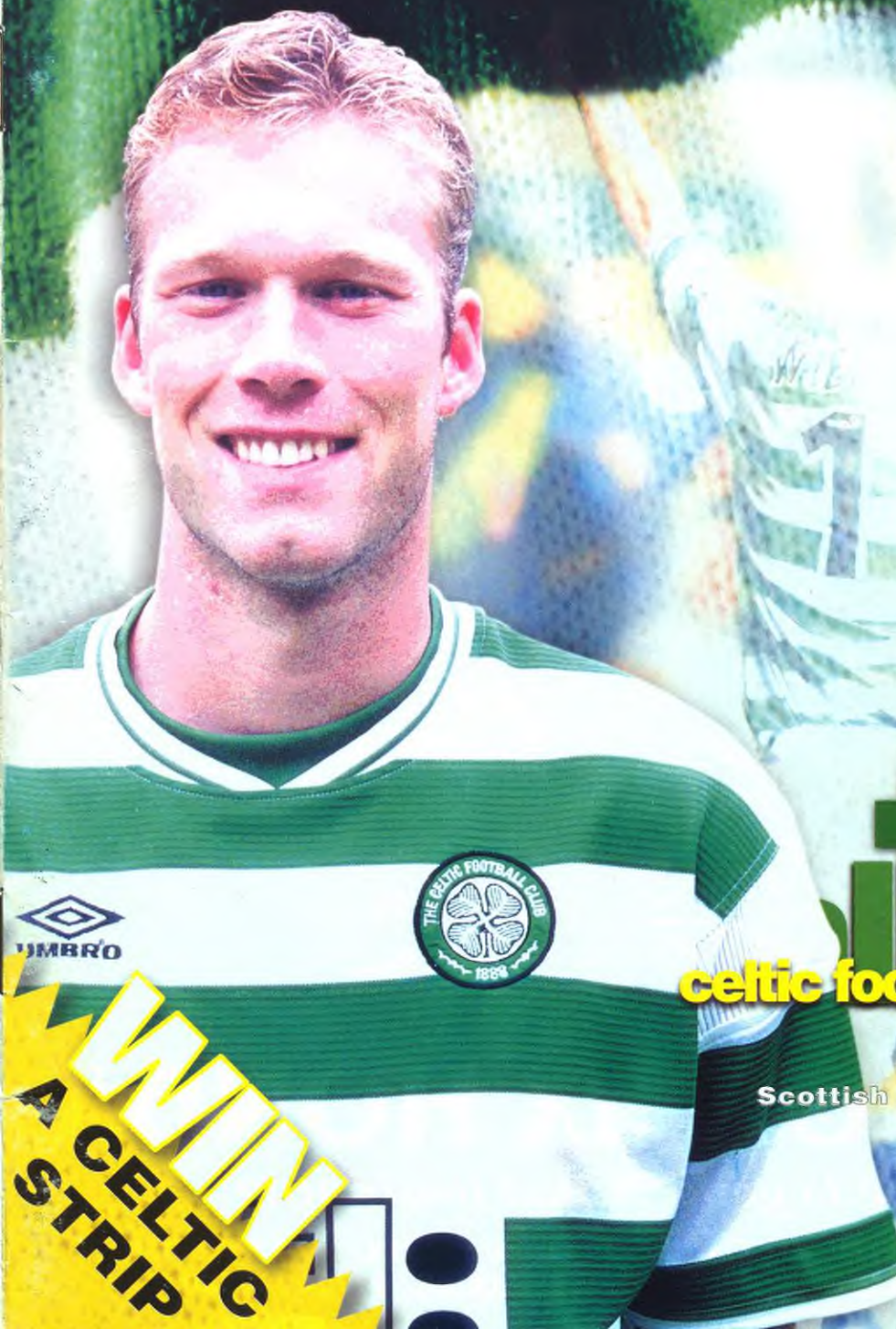

TODAY'S visitors Hibs are in better shape after their 2-0 win over Aberdeen at Easter Road last time out.

That win arrested a mini slump for Alex McLeish's men, who will, as ever, be fired up for their trip to Glasgow. Walk On takes a look at their main men.

OLAFUR GOTTSKALKSSON - Born 12/03/68

Signed in July 1997 from Icelandic club, Keflavik, Olly Gottskalksson is a commanding figure in goal and was the club's only ever-present during the whole of the 1998/99 season.

