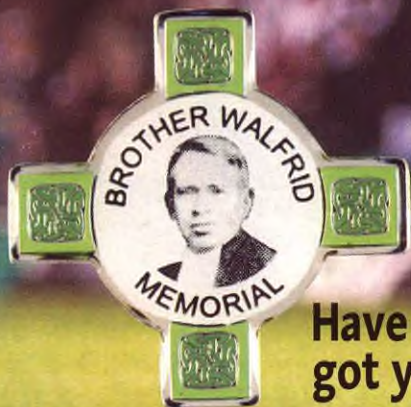

LOVEFOOTBALL



TODAY'S match against Dunfermline is just the latest in a hectic period of fixtures for the football club.

In a period of just over 10 days, we have played Barcelona in the Champions League, Hibernian in the league, then Falkirk in the CIS Cup before returning to league duty this afternoon.

The demands of such a schedule are intense and we have already suffered the loss of Jackie McNamara for a number of weeks after he suffered an ankle injury against Barcelona, and Chris Sutton continues to battle with a groin injury.

However, the players have continued to show the level of commitment needed at this club.

Our game at Easter Road last weekend saw us drop our first points of the season. It was an entertaining game and credit is due to Hibs for the manner in which they approached the game. However, the statistics from that match show that Hibs only had one shot on target in the entire 90 minutes while we had 11, so it would not be unfair to say that we were disappointed not to take all three points from a contest we deserved to win.

Changes were made for the midweek game against Falkirk in the CIS Cup. It provided an opportunity for some players in



the squad to show they can do and the result, as well as the manner in which we achieved it, indicates that the team did impress on the night.

The headlines naturally belonged to Ross Wallace and Aiden McGeady. Ross scored a hat-trick, while Aiden scored a wonderful goal right at the end of the game. They both know the amount of hard work and dedication needed to be a success

at Celtic and they will continue with their progress throughout the rest of this season.

It was a good performance all round for the team in a tie that, on another night, might have proved quite tricky and it was a reward for everyone who came along to Celtic Park on the night.

Those supporters must also be commended for their impeccable observation of the minute's silence for Brian Clough before the game.

Today's game against Dunfermline is now our priority. Davie Hay's side secured their first win of the season last weekend with a 1-0 victory over Hearts, and followed that up with a win against Partick Thistle in the CIS Cup. It is important that we don't allow the confidence gained from those results to go against us today.

Our target is three points today and, as was the case before our previous Champions League match, the players will not be distracted from that task with any thoughts of the impending match in the San Siro against AC Milan.

It is important that this is also the case for the supporters and your backing this afternoon will be as vital as ever.

Risk Assessor

Aiden McGeady understands why his gaffer fretted over fielding a bunch of kids, but was thrilled to help prove the fears unfounded

IN expressing, before Tuesday's visit of Falkirk, "real concerns" about entrusting Celtic's CIS League Cup future to the club's young players, Martin O'Neill could have been adjudged to be indulging in a spot of pre-match psychology.

One look at the players warming the Hoops bench would, perhaps, have suggested otherwise, but in challenging the likes of Aiden McGeady to "step up to the mark," O'Neill certainly provoked the desired response.

Falkirk, reported to be one of the Scottish First Division's more competent teams, saw all their pre-match bravado crumble as a Celtic team inspired by the creative axis of McGeady, Juninho and Ross Wallace teased and tormented them for the entirety of a surprisingly entertaining mismatch.

Of the Hoops' eight goals, Wallace, of course, claimed three, but it was McGeady who ensured the best was saved for last by turning his hapless pursuers inside out before crashing an unstoppable left-foot shot beyond the reach of the disconsolate Bairns keeper.

Nevertheless, while he and his young team-mates might have felt a little vindicated after proving their

manager's fears to have been without foundation, the 19-year-old admitted he could understand O'Neill's reservations about throwing them into battle en masse.

"I can definitely see where he was coming from," said McGeady. "I think it's always going to be a risk throwing the younger lads in because obviously we don't have the experience of the likes of Neil Lennon and Chris Sutton. But it

helped the other night that we'd a core of experienced guys playing like Paul Lambert, Bobo Balde and Joos Valgaeren in there, and I thought we all blended quite well together.

