We have to start with **DARIUSZ ADAMCZUK** - not only because he's first in the alphabet, but also because he's the card-shark of Dens Park.

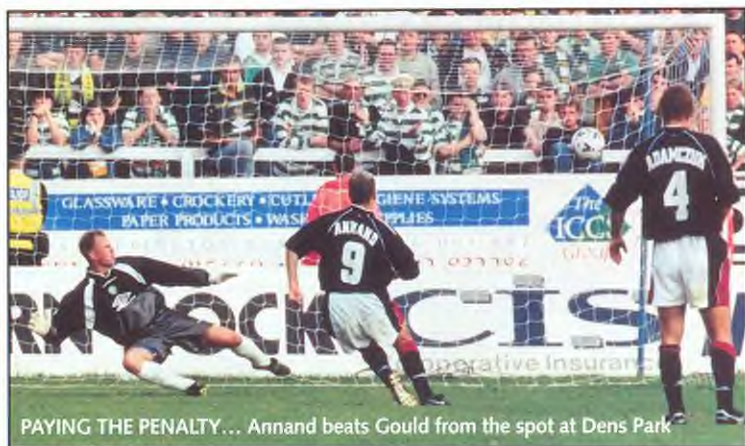

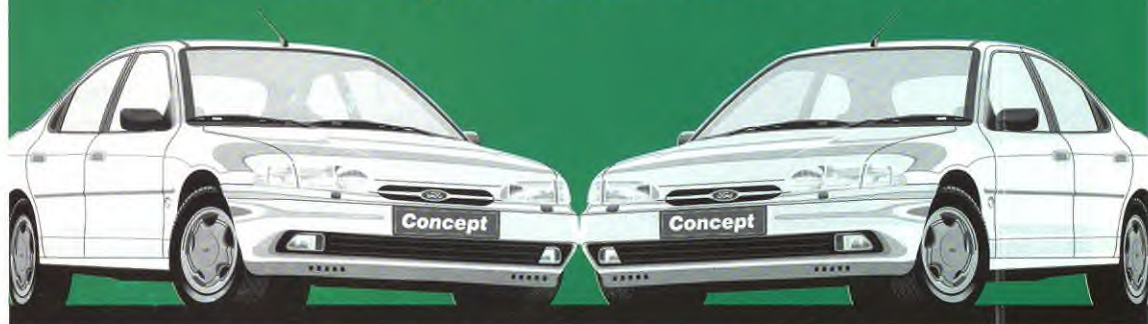
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
