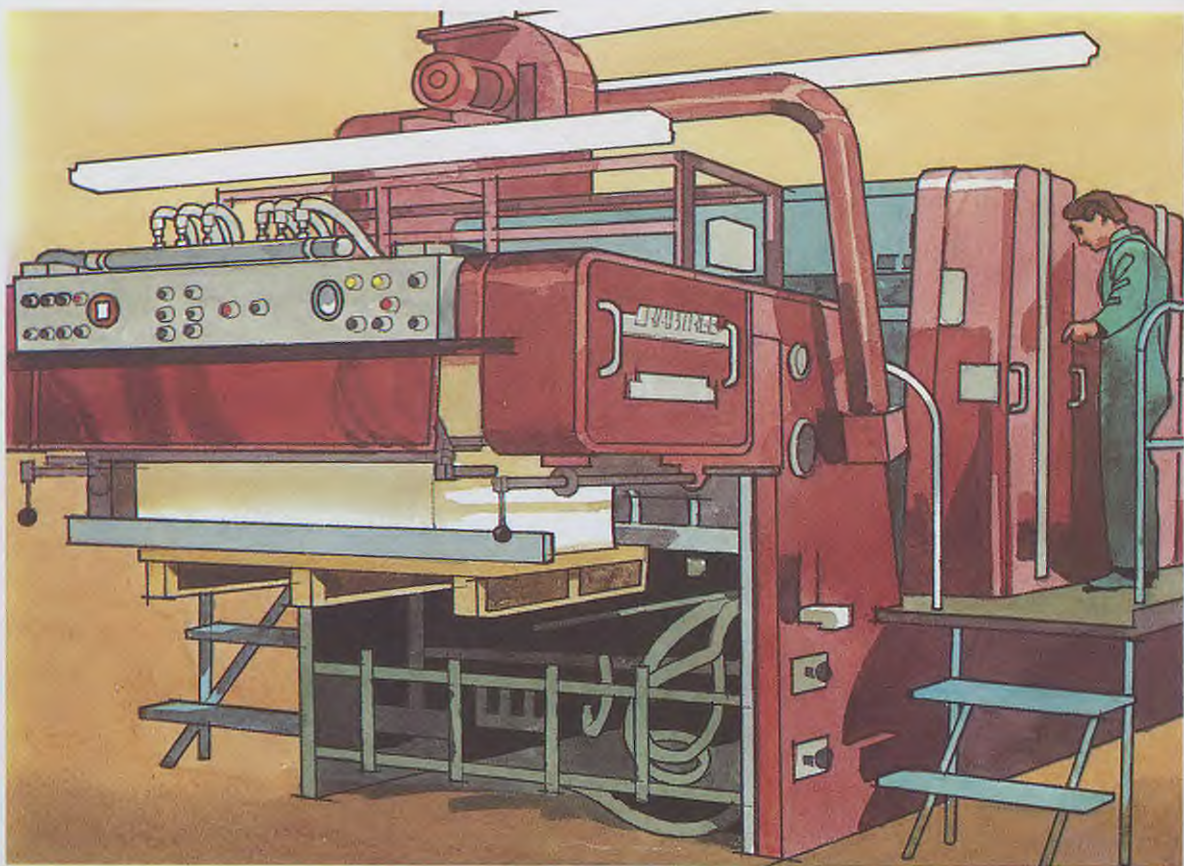

IAN SKELLY PLAYER OF THE YEAR

FRASER WISHART

When Fraser Wishart limped off the park at Easter Road with a mere 6 minutes left to play, he brought to an end a most enviable record. This was the first Premier League game in 101 consecutive matches that Fraser failed to complete the full 90 minutes. Last season he was the only outfield Premier League player to play a full 90 minutes in every game and he looked as though he was going to do the same again this season, when he took a knock and had to come off. A most remarkable run.

The only time that I can recall Fraser being substituted was late on in the Semi-Final of the League Cup against Rangers last year at Hampden when the score stood at 2-1 for Rangers and Motherwell were going all out for an equaliser.

With all the stresses and strains on modern footballers and taking into consideration the number of games played—a player who is ALWAYS fit is worth his weight in gold to any manager.

DOMINATED BY FEAR

The Ray Farningham goal at Easter Road brought Motherwell's unbeaten run to six games. More important than that is the fact that it took their points total to 35 which is 6 better than Falkirk with a vastly superior goal-difference. They are also 4 points better off than St. Mirren who only have two games left and the Saints also have a much poorer goal difference.

This means that with our tremendous late burst we have ensured that we will be playing in the top ten in 1988/89 season. It looks odds-on that we will be joined by near neighbours Hamilton Accies who only need a single point to clinch promotion.

It has been a long hard campaign which has been dominated at the bottom of the league by FEAR. The penalty for failure could have meant oblivion in a

football sense and with 25% of the teams in the League destined for the drop, it resulted in a fight for survival among the bottom six teams.

This did little to add to the entertainment value of matches. Results were more important than the manner in which they were achieved. Even experienced players were frightened to attempt and express themselves by trying anything unorthodox in case it didn't come off and they put their team in trouble.

This simply isn't good for football and our legislators must make certain that a similar situation is never allowed to arise again.

