**A WARM welcome to Celtic Park for today's match with Dundee. It is two weeks since our last league game, with the first set of World Cup qualifying matches taking precedence as well as taking some of our players away.**

It is always a worrying time when players are on international duty. While it is an honour for them to represent their country and is also an indication of the quality we have at the football club, there is always the risk of injury in these games and it is only when all the players return to Celtic Park that we can assess the situation and, hopefully, have a full squad to choose from for our next game.

It has been a pleasing start to the season, with four league victories out of four, but given that there are still another 34 fixtures to complete, we are a million miles away from having won anything.

Our previous league games have produced some wonderful moments but also some aspects which we know we have to work on and it is this that will keep the players focused.

Dundee have endured some well-publicised problems off the field but Jim Duffy has done an excellent job in ensuring that has not affected the team on the park, and as with every game against Dundee, we will need to be at our best to secure all three points.

Over the past few seasons, the players have shown that they do focus on the task in hand, whether that is a game before a big European night or a match the weekend after, and today will be no different.

And your support, which I know will be at its most vocal come Tuesday night, is just as important this afternoon.

# No wait problem

With Barcelona set to arrive in town, there is a danger Celtic could take their eye off the ball this afternoon. Ross Wallace insists not

**IT will be difficult for the 60,000 Celtic supporters coming along to Celtic Park for today's game to remain focused on the 90 minutes ahead. Listen closely to the proverbial buzz around the ground and you might just make out the word 'Barcelona' amidst the noise and confusion.**

It is wholly understandable that fans will feel like this. Tuesday night's Champions League match is, after all, the first of several massive games coming up for Martin O'Neill's side in the next few months.

And regardless of the quality of today's pre-match entertainment, it will not be able to compete with the Champions League theme tune or the spine-tingling sound of the Celtic Park faithful singing *You'll Never Walk Alone*.

It must be difficult, therefore, for the players not to have at least indulged in a little wishful thinking about the week ahead.

But as Ross Wallace pointed out, any such thoughts are always left behind in the dressing room.

"You think about Barcelona coming but you have to take one game at a time, and that means

Dundee," he explained. "When today's game comes and you're ready to walk out on the pitch you forget about anything else. You're just concentrating on winning the game that's about to start.

"We'll be going out to win. Dundee have a few younger players and they will match us for effort. Jim Duffy's got the team working hard. He's got good quality, mixed in with youth, but hopefully our ability will show in the end."

While it might be tempting to write that such an attitude, replicated throughout the squad, will come as a relief to Martin O'Neill, it's more accurate to state that it will come as no surprise.

The Celtic manager has, over the past four years, seen how his team have played prior to a big European tie or performed on returning to the domestic stage after taxing exertions abroad. They have not let him down, so when Ross Wallace says that the team is "taking one game at a time," it is not so much a cliché as a truism.

For the young Celt, however, taking one game at a time means,

in this instance, missing today's encounter with Dundee. A slight hamstring strain looks set to rule him out of the action against his hometown team, though he is hopeful of being ready for the Barcelona game.

"I've had a wee run of games so hopefully I can get past this injury," he said. "Obviously, I'm on a bit of a high just now, and though it's just a wee setback, hopefully I'll be fit and back for the Barcelona game."

"I've just got to keep working away. I'm only 19 and have still got a bit to learn. With the likes of Alan Thompson playing alongside me or in training there's nobody better I could learn from."

"He's played there for the past few years. You learn from watching him in training, and we also have Stephen Pearson and Bobby Petta as well."

And if there was anyone else, Wallace could look to for advice on how to successfully play in that wide left role, he need look no further than one of the finest left wingers Scotland has ever produced.

Celtic's assistant manager, John Robertson, has played at the highest level. He has the caps and the



medals to prove it. Video footage also reveals he set up the winning goal in one European Cup final and then scored the winning goal in the following year's showpiece.

"Robbo was one of the best," said Wallace, "and for me I can only learn from what he says, as well as the likes of Thommo, and if I take on board their advice and do what they're telling me, I shouldn't go too far wrong."

At only 19, Wallace is the first to admit that he still has much to learn in the game. That attitude, aligned to a willingness to work hard is what should stand the player in good stead for the future.

His progression into the first-team squad, alongside that of Craig Beattie, Aiden McGeady and David Marshall also provides the perfect motivation for the younger players looking to establish a future for themselves at Celtic.