"It was just a great night, particularly for all the young lads, and although Ross obviously did fantastically well to get a hat-trick, I was also delighted for big Mick (Stephen McManus), getting his

first goal. I think you saw how delighted we all were when he scored, and it was good for all the young boys to show the manager that he was right to throw us in."

It was, McGeady admitted, an enjoyable match to be involved in, particularly as it afforded him a first opportunity to play alongside Juninho, a fellow entertainer whose game the youngster intends scrutinising closely over the coming years to benefit his own development. The youngster also admitted to having been gratified that a team which didn't boast a single recognised striker had proved so potent in front of goal.

Said McGeady: "I'd an idea that the manager would make a few changes, but I don't think anyone would have expected that the match would turn out the way it did.

"Looking at the team - particularly the fact we'd no natural strikers in there - I think people might actually have thought that we'd struggle to get goals, whereas obviously it didn't turn out that way. I think it helped that we'd a few players in there who can create things, and Ross has to take a lot of credit for his hat-trick. I thought he did really well and I was delighted for him.



"Juninho was different class, too. There's so much the likes of Ross and myself can learn from a player like him, and I really enjoyed playing alongside him the other night. I don't know if I'd say I'm a similar type of player exactly, but I'd certainly like to be. He's quite a quiet guy so I haven't spoken to him all that much, but he's certainly looked the part so far and anything I can learn from a world-class player like him can only help me."

It's from the vantage point of the bench that McGeady expects to be analysing Juninho today, however, with O'Neill likely to give his strongest and most experienced team a run-out ahead of Wednesday's visit to the San Siro. Nevertheless, the teenager admits to being

far from downcast at having lost the starting place he appeared to have made his own at the start of the season, and insists that his manager can consider him a willing and dependable deputy for both Dunfermline and Milan.

He said: "I wouldn't think that I would keep my place in the starting line-up with the AC Milan game coming up, but I'm obviously ready to play and confident enough to think I'd do a good job if I did. The same would go for

Wednesday night. Obviously the gaffer will want to go with experience, but I'm ready to be called upon if he needs me.

"It was good to get back in on Tuesday, but I can't complain too much about dropping out when I did. To be honest, and although starting the season in the team was fantastic, the way things stand at the moment are a bit more along the lines that I'd expected.

"Plus, everyone's been playing so well that I can't have any complaints. At the moment, it's just a case of me grabbing any opportunities that come my way and trying to make an impact. I think I did alright when I was in the team earlier in the season, but I knew at the time not to get too carried away and the last few

weeks have proved me right. I'm still really pleased with my progress anyway. At this time last year I was still in the youth team,

after all, so I've absolutely no complaints."

Today, as well as looking for his own name on Martin O'Neill's teamsheet, McGeady will be anxious to see whether Pat Scullion, one of the youngsters he was

playing alongside a year ago, will be named in the Dunfermline squad. Scullion moved to East End Park during the summer after being released from his contract at Celtic Park and, after recently making the bench for one of the Pars' Scottish Premierleague matches, a reunion could be possible.

"It would be nice to meet up with Pat again, so here's hoping" said McGeady. "I spoke to him last week and he'd made the bench for the last first-team game, so I think things are coming on for him well there. It's been a good move for him and I really hope he can go on to be a success there."

The Pars have a real host of talented players and under ex-Hoops boss Davie Hay are sure to hit top form soon. We profile their squad

BARRY NICHOLSON

A cool and skillful playmaker who was an s-form signing for Rangers in July 1995.

With limited opportunities for the Ibrox club, Barry was delighted to move to East End Park in July 2000 for £200,000. And looking at his progress, he's made the correct choice.

The Dumfries-born midfielder's played more than 100 Premier League games and his almost ever presence in the first team has helped him to progress from the Scottish U21s to win two caps at full international level.

