Finally I would just like to wish all of our supporters a very happy Easter and I hope that you all have an enjoyable time with your families.

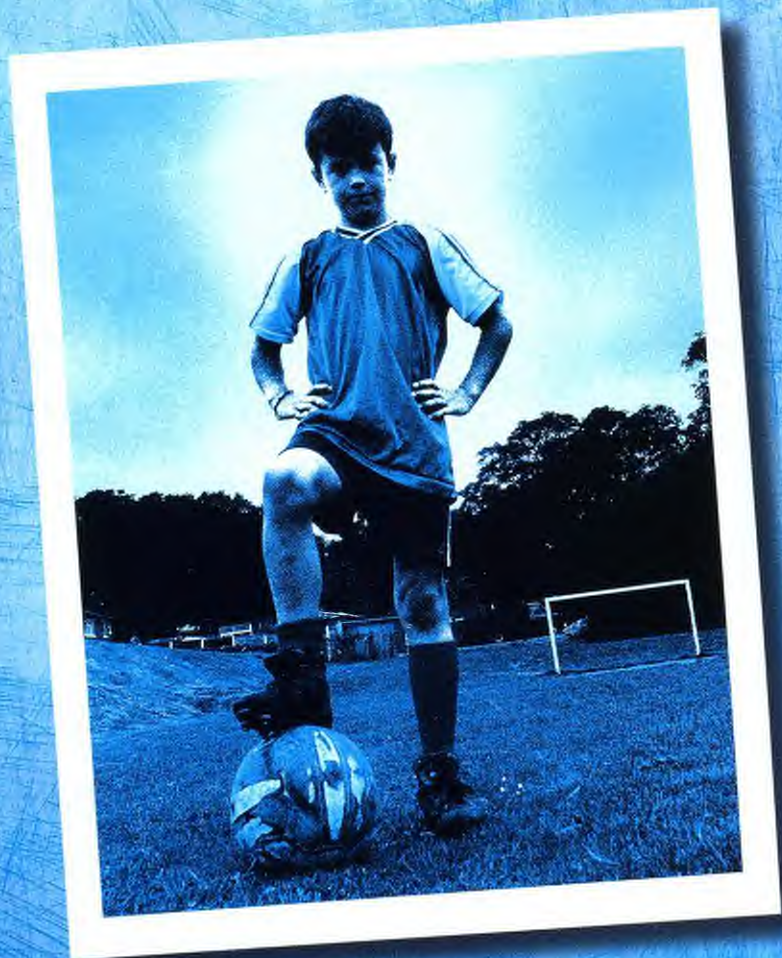

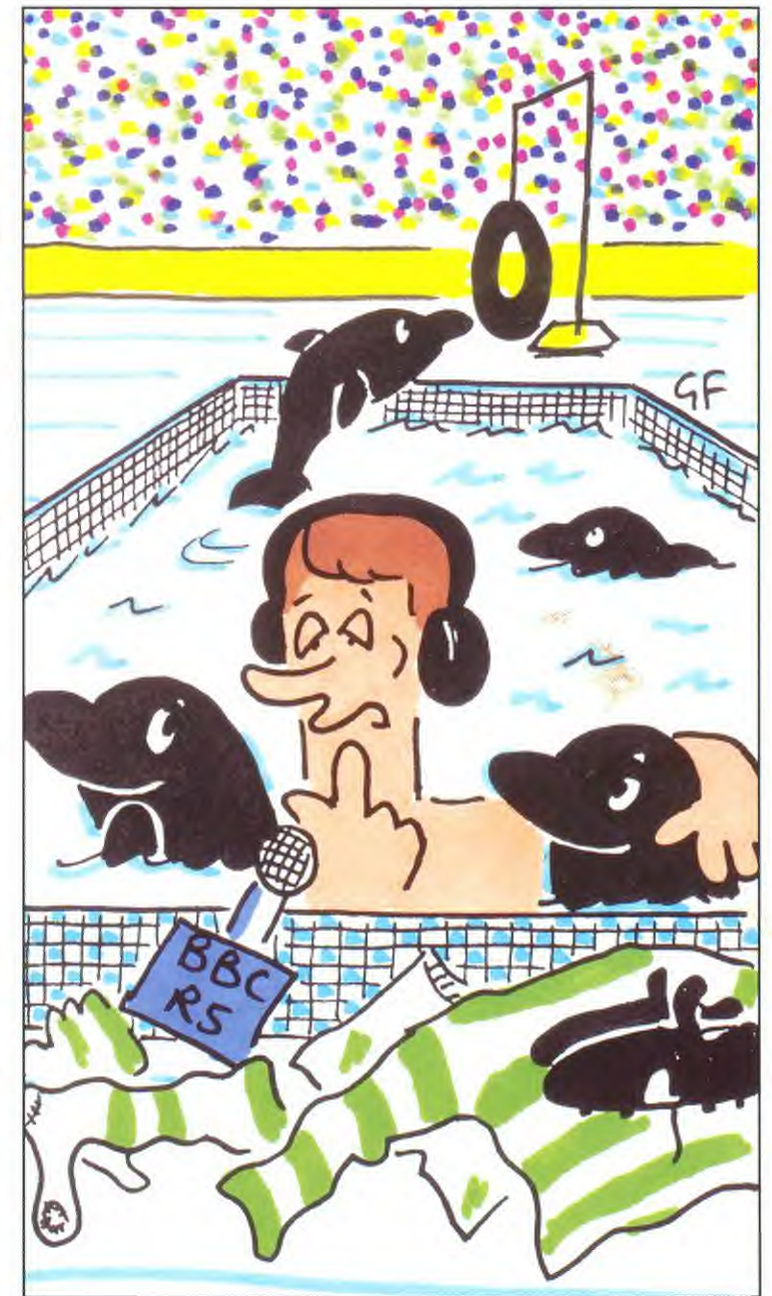
You were an untidy wretch! Will you smarten up, tuck that shirt in and for goodness sakes get a decent haircut.