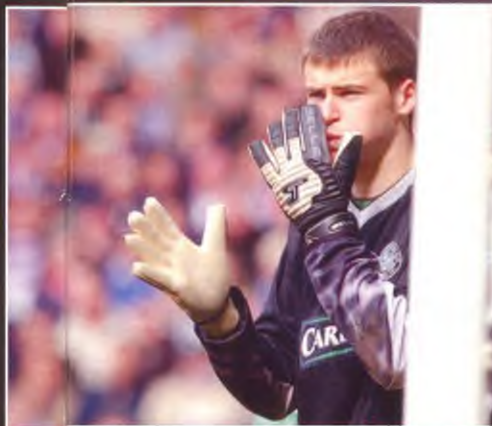
And regardless of whether he is comfortable with the tag 'role model' when it comes to those younger players, Wallace knows that seeing players come through the ranks and making it into the first team is an inspiration.

"You look at the likes of Shaun and big John Kennedy," he said. "We looked up to them a couple of years ago. It's going to happen all the time because the youth set-up's so good. Every year there's going to be good players who are looking up to us just now. We did that as well so it's only natural that this happens."

"There's a few who are pushing and are

looking quite good, and if they get a good season playing for the youths or the reserves, they might get their chance.

"Because there are not a lot of under-21 players, a lot of the 16s and 17s are getting the chance to play for the under-21s, which didn't happen a few years ago so it's a big opportunity for them to show what they can do."

"The manager's been brilliant that way. If he thinks you're good enough he'll put you in. That's a great incentive for us, for me and Craig and Aiden, and also

big David Marshall who's flying at the moment so, obviously the manager's shown that if you're good enough he'll put you in and it's up to us to work hard in training and impress in the games we're in."

Wallace, along with some of his younger colleagues, certainly seized the opportunity when it presented itself during Celtic's North American tour. And it was those players who hit the headlines in the games against Chelsea, Liverpool, Manchester United and Roma.

"It was good," Wallace admitted. "I didn't expect to play as much as I did. I started a couple of games and to play against some of the teams over there - they're world-

class teams - for the likes of myself, Craig and Aiden it was great.

"I thought we did alright when we were over there and didn't look out of place, and the senior players helped us a lot."

"In the games you get you have to try and impress the manager as well as every day in training. He knows what you can do but in the games you have to do a wee bit extra to put yourself in his thoughts for the following game."

"I don't set any targets. I don't know if any other players do. I just like playing my football and, obviously running out in front of 60,000 people gives you a buzz and you just want to do that again."

"Once you get a taste of it you want it all the time but, obviously, because of the players who are here, it's quite hard to do that so the opportunities you do get you've got to grab it with both hands."

**DEREK SOUTAR**

Although highly rated at Dens, Soutar, who was first choice keeper for Scotland under-21s, only made his competitive club debut in the final match of last season.

Not that he lacks experience, having plenty of top-team action at lower league level behind him, helping Brechin and Alloa to promotion to the First Division in previous seasons. Returned from a further loan spell at Glebe Park at the start of the year and, with the departure of Julian Speroni, he started the campaign as No.1 choice.

**KELVIN JACK**

Trinidad and Tobago internationalist, most recently capped in last Saturday's 2-1 over St Nevis and St Kitts.

Had a trial at Oldham in the summer. They were keen to secure the 28-year-old but he opted for Dens and signed on the eve of the new season. At 6'4", he's a powerfully built and agile keeper.

Had a spell with Reading last term and was previously with CL

# Jim Duffy has battled through a troubled spell to put together a quality squad. Here's a run-down of the opposition in Dark Blue

Financial San Juan Jabloteh, who beat Dundee on their trip to the Caribbean in 2003.

Made his debut as a Dark Blue when replacing the injured Soutar against Forfar in the CIS Cup.

**SCOTT MURRAY**

With the injury to Soutar, the youth team keeper was on the bench for Dundee's 4-4 draw at Easter Road a fortnight ago.

Only recently signed, he is highly promising and has represented Scotland at under-17 level.

**LEE WILKIE**

After becoming an outcast in Dundee's Bonetti era, the towering defender later got a second chance

at Dens. And within a couple of months was gaining rave reviews, as well as a full Scotland cap (against South Africa).

Was a regular in Berti Vogts' Scotland squads after firmly establishing himself as a first choice player but badly twisted his knee in January's derby and that has sidelined the huge central defender, probably until after Christmas.

**BOBBY MANN**

Manager Jim Duffy was delighted to secure a player of his experience and ability.

A stalwart with Inverness Caley over the past five seasons, stopper Mann has shown he can reach new levels every time he's been called upon to do so.

Has experience of two Scottish Cup semi-finals and last season skipped ex-Highland League side Caley to the First Division title.

With a young team, his presence will prove invaluable, not just because of his experience, but also his considerable abilities.

