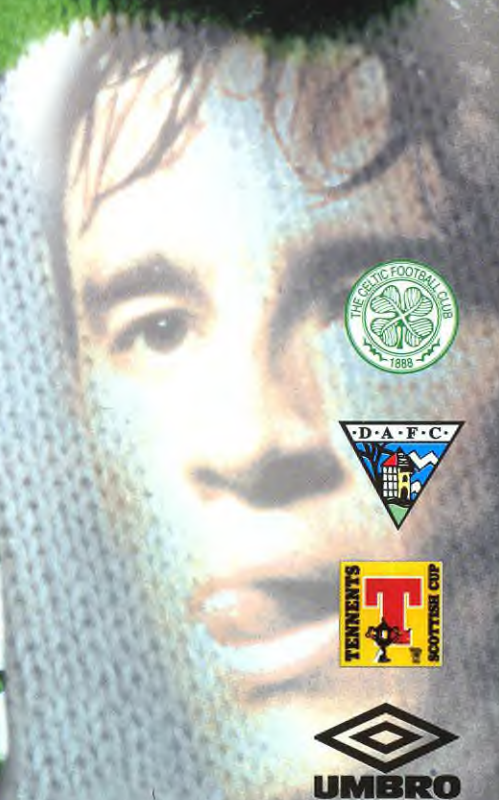

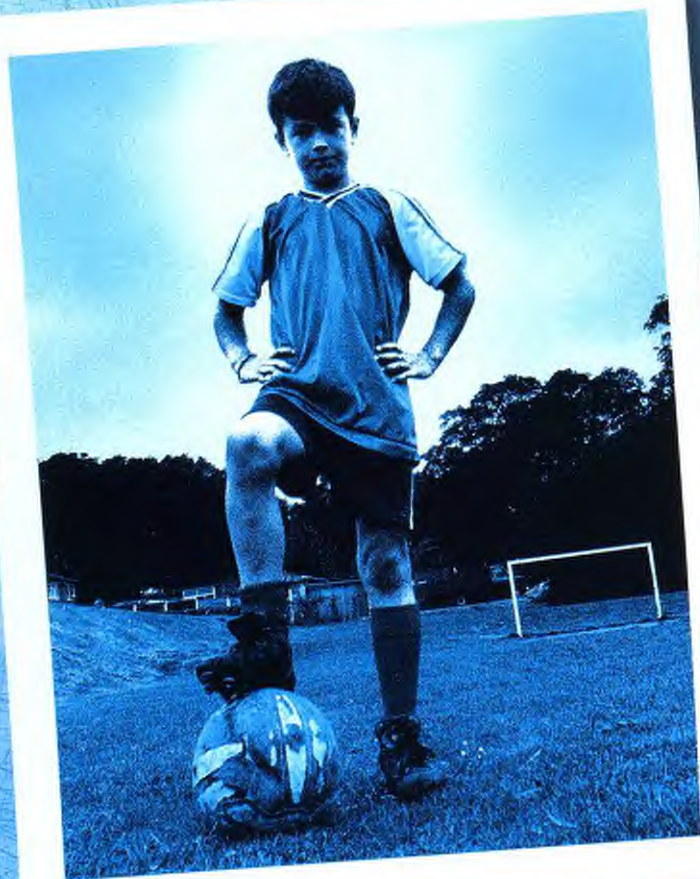

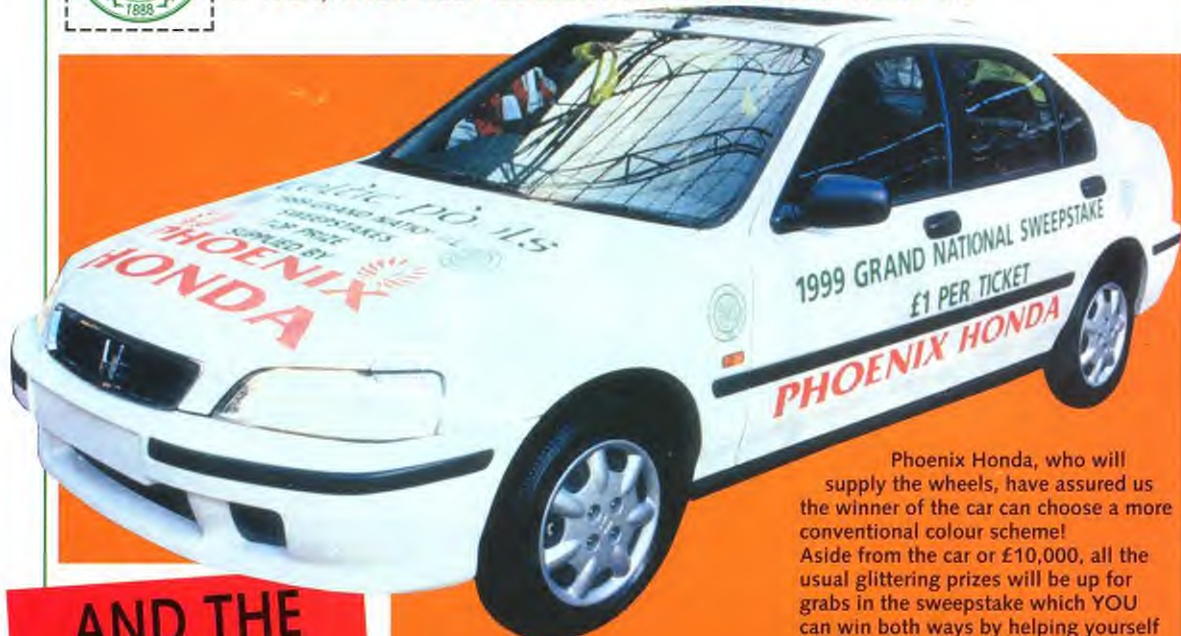

PULL-OVER... Defender Scott McCulloch keeps tabs on Henrik Larsson

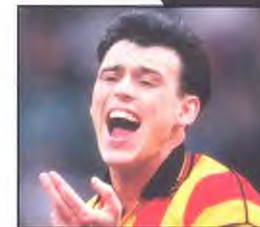

★ Celtic and Dunfermline meet for the 15th time on Scottish Cup duty this afternoon. Of the previous 14 Celtic have won 9 and lost 2, scoring 25 goals and conceding 10.

★ The first Scottish Cup meeting was in 1911/12 when Celtic won 1-0 at Celtic Park in the first round. The Bhoys went on to win the cup for the eighth time beating Clyde 2-0 in the final at Ibrox.

★ The last Scottish Cup clash came just last season in the same round with Celtic winning 2-1 at East End Park. Stéphane Mahe opened the scoring with his only goal for Celtic so far and Harald Brattbakk added a second. David Bingham scored a late consolation for the Pars.

★ The last Scottish Cup meeting at Celtic Park was in March 1990 in a quarter-final replay. The first match at East End Park ended goal-less on the same day that Scotland's rugby team clinched the Grand Slam by beating England at Murrayfield. In the replay Celtic ran out 3-0 winners with goals from Paul McStay (17), Tommy Coyne (22) and Joe Miller (65).

★ The two clubs have met twice in Scottish Cup finals, both in the 1960s. The first was in 1961 when a Jock Stein inspired Dunfermline won 2-0 after a 0-0 draw. This was Celtic's 28th final and 10th final defeat. The second was in 1965 when this time a Jock Stein inspired Celtic won 3-2 with Billy McNeill heading an 81st minute winner. This was Celtic's 30th final and 18th final victory.

★ Dunfermline's only other Scottish Cup win came in 1968 when they won 2-0 at Celtic Park. The Pars

went on to win the cup beating Hearts 3-1 in the final.

