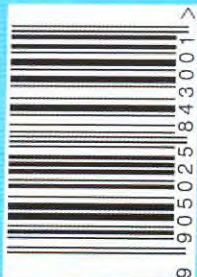

Introduction

Celtic Football Club is legendary and as with most legends as much myth as fact surrounds its history and what the Club stands for today. The Social Mission Statement aims to simply define what the Club stands for and seeks to promote within society.

History

Celtic Football Club was founded in 1888. Its principal founder was a Marist Brother named Walfrid. The Club had two principal aims: The first aim was to raise funds to provide food for the poor of the East End of Glasgow, an area of the City that was greatly impoverished and had a high rate of infant mortality. Within the East End was a large Irish community and friction was growing between the native Glaswegians and the new influx of Irish. Brother Walfrid saw the need for social integration and his vision was a football club that Scottish and Irish, Protestants and Catholics alike could support. A new football club would be a vehicle to bring the communities together and this was the second aim. The Marist brother sought for the Club to have both a Scottish and Irish identity and hence, the Club's name "Celtic" came about, representing a bridge of cultures across the Irish Sea.

Current Positioning of Celtic Football Club

Celtic Football Club is a Scottish football club with proud Irish links. The primary business of Celtic is as a football club. It is run on a professional business basis with no political agenda. However, the Club has a wider role and the responsibility of being a major Scottish social institution promoting health, well-being and social integration.

Who is Celtic Football Club for?

Celtic Football Club is for people who want to support a football club that strives for excellence in Scotland and in Europe, is proud of its history, supportive of its local community and seeks to support the following aims: "To maximise all opportunities to disassociate the Club from sectarianism and bigotry of any kind. To promote Celtic as a Club for all people, regardless of gender, age, religion, race or ability."

Summary

Celtic is a club for everyone who believes in football as a medium for healthy pleasure, entertainment and social integration. The Club always has been and always will simply aim to be the team of the people.

I WOULD like to offer a warm welcome to everyone who has come along to Celtic Park tonight for our SPL game against Falkirk. With exactly two weeks to go until Christmas, this game certainly falls within what will be a busy festive period for us and an important one too as we look to win our third league title in a row.

Following our two consecutive home league games - against St Mirren on Saturday and tonight's game with Falkirk - we face a tough away trip to Inverness this weekend.

That was a difficult venue last season and I'm expecting it to be the same this time around. Then we have games either side of Christmas Day and the same again at the New Year.

It's a heavy schedule that players must cope with and we already know the value of the squad, having had to cope with a number of injuries, particularly to defensive personnel.

The fact that we played against AC Milan, the reigning European Champions, in the San Siro, with four central defenders making up the defence is an illustration of the difficulties we have faced.

But it is testament to the players that we have overcome any obstacle put in our path to reach the last 16 for the second consecutive season.

While everyone will no doubt enjoy the speculation as to who we might play, and it will become slightly clearer after the final group games are played tomorrow night, from our point of view it's good that we can put that on the back burner until February.

Of course there will be excitement when the draw is made next week, the fact that we have secured our place amongst Europe's elite means that we can concentrate on the immediate task in hand, starting with the Falkirk game tonight.

I have said many times before that our priority every season is to win the league. That remains the case and so tonight's game is a vital one for us.

We know, however, that we are facing a side who have rightly gained a lot of praise for the way they play. They gave us a difficult game earlier in the season and it will be exactly the same tonight.

Our aim, therefore, is to be at our very best in order to try and secure all three points.

