Aberdeen might not have had the greatest of starts to this term.

But last Saturday at Ibrox they showed they do not lack spirit, coming from behind twice to take a point in an action-packed 3-3 draw with Rangers.

Today they return to Glasgow for the part two of their Old Firm double header, and they will be looking for richer picking than they managed a week ago.

It won't be easy, however, as Aberdeen don't have a great record against Celtic in recent years, and last term they didn't win a single game against the Hoops.

But they will give it their best under the forthright guidance of former Celt Roy Aitken. And one man looking to put on a good show against his old club will be **BRIAN O'NEIL**.

O'Neil was nearly a decade at Celtic and won't want his first trip back here to end in misery. So, he'll be hoping to avoid giving the home side a penalty of a start - his lot at Ibrox.

It was back to the future for Aberdeen in the close season as they gave new starts to a host of old stars.

JIM LEIGHTON was a hero of the Pittodrie fans for many a year and they were delighted when he arrived from Hibernian in the summer.

And at 39 years of age, Leighton shows no signs of hanging up his gloves - or



losing his spark.

Another former Don who returned north was **GARY SMITH**. A year ago he opted to take advantage of the Bosman ruling and sign for French club Rennes.

It wasn't the best time for him, however, and, despite leaving Aberdeen under a cloud, Aitken openly welcomed him back.

The third of the prodigal Pittodrie boys is **EOIN JESS**. He was once the shining light of Scottish football, tipped as the next Kenny Dalglish.

But it went wrong somewhere along the line and he headed to the bright lights of the Premiership with Coventry City last term. They didn't shine for him, though, and he came home.

Before he left for Coventry he had formed a formidable partnership with **PAUL BERNARD** and this midfielder has shown a new side to his play this term, after a disappointing time last season.

In the absence of Russell Anderson, **DAVID ROWSON** is covering as a make shift right-back, and not doing too badly either, getting on the scoresheet in the 3-1 defeat by Motherwell.

JOHN INGLIS didn't seem to be in the picture at all in recent weeks, but he was called back into action last Saturday at Ibrox and netted the crucial equaliser.

In the left-back position, is Bulgarian **TZANKO TZVETANOV**, second of two men from that country to sign for Aberdeen.

The other was **ILIAN KIRIAKOV** who suffered from injury and illness during the season, but could find himself

involved at some point today.

Out on the wing is a man everyone at Celtic knows, **JOE MILLER** (pictured below). Always a threat, Miller is capable of the odd glorious hit, as he proved recently against Stirling Albion.

STEPHEN GLASS had been out through injury for a while this term, and was missed, but he's made a good comeback and will push for a place today.

Up front for Aberdeen, Aitken can choose from a few options, but he shouldn't really make the mistake of leaving **BILLY DODDS** (pictured left) on the bench. He did so at the start of the term in favour of **DEAN WINDASS** and new boy **MIKE NEWELL**, but Windass' lack of form prompted Dodds' call-up to the starting line-up.

Newell is no stranger to the big time, playing for Blackburn Rover and winning himself a Premiership medal into the bargain.

Frenchman **ANTOINE KOMBOUARE** is suffering at the hands of the new defensive signings, and faces a struggle to gain a place in the central defence.

DARREN YOUNG was an 18-year-old going places, but he has been put in the shade slightly by the new faces at the club.

Latest signing is former St Mirren starlet **RICKY GILLIES**, a £500,000 buy from the Love Street club a month ago, who is a skilful goalgrabber.

Appeared as a substitute at Ibrox a week ago and heathly returns will be looked for from the highly-rated youngster once he's fully settled in.

WHAT WAS THE FIRST RECORD YOU EVER BOUGHT?

