**A WARM welcome to everyone at Celtic Park this evening for the UEFA Cup first leg tie against FK Teplice of the Czech Republic.**

Last Sunday at Firhill we beat Partick Thistle 4-1 and in so doing won our 24th consecutive league game and therefore broke a 44-year-old record which was held by Morton.

It's a record I'm sure most people associated with the club are very proud of it and my own personal view is that it will be quite some time in the future before it is broken again.

During the 24-game run the players have performed magnificently. Victories have come in all sorts of different ways, either scoring early in a game and consolidating victory or coming from behind in dramatic fashion, as we did in the last league game here at Celtic Park against Dundee United.

Scoring 81 goals from those 24 games, I think, shows the type of football the team has been displaying for a long time now. The goalscoring feats and the record will be put to the test on Sunday

against Livingston, but all things concerning our league position will have to wait until then.

Our attention and focus turns to this evening's very difficult game against FK Teplice, conquerors of Kaiserslautern and Feyenoord of Holland – who actually won the UEFA Cup only two seasons ago. Teplice fully merit their place in the latter stages of this season's competition.

As usual we have done as much homework as is possible to know about our opponents tonight, as I am sure they will have reciprocated in a thorough manner themselves.

Tom O'Neill, our chief scout, has been able to see quite a lot of them in recent weeks and holds them in very high regard. A few changes have taken place in their ranks since victory over Feyenoord but they have added much quality since December and this will be a closely fought tie.

Neil Lennon misses the game this evening and the return leg next week also. We are disappointed not to have his services. He has been having a

magnificent season so far and I believe is finally getting the recognition that he deserves.

Shaun Maloney will be another absentee this evening. He injured his knee on Monday afternoon's under-21 game but as I write these notes we don't know the extent of the problem.

Shaun changed the game for us against Dundee United otherwise we would have no record to cherish. I am hoping both he and Jackie McNamara sign new contracts at the end of this week.

Seville was a wonderful experience last year but already fading from the memory. At this moment we are a million miles away from any possible repeat. We will need all the help we can get from you this evening.

European evenings, as I've often said, are special occasions at Celtic Park. We will need another special evening to have a chance next week.

## CELTIC FACTS

● On 22nd February, in different years, two long-serving Celts made their debuts. In 1975, against Hibs, Peter Latchford made the first of his 272 appearances; while in 1986, against Hearts, Derek Whyte played the first of his 276 in the Hoops.

● In a Scottish Cup tie against Clyde at Shawfield, on 23rd February 1959, Celtic beat Clyde 4-3 after extra-time. In the club's long history, this was only their third extra-time victory.

● Two goals by inside-right Jim Blessington against Rangers at Parkhead on February 24, 1894 sealed Celtic's second successive championship.

● On the same date in 1990, Tommy Coyne scored the only goal of the game as Celtic knocked Rangers out of the Scottish Cup at Celtic Park.

● On 25th February 1928, Jimmy McGrory made the first of his seven appearances for Scotland in the 0-1 defeat by Ireland in Glasgow. His next showing would be three years later.

● In 1986, on February 26th, Tom McAdam was given a free transfer after 9 years' service. He had made 362 appearances for the club, with 48 goals. At that time, he held the record of scoring the most goals (8) in Old Firm matches since the war.



## FK TEPLICE FACTS

● FK Teplice was founded in 1945.

● The club plays all its home matches at the Stadion No Stínadlech, which holds 18,000.

● The city of Teplice is situated in the north-west of the Czech Republic, close to the German border. It is renowned for the production of glass and ceramics.

● The club was originally known as Technomat 1945-51; Vodotechna 1951-52; Ingstav 1952; Tatra 1952-60 and Slovan 1960-66.

● From 1st January 1995, two independent states were created out of the former Czechoslovakia - the Czech Republic and the Slovak Republic - and from that date, Czech and Slovak football went their separate ways.

● FK Teplice finished 6th in the Czech Republic league last season, with 45 points from 30 matches, a full 20 points behind winners Sparta Prague.

● At the Strahov Stadium, in Prague, on May 27, 2003, in front of a crowd of 5,833, FK Teplice won the Czech Republic Cup by beating FK Jablonec 1-0.

● At the time of going to print, Fk Teplice lie in 10th place in the Czech League, 17 points behind the leaders, Banik Ostrava.

