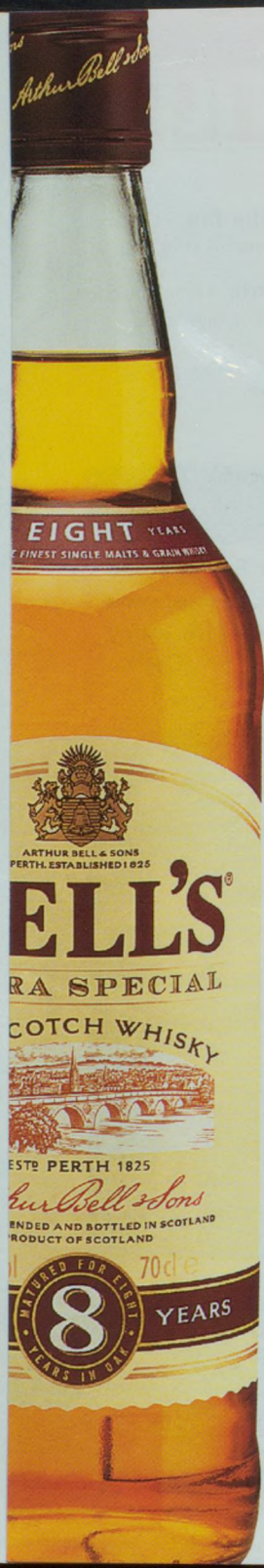

Both clubs have made several changes during the summer

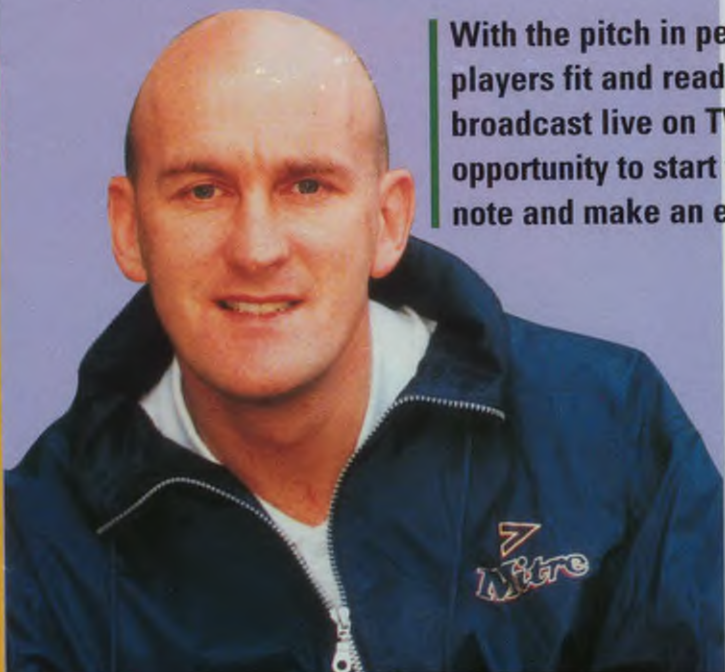

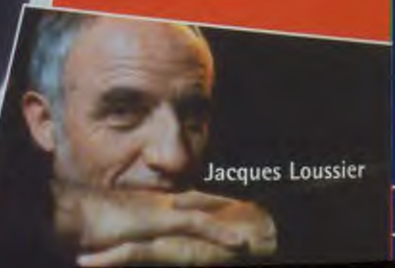