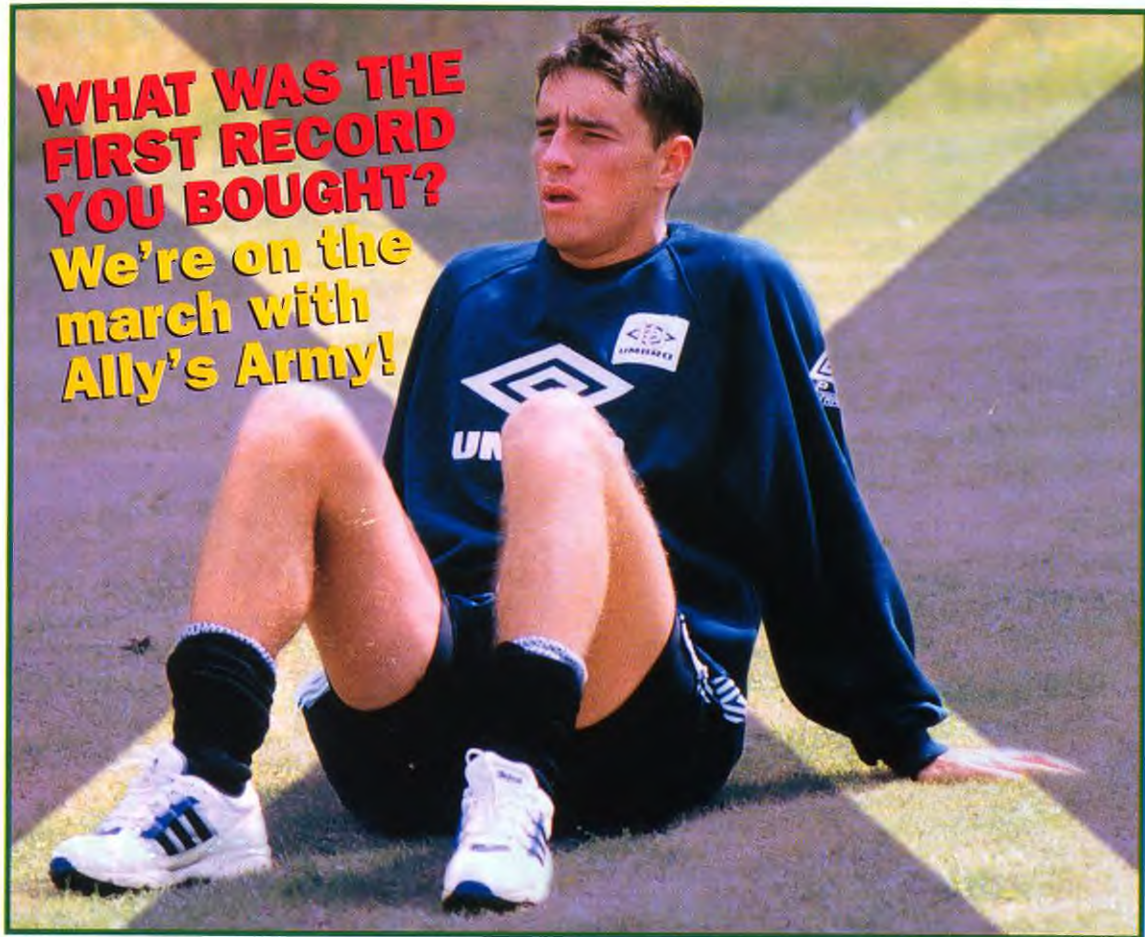

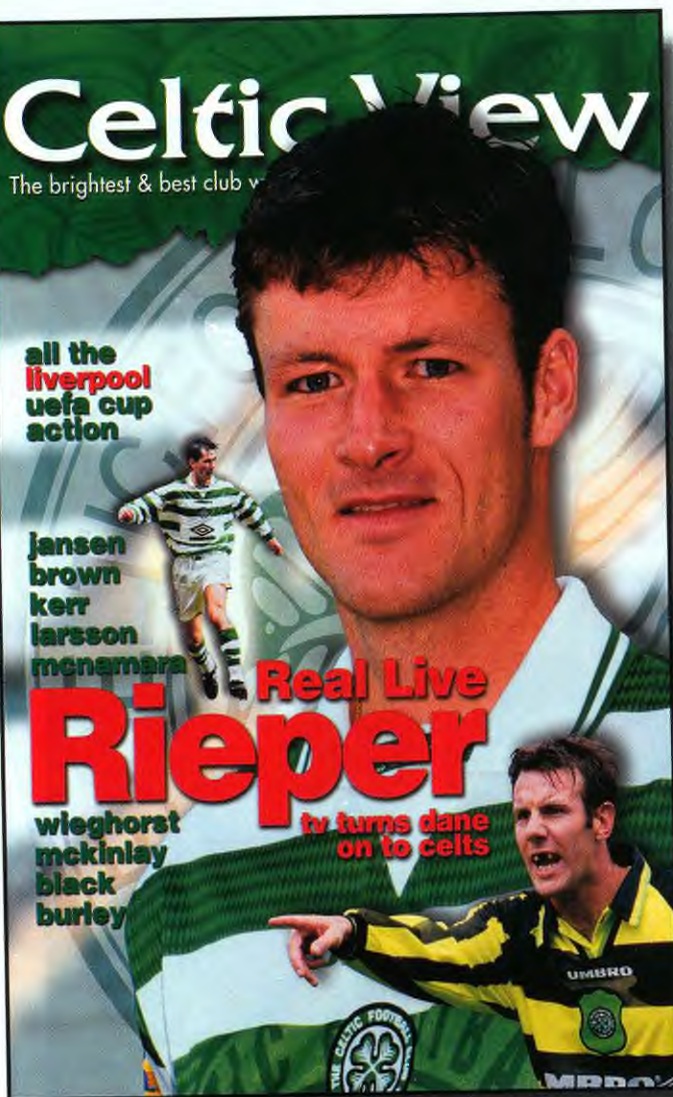

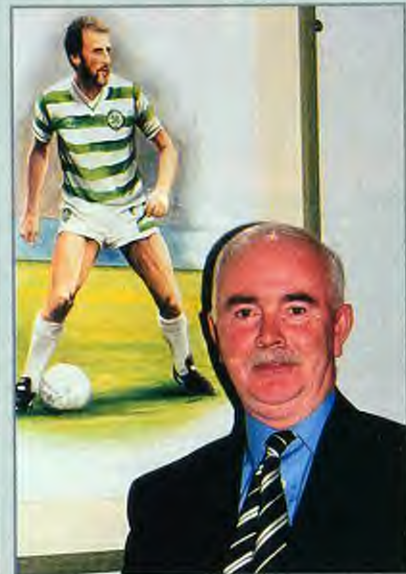
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Matt finish keeps Celts in the picture

If Matt Mannering could have his way, Celtic would never be beaten – and if his chosen team had ever taken the field, they probably never would. Here Kilsyth demolition contractor Matt takes us through his side and explains his choice.

I'm grateful to be given this chance to air my views on the side which I consider would have been the greatest Celtic team of all time.

And I've stuck solely to Celtic players as you have to admit we have produced some fantastic individuals over the years.

In goal I can't see past Ronnie Simpson – he came to Celtic at just the right time and with his old head he really settled the defence.

In Davie Hay at right-back you have a real bulldozer of a player - his sheer power and will to win would instil any team with confidence.

What can you say about Danny McGrain – his all round skill and his ability to link up with Dalglish in particular was a wonder to see.

He had a real never-say-die attitude as was apparent throughout his battles against injuries.

Bobby Murdoch was the most skilful of midfielders – one defence-splitting pass from him could win the game and he could score some great goals.

My captain would be Billy McNeill as he typifies the Celtic spirit – he led by example and

had Celtic first and foremost on his mind.

George Connelly was maybe a bit before his time – he strolled through games the way that Franz Beckenbauer did – I never saw him flustered.

Wee Jimmy Johnstone to my mind was the best Celtic player ever – he could win games on his own and with his devilment was a real favourite with the fans.

Kenny Dalglish was a legend even during his playing career – not only was he a great individual player but he was also a really fantastic team player.

Up front Joe McBride was an

extraordinary striker – he could score with his left or his right and would often end the game with three or four under his belt.

Charlie Nicholas had the potential to be the greatest ever Celt but I felt he left the club just a little too soon – one flash of genius though from him could turn the game.

John Collins is the typical modern player – very firm and skilful.

He's got an educated left foot and is a great reader of a game – his scoring record from midfield speaks for itself.

I'm in no doubt these players could take on the best in the world.

GOALS FLOW FOR PIERRE



● Celtic are currently unbeaten against Aberdeen in the Premier Division for the last eight games – their best run ever.

● Aberdeen have not scored against Celtic on their last five visits to Glasgow to play the Boys. Four games were at Celtic Park, two at Hampden and a Coca-Cola Cup semi-final at Ibrox.

● Celtic have won their last five home league matches with Aberdeen. The last time they achieved this was between 1911/12 and 1921/22 when they were victorious in nine.

