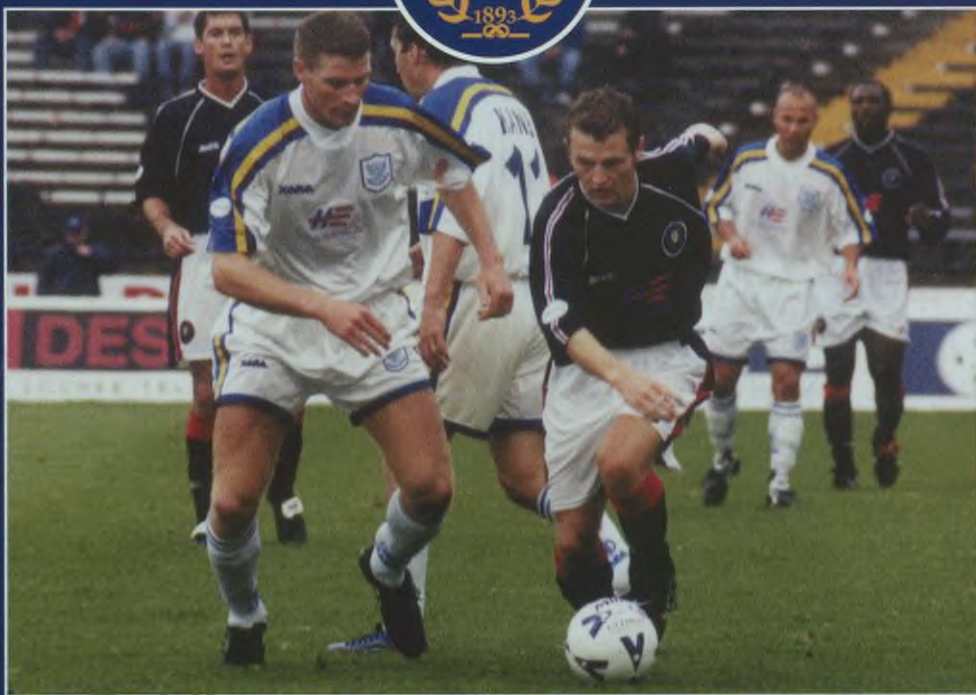

# MEMORY MATCH

Saturday, 28th February 1987  
Dundee 4  
Celtic 1



**Jocky Scott was in his first spell as Dundee manager for the game we feature this afternoon and it was one which brought more than a hint of satisfaction to everyone connected with Dundee Football Club.**

Whilst the top five had opened up a gap at the head of the table, the Dark Blues sat comfortably in sixth place and with three games in hand on most of their rivals had the opportunity to close the gap on Hearts who were thirteen points better off.

For the visit of Celtic that February afternoon, Jocky Scott shuffled his pack, still searching for that elusive first league win of 1987. The match also came in the wake of a draw in the Scottish Cup against Meadowbank. A performance which Jocky Scott referred to as 'nothing short of terrible, so changes in personnel didn't come as a surprise. Out went Stuart Rafferty, Ian Angus and Graham Harvey and in came Jim Duffy, Stewart Forsyth and John Brown as their replacements.

In Celtic's ranks, Pierce O'Leary took over from Anton Rogan and Mark Smith joined the 54-goal Brian McClair-Maurice Johnston strike force to the exclusion of Alan McInally. And the changes in personnel really gave the side the impetus they needed to challenge the league leaders. None-the-less, the Dark Blues trooped off for their half-time cuppa, trailing to Brian McClair's 31st strike of the season.

That came about in the 21st minute when the Celtic striker struck a 20 yard free-kick from the left through an opening into the far corner, giving Bobby Geddes no chance.

However, within a minute of the re-start, Dundee were back on level terms with a fine goal. Ross Jack made a run down the left and crossed to John Brown who pushed the ball across the face of the goal. Tommy Coyne allowed the ball to run past him and Vince Mennie hit it low into the net for what was his only goal that season.

Fifteen minutes later, Celtic found themselves trailing to another great goal. Stewart Forsyth made a run down the right before cutting inside to knock the ball in front of Rab Shannon and he chased it into the box to bury a low right-foot shot past Bonner.

The abiding memory of this game apart from the noteworthy result was the quality of the goals and this was equally true of Dundee's third just two minutes later.

Vince Mennie scampered down the right wing and centred for John Brown to run in and bullet



a header beyond the bewildered Bonner.