DEREK COLLINS - Born 15/04/69

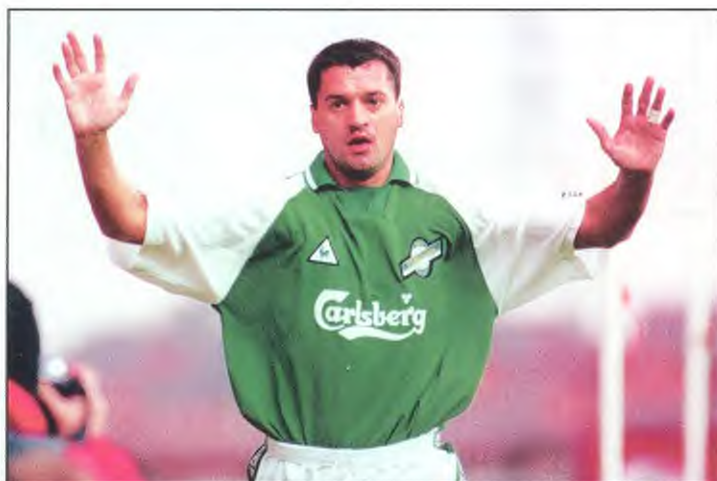
Derek is an experienced full back who played most of his career with Morton before signing for Hibs in December 1998. He made his debut in the 3-0 win against Clydebank.

PAUL LOVERING - Born 25/11/75

Signed from Clydebank in October 1998, this left-sided young player has quickly established himself as fans' favourite with his energetic, non-stop style.

FRANCK SAUZEE - Born 28/10/65

Franck joined Hibernian in February 1999, from French side Montpellier on a free transfer. The talented Frenchman has a cupboard full of medals including a European Cup Winners' Medal from 1993. He started his senior career at the age of 17, with previous clubs including

Marseilles, Monaco and Atalanta.

JOHN HUGHES - Born 09/09/64
Signed from Celtic in October 1996, Yogi is a natural leader on the park. An uncompromising tackler, he also has the knack of scoring vital goals. He went to Celtic from Falkirk after spells at Berwick Rangers and Swansea City. A local man and lifelong Hibernian fan, John is the club captain.

SHAUN DENNIS - Born 20/12/69
Shaun Dennis joined the Club in January 1997 from Raith Rovers, his only other senior club, and with whom he won a Coca-Cola Cup winners medal in 1995. The 6ft 1in central defender made his debut for

Hibernian against Motherwell. Shaun has one Scotland u-21 Cap.

STUART LOVELL - Born 09/01/72

Stuart signed in June 1998. He has played as a striker and as an attacking midfielder, and his bustling, all-action style and eye for goal has helped him establish a rapport with the supporters. He joined Hibernian from Reading.

STEVIE CRAWFORD - Born 09/01/74

Stevie Crawford joined Hibernian from Millwall in July 1997. He began his career at Raith Rovers and quickly established himself as

one of the country's best young strikers. He won the Coca-Cola Cup with Raith in season 1994/95 and in the same year he was acclaimed as the First Division player of the Year in Scotland. His one full Scottish Cap was gained against Ecuador in 1995.

MIXU PAATELAINEN - Born 03/02/67

Mixu was signed from Wolverhampton Wanderers in September 1998, returning to Scotland for the second time in his career. The talented internationalist moved from Finland to Scotland in 1987 and played for Dundee United and Aberdeen before moving to England. He has over 50 caps for his country.

RUSSELL LATAPY - Born 02/08/68

Russell signed in October 1998 having played in Portugal for several years for Porto and Boavista. He has represented Trinidad and Tobago from under 14 to senior level, and has amassed more than 100 full caps. Russell was named Scottish Football League Division One Players' Player of the Year in 1999.

PAT MCGINLAY - Born 30/05/67

Pat returned to Easter Road in November 1994, after two years with Celtic. A dynamic and powerful midfielder, he was a member of the League Cup winning side of 1991. He is the club's longest-serving player.

DIRK LEHMANN - Born 16/08/71

Dirk, a tall, right-footed striker, was signed before the beginning of the season 1999/2000 from Fulham. The German striker has played at a high level in both Germany and Belgium, where his former clubs include Cologne and Lierse SK.

