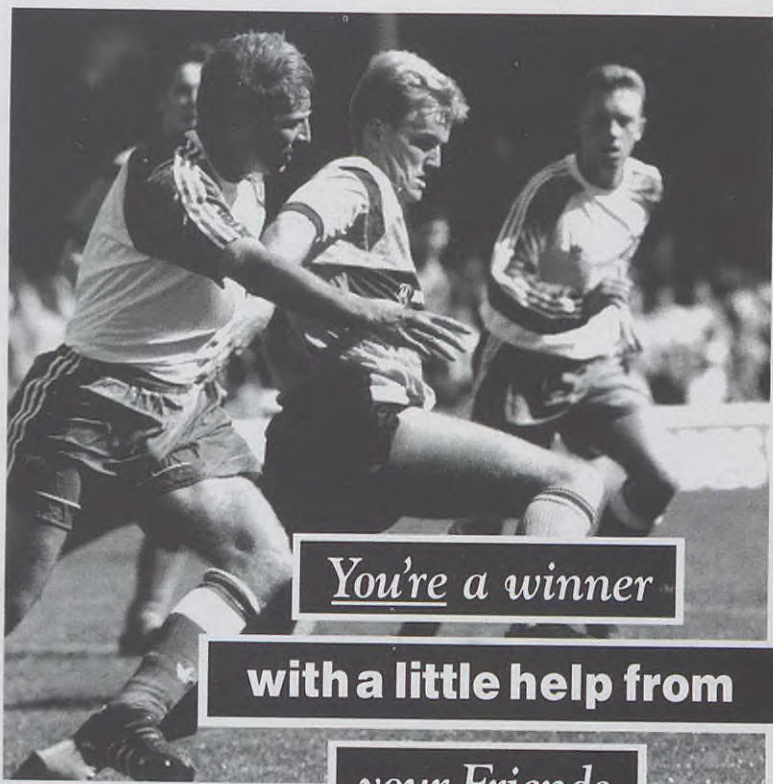

**We welcome Celtic today and I look forward to a good game. We are both passing teams and hopefully it will be a good game for the supporters. They have been playing well and the recent result against Motherwell was just a hiccup in their overall form.**

Celtic, like us, have suffered from inconsistency this season. But a couple of their most important players have been playing to their full potential recently so we know it will be a very difficult game as usual against them.

In our last league game against St Johnstone I was particularly disappointed with our form in the first half. The defence lets us down and gifted two stupid goals. I could not believe the change from the semi-final when we showed what we were capable of in defence and had curtailed Aberdeen bar for one slip-up.

But after half-time we got our act together and started to pass the ball well using shorter passes and began to spread our play a lot wider across the park.

Before we had been relying on too many long balls but this opened up their defence and we created a host of chances.

We fought back well and I felt we really deserved two points. Pat McGinlay, for example, could have had a hat-trick yet was denied even one goal. Darren Jackson's penalty miss near the end was unfortunate. He took it too quickly, but Darren is our man for that job and I have full confidence in him. We have missed 50 per cent of our penalties this season and undoubtedly it has cost us a few points.

But again that is part of our general inconsistency this season, something that you might expect from young players but not the more experienced ones.

Looking back on the semi-final I must say the disappointment is still there. We did our homework on Aberdeen. They work off the second ball from their crosses which are directed at Paatelainen, but I felt we closed him down and cut off that supply.

# First class fight back

**What could have been a real blow to club morale after the semi-final disappointment was rescued by a spirited fightback when Hibs should really have taken both points.**

But this game summed up Hibs problems all season. Any half decent judge of football could tell Hibs are a better team than St Johnstone and for that matter several other teams ahead of them in the league, but defensive lapses and the ability to shoot themselves in the foot has proved costly all term.

On top of that Darren Jackson's missed penalty summed up perfectly Hibs ability to throw away chances this season. It almost seems at times as if the team only want to win the hard way.

Saints two early goals from Allan Moore and new signing Martin Buglione (52 goals with Margate this season) had Hibs on the rocks.

Gordon Hunter and Steven Tweed, who had looked so solid against Aberdeen in the semi-final, were badly caught out when Paul Wright lobbed against the post for Moore to follow up. Willie Miller was the culprit four minutes later letting Buglione in for Saints second.

Alex Miller said afterwards: "The goals we lost were joke goals at this level - stupid defending, school playground stuff."

But the manager went on to sum up perfectly the second half. "I could

not fault our effort. Even without Darren's penalty we should have won it. He took it too quickly, but if we get another on Saturday he will take it."

It was a game Darren Jackson will want to forget. He missed a great chance to pull one back just before half-time when he blasted over from six yards in front of an empty net.

Hibs were booed off at half-time, but the introduction of Gareth Evans to a three man attack changed the game.

Darren went wide on the right as Gareth used his pace through the middle.

Within seven minutes Hibs pulled one back when Keith Wright volleyed in from 18 yards.

Hibs now went for the throat, but Andy Rhodes made two splendid saves off Pat McGinlay. First he dived to his left to beat away a close-range header, then he tipped a McGinlay header from a Jackson cross over the bar. But Rhodes wasn't finished as he then blocked a point blank shot from McGinlay.

Meanwhile Gareth had been denied a penalty when Paul Deas pulled him down, but he got compensa-

tion a few minutes later equalising in 72 minutes. Graham Mitchell swung in a cross from the left and Rhodes fumbled it. Evans leapt forward to nod in.

Hibs kept giving it pelters and looked as if the win was theirs when they got a penalty two minutes from time after Darren was pulled down by Tommy Turner.

But Dazza, who has scored three from the spot so far this season, blasted wide.

