DID YOU KNOW?

Celtic made history in 1967 when, with a 2-1 victory over Inter Milan in Lisbon, they became the first British side to win the European Cup.

Celts legend Jimmy McGrory holds the record for scoring the most goals in one season for the club. He netted a half century in Season 1935/36.

The record attendance for the Bhoys is not surprisingly against today's opponents and Old Firm rivals Rangers. In 1938 an astonishing 92,000 people crammed into Celtic Park to watch the two sides.

Celtic's 1-0 victory over Airdrie in the Scottish Cup Final of 1995 is their only piece of silverware in the last EIGHT years. But they have the chance to add to that later this month when they play Dundee United in the Coca-Cola Cup Final at this very ground.

Celtic have had SIX managers in the last ten years while Rangers have had only NINE in the club's entire 124-year history.



DID YOU KNOW?

Current manager Wim Jansen ironically played against Celtic some 27 years ago. The Dutchman was in the Feyenoord side that defeated the Celts in the 1970 European Cup Final.

Midfield man Paul McStay was forced to retire from football at the end of last season due to injury. McStay, who had been at Celtic for 16 years, was the club's most capped player – with 73 appearances.

When Celtic defender Tom Boyd led Scotland out against Latvia in the crucial World Cup qualifier at Celtic Park last month, he was winning his 50th cap for his country.

The first ever Old Firm match took place on May 28, 1888, the year of Celtic's formation. The match took place at the first Celtic Park, with the home side winning 5-2.

The Hoops hold the upper hand in Premier League meetings between the two sides. They have 31 victories to Rangers' 25 and there have been 26 draws.

CELTIC travel to Ibrox this afternoon hoping to stamp out a dismal record against their Old Firm rivals in recent years.

For the last two seasons the Parkhead side have failed to record a single league victory over Rangers.

The two sides will meet twice in the space of 11 days, a brace of matches which will surely determine just how far new boss Wim Jansen has taken his side.

The Dutchman has been a revelation since his appointment to the Celtic Park post in August, leading them to the Coca-Cola Cup final against Dundee United later this month.

It is new signings such as Super Swede **HENRIK LARSSON** who has helped get the Bhoys back playing with confidence.

The dreadlocked striker notched his eighth goal of the League campaign in last week's 2-0 victory over Dunfermline.

The Celtic fans have been crying out for a new centre-forward but with the form of Larsson and **SIMON DONNELLY** sometimes you wonder why.

Amazingly with the influx of foreigners to both Rangers and Celtic Donnelly, at the age of only 22, is one of the most experienced players in this historic match.

Arguably the most influential signing Jansen has made this season is a homegrown international – a sight not often seen in today's game in light of the Bosman ruling.

But **CRAIG BURLEY** – a regular in the Scotland set-up – has been ever-present for the Bhoys this season and scored the vital solitary goal in the Coca-Cola Cup final semi-final.

Another option in midfield may be new signing **PAUL LAMBERT**. He was all set to return to Scotland this week in a £1.7million move from Borussia Dortmund and could even make his debut today.

Danish midfielder **MORTEN WIEGHORST** will be happy with the personnel change at managerial level.

He found himself on the bench most of the time under Tommy Burns and when he did get on the field it was usually late on.

But Jansen has played him regularly this season and as a result Wieghorst is again featuring in the international set-up and will be hoping to travel to the World Cup with Denmark.

Youngster **JACKIE McNAMARA** is another whose change of position has helped him blossom under the

At the start of the season former full-back McNamara looked to be out of Jansen's plans but when given the chance he grabbed it with both hands and as a result is enjoying possibly his best spell at the club.

Former Celtic winger Paolo Di Canio would be a hard act for any professional to follow, but that is the job facing Dutchman **REGI BLINKER**.

Di Canio was held in high esteem by the majority of Celtic fans and there were a few broken hearts when he moved south to Sheffield Wednesday but Blinker will have eased the pain a little with his first league goal last week.

Celtic currently have the best defensive record in the Premier Division – an amazing turnaround from last season when the rearguard gave the fans much cause for concern.

