

# The Manager

Obviously, I was very disappointed at the way we went out of the Coca-Cola Cup at Dens Park on Wednesday night. It was a shocking first-half performance and that was where the game was won and lost. The fans were right to be angry with us at half-time and I couldn't wait to get into the dressing-room myself and I can assure you some harsh words were spoken. Players have got to realise that they must have the correct attitude and application for the full 90 minutes.

Commitment is not something you can just switch on at certain points in a game or indeed in certain games in a season. It has to be there all the time and players must give a hundred per cent. At 2-2, I was sure that we would go on and win the game and I'm sure the fans felt the same way but then we go and do something that is totally unprofessional and it costs us a goal. I was happy with the way we responded in the second-half and in extra-time but we have to learn to play with that sort of passion from the start of matches. We had plenty of warning with the Partick Thistle result.

When a match gets down to penalty shoot-outs as it did on



Wednesday, then anything can happen and you can't blame players for missing penalties in these situations. But the point is that it should never have gone that far.

The only plus point is that we hopefully have learned our lesson from it and we will be determined not to let that slackness creep in again. We have to make things happen in a match rather than waiting for them to happen.

Today, we welcome Celtic and this is the sort of match we need after Wednesday.

There will be a big crowd and a great atmosphere and players do not need to be motivated for these sort of matches.

I'm sure the players will be up for this one. We have done well at Tynecastle so far this season and we'll be looking to continue that form.

*Celtic are always exponents of attractive football and after six barren years, this great quality was rewarded by success in last season's Scottish Cup Final. Credit must be given to Manager, Tommy Burns, and his staff who have continued to adopt Celtic's traditional style of play, while restructuring the squad.*

*In addition, Managing Director, Fergus McCann, and his board played a lead role with their major investment in the club and through masterminding the most successful share issue in the history of the game. This has eliminated old debt; allowing the club to move back home to a rapidly developing Celtic Park; and providing funds for Tommy Burns to strengthen his squad.*

*The Parkhead boss has bought wisely in Van Hooijdonk, Thom, McKinlay, O'Donnell and Hughes, while also giving youth a chance through Slavín, Gray, McLaughlin and Mackay. This re-shaped squad has certainly excited supporters with record season ticket sales being recorded.*

*Celtic have certainly made a sound start to the current campaign and are currently second in the League table. Our visitors have also recorded a fine away victory in the Cup Winners Cup against Georgian side, Dinamo Batumi.*

*Regardless of the result this week against Rangers, Celtic are moving forward once again and Hearts face a demanding fixture as the famous Glasgow club strives to end Rangers dominance of the Championship.*

# Introducing

♥ Last season, Celtic finished 4th in the Championship, but went on to win the Scottish Cup with a 1-0 win over Airdrie in the Final. In the Coca-Cola Cup, our visitors lost the Final on penalties to Raith Rovers.

♥ Leading competitive goalscorers for the parkhead club last season were - John Collins 12; Andy Walker 8; Pierre Van Hooijdonk 8; Willie Falconer 7; Phil O'Donnell 7; and Peter Grant 3.

♥ Celtic's recent share issue was the most successful of any football club in the UK and was over subscribed. The club now has some 10,000 shareholders and the £13.8 million raised, helped to eliminate old debt; assisted with the funding for ground development; and provide cash for new players.

♥ Although Rangers secured their 7th Championship in a row last season, Celtic hold the record with 9-in-a-row between 1965-66 and 1973-74.

♥ Having returned to Celtic Park this term, our visitors have sold a record number of season tickets, a remarkable 26,000. Last season at their temporary

home, Hampden Park the "Hoops" attracted an average attendance of 24,601.

♥ Celtic's quite magnificent North Stand was completed during the summer at a cost of some £17 million. The new structure has 26,000 seats and with a further 8,000 in the Main Stand (built in 1929 and redeveloped in 1971) the capacity is a temporary 34,000. Celtic Park will eventually hold 60,000 spectators.

# GLASGOW CELTIC F.C.

**GORDON MARSHALL:** Goalkeeper. Age 31 from Edinburgh. Son of Hearts famous goalkeeper, Gordon has re-established himself as Celtic's last line of defence. The former Internationalist has had senior experience with Rangers, East Stirling, East Fife and Falkirk, from whom he was signed by Celtic in August 1991 for £270,000. Height 6'2"

**PAT BONNER:** Goalkeeper. Age 35 from Donegal. Signed from Keadue Rovers in 1978, the confident and commanding Irishman has made nearly 500 League appearances and played 78 times for his country. The 6'2" keeper has won all the domestic honours and has a place in any future Celtic Hall of Fame.

**TOM BOYD:** Defender. Age 29 from Glasgow. Pacy, attack-minded full-back or central defender, Tom came to Parkhead from Chelsea in February 1992. A regular in the national team, Tom also played for Motherwell whom he skippered to Scottish Cup success in 1991. Links very well with the forwards. Height 5'11"

**TOSH McKinlay:** Defender. Age 30 from Glasgow. One of the country's best attacking full-backs and more than merited his recent International caps. Tosh was with Celtic Boys Club, but started his senior career at Dundee before moving to Hearts in December 1988 for £300,000. Joined Celtic last season for a fee of £350,000. Height 5'7"

**RUDI VATA:** Defender. Age 26 from Schroder, Albania. Former striker, who moved back into defence to win International honours and is currently starring in an attacking full-back role. Rudi played for Vlaznia Shkoder and Dinamo Tirana, to whom Celtic paid £200,000 for his transfer in August 1992. The 6-footer also had a spell in France.