● The last player to score for Aberdeen at Celtic Park was Eoin Jess on January 19, 1994 in a 2-2 draw. Jess is in fact

Aberdeen's top scorer against Celtic in the Premier Division with 10 goals.

● Celtic 's top scorer against Aberdeen in the Premier Division is Pierre van Hooijdonk with seven goals in just six games.

The Dutch striker scored in every match he played against the Dons, except one – that was the 3-2 win at Pittodrie in September 1995 when Celtic trailed 2-0 at one time.

● Celtic have won on three of their last four visits to Pittodrie and in each win, the Dons opened the scoring. Before this Celtic went 14 games without victory in Aberdeen, 10 ending in draws.

● Only two players have played and scored for both clubs in

Celtic/Aberdeen Premier Division matches.

They are Joe Miller and Charlie Nicholas.

One player who could join this list today is Brian O'Neil as he scored for Celtic at Pittodrie on November 9, 1993 in a 1-1 draw.

● Celtic's 3-0 win over Aberdeen on their last visit to Celtic Park was the Boys' biggest victory over the Dons in the Premier Division.

The biggest win in all league games was 5-0 on April 1, 1996.

● Jorge Cadete's second goal in the above 3-0 win was Celtic's 200th league goal against Aberdeen.

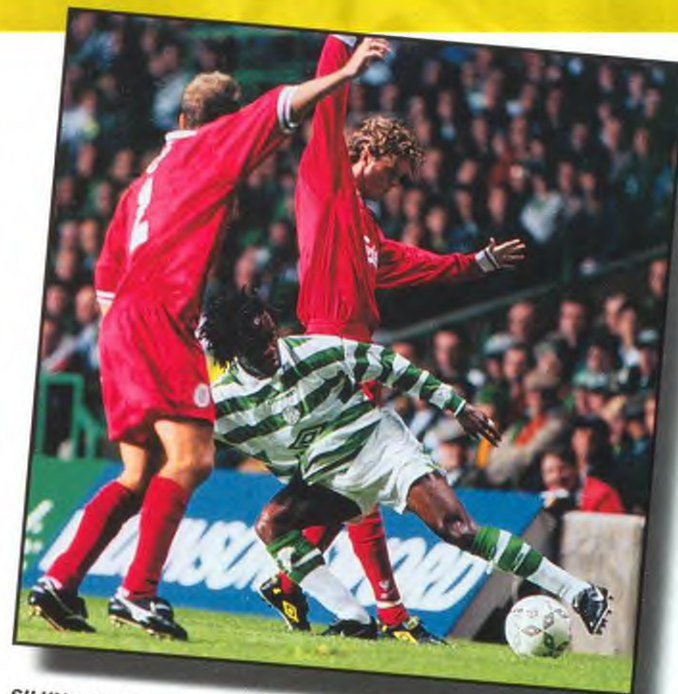

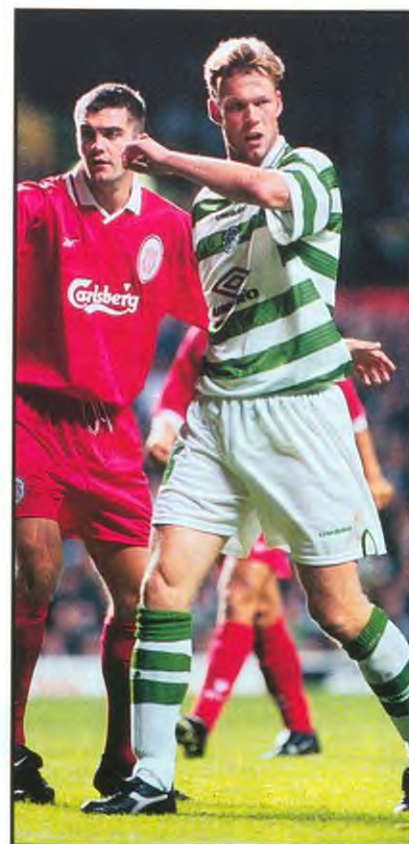

AFTERMATH OF THE RIOT

April 17, 1909 is a day that is infamous in the annals of Scottish football. Celtic and Rangers supporters rioted...

Not against each other as they would do in 1980 and many other occasions, but against the authorities who refused to allow extra time in the replayed Scottish Cup Final.

You see, they suspected there was a fiddle and that yet another big gate would help the already swollen coffers of Celtic, Rangers, Queen's Park (the hosts) and the SFA.