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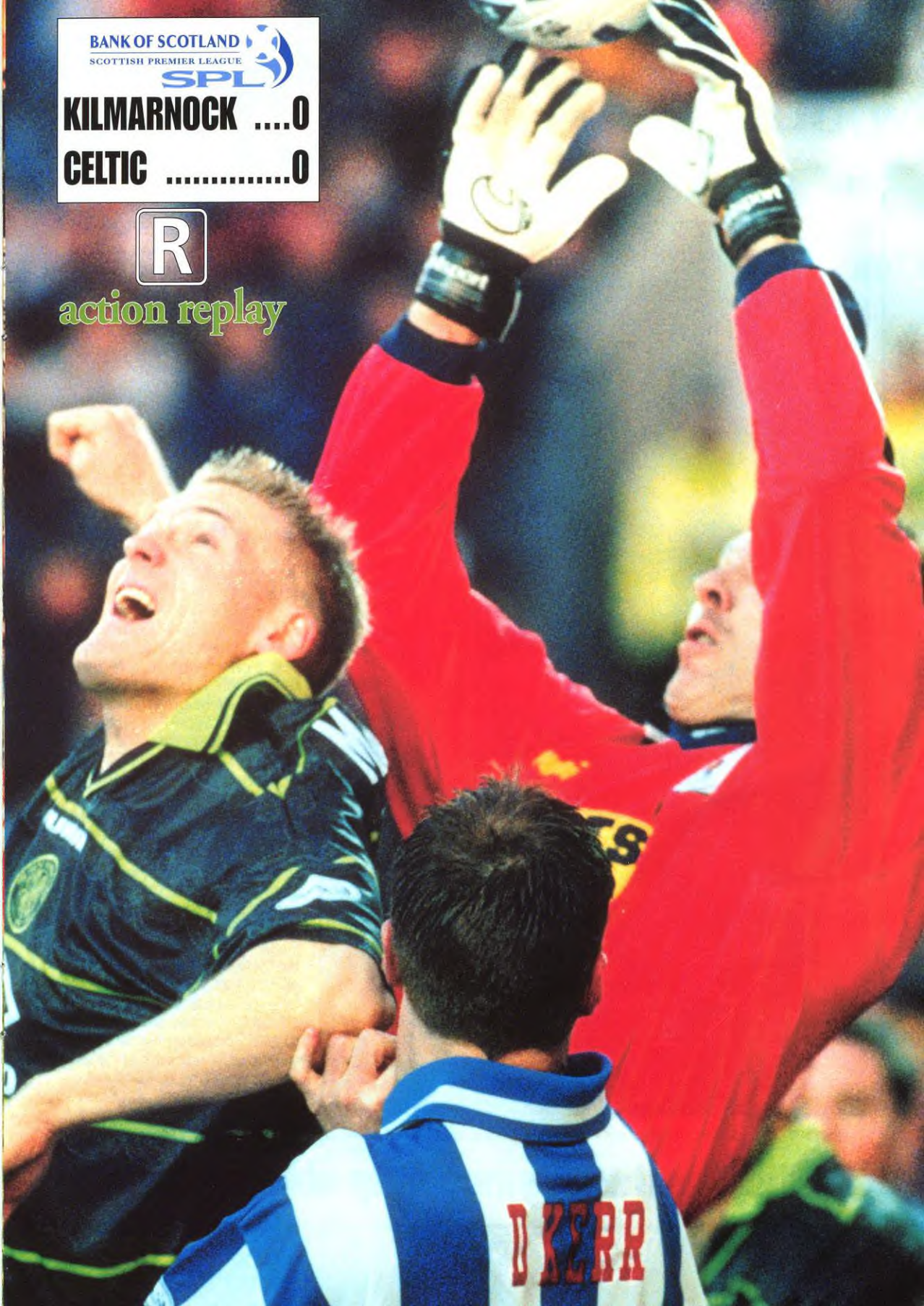