Englishman **ALAN STUBBS** revealed he had personal problems last season which affected his game but he has bolstered the back four this time around with the help of Danish defender **MARC RIEPER**.

Rieper signed from English Premiership side West Ham United earlier in the season and is enjoying his football north of the border.

Another foreign import is Frenchman **STEPHANE MAHE** who also links up well in defence.

Although his recent bizarre haircut seems to have drawn more press attention than his on-field antics!

Scotland defender **TOM BOYD** is the most experienced player in

Old Firm matches within the Celtic ranks.

He also reached a milestone on the international scene against Latvia last month when he won his 50th cap for Scotland.

Goalkeeper **JONATHAN GOULD** will be the last line of defence and he too has been a shrewd investment.

A series of shut-outs has helped him claim the No 1 jersey from **STEWART KERR**.

DARREN JACKSON

encountered a serious head injury on the team bus travelling to a match at Celtic Park

But the former Hibs star has made a speedy recovery playing in a reserve game on Tuesday but a place on the bench today looks to be his best bet.

Another player who played in that reserve game and is also recovering from an injury is striker **TOMMY JOHNSON**.

And all being well, the former Aston Villa frontman should also feature on the bench.

Midfielders **PHIL O'DONNELL** and **DAVID HANNAH** have struggled to find a starting place such is the good form of the middle men in the current team.

Both could also find a place on the sub's bench this afternoon.

Another defensive option is Italian **ENRICO ANNONI**. The former Serie A defender signed towards the end of last season and has already experienced the red-hot atmosphere of an Old Firm encounter.

IBROX Q & A

After joining Rangers in 1983, for how many consecutive seasons did Ally McCoist score against Celtic?

Coisty netted at least once against the Celts in each of his first nine seasons with Rangers. Not surprisingly, he's the Gers' leading post-war scorer in Old Firm matches.

What is Rangers' best comeback in an Old Firm Premier League game?

That came in September 1977 when the Light Blues triumphed 3-2 after trailing 2-0 at half-time. In May 1983, the Gers went down 4-2 to Celtic despite being two ahead at the interval.

Richard Gough famously scored his first-ever goal for Rangers in the October 1987 Old Firm match at Ibrox. Have any other players opened their Gers scoring account in games against Celtic?

Others who have done just that in recent times include Alex Cleland (below) at Parkhead in September 1995, Nigel Spackman at Parkhead in January 1990 and Terry Hurlock at Ibrox in September 1990.

What's Rangers' best unbeaten run in Old Firm League games?

The Gers have twice chalked up a sequence of 13 Old Firm League matches without defeat. The first spell was from seasons 1921-22 to 1927-28 and the second stretched between September 1957 and their 3-1 loss at Parkhead in September 1964.

Is it true that one of Celtic's "Lisbon Lions" European Cup winning team was the son of a former Rangers player?

"Lions" goalkeeper Ronnie Simpson was the son of Jimmy Simpson, the Light Blues' stalwart centre-half of the 1930s.

Incidentally, Simon Donnelly's father Tom was once on Rangers books.

What's been the highest-scoring Old Firm match of modern times?

Since the Premier League began in 1975, the top goals bonanza was the highly-entertaining 4-4 draw of March 1986. Ally McCoist, Robert Fleck and Cammy Fraser (2) were the Rangers scorers while Mo Johnston, Brian McClair, Tommy Burns and Murdo MacLeod were

on target for the visitors. It's probably one of the few occasions that both sets of fans went home happy.

A couple of seasons back, Celtic played their home matches at Hampden. Have Rangers ever used Hampden for home Old Firm games?

During the 1978-79 season, the Gers played their home matches against Celtic at Hampden because of reconstruction work at Ibrox. The results were 1-1 and 1-0 to Rangers.

REAL GREEK TRAGEDY FOR THE GERS



ON THE SLIDE...
Midfield ace Stuart
McCall sprints
away from an AEK
Athens tackle

WITH average summer temperatures of 90 degrees plus, Athens is one of the warmest European capitals and local side AEK certainly made it hot for Rangers when they visited the city in August 1994.