# GROWING IN CONFIDENCE

After coming back from his recent injury against Dunfermline, John Kennedy is starting to cement his place in Martin O'Neill's plans and the Scotland U21 captain is eager to extend his current contract at Celtic Park

Exclusive Interview: ALISON McCONNELL

**JOHN KENNEDY** returned to Celtic's first-team at Firhill on Sunday afternoon as Martin O'Neill's side left their signature on the record books with a comfortable 4-1 win over Partick Thistle that takes this season's total to 24 successive league victories.

It is an incredible statistic and allied to the boasts that Celtic can make on their home turf of having gone 70 games unbeaten, it underlines just how difficult the current team is to beat.

Not that it will allow thoughts to waver on the football park. Having seen off Kaiserslautern and Feyenoord en route to Glasgow, it isn't expected that FK Teplice will exit the tournament gracefully.

The Czech side are desperate to make their mark on the UEFA Cup and Kennedy has reiterated the mantra that Celtic need to be at their best to beat them.

Having started Sunday's game at the expense of Didier Agathe who missed out because of injury, Kennedy will have to wait before discovering if he is in O'Neill's plans tonight, although needless to say he is eager to take any first-team chances that come his way.

“It would be nice to be involved tonight,” he said. “If I’m picked I’ll certainly be ready but if I’m not starting, hopefully I’ll be ready to play a part in the game if I’m asked to.”

“We do have a good record at Celtic Park but I’m sure that isn’t something anyone will really be giving any thought to. You can’t afford to go into any game without giving 100 percent, let alone a UEFA Cup tie.

“We need to go out and give it our all, but this is a team that do it in every game. It would be brilliant to repeat what happened last season in the UEFA Cup, but it has to be a game at a time because when you get too far ahead of yourself that’s where you fall down.

“It’ll be a hard game because everybody knows that they’ve already put good teams out of the competition. We have to go out and show them a lot of respect but give it our best shot and try and establish a lead to take to the Czech Republic next week.”

Having started off last weekend on the right-side of a four-man defence, Kennedy has insisted that he has no concerns about where he is asked to turn out.

His confidence is slowly building as he frequents the first-team more often and the fact that he has been able to step into a winning side has made the learning curve a little easier.

“It was good to get back in again,” he said. “It’s a bit different but the way that I see it is that it’s a

game and I’d be happy to play anywhere.

“It’s been a decent time for me by getting the Scotland under-21 captaincy, which I’m proud of, and then getting back into the team at the weekend. It’s the first time I’ve been back since I got the head knock against Dunfermline and I’m delighted that the manager has kept me in the team.

“I imagine it’ll be a while before anyone comes close to breaking the league victories record again. It’s just one of these things that happens once in a blue moon but

it’s a great thing for the team to have achieved.

“Confidence in the first-team is at its peak just now and obviously it goes without saying that we want to keep the run going for as long as possible.

“My own confidence is good. I feel I’ve been a bit more settled in the last few games that I’ve played in the first-team and things grow from there. I want to stay in the team for as long as I can, get an extension to my contract and keep working away.”

O’Neill revealed last week that he

is keen to tie up Kennedy on a new contract over the next couple of weeks and the defender is eager to keep pushing for his chance.

“It’s been a busy schedule recently and there hasn’t been time to sit down but once things settle down and get a bit quieter I’m sure it’ll come,” he said. “I’m happy to be here and when you’re involved and playing in games, I don’t think there’s any better club to be at.

“The team is great to be play with and I’m happy to be here. We do have a big squad so there are always players prepared to step in if someone else is unavailable.

“I know the manager will want everyone fit and as many players as possible at his disposal so that he has his best team always available to him, but you do always want to take anything that comes your way.”

**A friend mentioned the Bolton Disaster Fund Match. Did any Celts play in it?**

This match - Scotland v Bolton select - took place on August 24, 1946 to help swell the fund set up for the dependents of those killed in the Burnden Park disaster.

This had occurred on March 9 that year when barriers collapsed at a FA Cup match between Bolton and Stoke, causing the death of 33 spectators.

The Scottish team that day was Miller (Celtic), D. Shaw (Hibs), J. Shaw (Rangers), Campbell (Morton), Brennan (Newcastle), Husband (Partick Thistle), Waddell (Rangers), Dougall (Birmingham), Thornton (Rangers), Hamilton (Aberdeen), Liddell (Liverpool).

