CELTIC PARK houses its final game of the 2004 calendar today with Dundee United being our visitors.

Much has happened to the club during the past 12 months and there have been a few highlights along the way.

A quarter-final UEFA Cup place was achieved on the back of the UEFA Cup final appearance the previous season, and then in May the club regained both the SPL Championship and the Scottish Cup.

In July we lost a couple of major players, Johan Mjallby and Henrik Larsson, to the Spanish league, but as we close the year down we are still at the top of the table.

Last Tuesday evening's draw against AC Milan at Celtic Park was not enough to secure European football next February so we are somewhat disappointed.

But I think most people realised just how difficult the task was going to be to emerge from a group containing AC Milan and Barcelona, along with a strong Shakhtar Donetsk who spent much money strengthening their team during the summer.

We played very well indeed against AC Milan but eventually had to settle for a draw against one of the favourites to win the Champions League.

Our last three results in European competition, including drawing against Barcelona in the Nou Camp stadium, yielded five



points so we actually finished quite strongly in the group but earlier results had dictated that it was going to be an uphill task, and so eventually it proved.

The players quickly got over the disappointment by going to Dunfermline on Sunday afternoon and winning a very difficult game by 2-0.

Chris Sutton gave us an early lead with a splendid header from Alan Thompson's delivery and Stilian Petrov rifled in a magnificent goal to win the game.

The artificial surface at East End Park added to the difficulty so it was particularly pleasing to put in a good performance and win the game.

We are back on league duty today and we welcome Dundee United to Celtic Park.

Ian McCall's side will come here with a spring in their step after last week's 3-0 victory over Kilmarnock, which not only took them off the bottom of the table, but will undoubtedly instil confidence in their ranks.

Their result last week proves that we cannot rest on our laurels and we will have to be alert in ensuring that we show the proper attitude to capture the three points available.

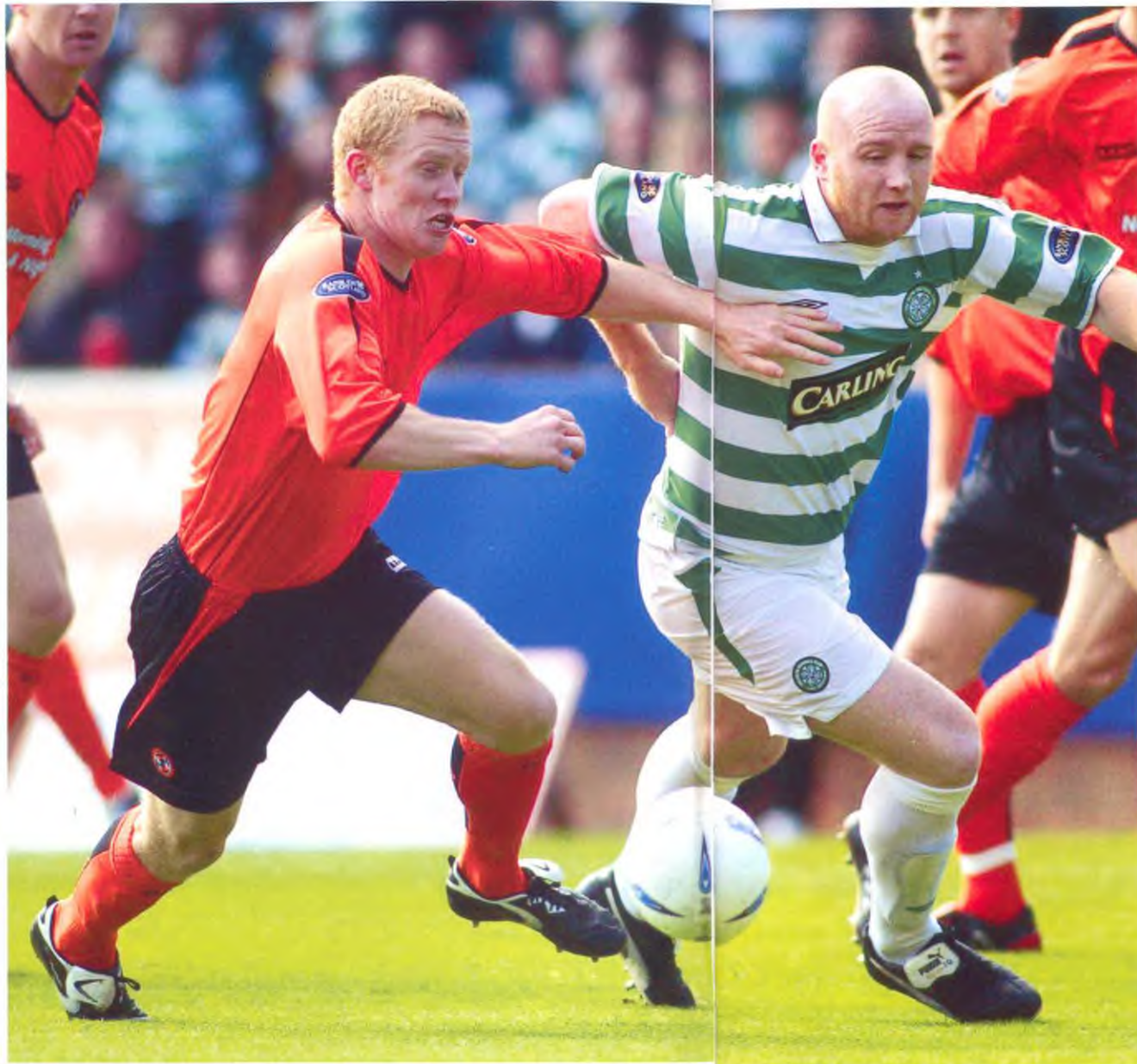
Finally, as this is our last home match of the year, I would like to wish every one of you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