MICHAEL RENWICK - Born 29/02/76

Michael joined Hibernian as a 16-

year-old trainee professional. The defender was voted Young Player of the Month for February 1998.

FABRICE HENRY - Born 13/02/68

Fabrice Henry signed for the club in July 1999. The attacking midfielder has played at a high level in Spain, with Toledo and with Sochaux and Marseilles in his native France. He joined from leading Swiss side, Basle.

MATHIAS JACK - Born 16/02/69

The former Bundesliga defender signed for the club in July 1998. The player, previously with Fortuna Dusseldorf, reads the game well and brings top-level experience to the squad.

EMILIO BOTTIGLIERI - Born 13/04/79

Emilio joined Hibernian in 1996 as a 16-year-old from Canada. He made his first-team debut as right

back against Stranraer in April 1999.

MARTIN HUGHES - Born 09/05/80

Martin was signed from Celtic Boys' Club in July 1997, and plays in midfield.

PAUL HOLSGROVE - Born 26/08/69

Paul was brought to Edinburgh in July 1998, and has played in both central defence and midfield positions.

GRANT BREBNER - Born 06/12/77

Grant Brebner first played for Hibernian while on loan from Manchester United during the 1997/98 season. He thrived at Old Trafford and became captain of the Scottish u-21 side. Brebner signed from Reading in August 1999.