The cup would be withheld but there was still league business to be taken care of.

Dundee had 48 points from 33 games and had only one game to go, whereas Celtic, on the morning after the riot, had 39 points from 26 games.

Monday, April 19 saw Celtic at Tynecastle for a tea-time kick off, and then captain Hay and manager Maley had to return to Glasgow for the SFA enquiry into the disgraceful scenes at Hampden on Saturday.

They did so with a smile, for Celtic had just beaten Hearts 2-1 in front of a 12,000 crowd, without the injured Sunny Jim Young.

McMenemy scored twice, and Hearts' goal came after a bad mistake from goalkeeper Adams.

Wednesday afternoon saw Hamilton Academical at Celtic Park. A small crowd, said to be about 2,000 - it was after all a working

To some, football is life and to others, life can be a riot! In the far-gone days of 1909 though some took this quite literally.

Celtic and Rangers reached the cup final before playing out two draws, 2-2 and 1-1, with the obvious outcome of another replay not going down too well with the followers of both sides.

They united to take on the police, the authorities and anyone else who seemingly stood in their way. For once they weren't venting their anger on each other but the riot and the eventual withholding of the trophy that year took the shine off other events of the time.

So read on as DAVID W POTTER explains how Celtic were also making headlines of the right kind in 1909.

day - saw a 1-1 draw, Celtic's goal scored by Jimmy Quinn.

Hamilton's left winger that day was a young medical student of Glasgow University called John Atkinson.

He so impressed Mr. Maley that he was offered a game for Celtic the next day! He was an amateur, so there was no problem about this, and in any case, things were desperate on the injury front.

Kivlichan, McMenemy and Hamilton were definitely out and several others were struggling for the game against Morton at Celtic Park and Maley was forced to draft in reserves like Dan Munro and Davie McLean, play Peter Somers at inside right and the half-fit Quinn

at inside left.

In the event the makeshift forward line did Celtic proud, for Atkinson scored twice, as did McLean, with one from Munro in

the 5-1 thrashing of Morton.

Such a shame that the game took place that Thursday afternoon in front of less than 2,000 people in what may well be Celtic's lowest ever attendance!

Friday, April 23 was a day off for Celtic! They were now only four points behind Dundee with four games in hand, but lost ground on the Saturday when a more conventional line up could only draw 0-0 at home against Airdrie while Dundee beat Queen's Park 2-0.

Thus, after another day of rest on the Sabbath (of course! This was 1909, remember!) Celtic entertained Motherwell on Monday April 26 with 45 points from 30 games whereas Dundee, having finished their programme, had amassed 50 from 34.

This was another small crowd on a wet and windy day, (there was an unseasonal fall of snow in the

Highlands) but Celtic turned it on and won 4-0.

The counters arrived with a hat-trick for Jimmy Quinn and the other goal from Davie McLean who had taken over Kivlichan's berth on the right wing. Wednesday, April 28 provoked howls of outrage from Dundee followers.

Celtic thrashed Queen's Park 5-0 at Cathkin (Hampden was out of action after the riot) with another hat-trick from Quinn and two from McLean, but the Queen's Park side was more or less a reserve outfit.

Dundonians suspected a little Glaswegian collusion and mutual back-scratching in this one!

Be that as it may, Celtic now were only one point behind Dundee with two games to be played - at Easter Road on Thursday and Douglas Park on Friday.

One point would have meant a play-off, for goal average and goal difference did not apply.

No points came the way of the weary Celtic team on a blustery day on a wet pitch in Edinburgh in front of 7,000 as Hibs won 1-0, and so it all depended on the last game at Douglas Park.

The early evening of Friday, April 30 attracted one of Hamilton's best ever attendances of about 8,000 to the game.

The game had attracted soldiers, middle class people and even a few ladies to see the climax of this championship race.

Hamilton were short of Davie, McLaughlin and Main, but Celtic were on the reasonably familiar lines of Adams, McNair and Weir; Young, Dodds and Hay; McLean, McMenemy, Quinn, Somers and Hamilton as the referee Mr A Jackson started the game.

The genteel audience were to be disappointed in the quality of the football, for Celtic were jittery, edgy and exhausted. Sunny Jim was his usual inspirational self however and it was he who put Davie Hamilton through to score in the 25th minute.