ANOTHER WIN AND TONIC?

Interview: GREGOR KYLE

THERE'S something about Dundee United and Euro heartache, and today Celtic will again be hoping to take out their frustrations on a Tannadice side that has proved tough to beat in recent seasons.

The last time Celtic faced the Arabs in Dundee they were returning to Scotland fresh from the cruel disappointment of a late 3-1 defeat by AC Milan in the UEFA Champions League.

This afternoon United will now arrive in Glasgow for Celtic's first home game since elimination from that same competition and the subsequent failure to qualify for the UEFA Cup.

At the last meeting in Dundee, it

could be said that the home team bore the brunt of Celtic's disappointment. And today, with that blow only compounded, the Celtic support will be hoping for a similar backlash from the players.

While the match had its occasional moments of controversy, three first-half goals – two from Chris Sutton and one from Stilian Petrov – saw Celtic return to Glasgow with the three points to add to their domestic tally and the opportunity to make amends in their next European game. With the UEFA outlet now

removed, the Bhoys are entirely focussed on the domestic prizes and, as Chris Sutton explained, they have been working hard to prepare for what he fully expects to be another hard encounter.

"It will be a tough game," said Sutton.

"I seem to remember last year we had a very close game at Parkhead against them and we were a bit fortunate to come out on top.

"They've had a good result in beating Kilmarnock last weekend and have got some players who can cause a lot of problems."

That result, Sutton believes, will

have reinvigorated the confidence of a squad presently lying in the bottom six of the SPL and, looking back on the last match at Tannadice, he says that, while the score was comprehensive, it was only achieved through toil and endeavour.

The strike ace explained: "We had a good start in that game and got some early goals that made the game comfortable in the end.

"But they are a well organised side and we have had some very hard games against them in recent years. They also got a point at Ibrox this year and yeah, every game is difficult, but they have some very good players."

For this reason Sutton believes the Arabs will be a real threat as they come to Glasgow looking to build on their successes and claw their way out of a pack of five sides separated by just three points.

He said: "I think they've got one of the stronger squads. At times you don't get the run of the ball or the breaks, but they have got the sort of players who can cause any team problems.

"Every game is tough, but I've had some very tough games against United. We just have to go out every week, prepare ourselves and do the best we can."

Celtic's exit from European competition was sore for the players and supporters alike. But as he looked back on the UEFA Champions League campaign, Sutton is philosophical about what could really have been taken from a group that included the giants of AC Milan and Barcelona plus a Shakhtar side that cost over £20 million to assemble.

"I was very disappointed," said Sutton.

"When we had the draw it was obviously a very exciting one but, realistically, we would have had to have been doing very well to qualify.

"We had a good realistic chance to get into the UEFA Cup, so that's been a disappointment but, having said that, in previous years we have

punched well above our weight in Europe.

"From a player's point of view, we would have liked to have done better. We were a little patchy but they've been good games to play in and it just wasn't to be in the end.