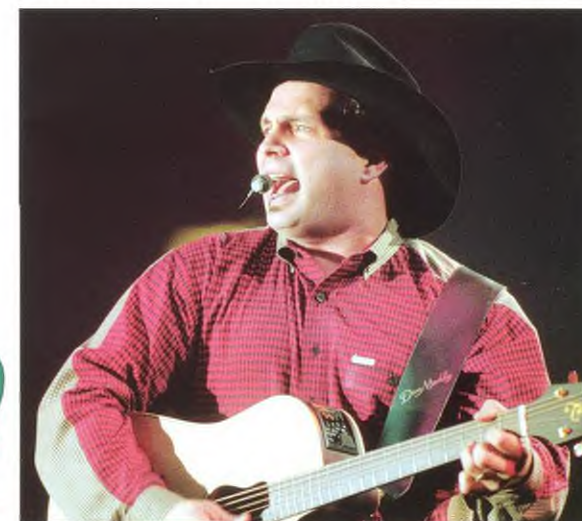

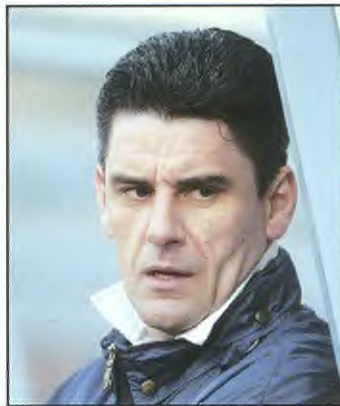

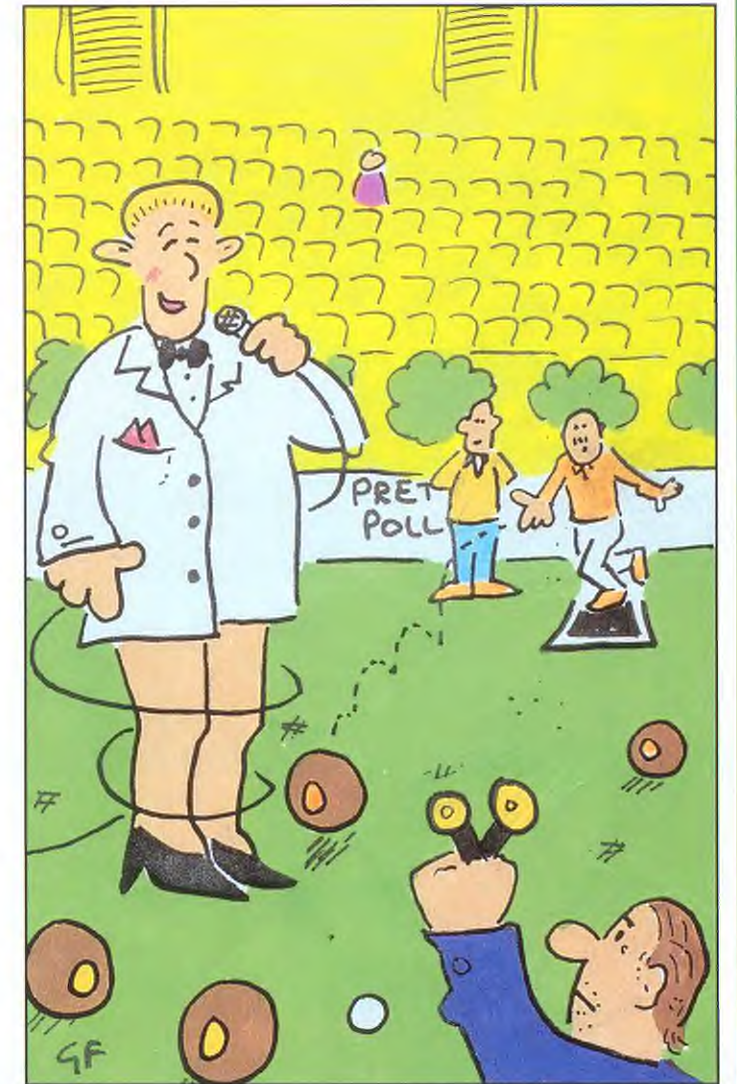

● In MARK Viduka's Celtic career he has made a total of 28 appearances. He has scored in 14 of those matches a total of 23 goals. Up until the Motherwell match on Sunday, when Mark Viduka scored Celtic won and won handsomely. In those initial 13 matches he scored in, Celtic netted a total of 55 goals and conceded just 4.

● Hibernian's last visit to Celtic Park was on 25th April 1988 when the match ended goal-less. The result was a blow to Celtic's Championship aspirations and a boost to Hibs' battle against relegation. However, come the end of the season Celtic were to finish Champions and Hibs were relegated.

● The attendance at the above match was 50,034, a record for a Premier match between Celtic and Hibernian. That record should be broken this afternoon.



THE TEAMS IN ACTION....

● Hibs' clean sheet on their last visit here, was only their second in the league at Celtic Park since 1985.

● Celtic are just two short of 100 home Premier goals against the Hi-bees in the Premier League, a total higher than any other visiting team. In second place are Hearts (83) followed by Motherwell (77).

● Hibernian have won just one of the last 21 league meetings with Celtic. That was the opening fixture of the 1997/978 season when

the one and only Chic Charnley scored the winner at Easter Road.

● Hibernian's last win at Celtic Park was on 12th September 1992, when they came through 3-2. Twice Celtic led through Dariusz Wdowczyk and Paul McStay, but Hibs came back with goals from Keith Wright, Darren Jackson (pen) and Gareth Evans.

● Hibs have appeared in 10 Scottish Cup Finals. They won the first two against Dumbarton in 1886/87 (2-1) and Celtic 1901/02 (1-0). However, they have lost in their last eight final appearances.

This season's Walk On features **DAVID W POTTER'S** complete history of Celtic through the decades right up to the Millennium...today, 1940-1945

Arguably, Celtic's worst years in their history were the years of the Second World War.

The demise of Willie Maley in 1940 meant the elevation of Jimmy McStay. McStay had been a fine captain of Celtic a decade earlier, and since his departure he had managed in Ireland and then had taken Alloa Athletic to promotion. He was a good Celtic man and seemed to have all the credentials for the job. He does however, remind one of the Roman Emperor of whom it was said: "... everyone would have thought that he was capable of being Emperor ... if he hadn't been Emperor."

The odds were against Jimmy from the start. The circumstances were unusual and unreal. There was no Scottish Cup, and no Scottish League - both closed down for the duration. Players were not always available because of the restrictions of war time transport and the demands of war work. Quite a few like Willie Lyon had joined the Armed Forces. Team selection was often a hit or miss, and no long term planning or even organised training sessions were possible.

But these factors affected everyone. Celtic's particular problem lay in the inexperience of McStay in dealing with them. Maley was a hard act to follow. The only man who had ever managed Celtic was Maley, and he was now gone.

The fine 1938 team had now broken up. Delaney was still there, but took a long time to recover from a badly broken arm sustained in a game against Arbroath in April 1939. He seemed to lose form when he did come back, and in any case struggled to bring out the best in some of the team-mates who were honest, hard working and determined but lacked the flair and

ability that men like Crum had possessed.

