Roar the boys on to a vital victory

Tonight's atmosphere will be a throwback to those fabulous nights of 30 years ago

LIFE is moving at such a hectic pace these days that I am writing these notes in advance of last Saturday's game against Aberdeen.

I can only hope things worked out at the weekend and that we will be in the right frame of mind for tonight's UEFA Champions League game against Porto. This is indeed a big game for both clubs.

Our opponents had a wonderful victory away to Rosenborg the same night we played Juventus.

I'm sure Porto feel ahead of schedule just now, because the team from Trondheim have a very proud home record in this competition.

Ironically we played the Portuguese in a pre-season game in Paris one evening in July.

Unfortunately the referee didn't turn up for the game making the game somewhat farcical with the stadium representative forced to stand in and, I believe, some of the Porto officials had to act as linesmen.

However, they still showed

themselves to be an excellent footballing team full of technically gifted players and their own record in the European Cup makes them formidable opponents.

I know when the draw was made in Monaco, Porto were very confident of going through from our group.

Meanwhile, the last minute events in Turin left a bad taste in the mouth and as I write I do not yet know the reply from our own letter to UEFA or the result of the referee's report. But I'm sure Hellmut Krug has looked at the video evidence with some degree of embarrassment in the last seven days since the match.

However, that is gone and we must get on with matters in hand. We showed great strength of character in the face of adversity and even the Italian press were fulsome in their praise of our football.

That indeed is a massive compliment to the Celtic players and they must take great

confidence and heart from the utterances of such highly respected journalists. There is no denying that all of the characteristics the boys showed in Turin will be needed tonight.

Those who travelled to Italy were magnificent in their support of the team and that backing is something I personally will never take for granted.

Over the last year the players have earned the respect of the fans. But all of us will have to play our part tonight if inroads to the Champions League second stage are to be made this season.

This is our first match at home, and regardless of the result on Saturday I'm sure the players will get a rousing reception and the atmosphere this evening can be a throwback to those fabulous days of just over 30 years ago.

Everyone knows that we have a long way to go before those dizzy heights are reached – indeed if ever – again.

But we will certainly give it one heck of a go tonight.