A few other chances were missed, and when Quinn was injured, he had to limp on to the right wing and change places with Davie McLean. Half way through the second half Jimmy 'Napoleon' McMenemy eased the pressure

with a fine individualistic goal from a McLean lay off.

The Accies scored a consolation goal near the end but Celtic held out to win the league for the fifth year in a row.

It was one of the more exciting championship finishes - at least as thrilling as 1922, 1968, 1979 or 1986, and although it made them sore in Dundee...

The sheer achievement of playing eight games in 12 days after a torrid Scottish Cup Final and a riot which might have cost them their lives...

As well as winning five and drawing two must go down as one of the great Celtic achievements.

Historians have sadly allowed the riot of that year to overshadow this triumph.



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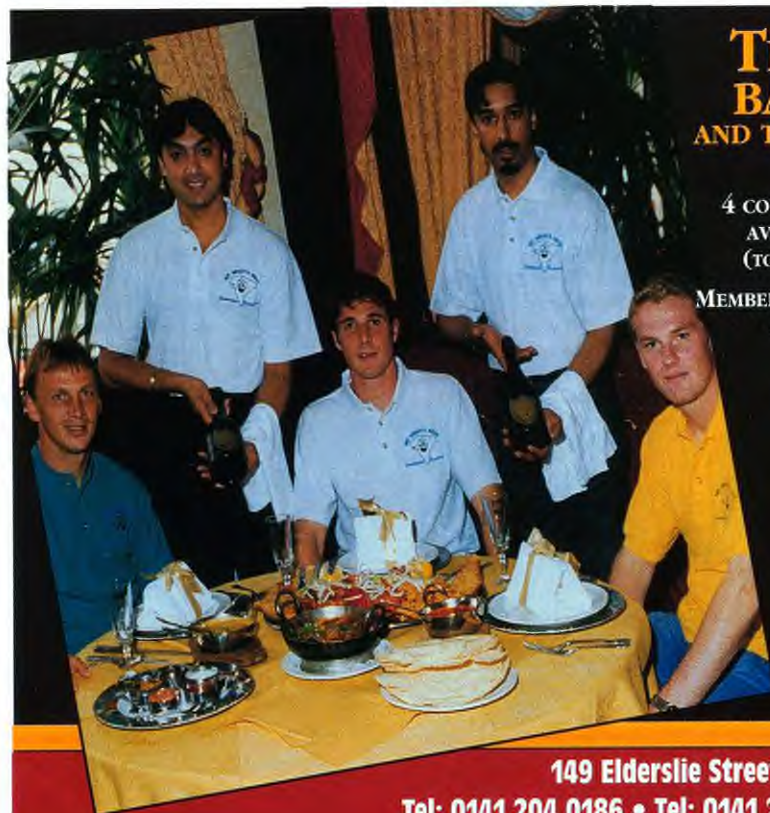

Guillotine operator and amateur footballer John Coyle has severed all links with playing the game and is now fully concentrating on spectating.

And given half a chance, the 26-year-old would also give the chop to those who come to Celtic Park wearing expensive replica strips of top English and European clubs.

He wouldn't dream of following the likes of Liverpool or Manchester United - reason being he thinks it's a waste of time and MONEY!

He explained: "You're either a Celtic supporter or you're not - there's no middle ground and no way that you can 'support' two teams.

"Many of the popular English teams, the English newspapers and some commentators think that Scottish football is just a big joke.

"They forget Celtic were pioneers in Europe not that long ago and currently have the backing of a massive support to help them get there again."

John cites a recent example when Liverpool came to town last Tuesday and nearly all of the media predicted a thrashing for Celtic.

He said: "Before the Liverpool match we were doomed in the eyes of the newspapers, the mighty Liverpool were coming and they would score a barrowload of goals.

"It didn't work out like that, in fact for spells in the game Celtic were far superior and should have won."

Opinionated he may be but Coyle also considers himself a realist.

He said: "It will be difficult when we go to Anfield but not impossible, Liverpool have shown they are a bit weak in defence.

"I know we might need a striker but I don't think it's more important than strengthening the defence.

"We have shown in recent games that we can score goals from many different positions and with various players - Jackie McNamara's goal on Tuesday was a perfect example."

And John believes he knows what he's talking about - unlike some of those who he describes as "so-called experts.