McStay had an early success when Celtic won the Glasgow Cup in 1940, but after that the only other victory came in the Charity Cup in 1943. The rest of Celtic's performances can be described as mediocre at best, and one particular horror must be recounted, namely the 8-1 defeat at the hands of Rangers on New Year's Day 1943. It is just as well that the war years are considered unofficial by football historians!

Yet there were a few bright spots on the horizon as well. Bobby Hogg and Malcolm MacDonald turned in some good performances. An excellent goalkeeper called Willie Miller was unearthed and youngsters like John McPhail, Pat McAuley and Bobby Evans were blooded. Season 1944/45 saw Celtic finishing strongly following a 1-0 victory over Rangers on New Year's Day, but this was sadly not enough to catch up with the strong Rangers side who dominated War-time football.

VE Day came in May 1945, and a few days later a Victory in Europe Cup was played for. Queen's Park took the field against Celtic when Rangers refused. Celtic won, but only by the expedient of counting corners, for replays were not allowed.

Thus Celtic won something, but it was not enough to save Jimmy McStay. Whether he resigned or was sacked is a moot point, but it mattered not.

By the start of the new season, Jimmy McGrory would be in charge.

It is only right and proper that no one in John Barnes' team wants to talk openly about Rangers while Celtic are four points off the pace having played a game more.

But irrespective of who does or doesn't want to think about Rangers when all isn't well at Celtic Park must still take heart from their recent shortcoming at Ibrox.

To think that Dundee, favourites for the drop at the start of the season, can come down to Glasgow and beat Rangers in their own backyard is remarkable.

Some pundits and 'experts' proclaimed openly that Dick Advocaat's men would go through the domestic calendar suffering nothing more serious than the odd draw.

But they have been beaten and if Celtic are to win this championship they have to be beaten again. Barnes and Celtic at large must take heart from Dundee's victory and hope that more League teams will do the same.

No one can argue that the primary challenge for Celtic is to sort out themselves and get their own house in order.

But is it really a crisis we are in the midst of at Celtic Park? Or is it nothing more than a few bad results which even, God forbid, Rangers will encounter?

The tabloids would have us believe the former and given half a chance the old cracked Celtic crest will be filling the

back pages of the sports sections before long!

Celtic travelled to Ibrox and lost to Rangers when in an Old Firm game you would normally tend to favour the home side. So there were no surprises there.

Before that they went to Lyon played well and lost which is a familiar tale and came back to Celtic Park, never played particularly well and lost again.

So one bad performance against a top European side was followed by two inept outings against Motherwell which culminated in defeats.

Excluding Wednesday evening's CIS Insurance Cup match with Dundee, Celtic have played 20 times and lost five and are still in with a good chance of winning the League championship. We still have over half the season to go and are only four points behind Rangers!

Where is the crisis in that?

Barnes himself knows there is enormous pressure to deliver success - he knew that even before he took the job.

But the pressure only becomes greater when the 'crisis' tag is mentioned in the same sentence as his name.

Don't mistake genuine concern for this club's welfare and future success or even the share price with the need to sensationalise events in order to increase circulation.

Managerial casualties at a club the size of this one creates endless speculation as Celtic supporters know only too well since Liam Brady left.

Every time a manager loses his job the opportunities to bandy names about is endless and the longer the club takes to fill the void left by the dismissed gaffer the happier the publishers become.

This isn't peculiar to Celtic - if the team across the city were in the middle of a bad spell then they too would get the same treatment. Although probably not to the same degree.

Don't believe the hype. If Barnes isn't up to this job not only wouldn't he have got it but he would never have taken it.