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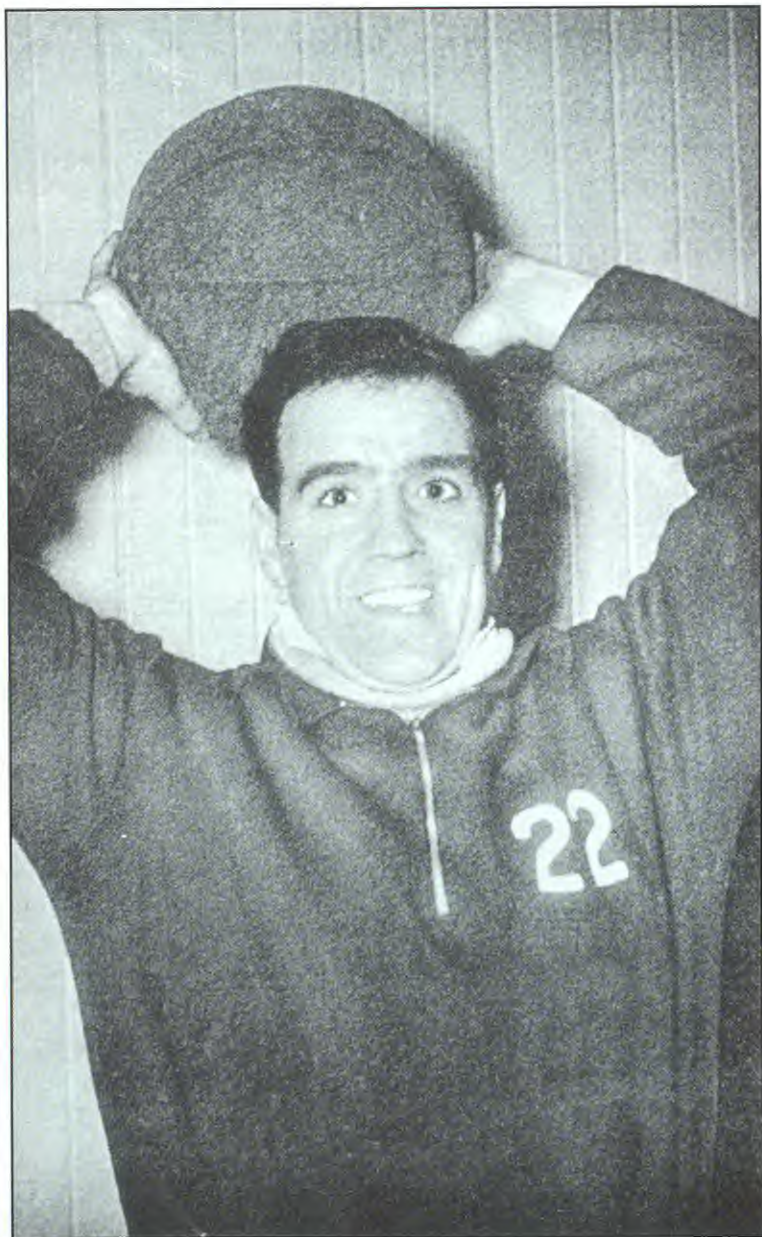