A crowd of 30,000 packed into the compact Nikos Goumas Stadium for the crunch Champions' Cup qualifier and the atmosphere was distinctly hostile as the home fans launched firecrackers into the travelling Rangers contingent.

On the pitch too, the Light Blues found AEK's firepower difficult to handle and the eventual 2-0 scoreline in no way flattered the Greeks.

Indeed if it hadn't been for the heroics of Andy Goram, Rangers could well have been out of Europe at the end of the first leg.

As early as the 10th minute, striker Dimitrios Saravakos gave a taste of things to come when he shot just over following a mistake by Gary Stevens.

Just minutes later, AEK has a goal chalked off before Brian Laudrup had to look lively to stop a low drive from Tsartas.

Rangers' attacks were restricted to the odd sortie from Brian Laudrup and the real action was all at Andy Goram's end.

Dimitriadis flashed a header inches wide then Kostis blasted in a shot which Goram somehow managed to tip round the post.

We present the unique country-by-country story of Rangers' travels in Europe.
Part 12: GREECE

The Gers keeper then had to scramble back hurriedly to push away an effort from Saravakos.

Just as it looked as if Rangers would get through the first half unscathed, danger man Saravakos hit them with a hammer blow.

His powerful right foot drive whizzed through a wall of players and into the Light Blues net.

After the break, Rangers' created their best opportunity to snatch a crucial away goal in the 56 minute.

Laudrup and Durie broke clear but their link play was thwarted by a timely interception from the AEK defence.

Fourteen minutes later, Walter Smith's men fell further behind and again it was Saravakos who did the damage. The explosive winger beat Richard Gough to the ball and, although Goram beat out his initial effort, the AEK man cannoned the rebound high into the net.

Ian Durrant replaced Durie in a late bid to salvage something from the match but, in the end, the Light Blues had to consider themselves fortunate to have only conceded the two goals.

Obviously that result left a tall order for the second leg but Rangers still harboured hopes of a history-defying comeback.

Sadly, on a rain-soaked Ibrox evening, these hopes never looked likely to be realised.

Minutes before half-time, AEK's Macedonian star Toni Saveski capitalised on some loose defending to ram the ball past Goram.

The Stadium went predictably quiet but no-one could deny that the Greeks were worth their lead.

In efforts from Kassapis and Vlachos, the away side had created the best first-half chances while Rangers had never really troubled goalkeeper Atmatsidis.

As the Gers forward partnership

of Mark Hateley and Duncan Ferguson struggled, AEK continued their neat possession play in the second period and always posed the more danger.

Ian Durrant was sent on for Gordon Durie and Basile Boli pushed forward but Rangers had little joy in affecting the pattern of the game.

As the clock ticked round, AEK could have increased their lead as the dispirited Light Blues faced up to their inevitable Euro exit.

After the game, Gers boss Walter Smith had no complaints:

"AEK worked hard at closing us down and were the better team over the two legs," he admitted.

AEK went on to play in some illustrious company in that season's Champions League and they only managed to gain two points from a section which included both Ajax and AC Milan.

Coincidentally, you may have read recently that the Athens side have been taken over by ENIC, the investment company which acquired a 25% stake in Rangers in February.