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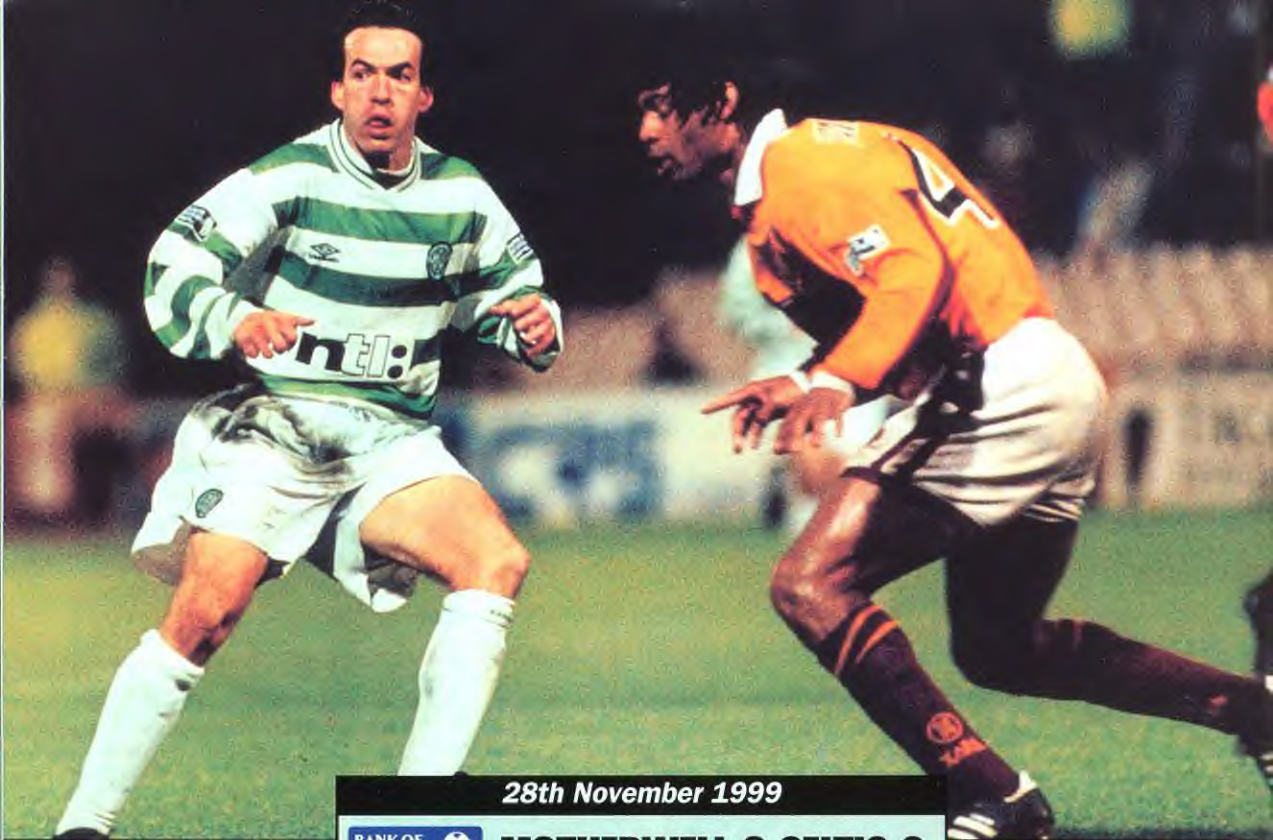

