Tonight is another very important step for everyone at Celtic as we welcome Hapoel Tel-Aviv for our UEFA Cup match.

I am pleased to be going into this game after another league win against Kilmarnock on Sunday although I feel that we could have played better in that game.

But, as always, it was important that we got the right result and now the competition for places among the players is very high and that can only benefit Celtic.

Hapoel is a side that Eyal Berkovic raves about and he is constantly reminding us of how good they are. I haven't seen them for myself but we have had them watched and we've seen them on videotape.

And from that I have noticed that their passing of the ball, movement and organisation is very good.

It will be a difficult game but we are going to attempt to win the match, not concede anything and hopefully score a few goals.

There is no point in thinking about reaching the later stages of this tournament before we have beaten Hapoel Tel-Aviv over two legs and we aim to begin that job tonight.

The first hurdle in any cup match, no matter which competition, is always the next game and we have to try and clear this particular one tonight.

And then we want to take things even further in Israel in two weeks from now to improve our chances of going through.

Hapoel may be an unknown quantity to many people but we won't treat them or the tie lightly.

What we do know is enough about their players to be prepared for this match and people like Eyal and others who we have spoken to about our visitors have been very complimentary about them.

People may not think they are



very good because they are from Israel but the players, the staff and myself won't think like that at all – that is not the correct way to approach this or any other match.

Israeli football in the last few years has grown dramatically and this is borne out by the amount of top players they have like Eyal

playing abroad.

The quality of the national team is another indication of how far Israeli football has progressed recently and although they slipped up against Cyprus last week, they have enjoyed some great results.

And if people are bothered enough to do their homework they will soon realise that the game in Israel is not what it once was.

Having the first game at home tonight, along with your backing and support will play a major part in ensuring that we take the correct result with us to Tel-Aviv.

And it is only from there that we can look to the next tie but the important thing is a victory – it can't be any other way.

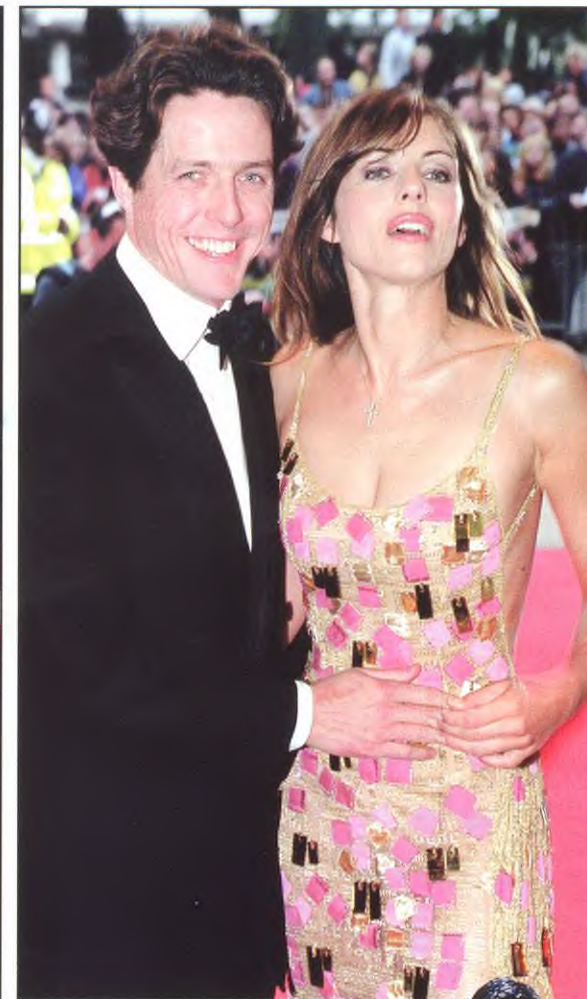

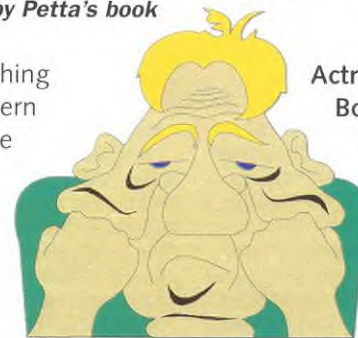

Megabucks Hapoel ad up to real threat

CELTIC will face an Israeli threat to their European dreams from a team that is bankrolled by a megabucks ad agency boss.

Six-times champions Hapoel Tel-Aviv have been transformed into title favourites again this year after being taken over by a business consortium led by Moshe Theumim.