This was a golden age for crowd figures. When the English league started a week later, six clubs - Chelsea, Everton, Wolves, Sunderland, Aston Villa and Spurs - all recorded attendances of over 50,000.

**IS it true that Ayr United once beat both halves of the Old Firm in the same month?**

Yes in season 1959/60. The Honest Men firstly beat Rangers 3-0 in October 1959 at Ibrox; and on November 7, at Parkhead, they did the double, beating Celtic 3-2.

At the end of the season, Rangers were in third place in the table, Ayr eighth and Celtic ninth.

**WHO was the first Celtic player to 1) play for Scotland at Wembley and 2) score for Scotland at the same venue?**

The first Celt to play there was Charlie Napier on April 9, 1932, when England won 3-0; the first to score was Bobby Lennox, when Scotland beat the then World Champions 3-2 on April 15, 1967.

But an ex-Celt was quicker to the score-sheet, Tommy Docherty netted one as the Scots went down 7-2 in 1955.

**WAS the team which won the Empire Exhibition Trophy in 1938 an all-Scots side?**

No. Joe Kennaway was a double internationalist - Canada and

Scotland - who had been born in Montreal. Willie Lyon, although capped for the Scottish Junior side while with Kirkintilloch Rob Roy, was born in Birkenhead.

**WHAT was the highest score by a non-league team against Celtic?**

John Paterson

Arthurlie beat Celtic 4-2 on January 9, 1897, in one of the biggest-ever upsets in the Scottish Cup.

More recently, on January 21, 1939, Burntisland Shipyard scored three to Celtic's eight in a Scottish Cup first-round encounter.

**CAN you compare McGrory's record to the top English scorer?**

In his career, Jimmy McGrory scored a total of 550 goals, the Scottish record. Arthur Rowley was the top English scorer with 464, followed by Jimmy Greaves (420) and John Aldridge (410), although the latter also got 45 for Real Sociedad.

**In a match against East Fife in the early 1970s, did three Celtic players miss penalties?**

This match took place at Bayview on February 17, 1973, when 11,557 were present to see the 2-2 draw. Bobby Murdoch missed the first penalty; a re-take was ordered and Harry Hood missed that one.

Later in the match, Celtic were awarded another penalty and Kenny Dalglish missed.

## They've never been one of the bigger names in Czech football but with the scalps of Kaiserslautern and Feyenoord already taken, FK Teplice are looking to add to their growing reputation

**THE Teplice stadium is called 'Stinadla – Gallows' and this season it has turned out to be have been fatal for German side Kaiserslautern and former UEFA Cup holders Feyenoord.**

The Czech side's sensational European campaign has forced many German and Dutch fans to take a look at a map to find out a new football name.

It actually takes a one-hour journey north from the capital Prague to the town renowned for its old spa and glass industry. No doubt football has become another symbol for the 53,000 inhabitants

who proudly call their town 'Little Paris'.

### Foundation in 1945

The club was founded in May 1945. Before that there was only the first division German club Teplizer FK, which ceased to exist after the war. The four founders – Rudolf Cajthaml, Václav Anft, Josef Jirásek and Zdenek Steflík founded SK Teplice Sanov that became successful soon after its birth. The promotion to the First Division in only three years was a unique record, but darker times were to come. The communist takeover in

1948 changed the entire country and football was no exception – it became a part of socialistic sport.

All the players had to have an amateur status and officially they worked in the patronage factories. This absurd state is still a topic of jokes for many former sportsmen who were officially employees of enterprises – they would often say: "Look at this factory. I used to work there for fifteen years. I have been there once!"

The Teplice club had to change their name many times: Sokol, Technomat, Vodotechna, Tatran, Slovan. All this time they played in



the top league. But worse was to come for Teplice in 1953. The reform of the socialistic sport system meant that the club was relegated to the second league. The reason was ridiculous: there were two teams called Tatra in the first league! The club took eleven years to return to the First Division.

#### **Sklo Union Teplice**

The co-operation with a local glass factory started in 1966 and, with the exception of a short break, it still remains. The club was called Sklo Union – the factory's name – Teplice. The first successes came in 1973 when they made their debut in the UEFA Cup and also won the Czech Cup. In the same year, the club also received a special 'present' – a new stadium. It had to be



finished on the anniversary of Soviet army liberation, but nevertheless it was one of the most modern ones of the era. Stanley Rous, then FIFA chairman, was present at the opening ceremony.