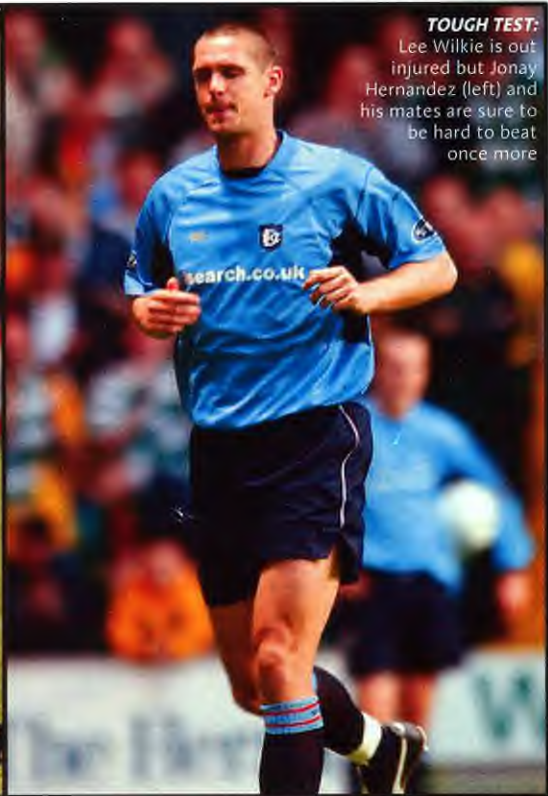
**JONAY 'CHICO- HERNANDEZ**

Signed on a Bosman from Real Madrid B, where he was the understudy to Brazilian superstar Roberto Carlos.

Hernandez has real commitment and lots of quality. His previous clubs include Tenerife and Ponotvevra in the Spanish Second Division, and he made his debut for Dundee against Hearts at the start of last season. Quickly established himself as the first choice left-back and has had busy summer playing

for his native Venezuela in the World Cup and Copa America.

**TOM HUTCHINSON**

The tall, powerful central defender has been desperately unlucky with injuries since signing from Fulham for £50,000 in August 2002.

Initially with Sutton United, he gained a trainee contract with Fulham. However, as the Cottagers moved up the divisions, an influx of overseas players limited Hutchinson's opportunities. Duffy knew of him from his time in England and snapped him up.

Has missed a chunk of his two seasons at Dens because of injury but his availability is now vital.

**BARRY SMITH**

Moved to Dundee as part of the deal that saw Dane Morten Wieghorst head to Celtic Park in December 1995, making him easily Dundee's longest serving player.

Prior to that the dependable defender was on the books at

Parkhead for five seasons, gaining Scotland under-21 honours.

An excellent reader of the game, Smith can fill any defensive role asked of him, and signed a new two-year deal during the summer.

**STEVE McNALLY**

Stopper who was farmed out to local side Downfield Juniors as he came through the youth ranks.

Very athletic, he made his first-team debut last season, appearing in two of the last three games.

**BRENT SANCHO**

Another Trinidad and Tobago internationalist, he joined Dundee in the summer of 2003 and made a brief competitive debut as a sub in the UEFA Cup tie in Shkoder.

Sancho had impressed boss Duffy during Dundee's winter break trip to Trinidad, but the club had to appeal to get a work permit for the man who has played in the USA and Finland, as well as his homeland. Can play in midfield or

defence and played in his country's internationals the summer.

**CALUM MacDONALD**

Young central defender from Perth is another to have broken into the first team this season.

Made his debut in Dundee's 5-2 win over Clyde in the third round of the CIS Cup. Another to have had previous first-team experience on loan with Peterhead.

**NEIL BARRETT**

Industrious and committed midfielder whom Duffy knew from his days at Chelsea, the club where Barrett began his career.

Moved to Portsmouth where he again served under Duffy.

After 26 appearances for Pompey, he came to Dundee on loan last January, making his debut in the derby. That move was made permanent this summer.

**MARK FOTHERINGHAM**

Was the most sought-after kid in



the country when Celtic beat a host of rivals for his signature.

However, despite becoming the youngest player ever to turn out in a competitive game for the Glasgow giants, his career had stalled to just three top-team Parkhead appearances when Duffy took him back to his home town last August.

Ironically, his debut in Dark Blue came as a sub against his old club, but since then the highly creative midfielder has fully established himself and has been capped by Scotland at under-21 level.

**GARRY BRADY**

Started as a trainee with Spurs and was on the fringe of the first team before moving to Newcastle United in July 1998.

A loan spell at Norwich followed before joining Portsmouth in March 2001.

Like Hutchinson, Duffy snapped up the midfielder just ahead of the August transfer window two years ago.

