## MESSAGE TO SPECTATORS

Please read the following rules and advice from the club about conduct and emergency procedures which will be in place while the match is taking place. ## LAST WEEK, MOTHERWELL

**CHAIRMAN** John Boyle expressed his serious concern about the state of Scottish football following the announcement of huge losses from Fir Park. He said that his club's only route was to 'down size', and he blamed his club's closeness to Glasgow for its inability to make inroads into the 'Old Firm' fan base. He also suggested that the other SPL clubs should get more of the TV revenue rather than less.

He has a fair point. If the fans who travel regularly to watch the 'Old Firm' were to support their local teams, the crowds at matches and income to other clubs would improve considerably. But how do you make that happen? Surely one way is for the Scottish media to come out of their Celtic/Rangers fixation and provide more balanced coverage of all clubs. The best (and usually only) way for smaller SPL clubs to get any recognition for what they are doing is when they are playing one or other of the 'Old Firm'. That is surely wrong.

The media will say that they are only reflecting what the public want, but are they, or are they simply continuing the divisions between the haves and have nots in the Scottish game? 'Old Firm' matches are fascinating affairs, but not so much so that we all need to be submerged in every paper and on every TV programme with nothing else. We really have got into a terrible state when the Edinburgh based 'Scotland On Sunday' devotes every column inch of its first four pages of last week's sports section to a preview of the 'Old Firm' match! The three SPL matches that had been played on the Saturday? Oh, they were relegated and neatly condensed into less than one page on page five.

The Scottish media do have a responsibility to promote the others much more than they currently do. If they don't, they might find, all too soon, that they won't have anything to write about.