#### **Modern era**

After the so-called Velvet revolution in 1989 the democratic changes influenced the sport club once again in a revolutionary way. The club changed its name again. The company Glaverbel Czech a.s., the successor of the famous glass factory, was the first solid owner setting the aim to build up a fully professional club. The extensive reconstruction of the stadium gradually changed it into one of the safest and most modern Czech stadiums, fulfilling all UEFA requirements. In 1996 the club returned to the First Division.

#### **Brave attempt against Borussia Dortmund**

In the 1998/99 season, the club

finished runners-up in the league and earned a chance to play in the preliminary round of the Champions League. The mighty Borussia Dortmund had to work hard to qualify. Teplice twice lost by 1-0, but after the home performance the players received a standing ovation from their grateful fans. The following UEFA Cup campaign ended in the second round. After knocking out Ferencvaros of Hungary, Spanish side Mallorca proved too strong.

#### **Reconstruction under Dusan Uhrin**

A ninth place finish in the year 2000/2001 forced the club to seek a managerial change. Dusan Uhrin, one of the most successful Czech coaches, arrived. He became renowned after leading the Czech National team to the final of Euro '96 at Wembley. His aim was a long-term reconstruction of the team. Nevertheless he was forced to leave the club. The new coach Frantisek Cipro saw his team reach the semi-

finals of the Intertoto Cup before losing to Bologna.

**Straka a new coach and spirit**

In September 2002, Frantisek Straka took over as the club's new coach. 45-year-old Straka is a former Czech international defender with 35 caps. The highlight of his career was certainly the quarter-final match against Germany in the 1990 World Cup. He played for Sparta Prague, and German Bundesliga teams Borussia Munchengladbach and Hansa Rostock. His coaching career started in Germany with Wuppertal and he also worked as an agent before moving to Teplice. His enthusiasm and charisma earned him great popularity. He lives with his team, and is able to organise the celebrations on the pitch as well as translate what he says to the media from Czech into German and vice versa. As he is always willing to communicate, journalists love him. His time in Teplice coincided with their greatest success: a third place finish in 2002/03, which earned another shot at the UEFA Cup.

**First Round - Kaiserslautern**

Although the league season was far from ideal and 11th place after the autumn half was a clear disappointment, the supporters were pleased by the tremendous successes in the UEFA Cup. The 2-1 victory in the first round match in Kaiserslautern was the first step – goals from Slovakian striker Henrich Bencik and talented young striker Jan Rezek. The team was perfectly directed by midfield general Pavel Horvath who provided assists for

both goals. The defence, marshalled by the experienced Karel Rada with 42 caps to his name, proved to be too strong for the Germans in the second leg. Teplice managed to sneak a 1-0 win, with Bencik sealing qualification in the 70th minute.

**Second Round - Feyenoord**

FK Teplice seemed to enjoy the role of underdog again, this time against the Dutch side who won the UEFA Cup two years ago. The defender Michal Dolezal opened the scoring in the away match in the fourth minute with a well taken free kick. The preceding foul on Rezek resulted in Feyenoord being

reduced to 10-men. It was Rezek himself who added the second. Teplice had a harder time at home as Feyenoord came close on a few occasions. Snoyl scored the first goal for the Dutch, but Teplice were rewarded with a spot-kick after a foul on Rezek, which was coolly converted by Horvath. But Feyenoord put Teplice under pressure and hit the woodwork twice in the second half. Nevertheless the evening ended with fireworks and a celebration comparable to winning the title.

**Transfer window**

European success for most Czech

teams means that the club will almost always lose its best players. This was certainly the case for FK Teplice. Jan Rezek and Petr Vorisek, the Czech international midfielder, were first to go. They were bought by Sparta Prague, the Czech big spenders funded by the money-spinning Champions League. But it didn't stop there. Bencik went to Ahlen in Germany and Lengyel, Kolomaznik, Divecky and Zelenka were also transferred. The fans must have been alarmed – Rezek, Vorisek, Bencik, all the stars of the tremendous European wins were gone. The new acquisitions included Jiri Kowalik, last season's top scorer, who was brought in to replace Rezek. But Kowalik was prevented from taking his place in the side after a debate with his former team, leading to doubts over his fitness. Jiri Masek from Jablonec was bought to accompany him in attack. Sparta Prague squad player Pavel Krmaz arrived to boost the midfield. Former Slavia Prague player Pavel Kuchar was signed at the last minute after he failed to make the breakthrough in Russia.