**CHRIS HEGARTY**

The terrier-like midfielder is the son of Paul Hegarty, who made his name playing for Dundee's city neighbours United.

Born locally, like almost all the young players at Dens, he is one of the many who gained his first-team debut late last season.

**NEIL JABLONSKI**

Signed as an 'S' Form in 1997, he came through the youth ranks to make his first-team debut in a win over Hibs in August 2002.

The powerful midfielder was one of several players to spend the first half of last season out on loan.

May miss out today due to a broken wrist sustained in training.

**STEVEN ROBB**

Made his league debut as a sub in a live TV match against Celtic in September 2001, but it was only the briefest of appearances, lasting just a couple of minutes.

The left-sided midfielder spent four months on loan at Raith Rovers, for whom he featured 10 times at the start of last season.

After returning to Dens, he was regularly involved in the first team, scoring his first goal in a Tennent's Scottish Cup tie against Aberdeen.

**SCOTT ROBERTSON**

Found himself on the bench against Rangers last season when still in the youths and also turned out for Peterhead while on loan.

Signed a new contract last season, indicating the high regard there is for this right-sided, Dundee-born midfielder.

**DOUGLAS CAMERON**

The son of '60s hero Kenny Cameron, Dougie made his Dundee debut at home to Motherwell in November, filling in at left-back for the injured Hernandez.

Although primarily a midfielder throughout his youth career, his subsequent appearances from the bench have been in the full-back berth. Has also been on loan at Peterhead.

**IAIN ANDERSON**

The winger joined Dundee for the second time last month.

Made his first appearance in a Dark Blue jersey as a 16-year-old 10 years ago, but left as a free agent for Toulouse in 1999.

Played less than nine months in France before going to Preston on loan, then joining the Deepdale club for £500,000 in the summer of 2000.

Went to Tranmere on loan before moving to Grimsby 12 months ago, having made 82 appearances and scoring 12 goals for Preston. Last term, he got six in 33 appearances for the Mariners.

**STEVE LOVELL**

Signed by Portsmouth for £250,000 from Bournemouth and spent spells on loan at Exeter, Sheffield United and QPR.

Duffy brought him north in August 2002 and it proved a shrewd move, with the Englishman finishing top scorer last term.

Blighted by injury this season, the striker still managed six goals.

**BOBBY LINN**

At 18, Linn was pushed into first-team action earlier than might have been the case had circumstances been different.

A bright future is predicted for the pacy Dundee-born striker and

his dramatic extra-time winner against Hearts – his first goal at the top level – booked the Dark Blues' appearance in the semi-final of last term's League Cup

**NEIL CLARK**

Strong running left-sided winger who came through youth ranks.

Made his debut towards the end of last season but is currently on loan to Forfar.

**GLENN LARSEN**

The new attacker, who likes to play off the front two, could have been at Dens Park last season, having been on trial just before the club went into administration. The 20-year-old was signed after being released by Valerenga of his native Norway. Previously he



played for Flora Tallin in Estonia after starting his career with Haugesund.

**JOHN SUTTON**

The brother of Celtic's Chris was recently signed on loan from Millwall.

The striker began his career with Tottenham Hotspur as an apprentice and was loaned out to Carlisle and Swindon before being freed and joining Raith in July 2003.

Sixteen goals in 21 appearances brought him a £60,000 move back to Millwall, for whom he made five appearances last term.

After the disappointment of being in the squad but not making the bench for last season's FA Cup final, he readily agreed to the loan move which brought him back north of the border earlier this summer.

