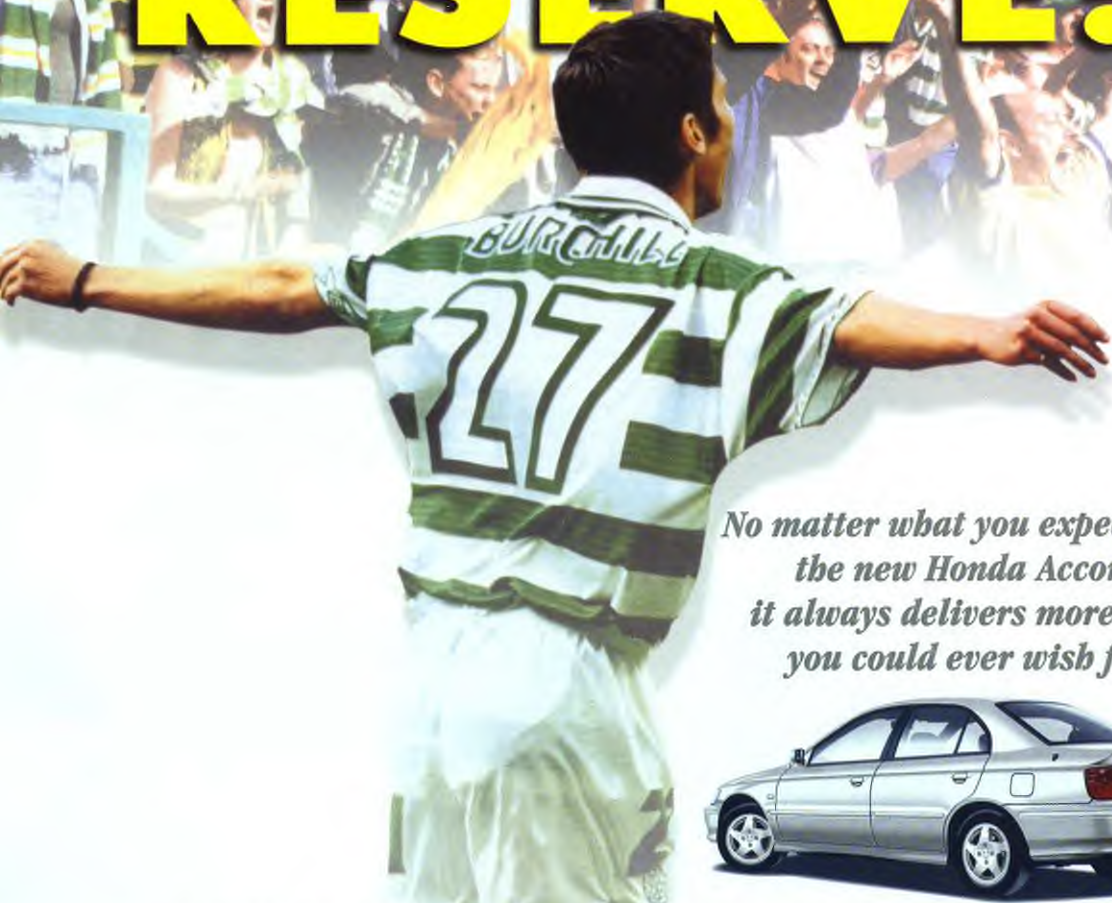

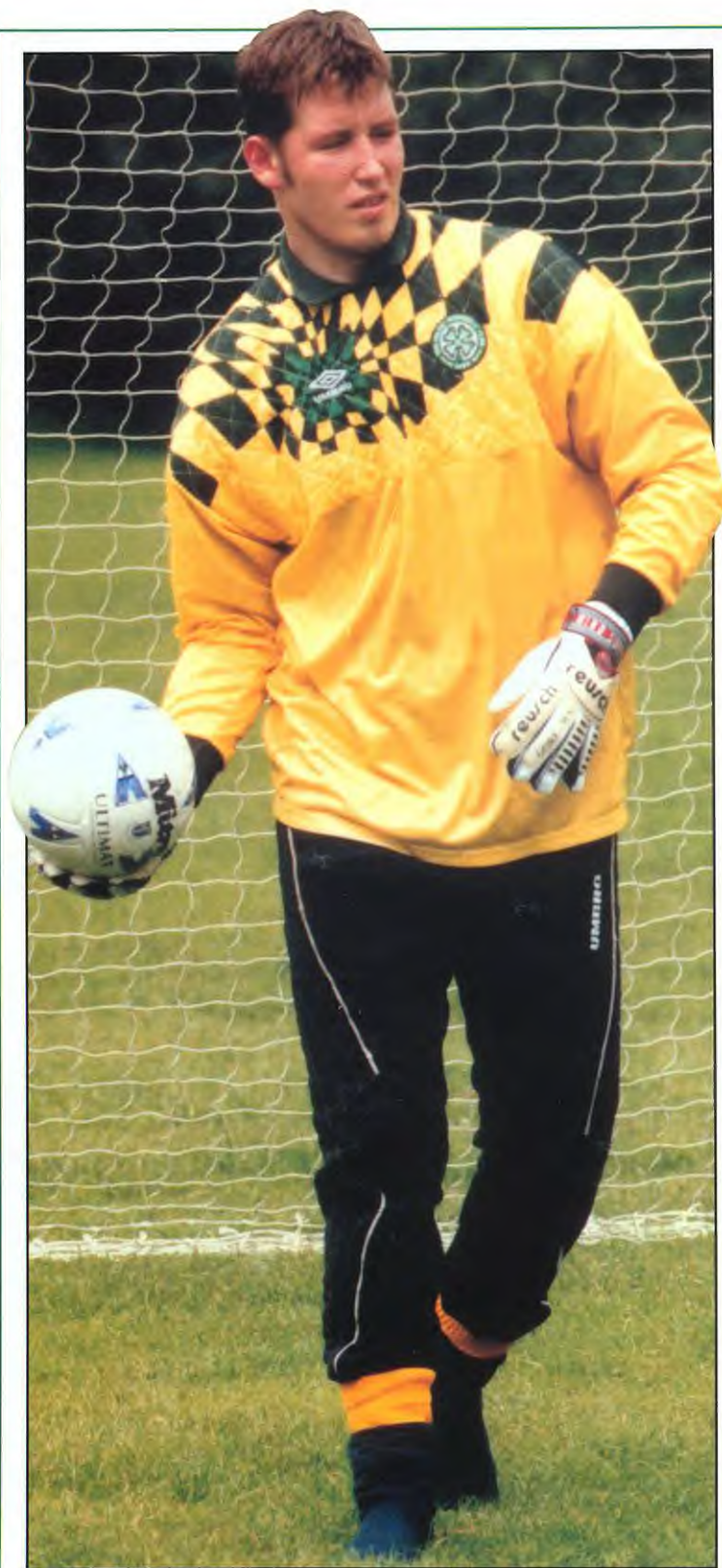

Apparently, at least according to some Daily Record Hotline callers, the angelic young upstart gets away with murder because of his babyface looks.

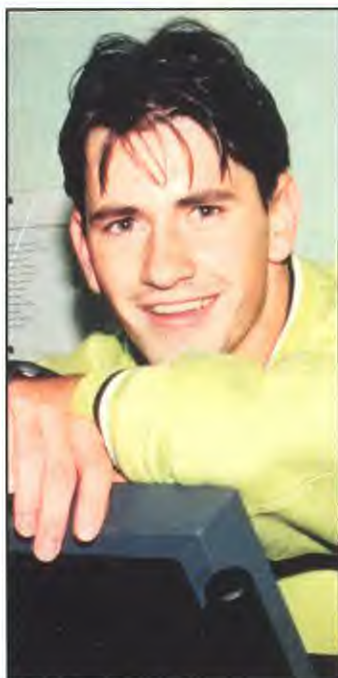
Maybe McNamara should gulp down a course of ugly pills so that he receives his rightful comeuppance from the men who dole out the coloured cards.