#### Horvath's injury

Before the league restart, Straka confidently claimed his team was better than it used to be.

Nevertheless Teplice lost the first match against an average Marila Pribram side 1-0. Straka admitted

that he had a sleepless night after the match thinking about the time the newly composed team might need to gel and the nervousness of many of his players in the match. But the next day brought the worst news. Pavel Horvath, the playmaker and free kick expert, had injured his left knee ligament in the match. His lay-off, which means he will miss both of the Celtic games, hit the Czech newspaper's headlines.

#### “It was hell”

Straka went to see the Celtic-Dundee United match. “Their power is tremendous,” he commented. “Celtic could not get into the match for some time and were one goal behind after an individual blunder. But in the last twenty minutes they showed a perfect performance, something unbelievable.” Larsson, Sutton, Thompson, Balde and Varga were among the names he pointed out but he appreciated the entire team. “The team has no weaknesses. Their great advantage is they have been playing matches and are self-confident.

“Nothing will stop them and they will be ready to punish all our mistakes.” He also used superlatives to describe the atmosphere at Celtic Park. “It was hell. I hope this

will be a great motivation for us.” Being asked about the possibility of Celtic underestimating his side he had a clear answer: “No chance. The Feyenoord and Kaiserslautern players might sometimes be moody, but Celtic are better than those clubs. We will have to give the best performance of our life to succeed,” he concluded.

#### A different team with nothing to lose

FK Teplice will come to Glasgow with a different team, but certainly enjoying the feeling that they have done more than expected. The last Czech team to play against a Scottish club in the UEFA Cup was Viktoria Zizkov, who sensationally eliminated Rangers, who seemed to travel to Prague for a holiday rather than a football match and were punished accordingly. Enthusiastic Straka and all his players know that the third round against Celtic will certainly be a different story.

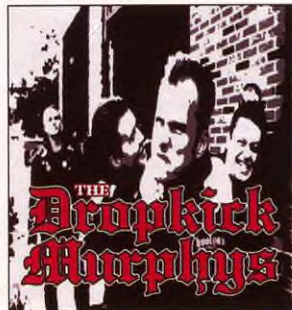

**IN an article in last week's View, about the 1967 match against Dukla Prague in Czechoslovakia, I mentioned the 'Neilly Mochan Walks', a source of excitement and amusement to the players.**

Whenever we arrived in a foreign city and had booked into our hotel, Neilly took us for a walk to stretch our legs, his occasional short cuts causing much hilarity, and occasionally trouble.

The story of our walk through Prague which ended in us heading straight through a troop of soldiers performing a drill was among the most disconcerting, but the funniest came on a visit to Amsterdam.

**The Occasion:** A first-leg quarter-final tie in the European Cup against Ajax in March 1971. We travelled over on a Monday and arrived at our hotel mid-afternoon. After being allocated rooms and swallowing a quick cup of tea, Neilly gathered us in the foyer of the hotel before setting out on our usual walk.

**The Background:** There was always a sense of adventure and tension on these trips but on this occasion, there was an added pressure, particularly for one man.

A group of terrorists from a former Dutch, then Indonesian dependency in the Far East, the Moluccas, were pushing for independence and had threatened to shoot our most famous player to draw attention to their cause. As you could imagine, Jimmy Johnstone was not too happy about this and was reluctant to leave the hotel. However, as there was a posse of armed policemen waiting to cover us on the walk, Neilly persuaded him to come along.

**The Group Assembles:** As we stepped out on to the street, the police guard, suitably armed with some form of gun slung across their necks, formed two protective lines and the players took up positions in the middle. There was one guy in charge and once satisfied that everyone was covered, he nodded to Neilly and he

led us down an adjacent street.

Neilly's walks were not quite as haphazard as they seemed. Even though he had never been in any of these places before, he figured that, if he set out from the hotel, say, for four blocks in one direction, then kept turning left after the same distance, then we should arrive back at base.

To be honest, the system worked pretty well, but it was his short-cuts that proved the problem. And, on this trip, that's exactly what happened.