A formidable figure in the political arena, too, Theumim – who is a close personal friend of former Prime Minister Shimon Peres – stepped in two years ago to shore up the ailing Hapoel after they had suffered the worst decade in their history.

Now power broke Theumim is determined to establish the Israelis as a major force, not only at home but in Euro competitions, too.

Nosedive

And he's not afraid to bring in foreign imports, with Hapoel boasting stars from Croatia, Hungary and Serbia among their ranks.

In addition to their title triumphs Hapoel have also won the State Cup five times and Theumim is determined to halt the nosedive after his side's last clinched the league flag in 1988.

Hapoel, at that time struggling against bankruptcy, narrowly avoided the drop in 1997 before Theumim stepped in and after his massive cash injection they were pipped at the post on the last day by of the 1998 season by Beitar Jerusalem.

Hapoel slipped back last season to fifth spot in the league but gained

sweet revenge over Beitar with a cup final victory over their deadly rivals.

Playing in the UEFA Cup last season, Hapoel lost in the preliminary round to Stroemgodset of Norway. This year they fared better beating P.K. Yerevan of Armenia in the prelims.

Here's a rundown on the men who are determined to sink Celtic's Euro hopes this time around:

DROR KASHTAN is the club's 55-year-old manager. Kashtan is easily Israel's most successful football boss having won the championship five times managing three different clubs - Bnei Yehuda, Maccabi Tel Aviv and Beitar.

He joined Hapoel this year and is one of the reasons why the club are favourites to win the championship.

Kashtan has experienced defeat in Glasgow before. Last year, when

he bossed Beitar, the Israelis faced Rangers in the UEFA Cup and after a 1-1 draw in the first leg in Israel they lost 4-2 at Ibrox.

SHAVIT ELIMELECH, 28, has made 169 league appearances for Hapoel in goal and is the longest-serving player at the club.

NIR RAHAMIN, 19, the club's teenage reserve keeper, has yet to make his first-team debut.

MOTTI OHAYON, 25, is in his fourth season with Hapoel. He has made 71 league appearances and scored five goals from defence.

24-year-old **ILAN BACHAR** was bought this season from Beitar where he made 97 appearances as a full back and scored nine goals.

Alongside him is **EYAL BEN AMI**, 23. He has already made 123 league appearances and scored seven goals.

SHIMON GERSHON, 21, is a man of many talents. He is also a professional singer, song-writer and guitarist as well as a regular in the Israeli under-21 side. He has made 81 appearances for Hapoel and scored three goals.

The team's most experienced player is 33-year-old **YAAKOV HILLEL**. He spent most of his career with cross-city rivals Maccabi Tel Aviv before joining Hapoel two years ago. He has made 319 league appearances and scored 20 goals.

ISRAEL COHEN, 27, is an experienced defender who has made 168 appearances in Israel's top league and scored three goals.

One for the future is **SHAI MACHLUF**, 19. This young defender has yet to make his first-team debut.

In midfield, **YIGAL ANTEBBE**, 25,

signed from Maccabi Herzliya in the summer and is a midfielder with an eye for goal having scored 17 times in 87 league appearances.

SALIM TOAME, 20, is a member of Israel's Arab minority community. He emerged last season as one of the country's brightest young stars and has won a regular place in the Israeli under-21 side. Toame has played 25 times for Hapoel and scored six goals.

ZIV KAVEDA, 20, emigrated to Israel as a boy from Ethiopia. He was signed two years ago from Holon and has played 33 times for Hapoel and scored six goals. An under-21

internationalist, he was a member of the Israeli Under-18 team which reached the European Championship finals in Iceland in 1996.

ISHTVAN PISHUNT, 29, is a Hungarian international star. He won two championship medals with Beitar, scoring 26 goals in 70 matches. Last season he played for Eintracht Frankfurt in the Bundesliga before joining Hapoel in the summer.

DABOR RUPNIK, 28, is one of the club's Croatian midfielders who joined Hapoel last season and has

made 27 appearances and scored one goal.

DIAN RACONICE, 29, is another Croatian and a new signing from Hadjuk Split.

The oldest player in the team is 34-year-old **SHALOM TIKVAH**, he is an elegant, attacking midfielder with a very similar style of play to Eyal Berkovic.

A former Israeli internationalist, he joined Hapoel three years ago from Standard Liege.

He has played 196 games in the Israeli league and scored 45 goals. His younger brother Avi plays for Grasshoppers, Zurich.

Up front there is **KFIR UDI**, 20. An Israeli under-21 internationalist, he has made 56 appearances for Hapoel and scored 6 goals.

