From the Manager's Desk

THE Scottish Cup competition gets under way at a time when the League championship fight is approaching a climax. In my opinion it is not in the best interests of the two competitions that both should command attention at this stage of the season. There is a sound argument for delaying the Scottish Cup competition to a later part of the season. This remedy is in the hands of the clubs and it appears reasonable to suggest that action along these lines should be taken in the near future.

As we'll be permitting clubs to devote all energy to the League championship at this stage of the season, a late start to the Cup would sustain public interest until the season is nearing its close. Too often clubs are left to play out the season after making an early exit from the Cup with their position in the League secure but with no chance in the championship. Added to the problems of the Cup and League is the fact that many clubs are left with a blank Saturday—a position which few clubs in Scotland can afford. We will fall further into arrears with our League fixtures when we travel to Firs Park to meet East Stirling in the third round of the Cup. The game at Firhill against Partick Thistle which is postponed to make way for the Cup-tie will, we hope, be played on the following Wednesday.

Looking back to last Saturday's Cup-tie against Fraserburgh. Let me say that the visit was a social success and I want to pay tribute to the sporting attitude of the Fraserburgh visitors following their defeat.

We scored enough goals to make it interesting and not too many to make it farcical. A word, too, about Charlie Dickson.

Big Charlie, besides his five goal feat, turned in his best game of the season. Charlie's return to goal-scoring form comes at the right stage of the season.

We must she've for the time being our ambitions in the Cup and turn to the business on hand. Our previous games against Rangers, Kilmarnock, Hearts, and Dundee—the leading contenders for the title—have reached a high standard. Celtic's fight—like our own—received a set-back in the New Year matches but again, like ourselves, Celts, are striving for recovery. That is the background to to-day's game and we are certain that a high standard will be maintained in to-day's match.

The spectators who braved the inclement weather for the Youth Trial at East End on Monday night were well rewarded. Seldom has there been better value for money. Our own youngsters were impressive. There have been many set-backs to progress during my term as manager—but progress has been made. Our sparkling teenagers—the youngest ever reserve team to play at East End Park—have already made their mark. Club managers and officials from both sides of the border who attended the game were high in their praise of the team. The S.F.A. Youth selectors were highly satisfied and several of our own players have been noted for the pool of players who will make the trip to Holland for the Youth International tournament in March.

Finally, let me remind you that our reserves will be in action again at East End on Monday night. Partick Thistle are our visitors in the third round of the 2nd XI. Cup. A home tie in the semi-final of the trophy against Dundee is the prize for the winners.

To-Day's Visitors

THE impact of Celtic on League and Cup affairs has been one of the outstanding features of the season. Seldom in the history of the Parkhead club has the team commanded such respect from all quarters.

To-day's game is made even more important because of the League position of Celtic and ourselves. Celtic are now in fourth position, three points ahead of Dunfermline, but we have a match in hand. The outcome of to-day's game is of paramount importance in the championship chances of both clubs. The setting lends even more than the usual importance to Celtic's visit.

JOHN FALLON—Came into the side following the injury to Frank Haffey. Has more than justified his promotion.

IAN YOUNG—Came as a centre-half to Parkhead from Neilson Juniors. A six-footer and one of the bright newcomers.

TOMMY GEMMELL—Another of the recent promotions. Also in his third season and has been groomed from the junior club Coltness United.

JOHN CLARK—Can be reckoned among the "young veterans." Has been six seasons with Celtic and came from Larkhall Thistle.

BILLY McNEIL—Keystone of the side and well-known for his exploits in the International field. McNeil could be the big stumbling block to-day.

JIM KENNEDY—Came as a left-back in 1955 from Duntocher Hibs. Also approaching the six-foot mark and one of the best in the country.

JIMMY JOHNSTONE—Has made a tremendous impact since his promotion to the League team. There will be good comparison to-day between Jimmy and Alex. Edwards.

BOBBY MURDOCH—A tireless, fast moving inside forward who has been at Parkhead since 1959. Has struck up a sound partnership with Johnstone.

STEVE CHALMERS—A goal-getter who has appreciated the switch from inside forward to attack leader. A junior from Ashfield, has been with Celtic since 1959.

CHARLIE GALLAGHER—Another from Yoker Athletic. A forcing type of player who is always among the goals.

JOHN HUGHES—Came, of course, as a centre-forward but has solved a problem at Parkhead by taking over on the left-wing. Hughes is one of Scotland's outstanding players.