**The Outcome:** As the large peloton walked along, with wee Jimmy huddled in the middle, Neilly suddenly noticed our large hotel sign and uttered those immortal words: "Let's take a short cut down here." With that, he swerved to the side and the whole expedition had to follow.

Unfortunately, the street he had chosen was in the 'red-light'

district of the city, where the houses on either side of the road were occupied by 'working girls', most of them seated at their windows wearing the briefest of outfits, trying to attract interest.

They must have been as fascinated looking at us as we were at them. After all, a group of men with an armed police escort would have looked strange! Were they convicts? Had they escaped from an asylum?

Anyway, we eventually arrived back at the hotel in one piece - including Jimmy - with another tale to add to the collection of 'Neilly's Walks'. However, I think the experience of seeing all those scantily clad women must have had some kind of negative effect on the form of the team. Two days later, we lost 3-0 to Ajax! The Boss was not happy and took his revenge...but that story is for another day?

# Pulling on the Hoops for the first time is always a moment to savour. Here are 13 men who made their debuts in a European match

**EVERY current or former Celtic player remembers his club debut with pride and affection.**

To pull on the famous hooped shirt and walk out among well-known names is a memory they will all take to the grave.

Some debuts are in important matches, others in run-of-the-mill league or cup affairs, if any match involving Celtic can be described as such.

Thirteen players had their first run-out in European matches, just enough to make up a team and have two substitutes as well.

In the current tactical mode of Celtic, I will lay the chosen team out in a 3-5-2 formation.

## Goalkeeper (1) Ronnie Simpson

Ronnie made his debut against Barcelona in the Fairs Cities' Cup in November 1964, but it ended in defeat.

It was the second time in four years that Ronnie had played against the Spanish giants, as he had been in goal for Hibs when the men from Easter Road played the Catalans in 1960 in the same competition.

Ronnie went on to make 24 appearances in Europe for Celtic.

## Back Three (2) Ian McWilliam

Possibly Celtic's tallest-ever player at 6' 5", Ian only made four appearances in total for the club but his debut –

and only European run-out – came in a 5-0 victory over Jeunesse Esch at Parkhead in September 1977.

## (4) Mick McCarthy

Mick made 64 appearances in total and five in Europe. The first came against Borussia Dortmund in West Germany in September 1987. It was not an auspicious start as Celtic lost 2-0.

## (3) Jim Craig

Yes, I was one of the European debutants. My big day came against Dutch side Go-Ahead Deventer at Celtic Park in October 1965.

I was a dental student at the time and travelled to Parkhead on the number 62 bus from under the Heilanman's Umbrella in Argyle Street, sitting alongside a whole crowd of Celtic fans, none of

whom had the foggiest idea that I would be in the team.

We won 1-0, a result which did not please either the crowd or the press, who gave the team a hard time in the papers the following day, although they were complimentary to me. I went on to make 31 European starts.

## Middle Five (5) Bobby Craig

No relation of mine but Bobby came to Celtic from Blackburn Rovers in 1962 with a very good reputation and made his first start against Valencia at Parkhead in October of that year.

A 2-2 draw was not enough to pull Celtic back from the 4-2 loss in the first leg. That was Bobby's only European appearance in his total of 21 for the club.



## (6) Jamie Smith

A young man full of pace and skill, Jamie made his start against Cwmbran Town on August 26, 1999. He came on to replace Morten Wieghorst in the 4-0 win.

## (7) Jackie McNamara Snr

A good, hard-working midfielder, Jackie had plenty of competition for his place in the mid 70s. He came on as a sub against Turku in 1973 and made five European starts in his total of 43 appearances.

## (8) Steve Hancock

Not a well-known name today but

every senior club was after Steve in the late 1960s as he shone for Newtongrange Star, where he picked up Junior Caps and the Junior Player of the Year Award.

Unfortunately, once at Celtic Park, the competition was guys like Macari, Dalglish, Connelly and Davidson and his substitute showing against Sliema Wanderers in November 1971 proved to be his only first-team game.

## (10) Steve Guppy

Snapped up from Leicester City, Steve made his European debut against Ajax.

## Front Two

### (9) George McCluskey

George came up through the ground staff to stamp his name on the striker position in the late 70s and early 80s, scoring 78 goals in his 204 appearances.

His debut was against Valur in 1975, when he came on as a substitute and found the net.

### (10) Craig Beattie

The promising youngster made his debut against Kaunas in August last year and has been on the fringe of the first-team this season.