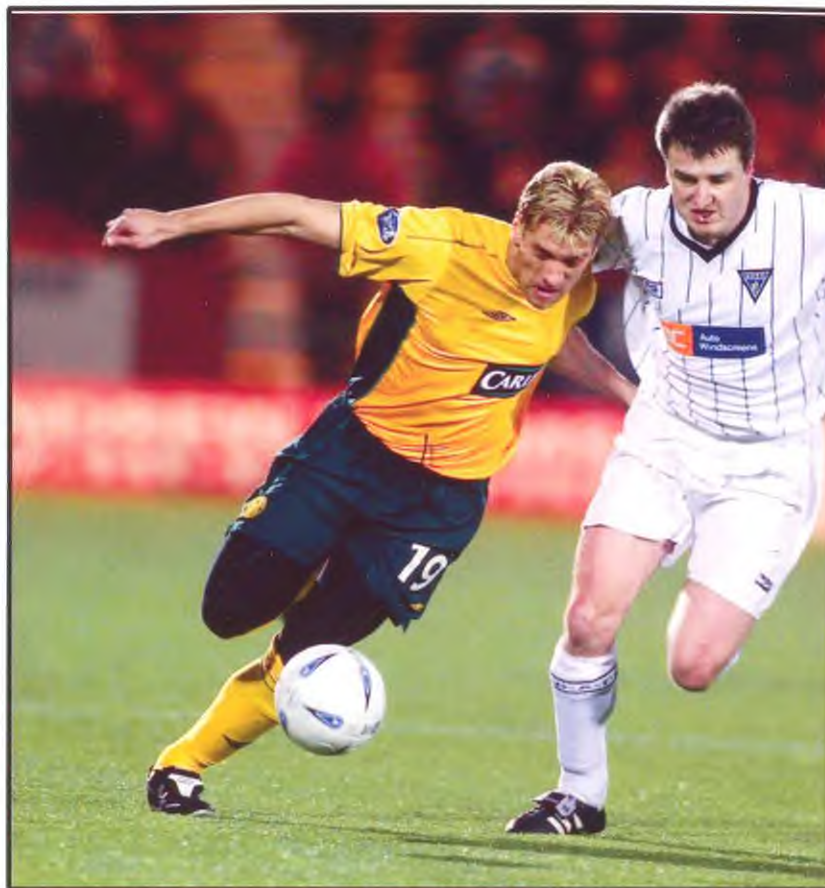
He misses very few games and sets himself extremely high standards. Barry has become a very important Dunfermline player and was made captain in the absence of Scott Thomson.

JAMIE LANGFIELD

Considered to be one of the best young keepers in Scotland.

He made an early breakthrough into the Dundee first team, making his SPL debut at Pittodrie in October 1998, aged only 18. In 2002 he was capped twice for Scotland at Under-21s and was included in the full squad.

However, just as he looked about to fulfil his undoubted potential, he lost his first-team place to Julian Speroni at Dens Park, and was among those to leave as the club's administration



crisis kicked in. Jamie has been unsettled since, turning out for Raith Rovers before Partick snapped him up in January. Thistle decided they would not be able to offer him any new deal and Jimmy Calderwood stepped in to sign him last May when it looked as though Derek Stillie would be leaving the Pars. Jamie is now pushing Derek for his No.1 shirt.

DEREK LYLE

Signed on a six-month loan deal from Queen of the South by Calderwood, Davie Hay will honour Derek's deal, giving him the chance to impress.

Joined Partick as a youth before going on loan to and then signing for Queen of the South for season 2002/03. Broke his collar bone and ankle in a match at St Mirren at the start of the next season and when he recovered was out on loan

again, this time to Stirling Albion, where he scored 10 goals in 19 matches. Craig Brewster had a look at him playing while he was at Stirling and re-affirmed his then boss' high opinion of the player.

GARY MASON

A hard-tackling ball winner from Edinburgh who is a product of Hutchieson Vale BC.

Started his career with Manchester City, but the Under-21 internationalist was loaned out to Hartlepool before signing for the Pars in December 2000.

A great acquisition, Gary is a regular first-team player and his defensive and midfield skills make him very important to the club. Also capable of notching goals

Brought to East End Park by Bert Paton but it was under Calderwood

his full potential developed.

'Nipper' is a bit of a utility man and no-one can decide on his ideal position. He prefers to play behind the front two, although has been preferred as a defender or midfielder. Where ever he plays, he always puts in a good shift.

The dressing room's practical joker, Scott had a short spell in England with Shrewsbury before moving north to join Brechin and then hometown club Aberdeen. He is now an automatic first-team player for Pars and was made skipper for season 2002/03 after being vice-captain. He was badly missed in the second half of that campaign as an ankle kept him out from January.

ANDRIUS SKERLA

Possibly Calderwood's best signing, Skerla has been a rock at the heart of the defence.