★ Celtic's biggest Scottish Cup win over Dunfermline came in the first round of 1932/33 when they won 7-1 away from home. The Bhoys went on to lift the trophy beating Motherwell 1-0 in the final at Hampden.

★ Celtic and Dunfermline have met in just one Scottish Cup semi-final. That was in 1966 at Ibrox, when goals from Bertie Auld and Steve Chalmers gave Celtic a 2-0 win.

The immediate post-war years were grim at Celtic Park, so the arrival of Charles Patrick Tully in June 1948 was a welcome one. He had played for Belfast Celtic and had somewhat of a reputation.

To say that he gave Celtic a shot in the arm is a gross-understatement, for not only could he play, he could also entertain - and the crowd needed both!

His impact was immediate in that he gave Celtic some respectability and a character to whom they could relate, but it would be a long time before Celtic could become a great team.

Tully was able to play on either wing, or indeed anywhere in the forward line. Even when listed in a given position, this often meant very little for he paid scant regard to where he was meant to be.

He dribbled, he teased, he scored goals, he clowned and created a cult following for himself. He was simply Charlie Tully.

Yet it would be wrong to paint a totally rosy picture of Celtic under Tully.

He did overplay the ball, often on occasions trying unsuccessfully to score a goal when there were other men better placed waiting for a pass, and there is a certain amount of evidence that he was not held in anything like as high regard in

the dressing room as he was on the terraces.

More than once stories emerged about fisticuffs at training, and Tully was either involved or not too far away.

He was magnificent in season 1953/54 when Celtic won the League and Cup double, and he played a fine part in the 7-1 thrashing of Rangers in October 1957.