OMRI AFEK is also just 20. He signed during the summer from Maccabi Jaffa, where he made 17 appearances last season and scored three goals.

PINI BALALI, 20, has made 23 appearances for Hapoel, mainly as a substitute, and scored one goal.

Teen star **AVIV VALLENERMAN**, 19, has made six appearances for Hapoel and scored once.

RONEN HARAZI at 29 and with 24 goals in 48 international appearances is currently the top target man in the Israeli national team.

He has had spells overseas with Salamanca in Spain and Borsaspor in Turkey and played last season for Maccabi Haifa in the quarter finals of the European Cup Winners Cup.

He has played 189 games in Israel's top league and scored 71 goals. He has already scored three goals for Hapoel in just four appearances.

Another foreign import comes in the tall and powerful figure of 25-year-old Serb **SEBASTIAN SIMOROTICH**. He joined two years ago and has scored 12 in 40 starts.



Did Celts pass their screen test?

● When Celtic beat Cwmbran Town 6-0 and 4-0 in the preliminary round it was only the sixth time in the last 20 years that the Bhoys have won both legs of a European tie. However, they have achieved it now in each of the last three European campaigns, for the first time since 1973/74.

● The above 10-0 aggregate win is Celtic's biggest in the UEFA Cup, with the 6-0 first leg victory their biggest ever success home or away. It was also Celtic's biggest aggregate score in any European competition since 1977/78 when they beat Jeunesse d'Esch of Luxembourg 11-1 win in the European Cup.

● This is the 40th time Celtic have been drawn at home in the first leg in Europe. Of the previous 39 they have progressed to the next round 19 times and been eliminated 20 times.

● Since 1980 Celtic have won just five European ties when they have played the first leg at home. They were against DVIK 1980/83 (6-0, 1-2), Ajax 1982/83 (2-2, 2-1), Aarhus 1983/84 (1-0, 4-1), Ekeren 1991/92 (2-0, 1-1) and St Patrick's 1998/99 (0-0, 2-0).

● Celtic have scored in each of their last six matches in Europe, the first time since 1991/92 that they have achieved this. The last team they failed to score against was Croatia Zagreb when they went down 3-0 in the Champions League qualifier away from home.

● Only eight players have scored 10 or more goals for Celtic in Europe and they all played for the Bhoys in the '60s or early '70s. They are Steve Chalmers, John Hughes, Bobby Murdoch, Jimmy

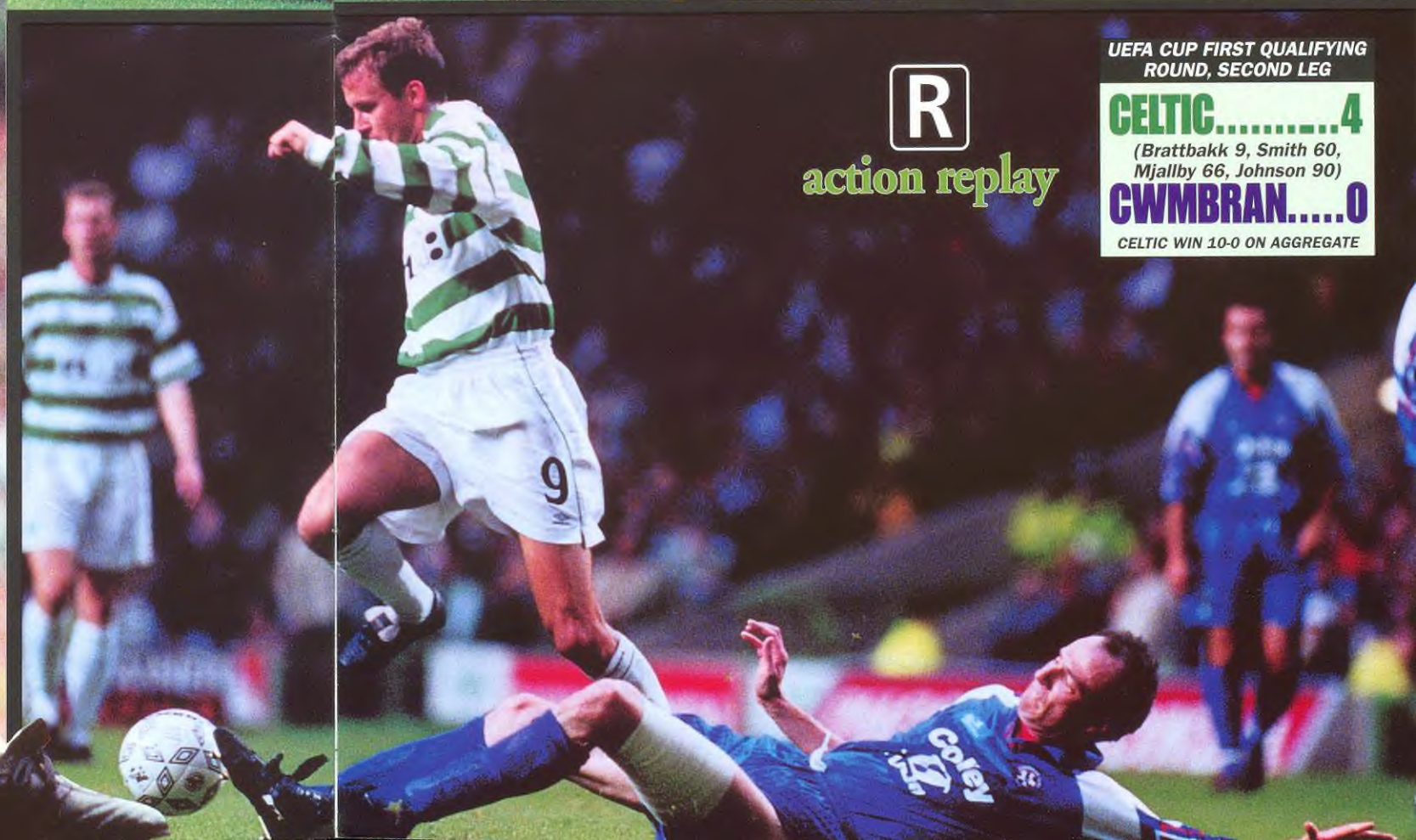
Johnstone, Bobby Lennox, Tommy Gemmell, Willie Wallace and Harry Hood. Some notable near misses are Kenny Dalglish (9), Lou Macari, Frank McGarvey and Murdo MacLeod all on eight. Of the current squad Henrik Larsson leads the way with six followed by Harald Brattbakk on four.