He explained: "If you have never played the game how can you all of a sudden become an authority on the subject. I know that I never played at the top level like Celtic do but I still played at amateur level for four years.

"And that's longer than guys like Celtic 'fan' and TV presenter Dominik Diamond who continually slags off the team he says he loves.

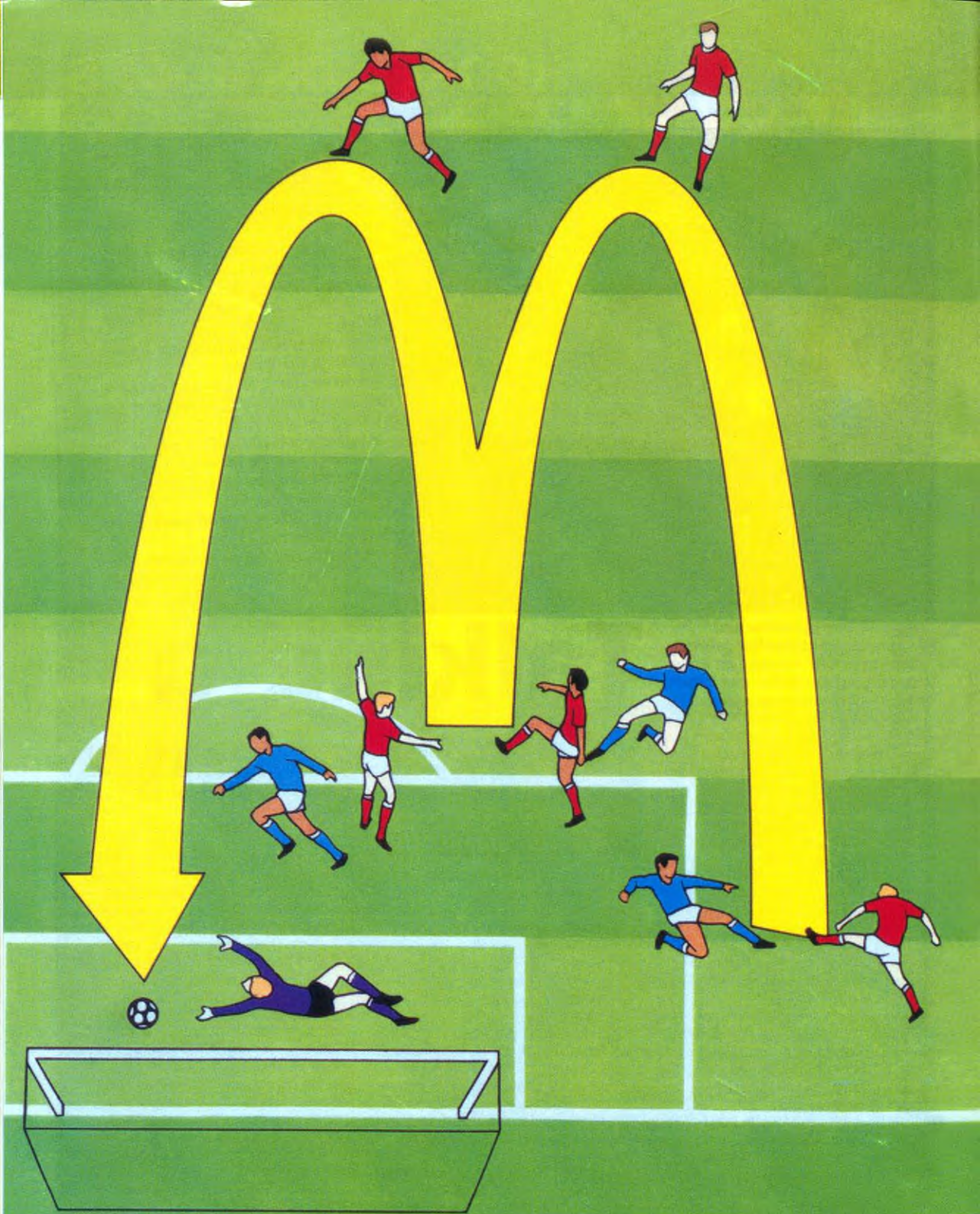
"The great thing about football is different opinions but I object to listening to people who haven't the first idea of what they are talking about."

He continued: "This team just doesn't know when it is beaten, I don't even think they will ever accept being second best for much longer.