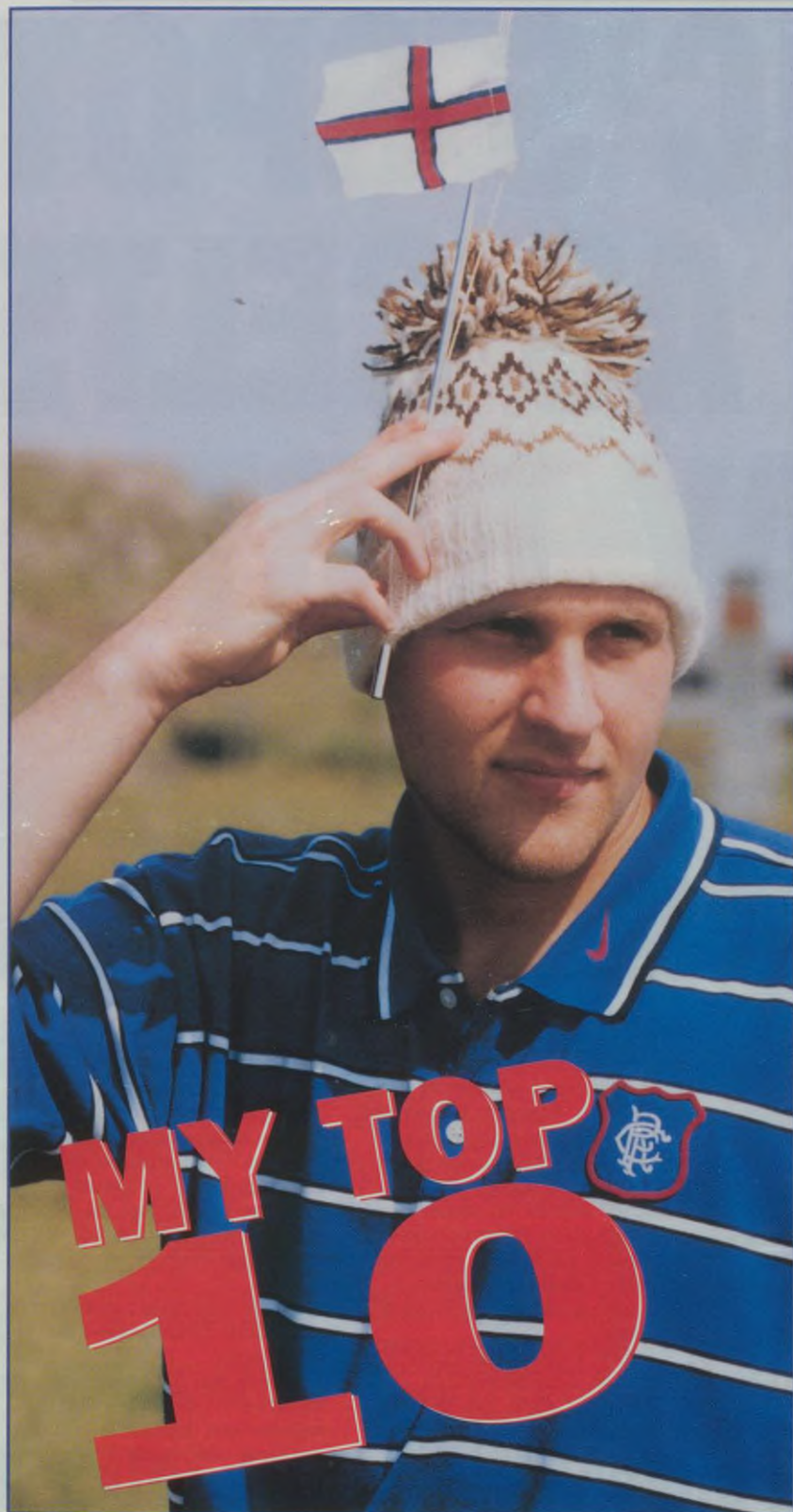

ERIC'S SPOT ON AS CELTS PLAY DIRTY

TODAY as the Old Firm lock horns on league duty, one man who knows a bit more about the fixture than most is former Rangers star of the Fifties and Sixties Eric Caldow.

Nowadays he helps out at Ibrox in a hosting capacity, but as he peers out from the Club Deck great memories of days past when he led the Light Blues are often rekindled.

The legendary full-back began his career at Ibrox in 1953 and made such an impact on his debut against Ayr United, that Manager William Struth had no hesitation in pitching him against Celtic when injury ruled out another great Ranger George Young.

While Caldow would eventually wait two years for Young to vacate the jersey on a more permanent basis, that early bleeding in the Old Firm clash proved invaluable experience for a youngster who was destined to lead the Gers in many a battle against our old rivals.

By the time he had hung up his boots on his Ibrox career, Caldow had played 39 times against Celtic, winning 18, drawing 11 and finishing on the losing side

only 10 times.