CROWD-PLEASER... Left-wing star Willie Fernie was full of tricks

In the 1950s, Celtic had two fine inside forwards, both of them match winners and both in the traditional Scottish mould of inside men. Some honours came their way, but concerned were Willie Fernie and Bobby Collins.

Fernie is generally acknowledged as being a superb dribbler, a great purveyor of the ball and a tremendous advertisement for both Celtic and Scottish football at their best. He came from Kinglassie in Fife in 1948, but was not an immediate success for the team, having to serve a lengthy apprenticeship.

He played in the Coronation Cup Final of 1953, but on the left wing and only because Tully was injured. It was the following year, in which the League and Cup double was secured, that Willie really began to shine.

He was not only a team man who could pass a ball, he was capable of his occasional moments of crowd-pleasing when he dribbled and mesmerised opponents.

His endeavours earned him a place in the Scotland World Cup squads of 1954 and 1958, and all in all he earned 12 caps for Scotland.

His fine play continued for Celtic, although by the time of the 7-1 game, he found himself at right half, a position in which he excelled just as much. Ill-advisedly, he was allowed to go to Middlesborough in 1958 where he became a cult figure, before returning to Celtic in 1961.

He finished his career at St. Mirren but not before dumping

Celtic out of the 1962 semi-final.

Bobby Collins had a lengthy career. Like Fernie, he played at Celtic Park throughout the 1950s, but Bobby was more adaptable than Willie in that he played many of his games on the wing.

He was popular with the crowd because of his lack of inches and his committed and talented performances, but did not always enjoy the affection of the Celtic management.

On one famous occasion, he was dropped for a Cup Final replay against Clyde, and the result was a win for the men from Shawfield who couldn't believe their luck.

His departure in 1958 was premature as can be gauged by the fact that he earned a Scottish cap (the last of 31) in 1965.

The departure of these two men was due to the Chairman's youth policy, because he felt that youngsters like Conway and Colrairie deserved their chance.

These two were disappointing, but one who did a little better was John Divers, son of another John Divers who played in the great team of the late 1930s. Divers quite clearly had the ability, and on his day could turn a game, yet he lacked

pace and so often gave the impression of lethargy.

Here at the same time too was Charlie Gallagher. Charlie was a silky footballer who could read the game and distribute the ball. His other attributes were a shot and his ability to take a corner kick - at least two of which changed Celtic history.

One was the Scottish Cup Final of 1965 and the other was the quarter-final of the European Cup in 1967 against Vojvodina, and Billy McNeill supplied the finishing touch in both cases.

Charlie was a great player but he wasn't always in the first team, but he was around when required as he was in the run-in to the League Championship of 1968.