Celtic were going through the mill now, but survived until seven minutes from the end before conceding a fourth. Neat play put Rab Shannon through on the right. His shot hit the bar, but fell invitingly to Ross Jack who promptly netted.

That capped Dundee's best display of the season and also marked what Celtic manager Davie Hay described as the worst performance of his managerial reign. But he was gracious in defeat, stating, "Dundee were worthy 4-1 winners and could have had half a dozen goals."

Meanwhile an obviously jubilant Jocky Scott said, "We annihilated Celtic. Our first three goals were brilliant. Wouldn't a repeat of that this afternoon go down well!"

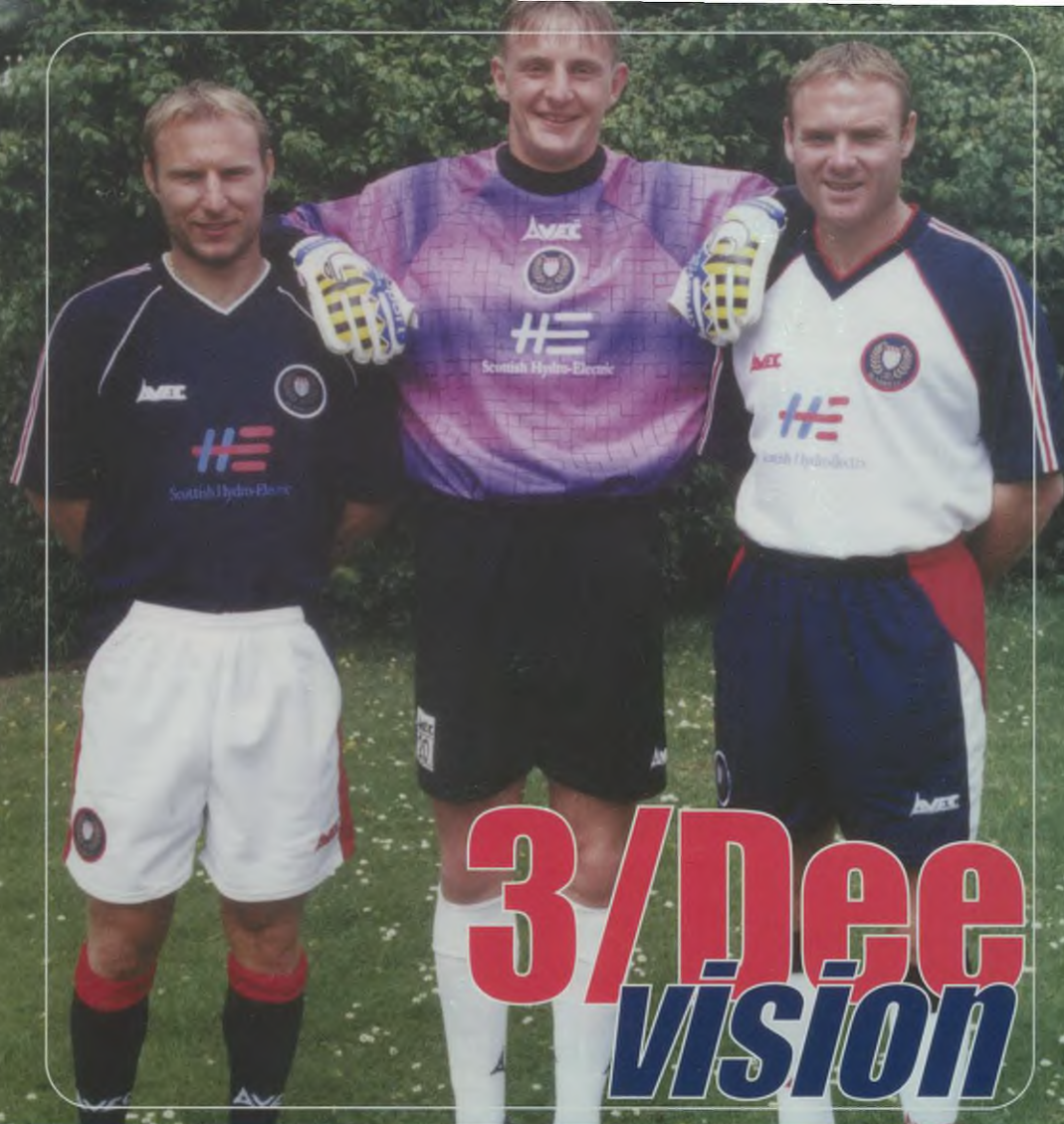