● During Celtic's 4-0 win over Cwmbran Town at home Jamie Smith and Johan Mjallby became the 78th and 79th players to score for the Bhoys in Europe.

At one point it was even suggested that our favourite Henrik smiled – but this writer couldn't swear to that in a court of law.

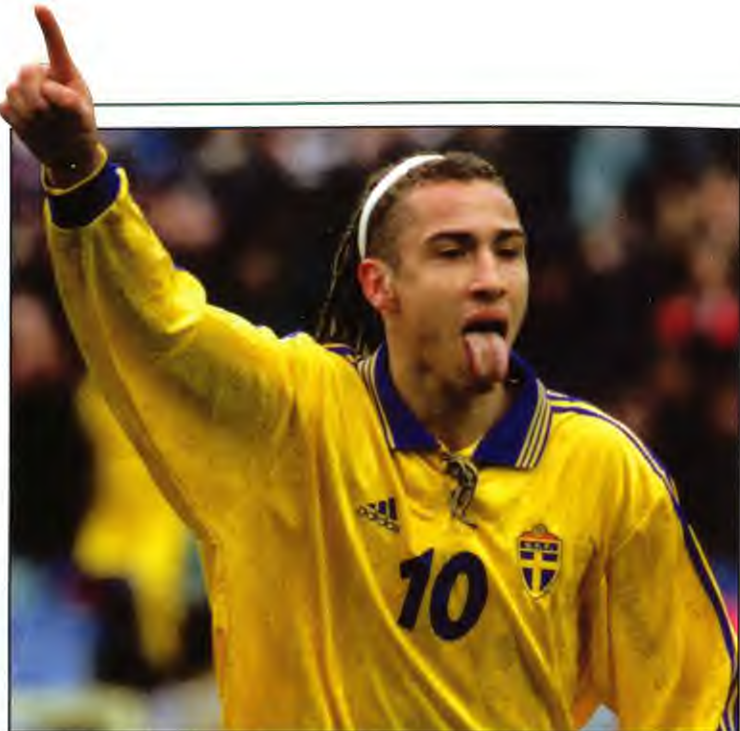
Celtic are aspiring to be one of Europe's top forces and the only way to go about that is to have the best players irrespective of their particular nationalities.

Tonight's match with Hapoel Tel-Aviv will hopefully be another step on the long road to re-instating some of the recognition we have lost in Europe over the past 20 years.

The club paid the price of success after the World Cup Finals in France with so many players suffering long-term injuries after the tournament.

But what is the alternative if you crave silverware the way that this club does? It is unfortunate of course that players pick up injuries but it could happen anywhere and at any time.