It was no surprise, therefore, that Eric highlighted an Old Firm game when he was asked to recollect his 'Match to Remember'.

"I loved to play in these games," said Eric, "but there is one game that particularly comes to mind because I scored the winner!"

"It took place at Ibrox on New Year's Day 1959, and I recall that we had no special preparations other than avoid the festivities of Hogmanay.

"THERE WOULD BE PLENTY TIME FOR CELEBRATIONS AFTER THE GAME, WE HOPED!"

"We assembled at the St Enoch Hotel for a pre-match meal. I always had something light – a plate of feathers!" he joked.

"Then we headed off to Ibrox where Manager Scot Symon would read out the team about an hour or so before the game.

"In the dressing room the jerseys were already hanging on the pegs. I remember when I first arrived at Ibrox I wondered if everyone was 10 feet tall, because the pegs were so high that you had to stand on the benches to reach them!"

"There was no pre-match tactic talk – Scot Symon wasn't that kind of manager."

"I think that the crowd was over 55,000 and I remember that the weather was deplorable with rain and sleet making conditions very heavy.

"Celtic got the opening goal

early in the first half through Peacock, but Matthew pulled us level minutes afterwards. The game looked to be drifting to a draw, and as time went by in the second half, the lines were beginning to disappear.

"At that time the referee was duty bound to abandon the match if the lines weren't obvious."

"With only around 25 minutes to go Alex Scott hit a speculative shot and Celtic's Mochan armed it away.

"The referee had no hesitation in awarding us a penalty and I stepped forward.

"The Celts' Bobby Evans edged over to the penalty spot and while the referee was looking elsewhere he scuffed away at the ground to obliterate the mark.

"I firmly believe that he was trying to get the game abandoned, but the referee was having none of it".

"I stepped forward and scored but that wasn't the end of the drama," said Eric. "With only five minutes to go Celtic were awarded a penalty and Bertie Auld searched desperately for the spot. A position was found, but he hit the bar with his kick and that was that."

"After the game we headed back to the hotel where we began our New Year celebrations in earnest.

"We may even have celebrated a possible Championship win because the team that led the table at the turn of the year usually won the title."

In fact, Rangers did win the title that season and Celtic finished a lowly sixth. It was a match to remember for the Rangers contingent but certainly one to forget for Celtic.

But then, that tended to be the way of things in Caldow's era!

PORTUGAL

GRAEME SOUNESS, sacked as manager by Torino after only ten games in charge, has landed himself another plum continental coaching post.

The former Rangers gaffer, who also had spells in charge at Liverpool, Southampton and Galatasaray, has been appointed boss of fallen Portuguese giants Benfica.

And incredibly Souness has been given an amazing £50 million to spend on new players.

The generous budget was donated by newly elected club president Joao Vale Valdez in a determined bid to revive their ailing fortunes.

Souness has already targeted Rui Costa of Fiorentina and Barcelona's Fernando Couto while Andrei Kanchelskis looks set for a move from Italy to Portugal.

Benfica currently lie in sixth place in the league, eight points behind leaders Porto, and have already crashed to a first round UEFA Cup exit.

A Milan side from the past decade took on an 'All Stars' Select XI which included Brazilian superstar Romario.

The 'All Stars' looked to have spoiled the old warhorse's occasion but a stunning display from Roberto Baggio helped AC to a 5-1 victory.

Baresi's side included the great Dutch triumvirate of Frank Rijkaard, Marco van Basten and Chelsea manager Ruud Gullit.

Former Ibrox stars Ray Wilkins and Mark Hateley, both former team-mates of Baresi, starred for the opposition.

Baresi, who was orphaned as a child, donated all the proceeds from his benefit match to children's charity UNICEF.

GERMANY

GEORG KOCH, the German goalkeeper who reneged on his promise to sign for Rangers earlier this season, has quit PSV Eindhoven after only four months at the club.

The highly rated 25-year-old signed a three-year deal with the Dutch champions during the summer.