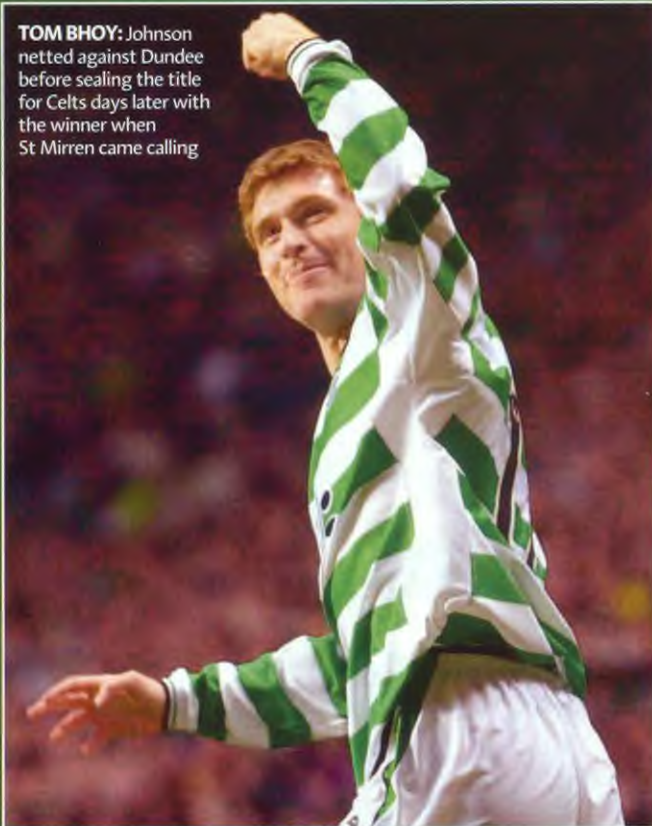

**CELTIC and Dundee have met on 216 occasions in the league. Celtic lead the way with 129 victories, while Dundee have only won 43 of the encounters.**

The other 44 games were drawn. However, in recent seasons Jim Duffy's Dundee side have proved to be tough opponents and are one of the few SPL teams to have actually won at Celtic Park during Martin O'Neill's tenure. We look back at five clashes involving both teams ...

November 4, 1893, Celtic Park

### Celtic 3-1 Dundee

(Campbell 2, Madden)

This was only the second ever meeting between the sides and the first at Celtic Park.

Earlier in the season, Celtic had won 4-1 at Dundee. The defending Scottish Champions also won the home fixture, thanks to a double from Johnny Campbell and a goal

## Celtic have a record win and history in their favour – but Dundee have proved plucky opponents. Here we recall a few of the sides' most exciting encounters

from Johnny Madden. Campbell made 215 appearances for the club in two spells, scoring 109 goals.

In between he played for Aston Villa from 1895-87.

Madden played in Celtic's first ever game and made a total of 118 appearances, scoring 49 goals.

He moved to Czechoslovakia where he is regarded as one of the founding fathers of football in that country.

Season 1893/94 saw Celtic retain their league title.

October 26, 1895, Celtic Park

### Celtic 11-0 Dundee

(Meechan, Doyle, Battles, Blessington 2, McMahon, Ferguson, 4 untraced goals)

This game remains Celtic's biggest ever victory and helped the side clinch their third Championship.

A crowd of just 10,000 were at Celtic Park to witness the avalanche of goals, so many in fact that

observers in attendance to record the vital statistics of the game were unable to credit four of the goals to any particular Celtic



player. Among the scorers who were identified was Jimmy Blessington. He made 99 appearances, scoring 38 times for the club.

April 4, 2001, Celtic Park

### Celtic 2-1 Dundee

(Johnson, Mjallby)

The game which set up the Championship win at home to St Mirren the following Saturday, this midweek fixture was a tense affair.

Tommy Johnson appeared to have settled nerves with a fifth-minute opener, but it was cancelled out by Juan Sara in the second half.

Only six minutes remained on the clock when Johan Mjallby popped up with a goal from a corner which raised the roof at Celtic Park and meant that victory over St Mirren would clinch the

title. Johnson scored on that day – the only goal of the game – and the title was back where it belonged... in Paradise.

May 13, 2001, Celtic Park

### Celtic 0-2 Dundee

As the Treble-winning season drew to a close, Dundee became the first to win at Celtic Park that term.

Both goals came from Fabian Caballero in a game that the visitors deserved to win.

Celtic followed that up with another league defeat, away to Kilmarnock, before turning on the style at Hampden in a 3-0 victory over Hibs to claim the Scottish Cup and secure the Treble.

December 13, 2003, Celtic Park

### Celtic 3-2 Dundee

(Larsson, Balde, Kennedy)

The sides met three times last season, twice at Dens Park and once at Celtic Park, such is the bizarre nature of the SPL split.

Celtic won all three, including the meeting at Celtic Park in December. Henrik Larsson gave the Hoops the lead after 15 minutes but just five minutes later, ex-Celt Mark Fotheringham levelled.

Second-half strikes from Bobo Balde and John Kennedy looked to have made things comfortable, but a last-gasp goal from Dundee jangled Celtic Park nerves just a little.

# Back to his roots

## Tosh McKinlay still has a place in his heart for Dundee and reckons they can survive

Interview: JOE SULLIVAN

**HE may unreservedly wear a green and white heart, embroidered on a green and white sleeve – but, like any other former pro, Tosh McKinlay has a deep passion for the game and a genuine interest in the affairs and welfare of any of his previous clubs.**

The ex-Celt also trod the boards at Tynecastle and Dens Park and both Hearts and Dundee have racked up column inches over the past couple of seasons.

Unfortunately, little of the news has been about their prowess on the pitch.

