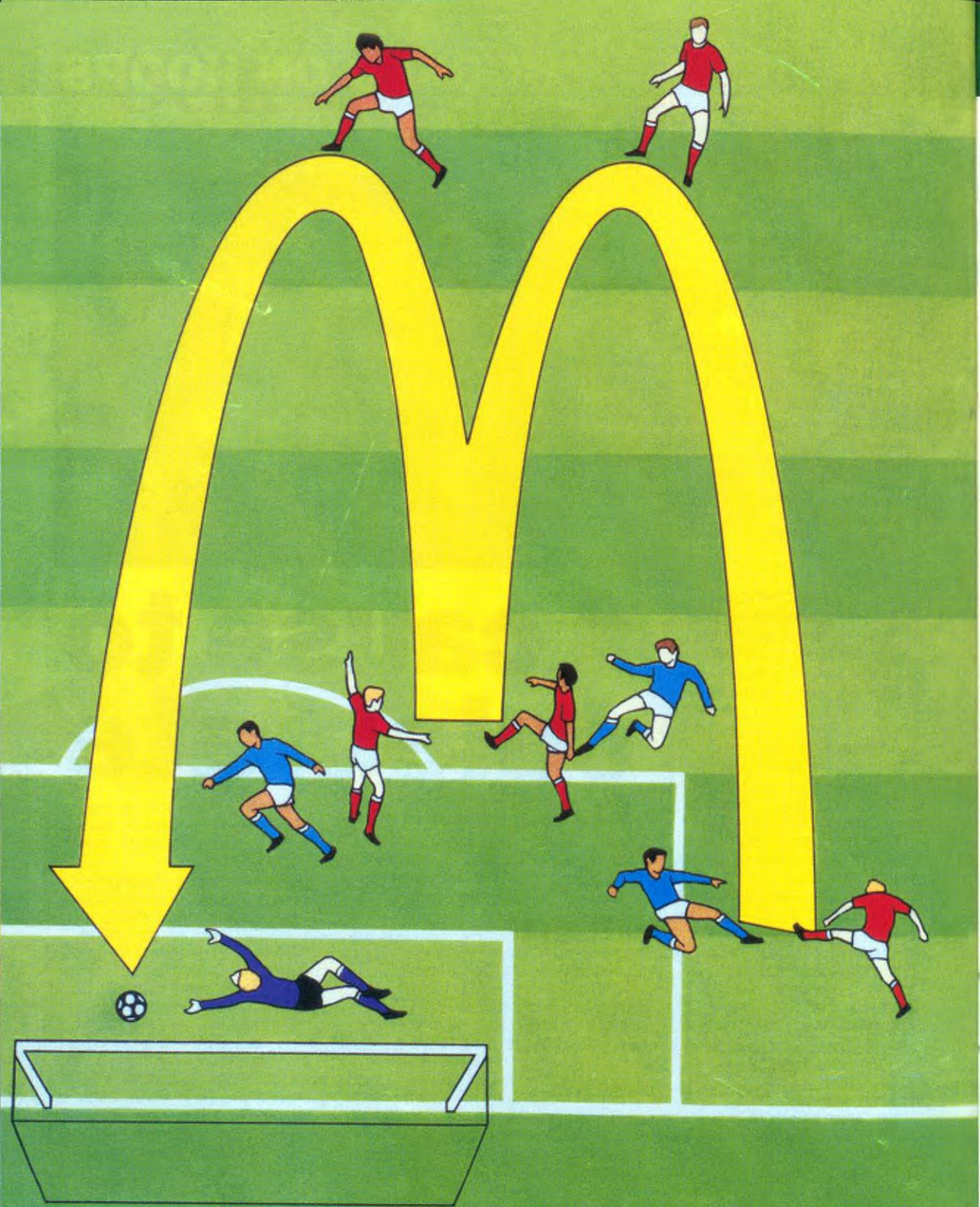

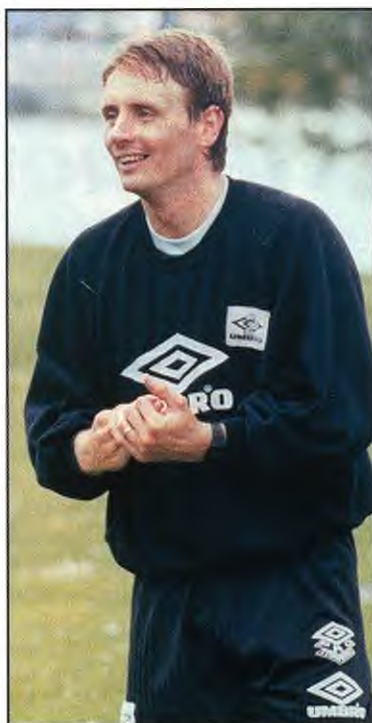

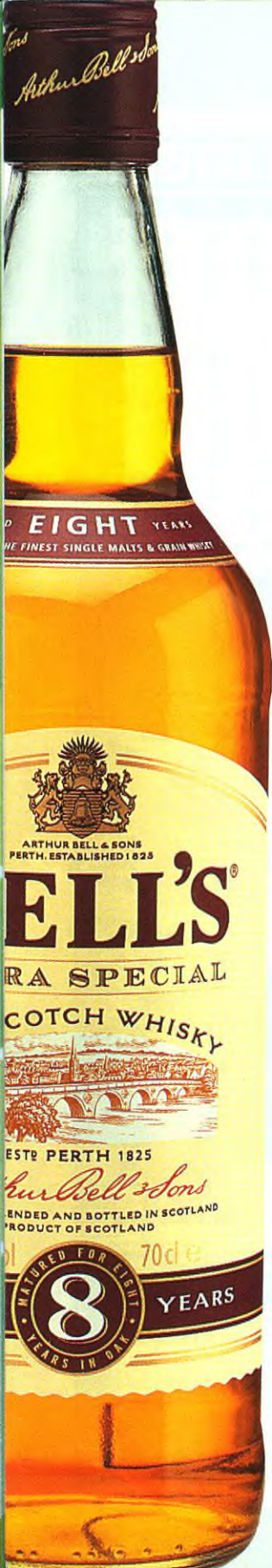