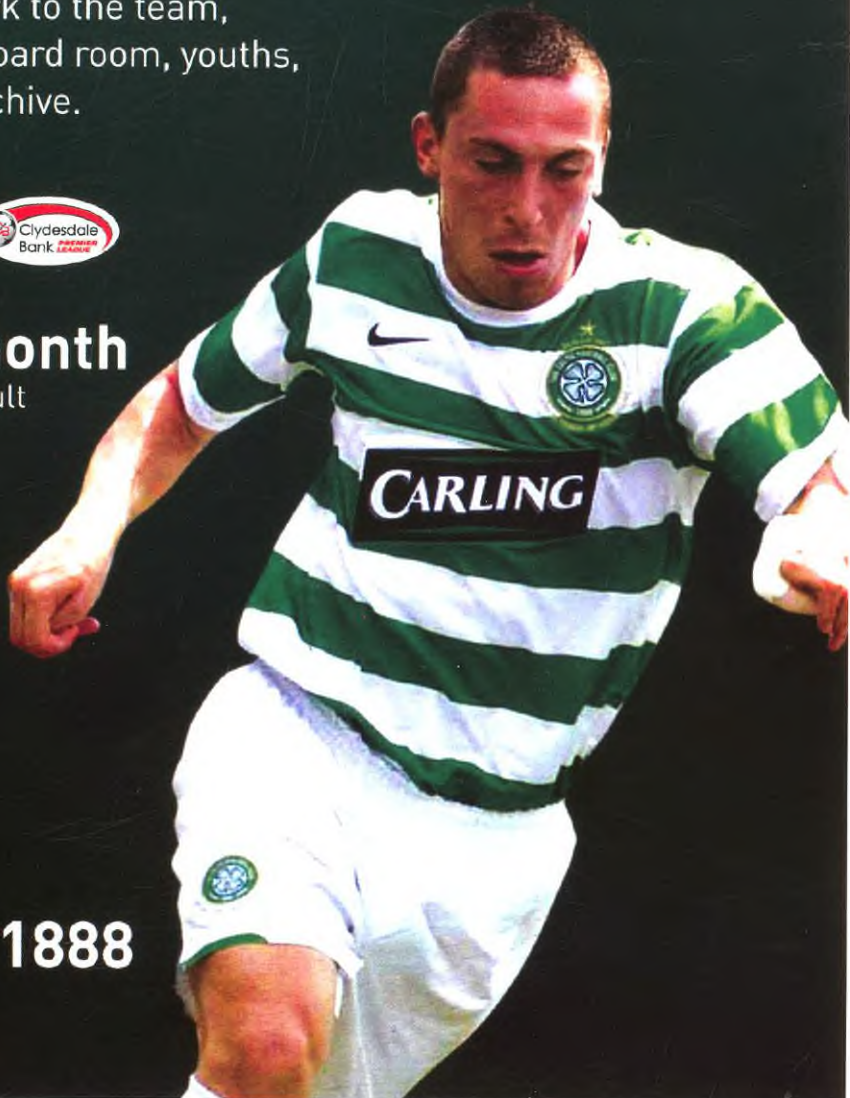

UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT AT CELTIC PARK AND AWAY FOOTBALL STADIA

New rules have been introduced by the SFA and SPL in connection with "Unacceptable Conduct" at football stadia. The new rules form part of our Stadium Regulations. It is a condition of entry to stadia that the Stadium Regulations, including these new rules, are followed.

A summary of the new rules is set out below. Full details are available on the Celtic website at www.celticfc.net or by contacting the Customer Service Manager on 0871 226 1888.

CELTIC FOOTBALL CLUB WILL NOT TOLERATE UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT AT CELTIC PARK OR AT AWAY FOOTBALL STADIA

- Unacceptable Conduct is conduct which is violent or disorderly
- Violent conduct includes any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property

Disorderly conduct includes:

- Conduct which stirs up or sustains, or is likely or is designed to stir up or sustain, hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of:
 - Gender
 - Colour, race, nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin
 - Membership or presumed membership, of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation
 - Sexual orientation
 - Transgender identity
 - Disability
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct

- Displaying writing or any other thing which is threatening, abusive or insulting

This list is not exhaustive and must be read in conjunction with the Stadium Regulations.

ANY PERSON ENGAGING IN UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT MAY BE SUBJECT TO ANY, OR A COMBINATION OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Removal from the Stadium
- Suspension from attending Official Matches involving Celtic Football Club
- Indefinite ban from attending Official Matches involving Celtic Football Club
- Report to the police and possible criminal proceedings