His most famous occasion

was the time in 1953 when he scored direct from a corner at Falkirk, was ordered to take it again by a fussy referee, then did exactly the same thing the second time.

He won 10 caps for Northern Ireland.

A vastly under-rated winger who had all too short a career for the team was John Higgins - a fast, speedy winger who could cut inside and take a goal.

Jinking into the history books

John played a vital part in the 1954 winning team, but had his career cut short by a recurring knee problem.

On the left at this time was Neil Mochan, commonly known as the Cannonball Kid because of his mighty shot.

Mochan, a player who could play all over the forward line, was probably happiest on the left wing, yet he was scandalously under-used by the Celtic management.

A feature of the lean years of the late 1950s and early '60s was the failure to produce a winger, other perhaps than Stevie Chalmers who would of course make his name elsewhere in the forward line.

Conversely, John Hughes whose glory days would be on the left wing, was first tried as a none too consistent centre forward.

In truth, in football generally, the days of the winger were fast coming to an end - but Celtic had one great one yet to come.

The poor Celtic team of 1963 had battled their way through to the Scottish Cup Final to play Rangers.

On a wet day, the club surprised its followers by giving a

game to a young redhead called Jimmy Johnstone who had only played twice before.

The youngster may have been overawed by the occasion, but on several occasions he gave the ponderous Rangers defence a roasting as Celtic earned a credible 1-1 draw.

Several times during the second half as the wind and rain swept East Terracing, we felt that if only Celtic would give the boy more of the ball, he might just have won the day for us.

Ludicrously, the management then dropped him for the replay, and the 3-0 defeat remains one of Celtic's darkest ever nights.

Even when Jock Stein arrived in 1965, there is evidence to suggest that the Big Man considered him disposable.

But, gradually, in spite of many "misunderstandings" the two of them combined to give Scottish football arguably its best ever player, and one who lasted the course a lot better than others.

The difference between Johnstone and everyone else was, quite simply, that Johnstone was a natural.

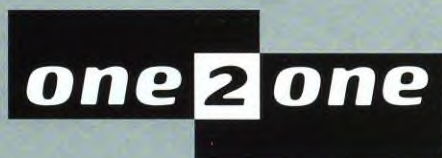
He was the last truly great Celtic winger.

This afternoon Celtic Park attendance figures should crash through the 1.1 million figure for the first time in living memory.

This includes friendlies and cup ties but in the bread and butter of league business, Celtic have averaged some 59,112 fans every time they've opened for business this season – far and away the best figure in Britain – and well within the top 10 in Europe.

All of which merely reinforces the findings of a Teletext poll this week in which Celtic fans were voted the most loyal in the country by some distance.

That it was in all likelihood Celtic fans who voted for themselves is unfortunate. However, the fact is that, until Manchester United build a bigger stadium, Celtic will continue to attract the biggest attendances in the UK.

Moonlight and roses? Well, only partly. As has been highlighted in this column before, there is a price to be paid for the phenomenon of 50,000 season book holders.

When someone – anyone – pays their money up front they are perfectly entitled to take their choice.

If that means demanding the manager's head every time the team fails to score five goals, then so be it.

If that means sitting in virtual silence outwith goalmouth incidents then so be that as well.

And let's not forget the old favourite of streaming out of the ground with 10 minutes to go to beat the traffic.

All perfectly legitimate and allowed. Not, however, particularly helpful to the team.

If honesty prevails then the vast majority of fans reading Walk On this afternoon will expect to do so at half-time with Celtic two goals up. After all, that's how home games have been going recently.

So much so that home comforts



are breeding a worrying trend at Celtic Park – that of almost total silence.

In between goals, Celtic fans seem content to sit quietly and wait for the next one to come along, rather like the number 64 bus.

And yet, when the number 64 fails to arrive the grumblings of discontent begin. And if the self-same bus takes over half-an-hour to come then the grumblings lapse into a foam-induced rant.

And that, you fear, is the curse of the successful team in an all-seated stadium.

Call me old fashioned, but I genuinely believe that football fans were a much more passionate bunch on the old terracing.

Of course nostalgia clouds the memory. There will be many who will recall the days of prostrate figures spread-eagled across seven steps under the severe affluence of incohol.

Or indeed the less than pleasant sensation of a hot liquid running down the back of your trouser leg following an abortive attempt to reach the wall at the back of the ground which doubled up as a toilet.

Post-Hillsbrough no one in their correct mind would advocate that

facilities, as they were, could be allowed to continue in such a vein.

They were dangerous, antiquated and cheated fans who paid good money for mediocre service levels.

And yet, they made for tremendous atmospheres. And that, I fear, is what has disappeared from football these days.

Old Firm games still produce a certain degree of passion of course (not half), but fans now resemble self-satisfied fat cats lapping up the cream and then asking for more.