Born in the Lithuanian capital Vilnius, he started his career at FK Vilnius. Soon stepped up from the Lithuanian Under-21 team to the full international side and had at the start of the 2002/03 season earned 33 international caps.

The dominating defender attracted the attention of PSV Eindhoven, where he played under ex-England boss Bobby Robson, and since joining the Pars in June 2000 from PSV for the bargain fee of £160,000 he has received massive amounts of praise from the fans and media.

CRAIG BREWSTER

Powerful and experienced striker who leads the line very well.

Craig played for Forfar and Raith before a successful spell at Dundee United, for whom he famously scored the winning goal in the 1994 Scottish Cup final. The 6' 2"

Dundonian then had five years in Greek football with Ionikos Nikea (Piraeus), becoming that club's all-time top scorer.

He joined Hibs in July 2001 and his ability to bring other players into the game helped the development of the Leith team's youngsters. Craig is a great pro and struck up a tremendous partnership with Stevie Crawford. He is a credit to himself with his professionalism, fitness and attitude, leading pundits to suggest he should be played alongside Crawford for Scotland!

ANDY TOD

First joined Dunfermline when Paton signed him from juniors Kelty Hearts in November '93.

Made his first-team debut a month later and very quickly became a favourite with the fans, securing a regular place in the side.



Although starting as a midfielder, he was tried in a number of positions before settling in as a centre-half. But after 264 appearances and 38 goals, he went on loan to Stockport in October 2000.

Andy returned to Dunfermline in January 2001 before Bradford City paid a six-figure fee for his permanent transfer in November.

That move didn't work out and Andy has since been on loan to Hearts and Dundee United.

RICHIE BYRNE

Signed just ahead of the transfer deadline in August 2003 from Irish side Shamrock Rovers.

The second signing from this club (Noel Hunt was the other), Richie is a 22-year-old left-back brought across as Calderwood tried to introduce more youth.

A tough-tackler, Ritchie can also cover in central defence and has become an increasingly important player for the side.

NOEL HUNT

A prolific goalscorer during his schoolboy days at Johnville in Waterford, he was signed by Shamrock Rovers.

Quite a lad and a breath of fresh air. He is young and still has a bit to learn but working alongside Brewster he will gain a huge amount. Missed the 2004 Scottish Cup final through a training ground injury. Keen to do well for the new manager in the position vacated by Crawford.

SCOTT WILSON

Tough and composed central defender who, with Rangers, played in the Champions League at the age of 19 and became an under-21 internationalist.

The hard-tackling centre-back always provided valuable cover for Rangers and made 78 appearances before going to Portsmouth at the end of the 2001/02 season.

Nicknamed "Dinger" from his days at Ibrox, he looked set for a

move to England – but in August 2002 Scott signed for the Pars.

Similar to Nicholson in that he made the decision to leave Ibrox for a chance of first-team action at DAFC. Since joining he has won his way into Berti Vogts' Scotland future team. Missed out on the 2004 Scottish Cup final because of appendicitis. Signed a new three-year contract in May 2004.

DEREK STILLIE

Keeper from Cumnock made his senior debut at Aberdeen, who he joined in '91 from Notts County BC.

Signed for Wigan in July '99 and made over 50 appearances, helping the Lancashire club to twice reach the Division Two play-offs.

Joined DAFC in July 2002 and took over the goalie's jersey that November. His abilities have grown in every game and he coaches well. Good with his feet and has made his way into the Scotland future and full squads.

GARY DEMPSEY

Progressed from North End United in Wexford to Cherry Orchard in Dublin before signing for Everton at the age of 16.

Returned to the Republic to spend six months at both Bray and Waterford before joining the Pars on the recommendation of the under 21-coach, Don Givens.

Sensational debut on August 3, 2002, coming off the bench to score with his first involvement at Celtic Park in front of 57,415.

DEREK YOUNG

Signed for season 2003/04 with his older brother Darren, a knee injury has unfortunately kept on the sidelines for most of his Pars career so far. Started at Aberdeen in October 1996, making his senior debut in '97 against Blackburn.

DARREN YOUNG

Joined for the 2003/04 season from Aberdeen, where he scored

five goals in 155 games. Signed for Dons in February 1996 and made his senior debut at 17 against Hearts. Under-21 caps rewarded his first-team performances, but a knee injury the following season sidelined him.

Three operations later, it was spring of 2000 before Darren re-established himself in the Dons team.

