Finally I would just like to wish all of our supporters a very happy Easter and I hope that you all have an enjoyable time with your families.

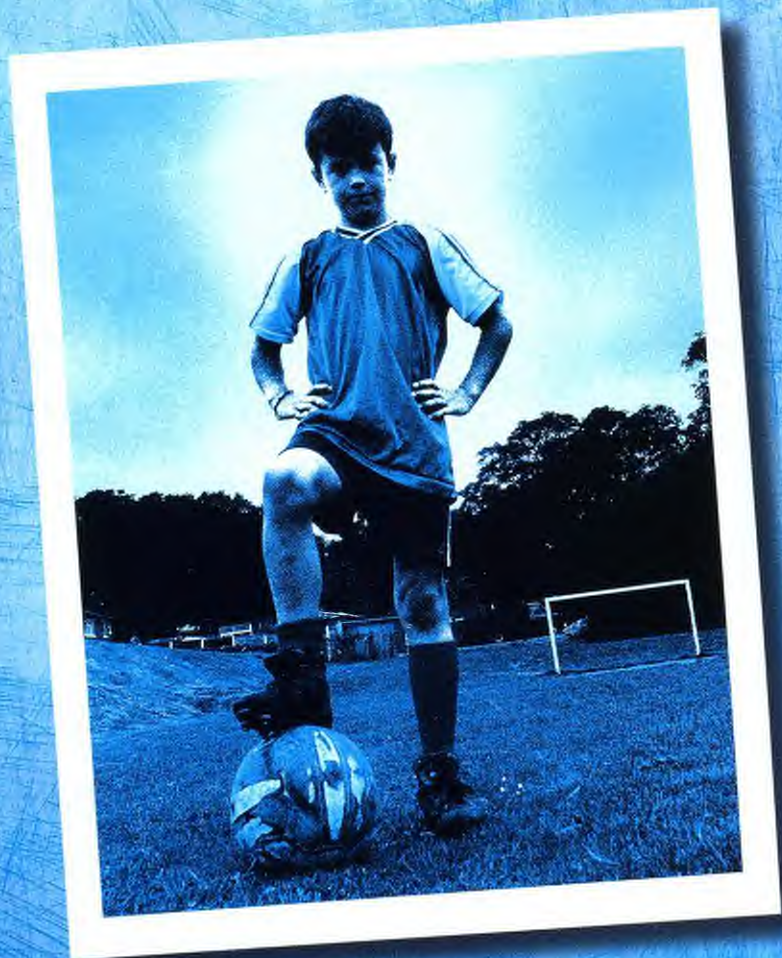