After spending his school years with Celtic Boys' Club, McKinlay spent nigh on eight formative years with the Dark Blues before moving to Edinburgh – and Dundee's recent problems have been giving him cause for concern.

On the pitch though, McKinlay is in no doubt as to what the players, management and supporters of Dundee will be targeting this season.

He said: "They will simply be looking to survive – that is the main thing.

"In Jim Duffy they have one of the best managers in the business and financially his hands are tied behind his back.

"He's restricted in that he has had to not only sell players, but basically sack players. So they will simply be looking to stay up this term – they can't afford not

to. I want them to survive and I do think they can do it. I represent Chris Sutton's brother John up there and I've been to all their league games so far so I know what they are capable of.

"They have blown hot and cold but they can manage to pull in the results that will keep them up."

McKinlay may have hit the nail right on the head with his 'hot and cold' theory.

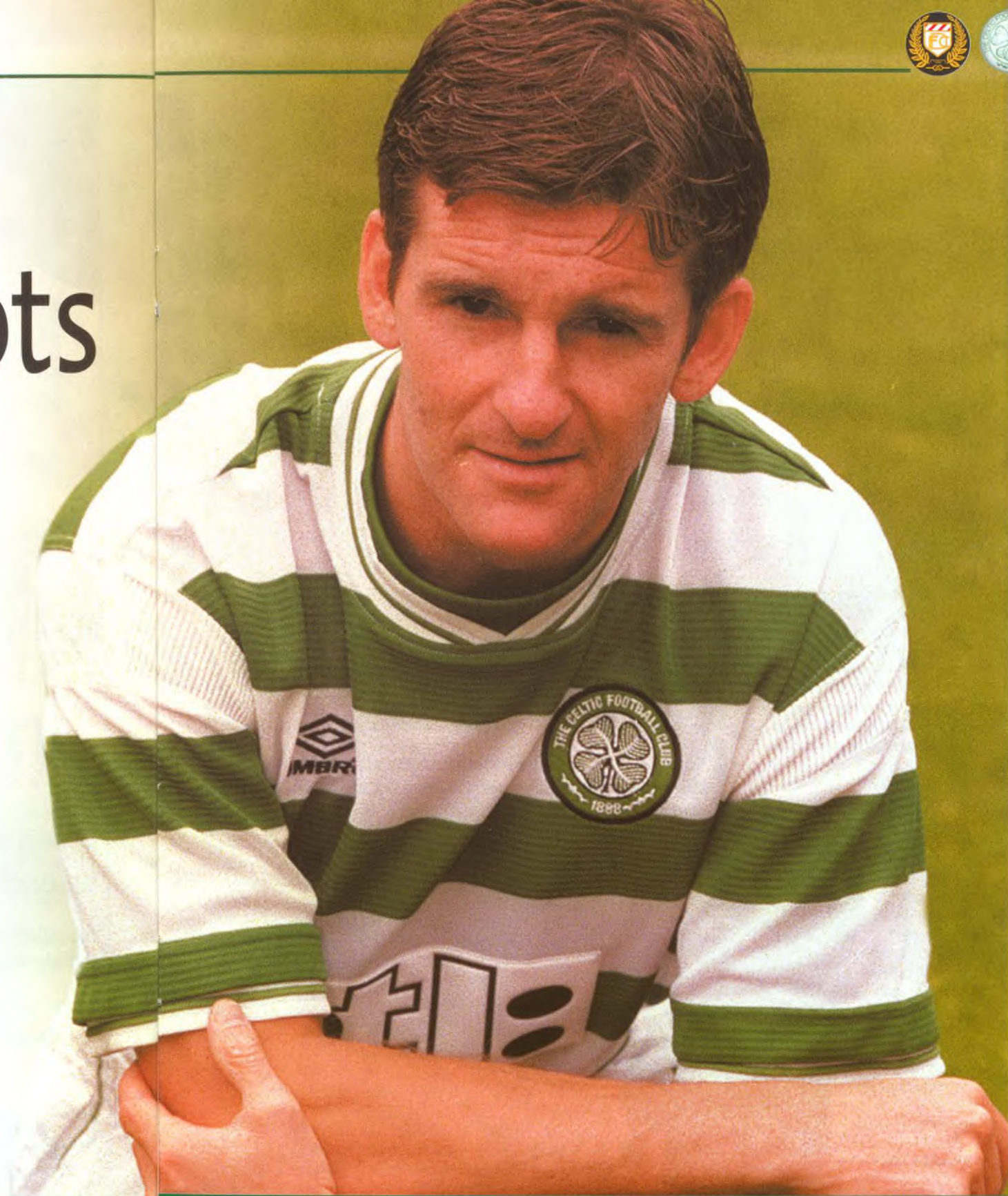
The Dens Park fans may have given a frosty reception to defeats to Hearts (1-0) and Motherwell (2-1), but the mercury rose on away days as a 2-1 derby win over city rivals Dundee United was followed by a quite amazing 4-4 draw with Hibernian.