He played in Europe and captained Dons in season 2001/02 when they finished fourth in the SPL.

His leadership qualities attracted Calderwood who admired the "engine" that drives Darren for 90 minutes.

AARON LABONTE

Promising centre-back who was one season at Newcastle before joining Dunfermline in May 2003.

Came on to make his debut as 80th minute sub in Pars 4-0 SPL loss at Ibrox in September '03.

GREG SHIELDS

Joined for a second term on in January 2004 but missed the Scottish Cup final because he was cup tied with Kilmarnock.

SIMON DONNELLY

Returning to the Premier League after an absence of five years.

The ex-Celt, who has 10 Scotland caps, joined Pars on a one-year deal in July. Simon returned to Scotland via St Johnstone on a free transfer from Sheffield Wednesday.

His last match in his previous SPL stint was, co-incidentally at East End Park in Celtic's 2-1 win on May 8, 1999. That completed a record of 181 appearances for the Hoops during which



he scored 42 goals. At Wednesday he made 62 appearances, netting only eight times, and last season he had 43 outings for St Johnstone, notching 11 goals.

BILLY MEHMET

Ex-West Ham youth captain, Mehmet signed on a two-year deal at the start of the 2003/04 season.

The move came about after Calderwood and Jimmy Nicholl took in the Premiership trial match at Lillieshall, and were hugely impressed with what they saw in Mehmet. He was invited for a trial at East End Park, and has since made the move more permanent.

THE GREAT BALANCE OF TASTE AND ICE COLD REFRESHMENT

TODAY'S visitors did last season what no other side in the SPL managed to emulate – dent Celtic's quest for Championship glory by stopping another five points being added to the kitty.

Motherwell and Hearts, courtesy of two draws each, both subtracted another four points from the possible tally, while Aberdeen joined the Pars in being the only team to record a win over the all-conquering Celts.

Every other side in the Scottish Premierleague – including Rangers – failed to take a solitary point from the Bhoys on their march to the title.

However, it has to be said that both murmurs at the hands of the Pars were virtually a whole season apart and, in hindsight, did little to alter the destination of the title.

That may not have been entirely evident on the August 9 opening day of the season when a crowd of 10,082 at East End Park witnessed a 0-0 draw between both clubs. But that only proved to be a blip on the screen as the record-breaking Celts then went on a winning streak of 25 SPL games before a 1-1 draw with Motherwell on March 14.

However, by the time today's visitors inflicted a 2-1 defeat on the Celts here in the East End of Glasgow, the title was already in the bag – and the major talking point was that the game was a dress rehearsal for the upcoming Scottish Cup final.

There were some striking similarities between the Celtic Park dummy run on May 2 and the actual performance at Hampden on May 22.

As in the first game, Dunfermline took the lead, with Andrius Skerla repeating Barry Nicholson's opener

in the league game – and Henrik Larsson equalised in both matches.

That is where any comparisons end, though, as the Swede helped ensure the stage show would not follow the same script as the 'dress rehearsal'.

In the league clash, Gary

Dempsey sealed the points for the Pars when he netted shortly after Larsson equalised.

But on Scottish Cup final day the Celts introduced improvisation to

the screenplay and the red pen was wielded by Larsson, who struck again with his second goal.

Next to act was Stilian Petrov, who struck the third of the game, and the 3-1 win added the Scottish

Cup to the SPL silverware already in the Celtic Park trophy room.

That cup final not only rounded off a successful season for the Celts, but also another fairly typical batch of games against the East End Park side – and that had been the case for more years than the Pars would care to remember.

Ironically, the last season in which Dunfermline claimed the upper hand over Celtic in their meetings was 40 years ago when the 1964/65 Scottish Cup final between the Pars and Celtic kick-started the most illustrious period in the Parkhead club's history.

On April 24, 1965, 108,800 rolled up to Hampden and twice saw Dunfermline take the lead only for Celtic to equalise.

Then, with just nine minutes remaining, skipper Billy McNeill rose majestically to head home a

Charlie Gallagher cross and Celtic Football Club would never be quite the same again.

That was Jock Stein's first trophy with Celtic, and his first Hampden final since 1960/61, when he led the Pars to a Scottish Cup win over the Bhoys.

So, despite the trophy win by Celtic, why was that term the last time Dunfermline came off better in a season's total games?

