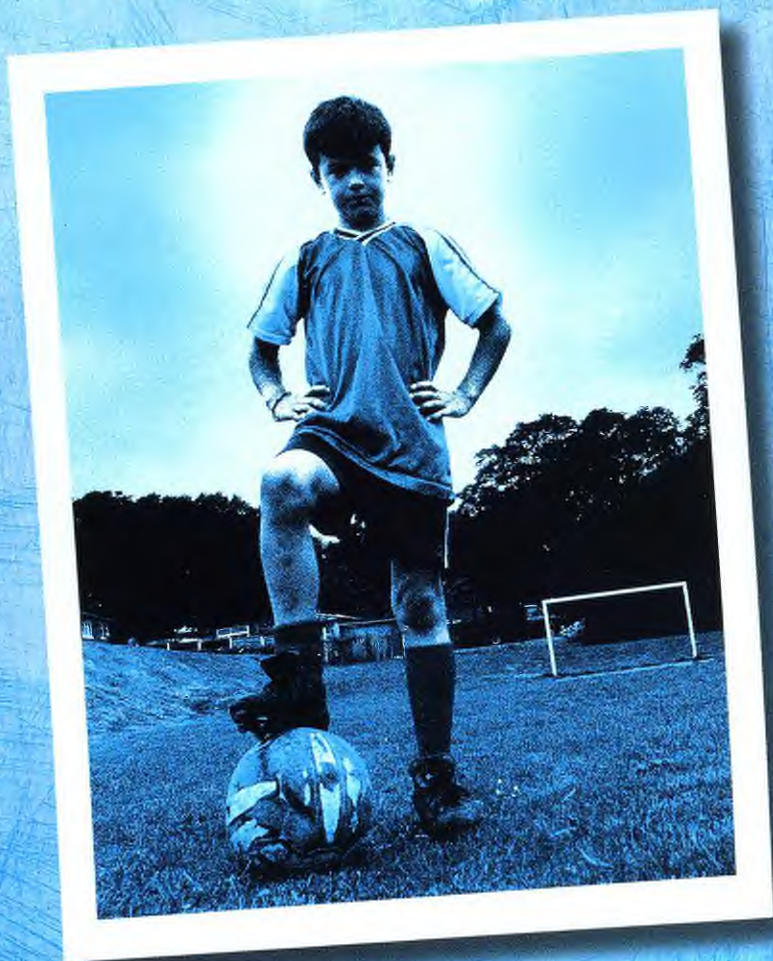

**WO:** A while after that you missed out on another youth tourney when the team travelled to Dallas but you stayed behind, what are your feelings on that?

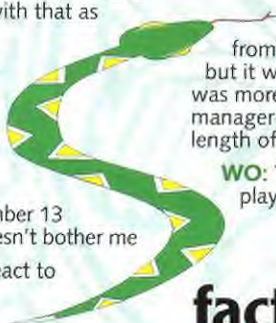
**SD:** I don't have to tell you that I was delighted as I was left behind to make my first-team debut!

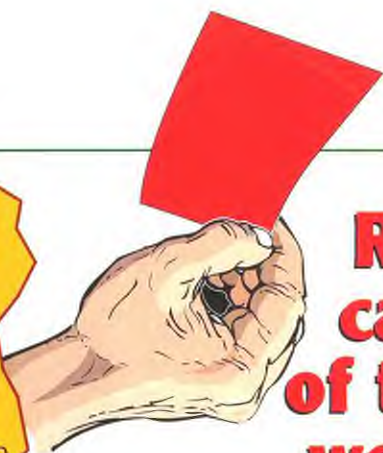
