**FIRST of all let me welcome you to Celtic Park as we host our first UEFA Champions League game since we played Juventus here just under two years ago.**

On that occasion we won an intoxicating contest 4-3, but unfortunately it wasn't enough to take us through to the second group phase of the competition.

We know that we will need a performance of that ilk again tonight against Lyon and the fact that we didn't take anything from our opening game against Bayern Munich in Germany a fortnight ago means we know we need something from tonight's performance.

It will be another testing evening for us because Lyon are a formidable side, as the fact they have won the French Championship for the last two years in succession would suggest.

They have also strengthened their squad over the summer by introducing quality players such as Giovane Elber

from Bayern Munich and our task will be a monumental one.

However, the UEFA Champions League is the platform that we want to be playing our football on and as a team we want to test ourselves against top quality opposition on a regular basis.

We performed admirably for long periods of the game in Germany in our first game in Group A, and to take nothing from it was a massive disappointment for everyone.

Since then we have lifted ourselves and taken maximum points from our league meetings and we cannot afford to dwell on what might have been in Munich.

Instead, we have to concentrate on producing a performance tonight that is good enough to win us something against an experienced and impressive Lyon side.

We go into the game on the back of a tough contest at Easter Road on Saturday afternoon where we

eventually took all three points from a demanding Hibs side.

The dismissal of Bobo Balde took some of the gloss off the result and it also made for a fraught finale to what had been an exciting contest.

I thought we started the game a little lethargically before finding our form after the interval but overall I was delighted with the spirit and endeavour that won us the points.

The first Old Firm game of the season looms on Saturday afternoon, which is another massive game for us to look forward to, but before we can contemplate the trip to Ibrox we have to focus on the visit of Lyon.

I can assure you that we are looking forward to it as much as yourselves and once more I urge you to give the team the vocal backing that we have come to expect on exciting European evenings such as this.

## CELTIC FACTS

- On September 13, 1972, Celtic played a first-round European Cup tie against Rosenborg – at Hampden. The poor crowd of 18,797 was almost lost in the vast stadium, where goals by Lou Macari and Dixie Deans gave the Hoops a 2-1 lead for the second leg.
- Four years and two days later, Wisla Krakow were the European visitors, this time to Celtic Park for a UEFA Cup tie. Celtic could only manage a draw against the tough Polish side, even though a 13th minute goal by Roddy MacDonald got them off to a fine start. Many of the 30,000 crowd had left the stadium before a last-minute equaliser by Kenny Dalglish gave Celtic a 2-2 draw.
- 60,017 gathered at Celtic Park on September 16, 1981 for the visit of Juventus, with Liam Brady in midfield. Celtic went at the Italians and got their reward when a Murdo MacLeod shot ricocheted off centre-back Scirea and past Dino Zoff for the only goal.
- One of European football's least well-known sides came to Celtic Park on September 17, 1980 for a Cup-Winners Cup tie. Polytechnica Timisoara had been surprise winners of the Romanian Cup and were not expected to be difficult opponents. Celtic did indeed control the match, scored through Charlie Nicholas in 19 and 42 minutes but allowed Timisoara a vital away goal 12 minutes from the end.
- A previous European night – on September 19, 1973 – had been more to the fans liking. Celtic had travelled to Finland for an opening-round, first leg encounter in the major trophy, with TPS Turku as opponents and treated their faithful fans to a feast of goalscoring. Tommy Callaghan (2), Harry Hood, Jimmy Johnstone, Dixie Deans and George Connelly from the penalty spot made the second leg a formality.



## LYON FACTS

- Olympique Lyonnais was founded in 1950.
  - The club's home ground is the Gerland Stadium, which holds around 42,000. Average attendance last season, when they won the French Championship, was around the 35,000 mark.
  - Olympique Lyonnais have won the League Championship twice – in 2002 and 2003; the French Cup was lifted in 1964, 1967 and 1973; and the League Cup in 1996 and 2001.
  - 34% of the club is owned by Pathe, a media company.
  - Only one Olympique Lyonnais manager – the previous incumbent Jacques Santini – has won the title of French Manager of the Year. He is now in charge of the French national team, who will be one of the favourites at next year's European Championships in Portugal.
  - Only two Olympique Lyonnais players, Guy in 1968/69 (25 goals) and Sonny Anderson in 2000/01 (22) have won the Top Goalscorer of the season award in France.
  - By winning back-to-back League Championships in 2002 and 2003, Olympique Lyonnais became only the sixth French team to achieve that feat. The others to have achieved this are Nice, Nantes, St Etienne, Olympique Marseille and Girondins de Bordeaux.
  - Unlike many other European countries, seven clubs were involved in the final stages of the race for the French League title.
- In the final table, only six points covered champions Olympique Lyonnais, AS Monaco, Olympique Marseille, Bordeaux, FC Sochaux, AJ Auxerre and Guingamp.
