**LOVE**FOOTBALL



**ALTHOUGH I'm disappointed at dropping our first points of the season, we are still unbeaten in the SPL and we took part in a great advert for the Scottish game at Easter Road on Sunday.**

The 2-2 game against Hibernian was played at a fantastic pace and had absolutely everything including a great atmosphere.

And the atmosphere was never going to be in any doubt last week when we began our Champions League campaign with a match against Barcelona at Celtic Park.

From the moment the draw was made, we knew this was going to be an extremely difficult tie and so it proved.

Barcelona are an excellent football team and Frank Rijkaard spent over £40million during the summer in further strengthening an already impressive squad.

It is no coincidence, therefore, that they are one of the favourites to win the tournament.

They possess some of the best players in the world and showed, particularly in the first-half just what they are capable of.

However, we knew all this beforehand and our aim from the outset was to try and win the football match.

It was a difficult first 45 minutes, losing a goal and having to defend for much of the half, but after the break we certainly pushed Barcelona all the way.

David Marshall's excellent penalty save kept us well in the game and Chris Sutton's equaliser galvanised both the team and the



support, and for a good period after that goal we dominated the game.

Indeed, we were unfortunate not to score a second goal. Stilian Petrov's shot was well saved and then Barcelona nearly put the ball

into their own net.

Barcelona's second goal was a blow, coming as it did when we were enjoying a good period of play. It also resulted in an injury to Jackie McNamara which will see him out of action for between four to six weeks.

And Barcelona's third goal,

scored by Henrik Larsson, gave them an insurmountable lead.

Once again, however, it is our players who deserve praise for the effort and commitment shown on the night.

Time and time again over the past few seasons, they have shown themselves capable of performing at the highest level and for periods of the match against Barcelona, they controlled the play against a top quality side.

It is disappointing to have lost our first game in the Champions League group stages, but there are another five games to go and our focus remains to do everything we possibly can to claim one of the first two places in Group F.

Tonight we're involved in cup action again, this time in the CIS Cup against Falkirk. The First Division side have started the season well and have been scoring freely over the past few weeks.

It is important that we are focused on the task in hand and we will be striving for victory which would put us into the next round of the competition.

There should be another excellent attendance at Celtic Park tonight and while the drama and excitement of the Champions League is difficult to replicate, it is important for the players that you give them the support and encouragement their efforts deserve.

# THE ONLY GOAL THAT MATTERS

Interview: **STEPHEN SULLIVAN**

**FOR Stephen McManus, season 2003/04 has yet to begin in earnest.**

The big defender may be in superb and - with three goals in as many appearances - free-scoring form for Celtic's reserve team, but starring for the second string no longer provides the fulfilment it once did.

McManus' sights are trained squarely on the first team these days and, in this respect, the season thus far has been a disappointment, with Martin O'Neill having looked elsewhere to solve the long-standing problem position on the left side of Celtic's defence.

Nevertheless, with Jackie McNamara - who, despite favouring his right foot, has all but made this role his own - now facing a spell of around six weeks on the sidelines, the opportunity could be there for the 22-year-old to emerge from the shadows.

McManus also knows that, with O'Neill's predilection for fielding fringe players in the CIS League Cup now well established, tonight

could well be the night for him to step up and show the Irishman just why he merits inclusion on a more regular basis.

"Oh, definitely," he said. "I think you always hope that you'll be in until the manager names the team, but obviously tonight could be a more realistic chance for the likes of myself.

"We'll see how that one goes, but you always know at this club that every game is a must-win, and no matter what team the gaffer plays, it will be one he fully expects will win the game. The players want to win every trophy going and the fans demand that we win every time we go out there, so defeat isn't an option for us.

"But I know that Falkirk have been playing really well this season and everyone realises that this is a

cup final for them. I don't know if the gaffer will make changes, but hopefully I'll be in his thinking for the game. Obviously Jackie's picked up an injury now and, although I'm gutted for him because he's been superb for the last couple of seasons, you know that the nature of football is that someone has to benefit from what's happened.

"It could well be Ulrik or Joos that benefit, but I'd like to think I'd be in the manager's thoughts. I feel happy enough with my form at the moment, and in that respect I think I'm just continuing from where I left off last season, which was a good one for me. I certainly feel I could do a good job if I get the chance."

The evidence from Celtic's reserve matches would certainly

suggest as much. McManus has been a stand-out in Kenny McDowall's impressive side, and has also supplemented his strong, commanding defensive play with a goal in each of his first three games, not to mention a cracker through his own net - more of which later.

It's certainly a measure of the big defender's professionalism that his commitment and energy levels remain unaltered for such matches, and he himself admitted to taking some pride in the fact that, at Celtic, no-one turns their nose up at a run-out for the reserves.

He said: "Those games are important for the boys who aren't in the team, and I do think we take a bit of pride in the fact we treat them with total professionalism. The one thing you don't want to do when you come back into these games is get sloppy, and I've seen some players, though not so much at this club, who've gone in and treated games at that level with a total lack of respect.