In a fairly run-of-the-mill first meeting at Celtic Park on December 19, an Alex Ferguson goal in the 82nd minute helped the visitors to a 2-1 win.

The current Manchester United boss also scored the last goal in the other league meeting that season, this time it arrived in the 62nd minute.

However, by that time with nearly half an hour to play, the score was 5-1 to Dunfermline!

There are a couple of possible reasons for such a high scoreline

against the Celts. One was that, despite winning 6-0 over Airdrie in Stein's first game in charge, the new manager's experimentation with his new charges was such that they leaked goals in abundance in the remaining games that term.

Celtic conceded to Dundee (3), Hibernian (4), Falkirk (6) and were also defeated by St Johnstone and

Partick Thistle before falling foul of the five-star Pars.

The other reason is that when third-placed Dunfermline met eighth-

placed Celtic on the day of that 5-1 defeat, it was only four days after that Hampden win, and the Scottish Cup final hangover – literally – may have added to a tinge of apathy regarding the outcome of the final league game.

That season was the last, not to mention the first and therefore only season that Dunfermline have finished above Celtic in the league.

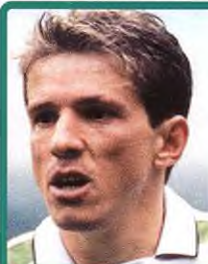

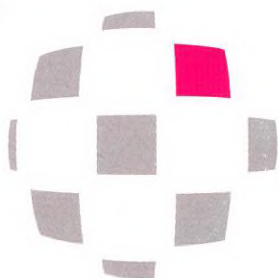

From the most humble of beginnings, Celtic has grown to become one of the biggest clubs in the world. Now supporters' groups have joined forces in a bid to have our founding father, Brother Walfrid, recognised with a memorial statue at Paradise – and you can now help by donating to the project

CELTIC'S origins are unique in world football. The aim, set out in Marist Brother Walfrid's vision, was to form a football club to put food into the needy mouths of hungry Irish immigrants in Glasgow's East End.

The club has come along way since its formation in November 1887, but it remains very much a unique institution, where every supporter feels part of the Celtic family.

Now the descendants of those first Celtic supporters have come together to raise funds to erect a statue of Brother Walfrid at Celtic Park.

And the organisers of this project are calling on fans worldwide to contribute and help create a lasting memorial of our founding father.

As part of the fundraising campaign, a can collection is being held prior to today's Dunfermline game here at Celtic Park and it is hoped that supporters will make a contribution of a minimum of a £1 to the campaign.

A special badge has been designed with the head and shoulders of Brother Walfrid and this is a limited edition.

Later on this year, prior to Christmas, a special souvenir brochure will be available. More information will be announced soon.

The supporters' groups involved are: the Celtic Supporters' Association, the Celtic Trust, the

Affiliation of Registered Celtic Supporters' Clubs, the Jock Stein Executive Club, the Association of Irish Celtic Supporters' Clubs, Association of Donegal Celtic Supporters' Clubs and North American Federation Celtic Supporters' Clubs.

Groups in Sligo have also been hard at work raising funds for their own statue to commemorate Brother Walfrid's contribution to the club, and will be taking part in one particularly special event culminating at today's match.

As part of the efforts to raise funds, Celtic fan Eugene McHale has given himself the challenge of walking from Brother Walfrid's village of Ballymote all the way to Celtic Park, finishing in front of 60,000 fans at our match against Dunfermline today.

Eugene, a former Mayo county GAA footballer, is being supported in his venture by Jim Sheridan and Eddie McHale.

Eugene has already completed walks recently in support of the Irish Heart Foundation and the North West Hospice. His 200-mile trek to Celtic Park started 10 days ago and he is raising funds towards the Sligo Brother Walfrid Appeal.

Money donated to this Appeal will be used to erect a statue in honour of the Marist Brother in County Sligo.

The memorial unveiling will take place on the weekend of October 23/24 as part of a Brother Walfrid Festival to mark the legacy and achievements of Celtic's founding father.



CELTIC Football Club was the brainchild of a Marist Brother who trundled the damp and bleak cobbled streets of the East End of Glasgow wracking his brain to come up with a way to raise money for the poor and needy of the area.

The year was 1887 and there was manifest necessity for organised aid despite Glasgow being known as the Second City of the Empire.