"We've just got to look forward to next season and knuckle down hard, try to win our league games and get a chance to play in the competition again."

A tight domestic competition at home is more than enough to occupy the thoughts of the 31-year-old – and he observed: "At the start of every season we expect it to be tight at the top between us and Rangers and this year it is tighter than it has been in recent years – but we're not even halfway through the season.

"We'll drop points and I am sure they'll drop points as well. We just

have to keep working hard and hopefully we will come out on top.

“Every player in the dressing room knows how hard that will be to achieve but hopefully we’ll do it.”

Sutton has also been impressed with the form of young Aiden McGeady this season, and watched last week as he again produced another excellent performance against Dunfermline

Chris added: “He’s come on leaps and bounds from the start of the season. Aiden’s always seemed confident when he’s trained with us but he seems to have really matured in recent months.

“It’s not easy for young players to break into the side, but he’s done it

and he’s there on merit. He gives us that something extra.

“I thought at Dunfermline he was outstanding, running the ball up the pitch, and he’ll go right to the top. He does seem to have his feet on the ground and is a tremendous asset to come in this season and play alongside. I think everybody in the dressing room appreciates how good a player he is.”

Sutton also had words of praise for new arrivals Henri Camara and Juninho and believes that, given time to settle, both will prove to be quality additions to the Celtic squad.

“I think Henri has done well,” Sutton said. “He got the bad injury

at Livingston and he was on fire that game. He really won us that one before he went off – he scored two important goals and looked sharp.”

The Englishman also believes the Celtic squad have a job to do in helping Juninho settle in to his new home at Celtic Park, and has an obvious respect for the World Cup winner.

Chris reasoned: “It’s been difficult for Juninho.

“I thought he did well in the first game against Rangers and he’s shown quality in other games.

“He’s a different sort of player but everybody’s got to work hard to help him mix in.

“However, you don’t play for the clubs he’s played for, and in the Brazilian national side if you are not a top player, and he certainly is that.”

DUNDEE UNITED pulled themselves off bottom spot last week with an impressive 3-0 home win over Kilmarnock and we take a look at the men who won those vital three points.

TONY BULLOCK

Signed by Ian McCall for United in June 2003, keeper Tony came into the senior game late. He was 25 by the time he signed for Barnsley from non-League Leek Town in March 1997. After 47 games he left to join Macclesfield and was signed by Ross County for the start of season 2001/02. Bullock spent two years with the Dingwall side, making 84 appearances, and did not have long to wait for his chance in goal for United as he replaced Paul Gallacher after first three matches.

MARK WILSON

A versatile two footed player, Mark is comfortable at right-back, centre half and midfield. He made his debut for United on January 5, 2002 in the Scottish Cup against Forres Mechanics. Two weeks later he underwent a league baptism of fire in the side that met Dundee in the derby at Tannadice. Season 2002/03 saw Mark become firmly established as a first-team regular, and he scored his first senior goal for United against Hibernian at Tannadice in December 2002.

United have undoubted quality in their squad and are now showing signs of their true form. We take a look at the players to watch out for

CHRIS INNES

Began his career at Stenhousemuir in 1996 and joined Kilmarnock in the summer of '98. However, in his first season there he managed only four first-team games and spent three months on loan to St Mirren, where he played 10 times. In season 2000/01 centre-half Chris made the breakthrough into the Killie first team and became a regular. Prior to his move to Tannadice, he totalled 89 appearances for the Ayrshire side and netted four times. Manager McCall had been a long time admirer of the player and agreed a two-and-a-half year deal with him in August 2003.

PAUL RITCHIE

Defender has just extended his stay at Tannadice for another 18 months. He started at Hearts and made 162 appearances, scoring nine goals. In his eight years with Jambos, Paul became an important player and was in the winning team for the Scottish Cup final in May 1998. Just a year later, however, he

could not find a place in the team and spent six months on loan at Bolton, before a free transfer to Rangers in June 2000. Two months later, without ever making the Ibrox side's first team, he was on the move again to Manchester City. But in three years there he was limited to 27 games and signed for United in August '04.

ALAN ARCHIBALD

A strong running wing-back comfortable in any defensive formation, Alan was signed by McCall for United in June last year from Partick. He made 231 appearances, scoring eight goals, for the Jags where, until leaving, he was their longest-serving player. In his first season at Tannadice, he was the only player to feature in every league and cup match for United, and his assured displays earned him a contract extension. He scored at Celtic Park in a narrow 2-1 defeat last season.

