What we are looking for tonight is a similar performance to the one we put in against Kilmarnock on Saturday.

But that has to come from all of us – players and supporters alike. When we went one behind to Motherwell we never gave the fans anything to shout about.

But at the weekend when we went behind they were tremendous and they could see that we didn't deserve to go one down – they knew we were giving our all.

I don't think they were too despondent and they got behind us in the second half and inspired us to victory.

Tonight we need to make as much noise as we possibly can because we are 1-0 down at the moment and the support of the Celtic fans will be very important.

The first 15 minutes tonight we need to get everyone into the match and I don't expect the game to be much different from the one a fortnight ago.

Lyon are very much a counter-attacking team, both home and away, and I don't expect them to move from that philosophy a great deal tonight.

They won't attack us left, right and centre and I knew that Jonathan Gould wasn't going to have a busy night in the first leg – that's not how they play.

And while we attack them



we'll have to be vigilant and concentrated at the back because they will want to catch us on the break.

get a goal and leave ourselves wide open in defence.

We were very disappointed to come back from France a goal down and we are determined to do what we can to overcome that tonight.

We deserved better than that, but we are only one goal behind and we have to be confident in ourselves that we can score two more than them.

But even if it has to go to penalties then that's fine but we're looking for a result and we need to be at our very best – both on the park and in the stands.

Tonight's Visitors

...The lowdown on tonight's visitors Lyon

Stop this lot and Celts will be Lyon tammers!

OLYMPIQUE LYONNAIS arrive in Glasgow tonight with a reputation for inflicting maximum damage AWAY from home in the French League.

Already 1-0 up from the first leg at their impressive Stade de Gerland, the French league pace-setters arrive on the back of a 2-1 home win over Nantes.

In short, they are flying. But Celtic more than acquitted themselves in the first leg and believe they can overcome Bernard Lacombe's talented collection to make dreams of the third round a reality.

Alphabetically and in the eyes of the Celtic support, Brazilian striker **SONNY ANDERSON** is top of the pile. A £9m signing from Barcelona in the summer the former Marseille and Monaco star breaks quickly – but was well marshalled by Tebily and Stubbs in the first leg.

Defender **JACEK BAK**, 26, is a Polish internationalist and after starting at minnows Motor Lublin he moved to Lech Poznan where he won the Polish title in 1993.

Bak also played in the French League Cup Final for Lyon three years ago but was substituted against Celts two weeks ago.

SERGE BLANC will of course be a name embedded in the minds of

Celtic fans following his double whammy in the first leg. After tangling with Henrik Larsson in the infamous leg break incident, the former Montpellier and Marseille defender then hit home the only goal in the 64th minute.

Right-back **PATRICE CARTERON** is a pal of Stephane Mahe from their days on opposite sides of the same defence at Rennes. Now 29, Carteron loves to get forward but he will need all his discipline to keep Lubo Moravcik in check tonight.

ALAIN CAVEGLIA is regarded as

one of the unluckiest players in the Lyon line-up. He's a regular goalscorer but the 31-year-old was displaced by the arrival of big-money strike duo Anderson and Vairelles.

Keeper **GREGORY COUPET** made headlines of course for his challenge, possibly outside the area, on Mark Burchill in the first leg. Celtic people felt the former St Etienne player ought to have been suspended for this one – the 26-year-old strongly disagreed.

CHRISTOPHE DELMOTTE is a 30-year-old midfielder who

played, along with others at Lyon, in the Lens championship winning team of two years ago.

Young 24-year-old defender **JEAN-CHRISTOPHE DEVAUX** is a product of his club's municipal youth academy, unlike midfielder dangerman **VIKASH DHORASOO**. Despite being in the pocket of Paul Lambert in the first leg the former Le Havre star still played a role in the goal and is rated as more dangerous than Anderson OR Vairelles.

HUBERT FOURNIER is an experienced performer at 32 but missed out on facing Celts two weeks ago through injury. He is expected to return this evening.

Not so veteran striker **MARCO GRASSI**. An effective performer with Monaco, Zurich, Servette, Rennes and Sion the Grassi has drifted out of the scene this season. He played with John Collins and Sonny Anderson when Monaco won the title in 1997.

Reserve goalkeeper **ANGELO HUGUES** will be on the bench behind Coupet this evening, whilst the return of **PIERRE LAIGLE** is also in doubt. Injured for the first leg the talented midfielder played in Serie A with Sampdoria after a spell with Lens.

The Lyon youth academy, whose most famous graduate is Marseille's Florian Maurice, has produced a rich crop of the current

first team – none more so than **FLORENT LAVILLE**. At 26, Laville has been a one-club man, winning a Division Three medal in 1993, playing for France in the Atlanta Olympics and impressing in the UEFA Cup run last season.

An under-17 championship winner with Lyon, **DAVID LINARES** is another local hero and youth system graduate and features in midfield.

Like **STEED MALBRANQUE**, Linares started against Celtic on the bench.

Malbranque, however, made a 53rd-minute appearance in place of Jacek Bak in a midfield role.

Likewise **CEDRIC URAS**. Though three years older than

Malbranque, Uras is a favourite thanks to Lyon roots.

TONY VAIRELLES is a regular in the French international squad and joined Lyon for an estimated £6million in the summer.

Well contained by Celts in the first leg but he will take some stopping tonight.

Finally, midfielder **PHILIPPE VIOLEAU** played in the Auxerre side who overcame Rangers in the Champions League in 1996, going on to play in the last eight.

From there he joined Lyon two years ago and is now a regular pick of personable Lyon coach **BERNARD LACOMBE**.

Lyon have a strong squad but the Hoops can do it.



No doubt tonight's match will see Bhoys fans once again turning out in numbers to support their team.

However, the massive Celtic faithful are being asked to come along to watch the sides down a step on the ladder, and spot who will be the next Mark Burchill to make the breakthrough.

With the under-21s boasting promising stars such as Jamie Smith, Colin Healy and Alessandro Sanna, and the free-scoring under-18s currently topping the league, the youth set-up is entering an exciting new period in its illustrious history.

Both sides now play their home matches at all-seater, covered stadia, with the under-21s based at Livingston's Almondvale Stadium and the under-18s at Scotstoun.

And admission is FREE for season book holders.

Second string matches have, in the past, drawn massive attendances, and the promise of watching the youngsters playing 'the Celtic way' still applies.

Fans can get in the habit by taking in the Old Firm under-21 clash at Almondvale on Monday (k.o. 7pm).

It's a match that under-21

coach Kenny McDowall says promises to be an entertaining affair.

He said: "It would be great for the boys to get a decent size crowd behind them in what is always a special match.

"Almondvale is a smashing wee stadium – the fans will be able to watch the match in comfort, and, hopefully, we can give them some good entertainment on the pitch.

"We have a lot of talented players within our ranks, and Celtic fans have already had a chance to see the likes of Smith and Healy.

"It would certainly give the boys a boost to know that the supporters are interested in coming to watch them, and I'm sure that they wouldn't be disappointed."

Head youth coach Willie McStay echoed his colleague's

rallying call, saying:

"I'm sure the fans are genuinely interested in who will be the next to come up through the ranks, and the only way they can find out is to go to the games.

"It doesn't cost anything if you have a season book, and the games are generally exciting, attacking affairs.

"Whenever the boys have had the chance to play in front of big crowds, they have responded, so it would be nice if we could get more people turning out."

Fresh from thrashing Aberdeen 7-2, the youths began the defence of their Youth Cup last night with a tie against Queen's Park.