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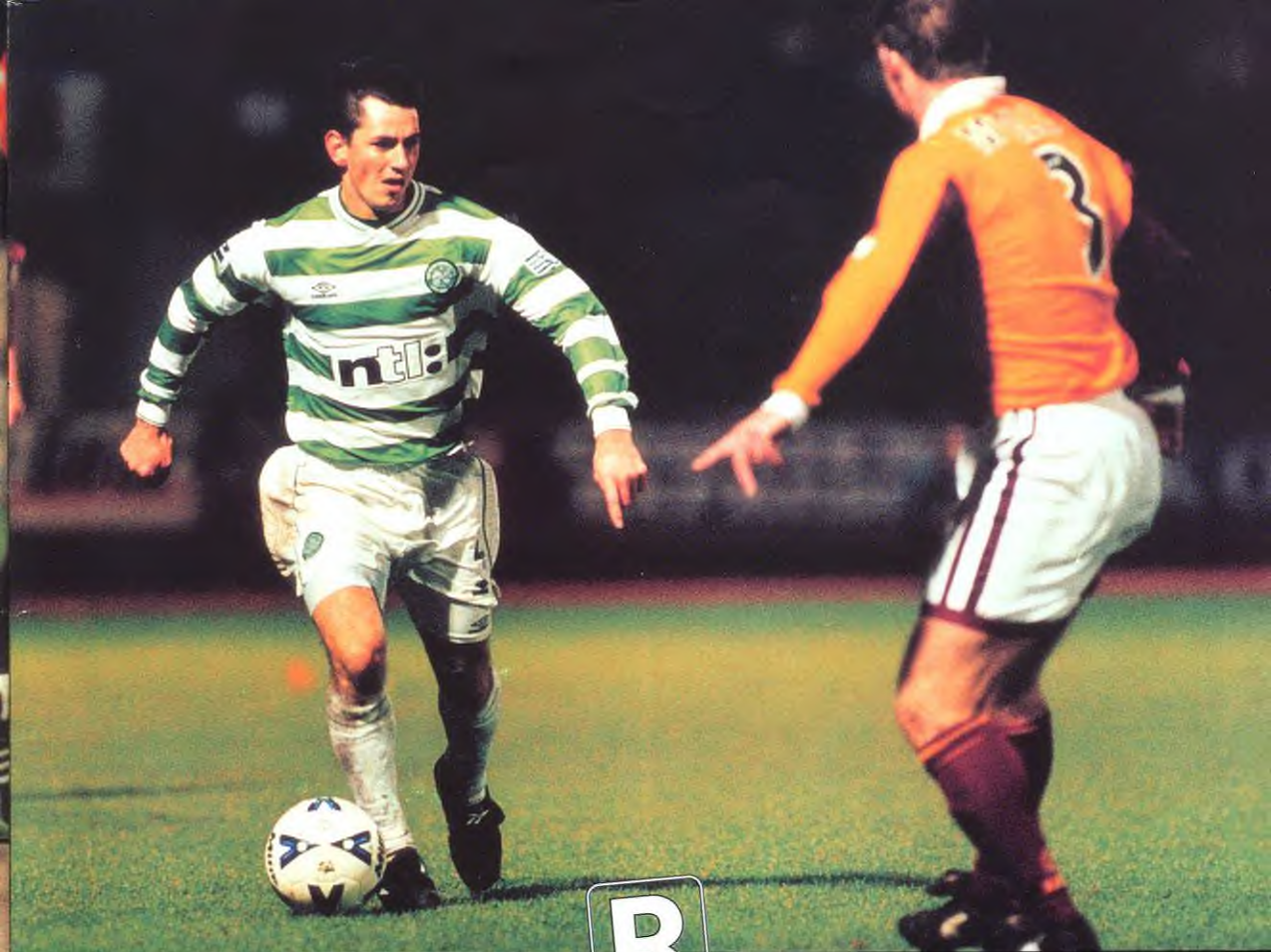


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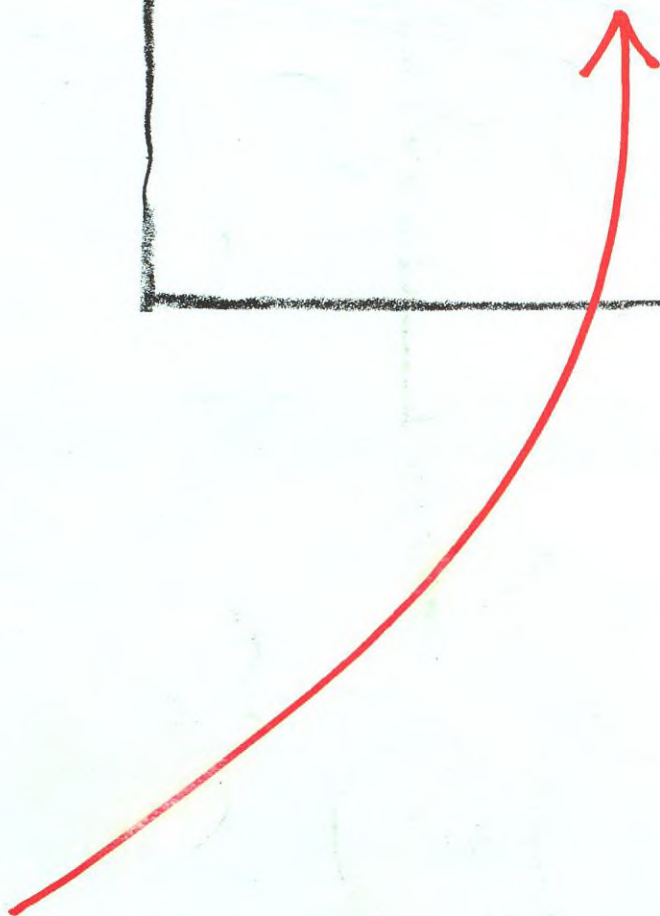
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