McKinlay said: "On the opening day against Hearts they weren't at the races but a week later they went to Tannadice and got the win.

"Then there was that quite unbelievable game at Easter Road. They got off to a good start when John Sutton fired in a cracker to give them the lead, but things soon changed and at 4-1 down, not only did you think the game was over, but 10-1 wouldn't have been an unrealistic score the way things were going.

"But Hibs are in a pretty similar predicament and they can suffer from it too, in that they are a team of young boys with little experience, and Dundee amazingly fought back to 4-4."

At home, a 4-0 League Cup win over



Forfar is all they have on the credit column as, so far this season at any rate, their form at Dens has let them down.

It was the same last season as although Dundee finished mid-table, reading of the home losses column was more akin to looking at that of a club clearing the dreaded drop by the skin of its teeth.

But although they have hit the points and goals trail on their travels, McKinlay doesn't expect the run to continue at Celtic Park.

He said: "I don't think there will be much hope of a shock as Celtic will be far too strong for them at the moment, especially at Celtic Park, and there is relatively little experience in the Dundee ranks.

"A couple of seasons ago they would come to Celtic Park and make a game of it. In fact, outside of Rangers, Dundee were the team who would come here and try to take something from the game.

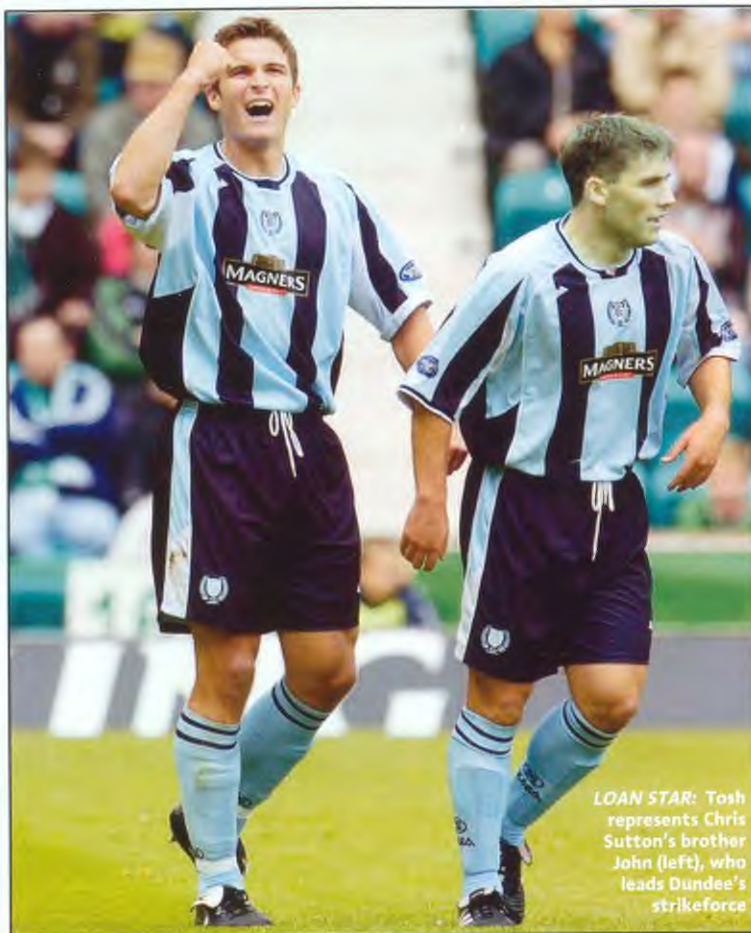
"Most teams would come here with a damage limitations philosophy but Dundee would avoid that and they did pick up a few points now and then.

"But as I said, Celtic should be too strong and the restrictions placed upon Duffy could mean a different approach from them today."

Those restrictions arose from the club's fight against administration.

This has affected their hopes on and off the field, while they still suffer from the hangover this season – but Tosh feels that clubs should walk before trying to run.

He said: "I was at a Fans' Forum up there last week and they have a loyal nucleus of fans in the Supporters' Trust who

will do their damndest to keep the club alive and kicking.

"But when you have regular crowds of 5,000 to 6,000 supporters at home games your hands are very much tied financially.