However coach Dick Advocaat dropped the keeper in favour of Ronald Waterreus after only four league games. Apparently Koch's wife failed to settle in Holland and wanted a return to Germany.

Ironically the reason Koch, who's a close friend of Jorg Albertz, gave for not joining Rangers was that his wife didn't fancy the prospect of living in Scotland.

He has now returned to the Bundesliga after signing a five-year contract with Arminia Bielefeld.

BAHAMAS based businessman Joe Lewis has added Greek side AEK Athens to his growing portfolio of football clubs.

Lewis, who ploughed over £40 million into Rangers last season, now has a controlling interest in four major European teams.

His company ENIC, who brokered the £6 million deal to buy Athens, also own Italians Vicenza and Czech outfit Slavia Prague.

The arrival of Lewis has been widely welcomed by Greek fans who are just delighted to see the back of controversial president Michalis Trochanas.

Athens, who defeated Rangers to qualify for the Champions League in 1994/95, have fallen badly behind rivals Olympiakos and Panathinaikos in the past few seasons and supporters see Lewis as the man to bring success back to the Greek capital.

IT had all the hallmarks of a classic Old Firm encounter, seven goals, three bookings and two sendings-off.

Unfortunately nine-man Rangers lost out in the most dramatic of circumstances to their young East End rivals in the first youth derby of the season.

The Ibrox kids were beaten 4-3 last Friday afternoon at Barrowfield but this was a game they certainly deserved to take something from.

Some contentious officiating from referee Robert McKendry helped seal Rangers' fate as they crashed to their first defeat of the season.

The Rutherglen whistler red-carded Robert Malcolm inside 20 minutes following an altercation with John Paul Dow.

Yet the Celtic striker escaped with only a booking for his part in the petty squabble.

At the time Rangers trailed 2-1 having gone behind in the first minute when Burchill slotted home a McColligan cross.

Rangers hauled themselves back into the match through David Young on 16 minutes only to fall behind again less than a minute later.

But the sending-off only served to fire the youngsters up and they equalised for the second time on the half hour mark.

Pint-sized striker Stuart Kelly rose unchallenged at the near post to glance Stephen Carson's corner into the roof of the net.

And 30 seconds later the Gers took the lead when Young's clever lofted pass caught out the Celtic defence.

Gary Dewar raced clear and executed the finish to perfection, deftly lobbing the ball over the advancing keeper Morrison.

Dow made it 3-3 after the break but the drama wasn't over there.

With 15 minutes left on the clock Michael Stone and Mark Burchill were involved in some jersey pulling inside the area.

Both players clattered to the deck but amazingly referee McKendry pointed to the spot and

sent a second Rangers player for an early bath.

Burchill converted the penalty and despite a gallant effort Rangers, with their two-man disadvantage, couldn't summon up one final throw of the dice.

Afterwards boss John McGregor praised his young troops. He said: "Despite the final result I was delighted with our performance because I couldn't have asked for any more from my players."

"Sometimes in football you have to set the result to one side and look at the positive factors to come out of the game.

"That was certainly the case against Celtic because we fielded a very young side and I don't think we deserved to lose the game.

"I didn't see the first sending off but I think the second one was a little harsh although you've just

got to accept these things in football.

● ON Tuesday night the reserves consolidated their place at the top of the league with a 1-1 draw against Kilmarnock.

However Rangers should have had all three points safely tucked in the bag before Killie grabbed a late equaliser.

They controlled the match at Rugby Park throughout but failed to capitalise on their domination and were left to rue a series of missed chances.

It was Jorg Albertz, enjoying a rare run-out for the second string, who put Rangers ahead after 20 minutes.

The German, finding himself in acres of space 30 yards out, let fly with a typical blockbusting effort which fairly fizzed into the bottom corner.

Jonatan Johansson then hit the bar and David Graham squandered a good opportunity in the first half.

After the break both Steven Boyack and substitute Darren Fitzgerald had the ball in the net but both efforts were ruled out for offside.

And with ten minutes remaining Gary McCutcheon streaked clear before waltzing round Theo Snelders to earn the home side a share of the spoils.