MARK KERR

Talented midfielder signed from Falkirk in July 2003. He made his



Bairns debut in season 1998/99 at the age of only 17 against Clydebank, and by the time he left he had accumulated 125 appearances and scored nine times. Mark soon settled at Tannadice and became a regular in the side. By the end of his first season he had racked up 33 league and two cup appearances.

DEREK McINNES

McCall signed Derek in July 2003 and the player was immediately installed as team captain – a mark of the high regard in which he is held by the manager. He has gained much experience, particularly with his previous club West Brom, having captained them to a place in the English Premiership in season 2002/03. He made 100 appearances for the Baggies and scored six times. Earlier, Derek spent almost five years with Rangers and, in that time, played 53 times. Missed only four games in his first full season at Tannadice.

GRANT BREBNER

After tracking the player for some 18 months, McCall finally signed the Hibs midfielder in August 2004. Grant began his career as a trainee at Manchester United shortly before his 17th birthday in 1994. After four years there he was loaned out to Cambridge. On his return to Old Trafford he was





again farmed out, this time to Hibs, where he played nine times, netting only once, against United in the match that effectively relegated the Edinburgh side that season. He returned again to Manchester but was transferred to Reading only days later without ever making a debut for the Red Devils. While with Reading he made 46 appearances and scored 11 goals in a side that included current United front player, Jim McIntyre. As the next season dawned, Grant was tempted back

and played for the Diamonds in the 1995 cup final when they lost 1-0 to Celtic. He moved to Kilmarnock just before the March 1996 transfer deadline, and two years later won a Scottish Cup medal with the club, scoring the winning goal in the semi-final replay with United en route. He signed for United in the summer of 2000 and made a good start, with five goals from his first nine SPL games. By the end of last season Jim had reached a total of 93 appearances and scored 26 goals.

top scorer in 2001, netting nine times in his final season. He was one of the most consistent strikers in Trinidadian football and had a reputation as a clinical finisher. His goals were crucial to United's fifth place finish last term.

COLLIN SAMUEL

Boss McCall signed the Trinidad & Tobago internationalist for the second time in his career when he brought him to Tannadice last July. Collin is a speedy attacker who had already made a big impression at Falkirk. He appeared 42 times or them and netted 16 times, including two memorable hat-tricks, the second of which was in a 4-0 win against Hearts in the Scottish Cup in 2003. In his first match for his country, against Grenada in 2001, he scored twice. Since then he has made eight more international appearances.

BILLY DODDS

In his first spell with the club, Dodds was then manager Paul Sturrock's first signing. Billy's Tannadice career got off to a whirlwind beginning with a hat-trick in his first start – the opposition being former club St Johnstone. It was following his move from Perth to Aberdeen that the hitman was first capped by Scotland, scoring his first goals for his country in the 3-2 win over Estonia. He was transferred to Rangers in December 1999, returning to Tannadice early in 2003 and making his second debut against Kilmarnock in the SPL the next day.

GREG CAMERON

Having worked his way through the various youth levels, Greg became the youngest player to play for United in the Premier League – the 16-year-old beating Christian Dailly's record when he came on to replace Brebner in United's 3-0 victory over Kilmarnock last weekend.

Had an impressive record at Inverness CT after leaving Rangers, where he spent just over two years in the youth squad. He joined Caley in 1997 and spent almost six years as a regular there. A talented left sided player, Barry played 166 games and scored 27 times. His strong running on the left side has given United an added dimension and he starred as United finished fifth last term. He scored the equaliser at Ibrox against Rangers in October with a late free-kick.

JIM MCINTYRE

An experienced striker, Jim can also play in left midfield. He joined Airdrie from Bristol City in 1993

JASON SCOTLAND

United acquired the out-of-contract

Celtic and Dundee United have played each other 148 times in the league, with the dominant Hoops having won 81 of those games to the Arabs' 32. The other 35 meetings have been drawn. We look back at a few of these encounters, starting with the first time they met at Celtic Park more than 80 years ago

**1925/26
CELTIC 6-2 DUNDEE UNITED**

THE last game of season 1925/26 saw Dundee United visit Celtic Park for the first time. A crowd of just 6,000 turned up to cheer on the Scottish Champions who had actually lost 1-0 when the teams met for the very first time in the league, at Tannadice on September 19, 1925. The game at Celtic Park on April 24, 1926, saw a comprehensive victory for the Hoops. Jimmy McGrory scored two while Adam McLean hit a hat-trick and John 'Jean' McFarlane scored the other goal.