Shipbuilding and heavy industry were the lifeblood of the ever-growing Victorian metropolis and thousands flocked to the city in search of work, housing and a life above the pitiful poverty line.

And a large percentage of the new breed came over the sea from Ireland, a country that was still feeling the effects of the potato famine that blighted the lives of millions.

Therein lay the problem though – the influx that crossed the Irish Sea were mainly Catholic and they quickly realised that the streets of Glasgow were not paved with gold and there weren't enough jobs to go round.

And, if there was employment available, it was low-paid, while the spectre of national and religious nepotism raised its ugly head in the job stakes.

Poverty was rife, disease was a daily obstacle, child mortality affected the lives of many and soup kitchens presented those afflicted with a vital foothold in their day-to-day existence.

It was to subsidise these soup kitchens that Brother Walfrid set the fundraising wheels in motion to drive poverty from the stricken streets of the East End.

Football was a fledgling sport at the time, but the simplicity of the basic essentials to play the game on the street and the relative ease of promoting it as a spectator sport made it a sure-fire winner with the public.

And so the seed was planted in Brother Walfrid's mind and at a meeting with local Irish businessmen at St Mary's Hall in the Calton on



CELTIC FORMED BY WALFRID'S VISION

November 6, 1887, the decision was made to found a football club – and from that acorn a giant oak grew with roots firmly embedded in Scotland and Ireland, but a trunk that developed so strong, the limbs and branches stretched and weaved their way throughout the world.

In the early days, football clubs generally drew support from the surrounding area, but Brother Walfrid could little have known that the pull of Celtic would quickly outgrow the Parkhead area, interlace throughout the streets of Glasgow and mushroom all over Scotland and beyond as the appeal magnified beyond all comprehension.

Celtic played their inaugural game on May 28, 1888 in a 5-2 win watched by a crowd of 2,000 as the team of; Dolan, Pearson, McLaughlin, W Maley, Kelly, Murray, McCallum, T Maley, Madden, Dunbar and Gorevin took to the field as the first ever Celtic XI.

Neil McCallum had the honour of scoring the first-ever Celtic goal 10 minutes into the match.

The opposition that day was team from the other end of the city known as Rangers and, ironically, the history of both clubs was to be forever intertwined in the years that followed.

But as Walfrid watched the club grow in its formative years, and noted the steady flow of Brake Clubs making their way to matches on horse-drawn coaches, he couldn't have envisaged that within 80 years the descendants of those same fans would be flying in a great iron bird at 30,000 feet to see the Bhoys in green and white lift the European Cup at Lisbon...

Or that in the year 2003, tens of thousands of supporters from all over the world – from Scotland, England, Ireland, Wales, Europe, United States, Canada, South Africa, Asia, Australia, and elsewhere – would gather in a southern Spanish city to cheer on the Bhoys in green and white and celebrate being part of the Celtic family.