He said afterwards: "I rushed it a bit. I did not feel as confident as normal, but it is my job to take penalties and I was not going to pass the buck. There is no point in me feeling sorry for myself. I just have to pick myself up and look forward to the next game."

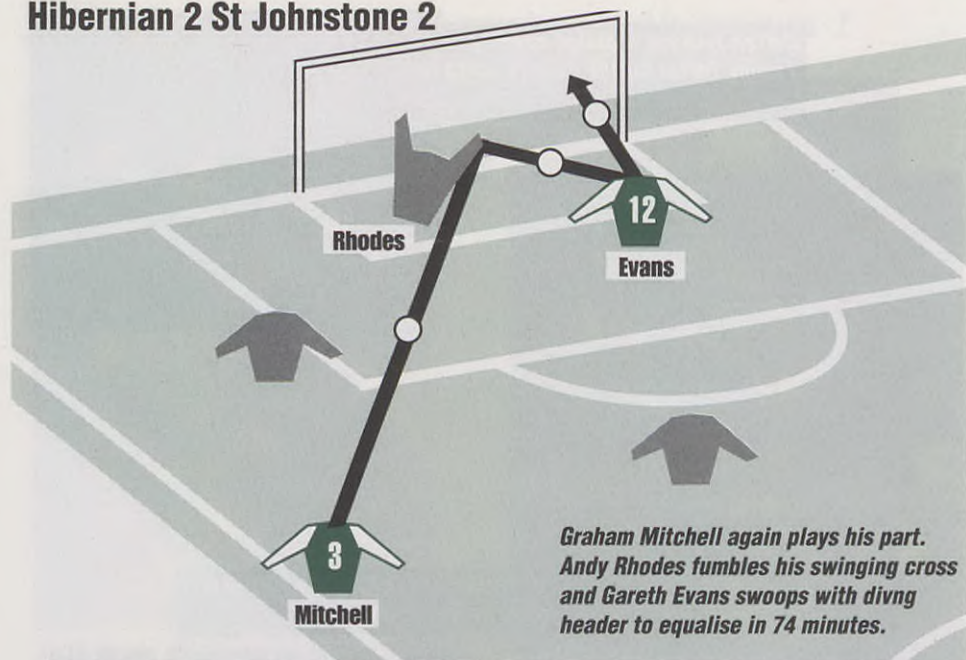

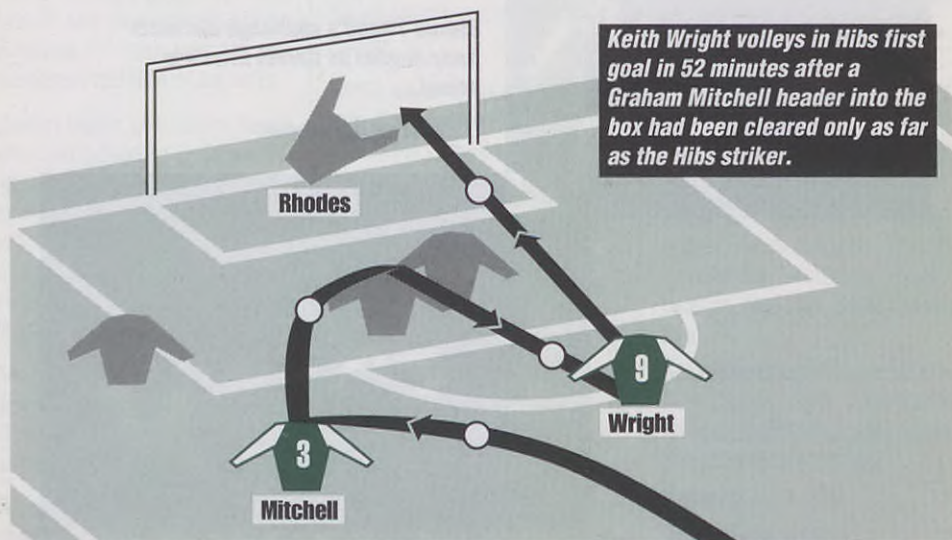

# INTERNATIONAL DID YOU KNOW?

**Hibs most capped player is Lawrie "Last Minute" Reilly. He won 38 caps between 1949-57.**

**Alan Rough** won two caps with Hibs against England and Wales in 1986. Alan came on at half-time in the World Cup qualifying game at Cardiff to replace Jim Leighton.

**Hugh Howie**, full back, scored for Scotland in his one and only cap against Wales in 1948.

**Gordon Smith** won 18 caps and scored in three consecutive internationals in 1955. The opponents were Yugoslavia, Austria and Hungary and all of them were away from home.

**James Main** won his first full cap against Ireland in March 1909 and died the same year as a result of internal injuries sustained in a match against Partick Thistle on Christmas Day.

**Joe Baker**, as we all know, was capped for England on five occasions. He also won five Under 23 caps.

Less well known is that his brother Jerry, who also played for Hibs, was capped for America.

Two Hibs goalkeepers have defended the Scotland goal at Wembley. Roughie in 1986 and Willie Harper in 1924.

Five other Hibs keepers represented Scotland at Wembley but not while they were with Hibs. They were:

**Willie Miller** (Celtic) 1947

**George Farm** (Blackpool) 1953

**Tommy Younger** (Liverpool) 1957

**Ronnie Simpson** (Celtic) 1967

**Jim Herriott** (Birmingham) 1969

One Hibs player was a Wembley Wizard. **Jimmy Dunn** played at inside right in the legendary 5-1 victory in 1928.

**Willie Bogan** made his debut for Scotland while with Hibs in 1945. He was taken off injured after 60 seconds and never won another cap.