**JOHN HUGHES:** Defender. Age 31 from Edinburgh. Tough and inspirational defender who signed last month from Falkirk, with the fee to be assessed by tribunal. John played for Arbroath as a teenager, then had five years as a junior before kick-starting his career at Berwick. The former striker then had a spell at Swansea, joining Falkirk in 1990.

**MALCOLM MACKAY:** Defender. Age 23 from Bellshill. Powerful central defender who has been on the fringe of the first team squad since his transfer from Queens Park in August 1993. Height 6'1"

**MARK McNALLY:** Defender. Age 24 from Motherwell. Strong and quick central defender or full-back, Mark stepped-up from Celtic Boys Club in May 1987 and

has now made over 100 League appearances. The Under-21 Internationalist is very strong in the air, although only 5'9"

**PETER GRANT:** Midfielder. Age 30 from Bellshill. Signed from Celtic Boys Club in 1982, Peter is the club's midfield anchorman and is currently showing the form which earned International honours in 1989. No one works harder for the Celtic cause than Peter, who has shown great organisational ability. Height 5'9"

**PHIL O'DONNELL:** Midfielder. Age 23 from Bellshill. Goalscoring and skilful midfielder who also has limitless stamina. Phil was SPFA Young Player of the Year in 1991-92 and 1993-93 while with his first senior club, Motherwell, and he has now earned his first International cap. Phil cost Celtic £1.7 million when transferred at the start of last season. Height 5'10"

**JOHN COLLINS:** Midfielder. Age 27 from Galashiels. Classy, International playmaker and prolific midfield goalscorer, John once trained with Celtic Boys Club. However, he started his career with Hibs and Celtic subsequently paid £1 million for his transfer in July 1990. A key man at Parkhead and currently in fine form. Height 5'7"

**PAUL McSTAY:** Midfielder. Age 30 from Hamilton. Signed from Celtic Boys Club in 1981, Paul has been the Parkhead club's creative midfield general over many years and is a stalwart in the International team. The Celtic captain has been sidelined so far this season with an ankle injury, but looked back to his best in this weeks match against Rangers. Height 5'10"

**SIMON DONNELLY:** Forward. Age 20 from Glasgow. Pacy and skilful front man who broke into the squad in 1993-94 and is now an Under-21 Internationalist and one of Scotland's hottest prospects. Simon signed from Celtic Boys Club in May 1993. Height 5'6"

**PIERRE VAN HOOIJDONK:** Forward. Age 25 from The Netherlands. Towering and skilful Dutch International striker who made his mark with RBC Roosendaal and then NAC Breda from whom he joined Celtic last season for £1.5 million. Sets-up chances as well as scoring goals and was the Celts Cup winning hero from last term. Height 6'5"

**ANDREAS THOM:** Forward. Age 30 from Germany. Exciting accomplished striker who earned 51 caps for East Germany and further honours after his country's

unification. Andreas rose to fame with Dynamo Berlin and became the first big transfer from East to West when he joined Bayer Leverkusen in 1989 for £1.5 million. His move from Bayer to Celtic cost £1.7 million.

**ANDY WALKER:** Forward. Age 30 from Glasgow. Hard working and tough striker who joined Motherwell from Baillieston Juniors and then transferred to Celtic in 1987 for £350,000. Andy moved to Bolton in 1992 and after a successful spell in England, he returned to Celtic in July 1994 for a tribunal fixed fee of £550,000. Has one cap for Scotland. Height 5'8"

**BRIAN McLAUGHLIN:** Forward. Age 21 from Bellshill. Dynamic, ball-playing winger who broke through in 1993 after signing from Giffnock North AFC in July 1992. The 5'4" forward has great pace.

**TONY MOWBRAY:** Defender. Age 31 from Saltburn. Spent ten years with his local club, Middlesborough, where he was hailed as a dependable and uncompromising centre-half. A fee of £1 million took Tony to Celtic in November 1991 and he has now played over 350 games in a hooped shirt. The powerful 6'1" midfielder is a threat at set pieces.

**WILLIE FALCONER:** Forward. Age 29 from Aberdeen. Powerful, 6'1" midfielder or striker, Willie is a product of Lewis United and started his senior career with Aberdeen. He moved to Watford in 1988, Middlesborough in 1991 and then Sheffield United in 1993. Willie then signed for Celtic in February 1994 for a fee of £260,000. Wins most of the high balls.

trip to Dundee and gave the team so much encouragement.

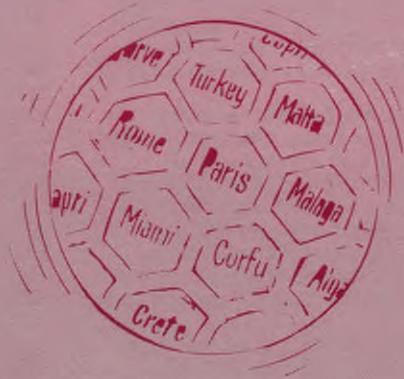
We do, however, have to take positive aspects from our start to the season and in particular the form of our young players - not just in the first team but throughout the Club - and the return of traditional fighting spirit.