## Subs

### (11) Dmitri Kharine

The Russian goalkeeper played his first game between the sticks against Cwmbran Town in August 1999.

### (12) John McCluskey

Another McCluskey, this time George's brother, came on as a substitute against Jeunesse Esch in September 1977, the same match as Ian McWilliam.

Unfortunately, John suffered from serious leg injuries and eventually had to hang up his boots in 1979.

# the YOUTH ACADEMY

**PLAYING European football is the pinnacle of a player's club career.**

Obviously international football is a different standard and is seen by all as the highest level.

However, playing in fixtures like tonight is what young players dream of, and is what they are striving for when they are grafting hard on the training park.

As the sweat drips from their brow they can lift their heads, look up at Celtic Park in the distance and visualise what it will be like to play in a European fixture, under floodlights in front of 60,000.

shift’ away. I expect all of our players to put in a ‘hard shift’ when they come into work every day.

Yes ‘work’, that’s what it is – it is their work, no longer a hobby, no longer just a game played for fun, it is their job. If they do their job well the manager might give them a try, if he does, they are one step closer to the dream. That’s the way it is when the rewards are so high.

Not every player in our Academy will make the first-team – that much is obvious. To succeed every player in our Academy has to work harder, train better, and play better than his team-mate if he is to have a chance. Even at the young ages at our Academy, the players need to understand their team-mate is their pal in the dressing room, but he is also competing with them for a place ultimately in the Manager’s first-team. We will help them as coaches as much as we can – but it

will be the desire within themselves that will make the difference.

For those who don’t make it, we will help them find something elsewhere – the release package provided by John Cusley is geared to soften the blow of rejection. Plenty of clubs will take a player that Celtic cannot sign and we have to try and facilitate that as best that we can.

In our Academy we have some young professionals who have done well for themselves so far. They have that great honour of being able to say, at any time in their future, that they were a professional footballer with Celtic.

It is a marvellous thing to be able to say and I hope they appreciate it – I am sure they do.

**IT was a return to domestic action last weekend for Celtic's Under-17 side.**

And they couldn't have wished for a better result as they brushed aside Dundee 7-0.

It was another impressive display from a squad which has so far remained unbeaten against Scottish opposition this season.

And U17 coach Jim McNally was delighted with the performance.

"The team played really well and imposed themselves on Dundee right from the start of the game," he said.

"And even our goalie had to make a good save during the

match so it was a great performance all round."

There were even seven different scorers in the match, another pleasing aspect of the game for the coach.

Paul Hutchinson, Michael McGlinchey, Paul McGowan, Diarmud O'Carroll, Jim O'Brien, Simon Ferry and Charlie Grant all chipped in with a goal apiece and the young Celts even missed a penalty into the bargain.

Celtic led 1-0 after the first period, while in the second period they piled on the pressure with a further four goals.

And in the final 30 minutes, they completed with the seven-goal rout with two more strikes.

The victory was in stark contrast to their previous game – a friendly match against Manchester United at the English club's training ground.

In that game, it was Manchester

United who ran out winners by five goals to one.

But it was still a valuable experience for the young side as far as Jim McNally was concerned.

"It was a fantastic experience for all the boys, even if there was a bit of a shock in losing 5-1, which they haven't been



used to up here against the Scottish teams," he explained.

"It was good to go and play against a team like Manchester United and I think the overall experience helps everyone.

"The Manchester United team were a year older and had one or two players

who had a bit of first team experience in the Carling Cup, and they kept the ball very well, which showed our boys just important that is.

"After about an hour, the score was 1-1, but in the last part of the game, United managed to score the rest of their goals."

Celtic's under-17 side are back in action this Sunday at Shotts, when they play Motherwell. Kick-off is 12noon.

**SCOUTING CERTIFICATE**

**AS we strive to achieve consistency in our recruitment of young players, the scouts involved are continuing on their quest to gain the Scouting Certificate awarded by the English FA.**

As stated previously, the purpose of the Certificate is to ensure that, as we search for players throughout the UK and Europe, all of our scouts are familiar with the requirements of a player who may go on to represent Celtic at the highest level, in Scotland and Europe.

The scouts log every game they attend and will then be involved in an interview where they discuss their findings, to ensure all are following the guidelines laid down by Tommy Burns for identifying talent who may go on to play in the first-team.