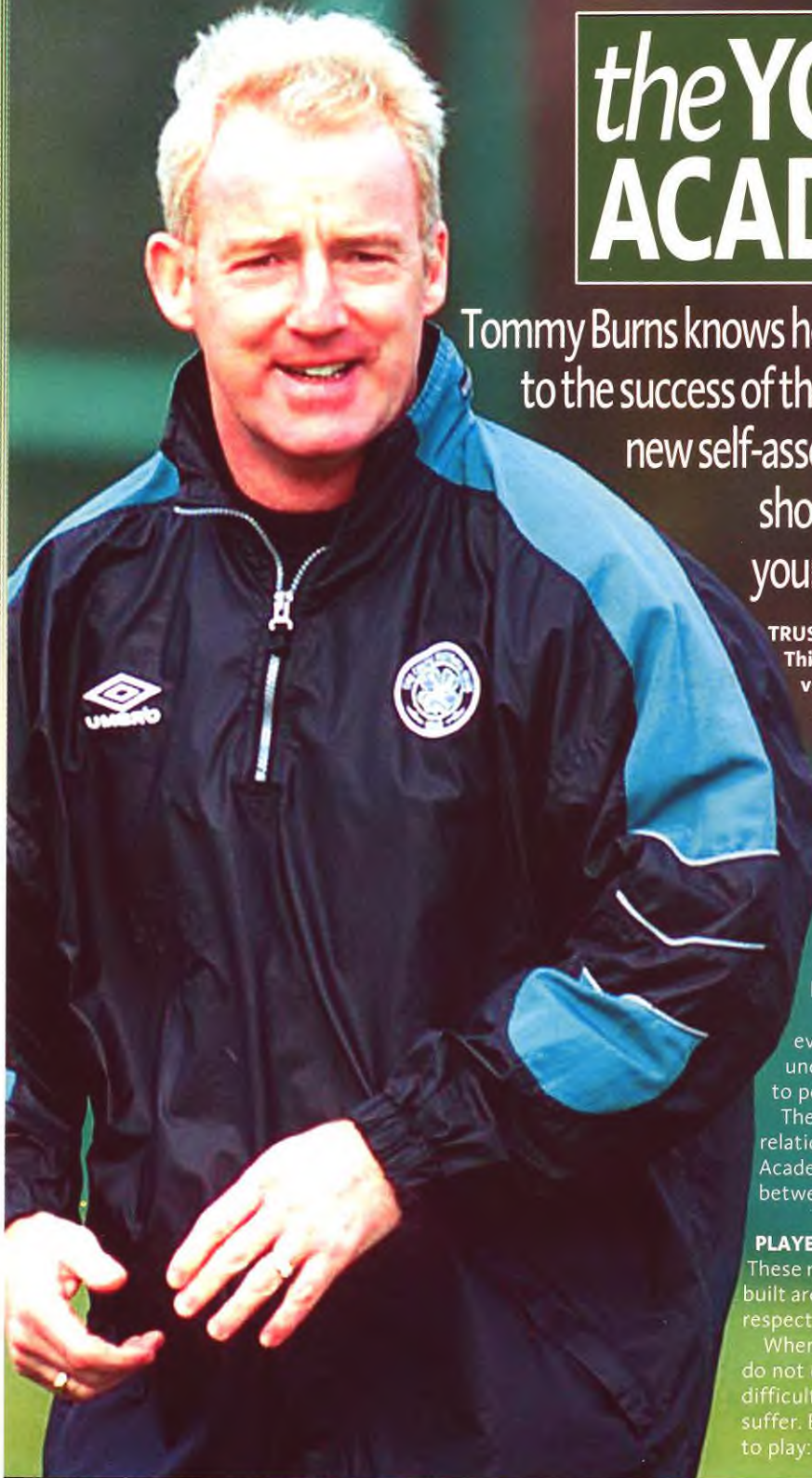

the YOUTH ACADEMY

Tommy Burns knows how crucial trust is to the success of the Academy – and new self-assessment sessions should further boost youngsters' progress

TRUST, and mutual respect.
This is something that I am very keen to promote among the staff, players and parents within our Academy.

Everyone working at the Academy must be dedicated to helping players improve and progress, and all of the players/parents in the Academy must trust those working at the Academy to help them.

It is so important that everyone involved understands they have a role to perform.

The most important relationships we have in our Academy are without doubt as between the following:

PLAYERS/ PARENTS/COACHES

These relationships have to be built around trust and mutual respect.

Where these key components do not exist there will be difficulties and everyone will suffer. Each of the three has a role to play:



● Players need to commit themselves fully to the coaching and matchday programme, and give everything they can realistically give to the club. To achieve success at a club like Celtic will require dedication and that requirement for dedication will never diminish while the player is at the club.

● Parents/Guardians need to support their child in their endeavours to achieve their role above. This is difficult, a lot of time is required, a lot of encouragement needed, a realistic view of what's possible to maintain focus, and a trust in the club to do the best that they can for the child.

● Coaches need to provide coaching that addresses the needs of the player as an individual and the group as a whole. This requires regular communication with players and parents/guardians. It will require critical evaluation of the players as well as detailed thought and planning about how to improve them.

It is a tri-partite arrangement with each member carrying big responsibilities. To help make this process work John Cushley has announced a schedule of "Self Assessment" evenings to run throughout the season at about six-week intervals for each age-group U11-U16. This will provide a forum for discussion, analysis, support and the opportunity to construct a plan going forward for each individual.

These evenings are designed to encourage relationships with the focus fully on the development of the player as an individual.

Opportunities to establish "Trust and mutual respect" will be presented and should be grabbed at every opportunity.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all of the parents/guardians of players within the Academy for their huge effort and commitment.

Believe me, we well appreciate your efforts. Enjoy the game!