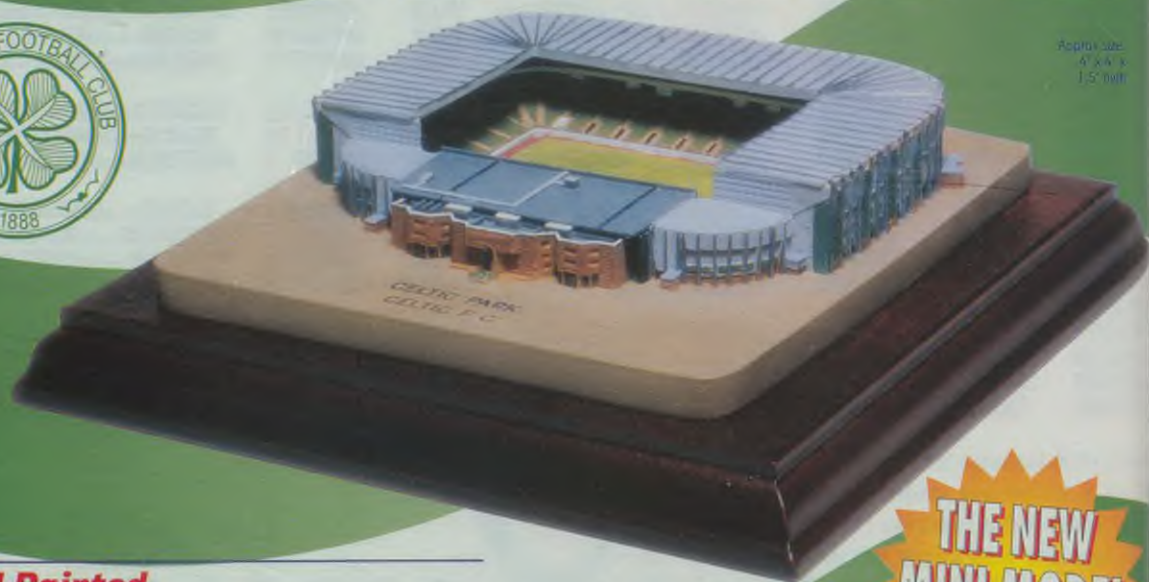

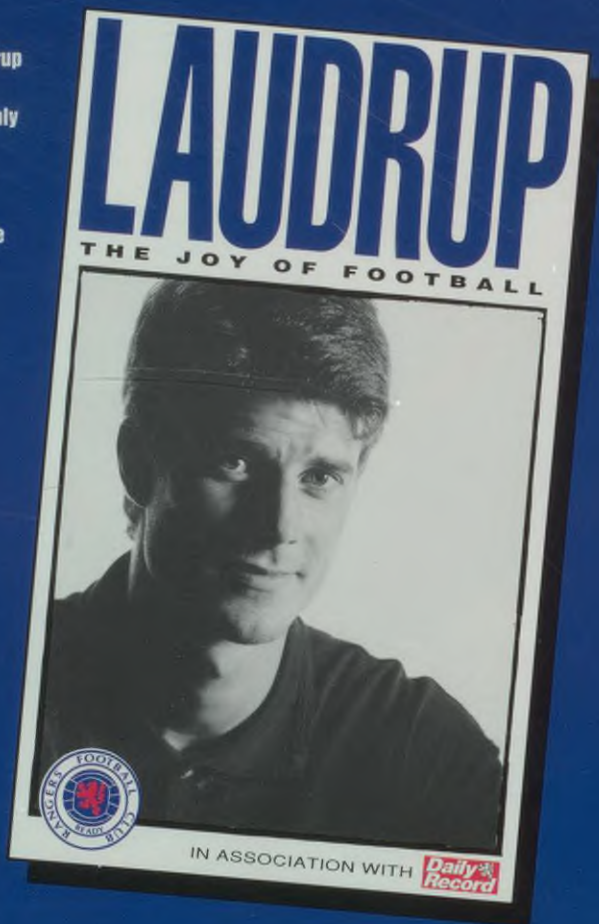