**1929/30
CELTIC 7-0 DUNDEE UNITED**

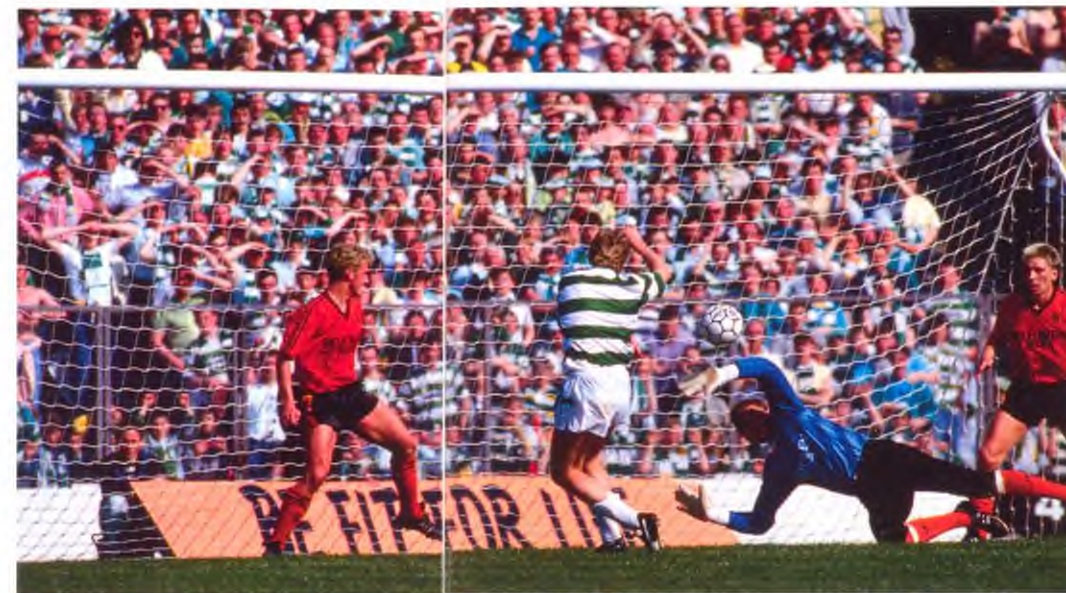
CELTIC'S biggest ever victory over Dundee United came on March 1, 1930. The Hoops won 7-0 that day at Celtic Park, with Peter Scarff the hero thanks to his four goals that day. The other strikes came from Alec Thomson, Charlie Napier and Willie Hughes. Notable absentees through injury were Jimmy McGrory and John Thomson.

**May 14, 1988
CELTIC 2-1 DUNDEE UNITED**

DUNDEE UNITED, chasing their first ever Scottish Cup triumph, must have thought this was their year when they took the lead at Hampden through Kevin Gallacher midway through the second half. But Frank McAvennie equalised with just under 15 minutes remaining. Then, as extra-time was looking likely, McAvennie grabbed a second goal to give Celtic the league and cup double in their Centenary season.

**December 26, 1992
CELTIC 0-1 DUNDEE UNITED**

IT was a Boxing Day disaster for Celtic as they lost 1-0 to the Tangerines – the last time United managed to record a victory at Celtic Park. The only goal of the game came a minute before half-time from striker Iain Ferguson following good work from ex-Celt Jim McNally. The Hoops were to finish third in the league that season.

**July 20, 2000
DUNDEE UNITED 1-2 CELTIC**

MARTIN O'NEILL'S first league game in charge at Celtic ended with a victory as the Hoops beat United 2-1 at Tannadice. Henrik Larsson returned to action following his broken leg the previous season, having made a substitute appearance in the last league game of the previous season - also against United. And the super Swede got O'Neill's reign off to the best possible start with a goal on 37 minutes. United equalised just after the break but the winning goal was

provided with just over 20 minutes of the match remaining through Chris Sutton.

CELTIC played Dundee United four times in the Scottish Premierleague last season, with three of those fixtures at home thanks to the vagaries of the SPL 'split'.