"Some fans brought up the prospect of the Old Firm leaving Scottish football and if that was the case they would then expect Dundee to be one of the top teams in the country and

winning trophies regularly.

"Dundee is their team and they have every right to look at it from that angle and hope and wish the best for their team. But the bottom line is even if they were winning a Scottish league bereft of the Old Firm, they would still be playing to crowds of 5,000 or 6,000.

"Professional football is all about the number of punters who pay at the turnstiles and unless you have that in sufficient numbers you simply cannot buy success.

"Dundee tried that and they are now paying the price as you can't have limited crowds coming



through the door and still pay players £10,000 a week.

"When I was a kid at Dundee what they would do was groom young players, bring them on and then sell them on at a profit.

"No supporter likes their team to be seen as a selling club but football is a business and no proper business would sell all their assets in one go. Dundee was a well-run club and that was part and parcel of their survival.

"Apart from myself, the club helped to bring on the likes of Stuart McKimmie, Colin Hendry and Ian Ferguson."

At the other end of the transfer market, even Celtic haven't been pushing the boat out with regards to numbers, but they did pull off a coup in signing Juninho.

McKinlay said: "We know he has already caused Rangers trouble but he could really cause havoc for the

likes of Dundee and other teams in the SPL. I've been crying out for this sort of player since Lubo left and it's just a pity that Juninho didn't have the opportunity to play alongside Henrik Larsson.

"Henrik's gone now and it's no use crying over spilt milk, but any team facing Larsson and Juninho in the same side would have a frightening task on their hands.

"We've been missing that Lubo type of player who operates 25 to 35 yards out from goal and can change a game completely with the deftest of touches and, like Lubo, Juninho has goals in him.

"Lubo was simply terrific and, while when he arrived here, we were all wondering where he had been - he had obviously been a great hero at St Etienne, Bastia and back home in Slovakia.

"Things didn't go too well for him in Germany with Duisburg but

they wanted him to track back too often, which was a complete waste of his skills and talent.

"I still keep in touch with Lubo and he's an absolutely wonderful guy as well as a great player. He was a genius with both feet.

"I remember the game against Motherwell when Andy Goram lined up his wall for Lubo's right-foot free-kick and the wee man simply switched feet before firing the ball in.

"He could take corners on any side of the pitch with either foot and, of course, his all-round play was simply superb.

"Martin obviously used him sparingly in the latter part of his career here but even then he could come on for 20 minutes and change a game.

"Let's put it this way, we are comparing Juninho with him and Juninho is a World Cup winner!"

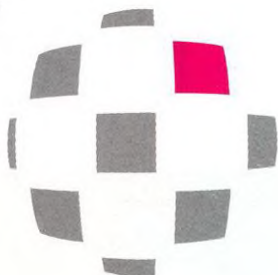

# MAKING SENSE OF THE NEW FASHION

# the YOUTH ACADEMY

## Identifying talent is still key issue

**I HAVE been banging on about good talent identification being the key to good youth development and I'm certain this is an essential component.**

However, fashion, for want of a better word, has a pervasive effect on everything. Football is no exception, and neither is youth football.

At the moment clubs are running like lemmings towards the new Eastern Bloc countries as a new way of getting magical talent. Is this right or wrong?

Well, only time will tell, but fashion will not remove the necessity for good talent identification.

We recently sent a scout to a youth international tournament in Poland. The sides involved were all European national teams. Hungary, Czech Republic, Ukraine and Poland were among them.

The competition was crawling with scouts from all of the top UK clubs. I took delight in our scout's report from the competition.

It went something like this: "Yes, there are good players out there, Ukraine has three of interest, the Czechs have one and the Hungarians one. I have detailed reports on them all for you."

I asked the question, "are they better out there than what we have in the UK?" The reply from our scout was: "Well, that's not really



the way I looked at them – I just looked at all of them as players and compared them with what we already have in the system and those we are looking at in other countries.

"My recommendation is that we bring those four in on trial."

It's a great answer because it showed that he wasn't influenced by fashion. He just saw players and measured them against the attributes required of a Celtic player. In the Academy we recognise we will not be able to fill our professional squads with Scottish players – we know we have to look everywhere for talent.

I do not want our programme just following fashion for the sake of it. Academies in England have been guilty of this – Australian players, Nigerians, French – all have been involved in the fashion parade, with swathes of them recruited for the sake of it.

Often it is because someone finds a gem and then everyone jumps on the bandwagon.

Harry Kewell appears and suddenly Australia is the place. Nicholas Anelka appears and suddenly it's France and so on...

The key is simply to stick with your talent identification blueprint and recommend players according to that. Whether they come from fashionable countries or not, talent is talent and that is what we are interested in here.