Football should be all about flair, excitement, goals, enjoyment, near-misses, attack, entertainment, commitment, skill and all packaged in an environment where players are allowed to give all this to their supporters, uninhibited by the fear of failure and its consequences. The modern game has become negative, at times to the point of being cynical in its disregard to the spectators. The most notable exception to this has been today's visitors—CELTIC. They have a long, proud tradition of playing all out attacking football and it is with this approach that they have won the Premier League Championship in this their Centenary Year.

It is worthy of note that their often maligned defence has only conceded 23 goals in 42 games. This of course is the outcome of concentrating on playing every game in the oppositions half of the park!

It has been an interesting season and now that all the pressures are off we should be able to look forward to a highly entertaining encounter today.

EDINBURGH FOOTBALL PROGRAMME FAIR

ACTION REPLAY

THE FOOTBALL GROUNDS IMPROVEMENT TRUST

During the past thirteen years, over £35 million has been spent by the Football Grounds Improvement Trust on safety and improvements work at League grounds throughout Britain. This money has been raised entirely from the Spotting-the-Ball competition run by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettlers. FGIT's primary objective is to bring Britain's football stadia up to the highest level of safety possible. We take this opportunity to trace the progress of the organisation.

Last month Tom Wharton, Chairman of the Football Grounds Improvement Trust, announced that grounds in the United Kingdom had reached their highest ever level of safety. Commenting upon the progress made, Mr. Wharton confirmed: "Three years ago, shortly after the Bradford City disaster, it was suggested that many league clubs would have to close. As a result of our safety programme, not one ground has been closed and football has come through perhaps its most serious period in relation to spectator safety."

Having invested £35 million, the Football Grounds Improvement Trust has become an integral part of the professional game. During the past three years alone, no fewer than 2,500 applications for grant-aid have been serviced, with every single League club throughout the United Kingdom offered assistance in their endeavours to raise the level of safety and comfort at grounds.

The work of FGIT is visible throughout the League with the new stand at Watford, covering at Everton and

Sheffield Wednesday and disabled facilities at a number of clubs including Hartlepool, each a testament to the pools funded organisation.

The Football Grounds Improvement Trust was formed by the PPA in 1975 as a direct response to Parliament's passing of the Safety of Sports Grounds Act after the 1971 Ibrox Disaster in which 66 football fans were killed.

"We're proud of our role," Chairman Tom Wharton stated. "We've gone a long way in helping our clubs make grounds safer and more comfortable for supporters."

The progress made has not been restricted to the professional game. Spotting-the-Ball contributes over £9 million each year to provide for the benefit of football at every level. Initiatives such as building pitches, providing changing accommodation, safety at 'non-League' grounds, research into hooliganism, closed circuit television, the cost of policing League matches and sometimes even paying for park team kit is all funded by the sister organisation The Football Trust.

With the season ending on an optimistic note, Mr. Wharton firmly believes that League football clubs are both capable and willing to provide facilities in keeping with the status of this premier competition. And he concludes: "Should the PPA's donation continue at its present rate, the next decade will see a further £40 million investment in providing the facilities at grounds necessary to take football into the 21st century."

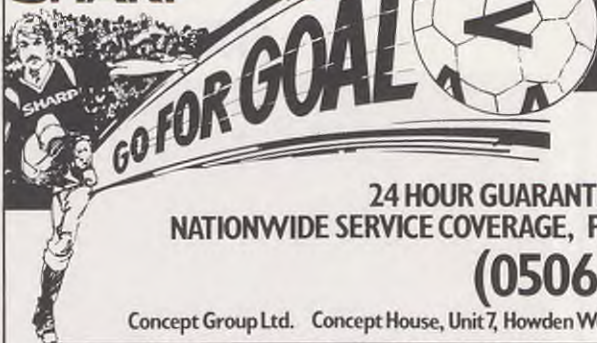

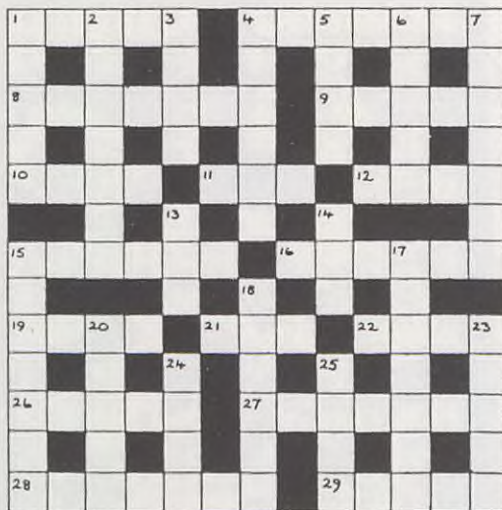
To win the long hard grind of the Premier League Championship requires team effort over the course of 44 games.

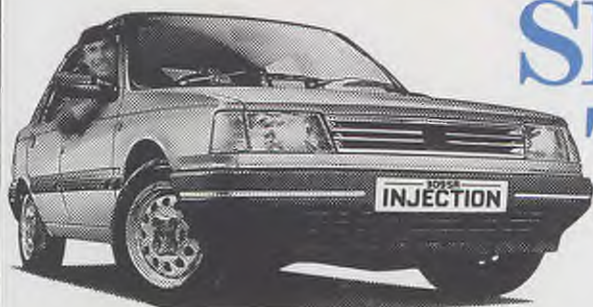