The Hoops won all four encounters, and they hit five in the opening game without reply – the goals coming from five different scorers. They were: Maloney, Agathe, McNamara, Thompson and Larsson. The Celts followed that up

with another five-star display, although United managed to score one. The last two games, however, were much closer affairs, both ending in 2-1 victories for Celtic. The first of those games, on St Valentine's Day this year, saw the Hoops come from behind to win 2-1. Two goals late on from Maloney and a Sutton penalty were enough.

Henrik Larsson's last competitive game at Celtic Park provided the

backdrop to the game on May 16, 2004 between the sides. And the Magnificent Seven didn't disappoint as he scored both goals inside the last 10 minutes to win the match. He then shed a few tears that were reciprocated around the ground as the realisation that he would soon be leaving Paradise hit home.

This season, the teams met at Tannadice on October 3, and it was the Hoops who triumphed 3-0.

All the goals were scored in the first half, courtesy of Petrov and a Sutton double, one of which was from the penalty spot.

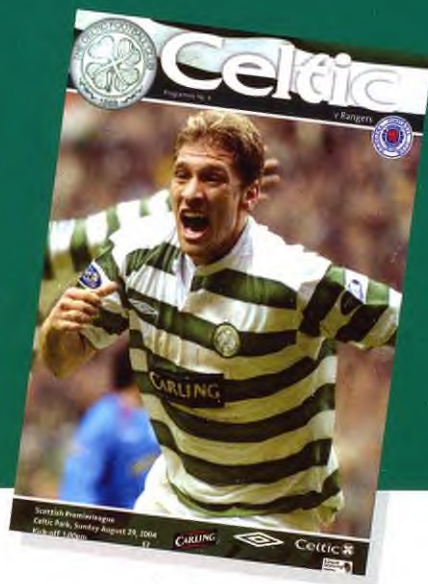

Paradise lost for journeyman Kev

Kevin Gallacher never quite made it to Celtic despite his family background – but still enjoyed a fine career as a top-class striker

HE IS perhaps regarded as one of the best Celtic-minded players never to have played for the club – but the family ties that bound Kevin Gallacher to the East End of Glasgow ultimately kept him away from Paradise.

In a career spanning some three decades, the pacy striker and occasional winger built a reputation as one of the most successful Scottish exports in the English leagues, making his name at Coventry, Blackburn, Newcastle and, latterly, Preston North End and Huddersfield.

He headed south to Coventry from Dundee United but throughout his time in England was continually linked with a move back home to Scotland and Celtic – the club he supported as a boy and one with a very special bond with the Gallacher family.

If Kevin had opted to sign for Celtic he would have been the third generation of the Gallachers to do so, with his father Willie and, more famously, his grandfather, the legendary Patsy, pulling on the Hoops during their careers.

His dad's cousin was also the late, great Johnny Divers, and with that Celtic tradition in the family it seemed only natural that a young Kevin would join the Hoops as a

talented 13 year-old. But instead Gallacher headed north to Tannadice and Jim McLean's United, where he would establish himself as one of the most talented strikers in the Scottish league and often prove to be a painful thorn in the side of Celtic, scoring some seven goals against the Bhoys including a memorable strike in the 1988 Scottish Cup final.

Now settled in Lancashire, Gallacher is working in the region is a coach and regular commentator and keeps a close eye on the results of both Celtic and Dundee United.

He said: "I spent five years in the first team at Tannadice, but I had been there since I was 13, so it was actually nine years in total.

"It was a great place to start out and learn about football.

"I had great times there and when I look back even the bad things were good – like cleaning out the showers and the changing rooms as an apprentice.

"They've taken those sort of tasks away from young players now and today they are a bit mollycoddled, but I think that by doing so they are also taking away an important part of their education."

The education that Gallacher obtained at Tannadice was

comprehensive enough to prepare him for a long career in the English Premiership, and his crowning glory in the south was that memorable English title win with Blackburn.

The story could be very different though if he had followed in the family tradition and signed for Celtic. However, as Gallacher explained, it was family advice that helped decide his future.

"My grandfather and dad were always determined I shouldn't sign for Celtic and should work to make a name for myself at another club.

"I remember one of my cousins did decide to sign for Celtic and he wasn't too happy about that.

"But it was really going up to Dundee and speaking to Jim McLean that made my mind up. He really sold the club to me and then later gave me my opportunity.

"But I never lost my links with Celtic and I've got plenty of friends and family that are still at Celtic Park every week and they keep me up to date with what's happening."