Having a team overflowing with international talent will

always be fraught with danger in terms of casualties, but that danger is more than matched with potential in the domestic game.

Instead of complaining about a country calling first on a player, as the football law allows, we should be proud that all of these nations want OUR Bhoys to represent them.

We could of course eradicate the risk of injury and of 'foreign' medics treating our players by simply signing a team of Scots.

The problem with that one is that there isn't a team of players in the country good enough to wear the Celtic colours.

Sad as it sounds the best Scots are already Celts and there aren't enough of them to make a team let alone a squad the size of the one we currently enjoy.

Furthermore, when the Euro 2000 finals kick off next summer in the Low Countries who would you cheer now that Ireland and Scotland aren't guaranteed to be there?

At least at the moment there is a choice of Norway or Sweden and perhaps even Israel and Denmark if things go well.

The days of Celtic solely being a Scots-Irish organisation are dead and buried – this club is a multi-cultural, multinational and multi-talented outfit.

And we should all be proud of that.

This season's Walk On features DAVID W POTTER'S complete history of Celtic through the decades right up to the Millennium...tonight, 1910-1915

All good things must come to an end sometime and the mighty run of six League Championships in a row did just that in 1910. In comparative terms, season 1910/11 was a failure.

All that had happened was that several players had reached their peak simultaneously and there was a consequent loss of form. Willie Loney was injured several times during the season, Jimmy Hay was moved to left-back, a switch that was not a success, and in addition Rangers at last got a good squad together. Inconsistent league form at Celtic meant that Rangers won the title.

Celtic did however salvage the Scottish Cup. An undistinguished run to the Cup Final saw Celtic beat Hamilton Accies in a replay after a very poor first game to land the Cup for the seventh time.

No success however was forthcoming in either of the Glasgow tournaments. Celtic lost to Rangers in each Final.

The pattern was repeated the following year 1911/12. Rangers won the League and Celtic the Cup. This time Clyde were the defeated finalists on a windy day at Ibrox in a poor game.

Indeed, it was a poor season, but Celtic did at least find two great players. One was Peter Johnstone who settled at left-half to replace Jimmy Hay who had

Ups and downs of the early years



MAKE MINE A TREBLE... Celtic's all-conquering side from the 1913/14 season

The football played is described as breathtaking and magnificent, and the man who made it all happen was the amazing little Patsy Gallagher. But he had men around him who could exploit his abilities.

The team was not long back from its European tour in summer 1914 when some sort of crisis occurred in Serbia concerning an assassination.

Little more than a month later when all the teams were playing their trial matches and pre-season friendlies, Britain found itself at War with Germany and Austro-Hungary because the Germans had invaded Belgium.

The effect on Scottish football was immediate, but illogical. The Scottish League continued but the Scottish Cup and international matches were shelved.

This was a shame for Celtic, in particular, but the team had no difficulty at all in winning the 1914/15 Scottish League.

They had retained almost the same team as 1914 with very few men joining the forces – and this meant, of course, that they still had Patsy Gallagher.

Enough said!

moved on to Newcastle. The other was a frail looking lad introduced against St Mirren on December 2nd, 1911 at inside right. His name was Patsy Gallagher.

Patsy won a Scottish Cup medal that year, but the next season 1912/13 was a very disappointing one indeed with Celtic never really in contention for the League, and going out of the Scottish Cup at the quarter-final stage to Hearts.

The Glasgow Cup was also a failure, but a token of things to come arrived in the Glasgow Charity Cup at the very end of the season when Celtic beat Clyde, Third Lanark and then Rangers to lift the trophy.

Season 1913/14 was a great term. The back three of Shaw, McNair and Dodds was now in place, the half-back line contained Young, Johnstone and McMaster and the forward line had two inspirational inside men in young Patsy Gallagher and veteran Jimmy McMenemy to feed wingers Andy McAtee and Johnny Browning.

For centre forward, Quinn was now ageing and injury prone but men like Bernard Connolly, Ebenezer Owers and eventually Jimmy McColl fitted the bill.

This team won a Scottish League and Cup double, the Glasgow Charity Cup and only Third Lanark in the Glasgow Cup prevented a clean sweep.

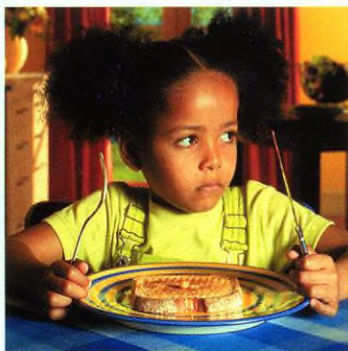