Charlie's rival was Bertie Auld. Bertie started off as a left winger,

a talented one, but was sold off to Birmingham City in 1961 when he fell out of favour with Chairman Mr Kelly. A week or two before Stein's appointment, pride was swallowed and Bertie was brought back.

Under Stein his role gradually changed to being a midfield one, and he was one of the most influential players of the early Stein era, not least at Lisbon in 1967.

His play was superb and he added the one extra ingredient that all great teams require, namely a touch of arrogance and self-belief which can infect the rest of the team and encourage the idea that Rangers (and even Inter Milan) can be beaten.

Fans start to develop summer fever over new signings - or the lack of as may be - newspapers feed the lust with an ever burgeoning host of new names each day and, of course, the speculation over likely departures begins in earnest.

Already this week we've read of the imminent arrival at Celtic Park of Wolves hot-shot Robbie Keane for £9 million (despite the fact 'Celtic's' contact continually hung up the phone when enquiring after the player), while defenders Ronnie Johnsen, Polish international Tomasz Hajto and Kilmarnock's Jim Lauchlan are alleged to be 'shooey-ins' when the season ends.

And let us not forget that Alan Shearer is set to exchange the black and white of Newcastle for the green and white hoops either. Although that may well only happen in a world where the sky is full of purple polkadots.

Only one thing about that little lot is for sure. They won't all be arriving. And that may well be one of the only things which can be said with any certainty right now.

Alan Stubbs could be for the off. Simon Donnelly, Phil O'Donnell definitely are with Tosh McKinlay with the unhappy Rico Annoni possibles to follow.

On top of that, it's still said to be unclear who will lead the Celtic team into next season - despite the fact Head Coach Jozef Venglos is

sitting firmly in the driving seat.

All in all, to the common fan right now it appears that just another typical Celtic summer of uncertainty is in prospect - and that's something Joe Punter in the North Stand must dread even more than the obligatory fortnight in Benidorm with the wife and kids.

The fact is that very few, other than those who will directly affect the course of events at the very top, really have the foggiest idea of what the future holds in store. Probably not even Matt McGlone.

And yet, a calm approach suggests that much more is already clear than meets the eye. New plc Chairman Frank O'Callaghan is already in place, while Chief Executive elect Allan MacDonald has impressed many with his 'can do' approach to learning the ropes at Celtic Park.

On the face of it that only leaves a Football General Manager and player comings and goings to be dealt with. If, as seems to be the case, continuity is to be the byword on Fergus McCann's departure, then Jozef Venglos really ought to be entitled to sleep soundly at nights - though a Championship miracle or Scottish Cup victory would provide a comfortable pillow.

Naturally, after all his years in

the game, the wily Slovakian coach knows the score where football power changes are concerned. And yet, the Celtic situation appears to be more a subtle process of evolution rather than a bloody coup borne out of revolution.

Frank O'Callaghan, Dermot Desmond and Allan MacDonald have already expressed their admiration for the work done by Fergus McCann.

If things go to plan then those gentlemen will be the key players in the new Celtic - and no one individual will be big enough to say otherwise.

Which still leaves the biggest bug-bear of them all - new players.

It hasn't gone unnoticed that Bosman has stung Celtic a good number of times more than it has benefited the club.

However, much of the lack of pre-contract signings in the past have been down to the lack of a first-team coach to say yeah or nay during the close season to prospective new Bhoys.

We can only hope such a scenario doesn't repeat itself - or is already repeating itself - this summer. In the hope that it isn't, then we at **Walk On** pronounce the silly season well and truly open....