Despite his determination to make his own name, Gallacher continued to be linked with a move to Celtic Park throughout his career and was near to signing in the early days at Coventry.

"It was very close," he revealed.

"I think the closest I came to

signing was when I had come down to Coventry in the January and was finding it hard to settle.

"I was quite young, was in a new house, still trying to make friends and had just got married.

"I got a phone call from my uncle Tom who told me that Billy McNeill wanted to me to sign for Celtic, but I decided to stay.

"I think it was my stubbornness that stopped me – I was determined to succeed in England."

Gallacher has watched in recent years as his former strike partner at Blackburn Rovers, Chris Sutton, made the same move in reverse, heading north to Celtic to establish himself as one of the club's most impressive and consistent performers.

"Chris came to Rovers from Norwich and I got on really well with him on the park," he explained.

"There was a real connection between us and a massive understanding developed. I think that showed in the fact that we scored 47 goals in our first season up front together."

Continued Gallacher: "I think one of his main strengths is his versatility. He came to Blackburn as a centre forward but had been converted from a centre-half.

"I've watched him over the past couple of seasons and that versatility has widened to include the centre of midfield and I think it says a lot about him that he is just as good in whatever position he is played in.

"The move up to Celtic has revitalised him."

Now based permanently in England, Gallacher is a keen observer of the Scottish game and watches for the results of the team he supported as a boy and the team he went on to represent.

"I keep an eye on Celtic's results and I get the extra news from Tannadice on the phone to my aunt

Kathy. She is still living up in Dundee and is always at Tannadice. I speak to her regularly on the phone to find out how the team is doing.

"I was actually up there a few weeks ago seeing Eddie Thompson and the lads and doing the half-time draw.

"It was nice to get back up again and see the place and catch up with people, but it's a different generation of supporter now.

"The ones that remember me are a bit older, while the younger ones are just looking at me saying 'who is that?'"

The Arabs have suffered from fluctuating form this season and presently lie fourth bottom in the SPL. But Gallacher was impressed with United's crop of players during his recent visit and believes they will take heart from last weekend's 3-0 win over Kilmarnock and a draw

with Rangers earlier this season.

"They have assembled a not too bad squad up there," he said.

"I know the table does not lie, but at the end of the day these are difficult times for Scottish football and United got a really good result last weekend.

"There's only a point between Celtic and Rangers at the top and I think Celtic might be feeling the pinch a little now that Henrik Larsson is gone. I know one player doesn't make a team and that John Hartson is doing well up there, but I think they miss Henrik."

Picking a team to support for today's match would perhaps inspire mixed emotions, but when predicting a result Gallacher lets his head overrule his heart.

"I would always fancy Celtic at home," he admitted.

"Celtic Park is a tough cauldron to go and play in and I know that they may have had a few tough games lately, but I would go for Celtic for the home victory."

December 18 heralded a victory during the Barnes/Dalglish reign, and there have been other notable wins down the years. But this time last year the Celts suffered CIS pain

CELTIC and Dundee United met at Celtic Park on this day in 1999. And it was Dundee United who took the lead on 26 minutes through Joachim Ferraz.

But the Hoops launched a stunning second-half comeback, scoring four goals courtesy of Regi Blinker, Mark Viduka, Lubo Moravcik and Mark Burchill.

From that side, Jackie McNamara, Paul Lambert and Stilian Petrov are the only three Celts still at the club. It wasn't the best of seasons for Celtic, managed by the 'dream team' of John Barnes and Kenny Dalglish. Events after the turn of the year meant the departure of Barnes, and the following season Martin O'Neill arrived to restore the club's pride and fortunes.

Celtic's first game on December 18 came in 1897 at Celtic Park when they defeated St Bernard's 5-1. The goals that day came from Pat Gilhooley with a double, Sandy McMahon with two and one from George Allan.

Allan was sadly to pass away just under two years later at the age of 24 from tuberculosis, having made

19 appearances for Celtic and scoring 16 goals.

JIMMY Rowan made his debut against Dundee on this day in 1954 and scored in the 4-1 victory at Celtic Park.

He was to make only one further appearance for the Hoops, in a 2-1 defeat against Hearts at Tynecastle in October 1955. The other scorers for Celtic on Rowan's debut were Willie Fernie and Mike Haughney, with a Dundee own goal making it four.