Or, even worse, like members of the press.

As long as the likes of Henrik Larsson are around of course, the fans will have ample helpings of all that is good in football.

But, as Harald Brattbakk suggested in the Celtic View this week, the law of averages suggests that five-goal hammerings at Celtic Park have to end sometime against somebody.

Heaven forbid that he'll be correct in his prediction today. The Scottish Cup has taken on a new importance for Celtic now with the announcement of the new UEFA Cup place allocations.

However, if sometime in the future the goals do stop flowing, remember recent weeks.

Celtic's fans top the lot!

More than a million punters have clicked through the turnstiles at Celtic Park already this season as Celtic fans have gone on a record-breaking frenzy to leave all other British clubs trailing in their wake.

Since the summer, 1,057,434 supporters have filed through the gates at Paradise. The figure includes friendlies and cup games but even the league statistics, the only true benchmark of inter-club comparison, tell a story to make other clubs green with envy.

In the 12 home league matches this season the counters have clocked up 709,350 times for an average home gate of 59,112.

That leaves other clubs – including the mighty Manchester United and Rangers – standing. Man United's average home gate this season is 55,174 while at Ibrox the figure stands at 49,263.

However, the revolution that is

Celtic continues to roll on and the average league gates here have gone up by a STAGGERING 21.11% on the 1997/98 average of 48,808.

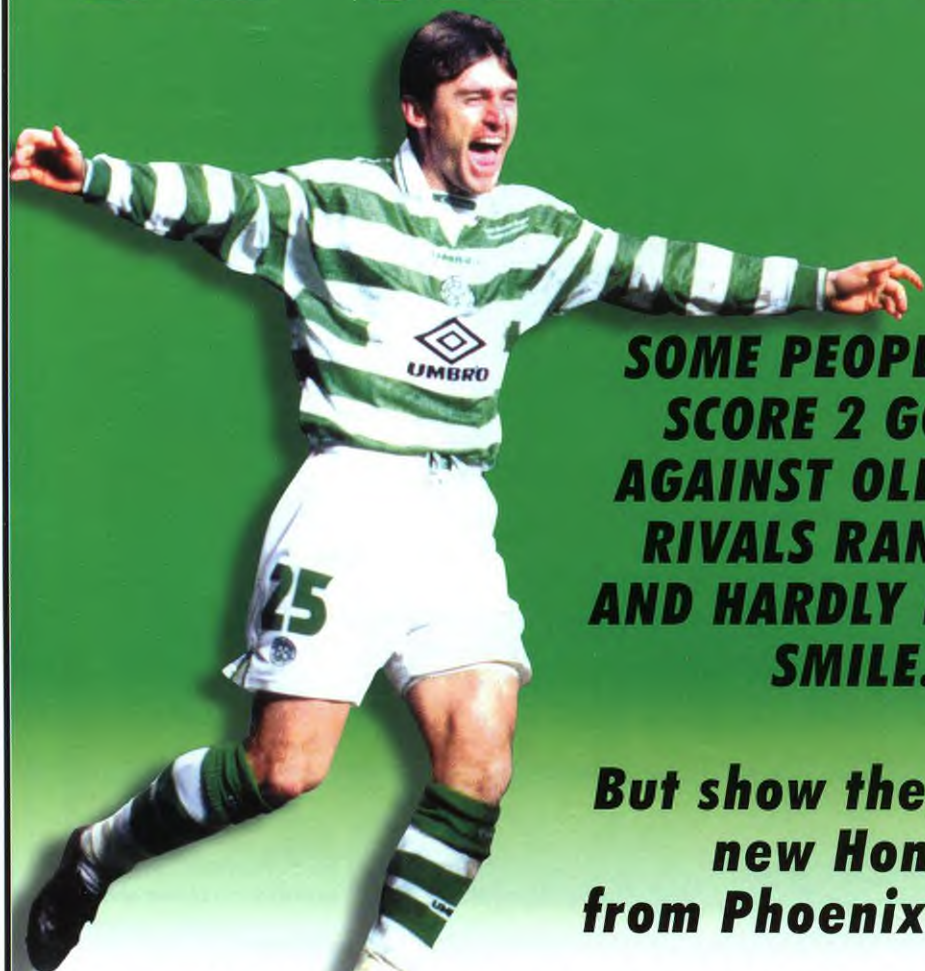
Celtic Managing Director Fergus McCann said: "These figures are not only valuable to the club but gratifying in that the team is playing in front of fantastic crowds against some teams who don't travel with thousands of supporters."

Celtic's lowest league attendance this term was for the St Johnstone game in September when 55,889 clocked through the turnstiles.

However, Celtic's smallest crowd is still BIGGER than the highest gates of Man United and Rangers this season.
