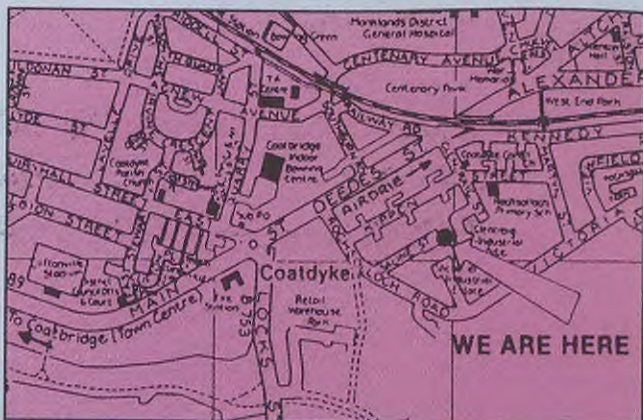






In the first half we played reasonably well without ever threatening very much but we still felt a bit aggrieved to trail 1-0 at the interval having dealt comfortably with most of Saints attacks.

However, in the second half we exerted our authority on the game and equalised through Davie Kirkwood who hit a low drive in to the bottom corner of the net.