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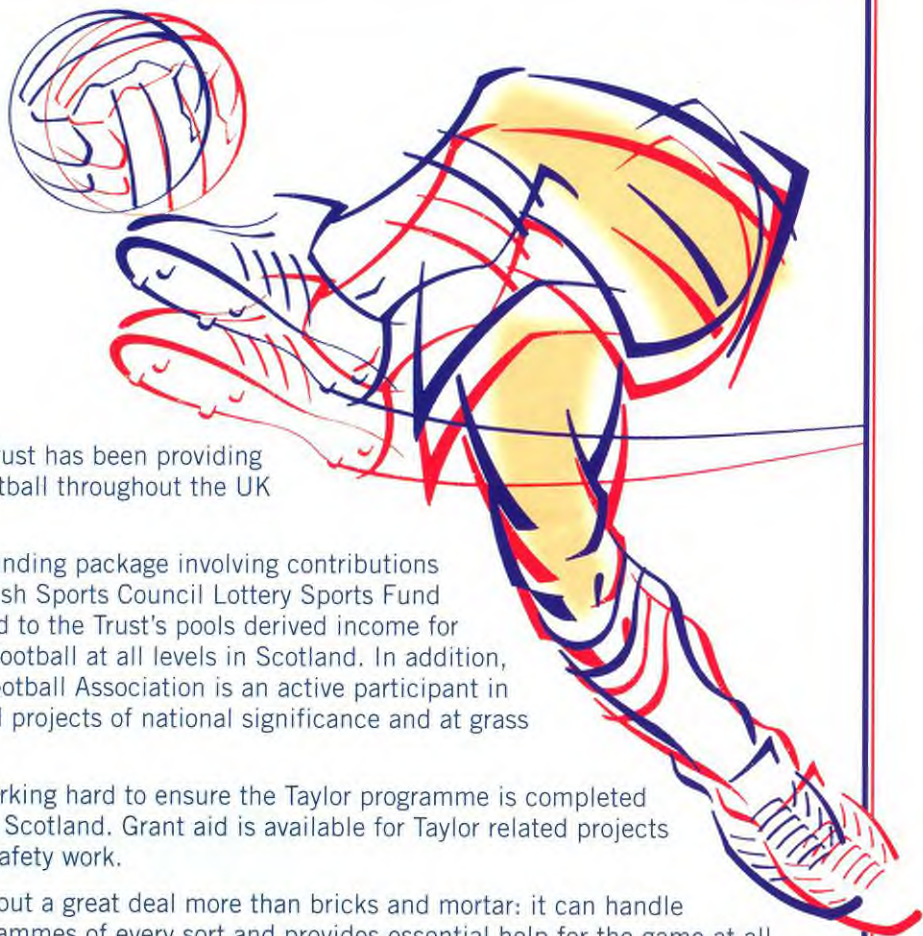
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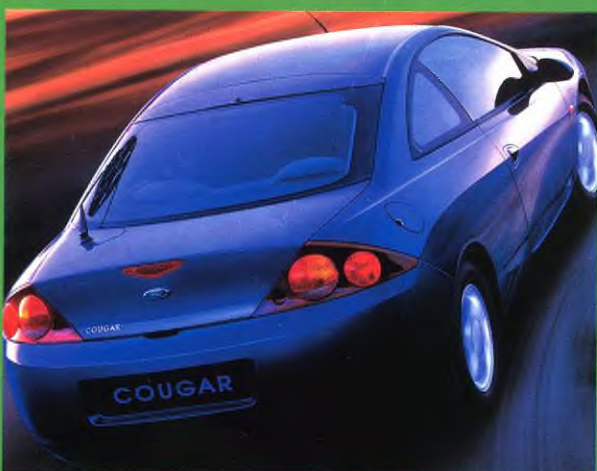
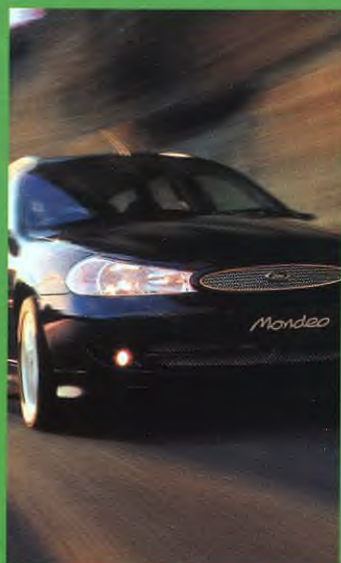
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