**UNDER 19S**

THE 19s, having returned from Italy, are now preparing for their Youth Cup tie against Aberdeen, which takes place on Wednesday 25 February, at Airdrie.

**LEVEL 2 COACHING**

**LAST weekend saw the assessment of the coaches who have been attending the Level 2 Coaching Certificate.**

The Assessment part of the

course took place last weekend in Larbert, and the coaches are now awaiting the outcome. On completion of the course, the number of qualified coaches in the Youth Academy and Player Development Centres, far surpasses any other club in the country.

**FIXTURES**

**THIS weekend saw the return to scheduled fixtures, with our 11s, 12s and 13s playing Livingston, and 14s-19s playing against Dundee.**

This is the first scheduled fixtures we have had since the last week in November and sees an end to the longest winter shutdown in the history of Scottish football. Although we have played a large number of friendly matches against various levels of opposition, there is no substitute for the real thing. The boys and coaches are desperate for the matches to commence and have been working even harder than usual in preparation.

**UNDER 11S**

A NUMBER of boys identified by our scouts throughout the country have been involved recently with the 11s squad.

Last weekend we invited a number of kids, recommended by the scouts, to take part in coaching and games, with the 11s

squad at the Science Park. Some of the boys were very impressive and will continue to train and play with the squad to enable further assessment, the others will continue to be monitored by the scouts, with a view to them becoming more involved as they develop.

**UNDER 10S**

**THE 10s continue to develop at the Player Development Centres, and represent their Centres on a regular basis at Cumbernauld.**

The games programme brings the boys, from our Centres throughout the country, to Cumbernauld most weekends, to play against each other under the watchful eyes of our coaches and scouts. This is the first step in selecting the 11s squad for next season, and so far the standard of player has been very high.

**TOURNAMENTS**

**THE next tournament for our squads will be during April when a squad of 16s/17s go down to England to play in the London Cup against top class opposition.**

After that during May we have six squads going abroad to play in various tournaments throughout Europe.

## Celts triumph over Czech opposition thanks to Murdoch and Hughes

**CELTIC have only ever played one European tie on February 26 – back in season 1963/64 in the European Cup Winners' Cup.**

And it was a team from the former Czechoslovakia who provided the opposition.

Slovan Bratislava, who are now classed as a Slovakian side since the break-up of Czechoslovakia, came to Celtic Park to play Jimmy McGrory's side in the quarter-finals of the competition.

The Celtic side that night was: *Fallon, Young, Gemmell, Clark, McNeill, Kennedy, Johnstone, Murdoch, Chalmers, Divers, Hughes.*

A crowd of 53,000 packed into Celtic Park to cheer on the Bhoys but it was late in the game before they were rewarded for their vocal support.

Despite enjoying much of the game's possession and attacking Slovan Bratislava relentlessly, it was only in the 71st minute that the Hoops made the breakthrough when they were awarded a penalty.

Bobby Murdoch stepped up and slotted home the spot kick to give Celtic a narrow 1-0 lead to take into the second leg.

In the return game, Celtic left it

even later to score, with John Hughes netting the only goal of the game with just five minutes remaining.

Interestingly enough, in the second leg, Slovan Bratislava included a player in their line-up by the name of Moravcik, though he is no relation to the great Lubo Moravcik who so recently graced the green and white Hoops.

Having successfully seen off Slovan Bratislava, Celtic faced MTK Budapest in the semi-final, and a 3-0 victory in the first leg courtesy of goals from Jimmy Johnstone and a Stevie Chalmers double, put the Hoops in the driving seat for a place in the final.

But a disastrous second leg in Hungary saw MTK run out 4-0 winners to knock Celtic out.

## BIRTHDAY BHOY

**ON this day in 1929, Joe Baillie was born. His life was to be tragically cut short just 37 years later when he drowned in the River Kelvin.**

Joe signed for Celtic in 1945 and made his debut in September 1946, in a 3-1 defeat away to Queen of the South.

A left-half, he played for the Hoops until 1954, though an injury he sustained in 1952 effectively curtailed his career.

He made 151 appearances for Celtic, scoring one goal – against Forfar Athletic.

His greatest success came in the 1951 Scottish Cup, when he was part of the Hoops side which beat Motherwell 1-0 in the final.

Joe, who subsequently had spells with Wolves, Bristol City, Leicester City and Bradford Park Avenue, died in March 1966.