"Whether it's the cold night or the fact there's no fans there, it's obvious they just haven't fancied it, and I think it shows the professionalism of the current players at this club that that it has never happened with them.

"Personally, I feel I've been doing alright so far, and getting the goals has been a nice surprise - the ones at the right end anyway! To be honest, though, I'd rather keep a clean sheet these days than stick one in the net these days. I think that's the way you have to be as a defender.

"But the main thing for me has been to get 90 minutes under my belt to keep my fitness levels up

and that's something Kenny's been good enough to give me every week so far.

"I'm in the same situation as Ulrik, Lambo, Bobby and Pearo in that respect - we're all just trying to use the reserves as a vehicle for getting ourselves back into the first team - and I've enjoyed the matches so far."

That has been evident in McManus' play, and yet there was, of course, one moment when it was equally clear that he would have dearly liked the turf to open and swallow him up. It came at the Excelsior Stadium against Inverness Caledonian Thistle when, having already put Celtic in front, he left Rab Douglas helpless with an attempted back-pass-cum-stunning 40-yard volley.

Predictably enough, it proved the subject of much hilarity in the Hoops dressing room over the days which followed - particularly as a late Paul Lawson strike had



ensured McManus' own goal wasn't a costly one - and the question remains: what exactly happened?

"Oh God, don't ask," he said, wincing. "It was just one of those things - I tried to knock the ball back to big Rab and I remember

thinking that it was important not to be short with it because the pitch was really sticky. And I certainly wasn't short!

"To be honest, it was probably the sweetest volley I've ever struck in my life, and as soon as it left my boot I could see exactly where it was going. But the main thing is that you learn from these things and don't let them affect you, and I can laugh about it now. Next time I'll know just to boot it into row Z."

# Falkirk have a healthy mixture of youth and experience. Check out the players in their squad

## DARREN HILL

A product of the youth set-up, the keeper is now in his seventh season with the club. Started 20 games in the league last term and achieved eight shut-outs. An excellent shot-stopper, Darren will share first-team duties with Allan Ferguson.

## ANDY LAWRIE

One of the earliest success stories

of the Falkirk youth set-up, Andy has been with the club since 1996. Despite being loaned to East Fife a few seasons ago, the player has become the long term, first-choice full-back, where, as well as showing his defensive capabilities, he is always liable to steal a goal when he supports the attack. A horror leg-break two seasons ago curtailed his appearances but he is

now back to full fitness and ready to join the club's Hall of Fame as he nears 200 appearances.

## SCOTT MacKENZIE

Another great servant, Scott was recently inducted into Falkirk FC's Hall of Fame by the fans, having amassed over 300 appearances. Mr Versatile joined the Bairns on full professional forms in September 1990 and served for almost 10 seasons – the highlight of which was picking up a runners-up medal in the 1997 Scottish Cup final against Kilmarnock. He was lured to St Mirren by the challenge of the Premierleague in 2000 but was pleased to return to his first love in 2002. This is his testimonial season.

## MARK CAMPBELL

First came to the fore in February 1998 when Ayr United pipped Motherwell and Kilmarnock to sign the 22 year old from Stranraer for £90,000. A commanding centre-half and strong in the tackle, he is a player who rarely loses out in an aerial battle. Played alongside coach John Hughes at Ayr so they should form a formidable defensive partnership as the Bairns seek promotion to the SPL.

## KEVIN JAMES (Captain)

It's second time around for Kevin at Falkirk as he originally joined the club as a youngster in 1993. The popular centre-back was an instrumental figure for the Bairns during the 1997 Scottish Cup run when he scored the famous equaliser against Celtic in the semi-final.

A move to Hearts followed and spells at Morton and Airdrie preceded his return to Brockville. Kevin and he was a tower of strength in the title season before a unfortunate injury saw him sidelined for most of last year.

## NEIL SCALLY

After being released by Ayr at the end of 2001/02, Neil signed for Dumbarton, where he played a pivotal role in their successful fight against

Second Division relegation. Newly-promoted Brechin City were interested in bringing Scally back to the First Division last term, but Falkirk nipped in to sign the player who is highly rated by coach Hughes. A tough tackling and hard-working midfielder.

## BRENT RAHIM

Brent has plenty of international experience, having been capped over 30 times for Trinidad & Tobago and represented his country in the qualifiers for the 2002 World Cup. After a spell in the United States, Brent saw service with Sofia Levski in Bulgaria, West Ham United and Northampton Town before a successful trial period with Falkirk earned him a two-year contract. A hard worker who never hides.

## KIERAN MacANESPIE

Joined Fulham in the summer of 2000 for £80,000 on the recommendation of John Collins, who had watched him star for St Johnstone during the 1999/00 season. The Scottish under-21 internationalist found it difficult to hold down a first-team berth and was loaned out to Hearts in January 2001, followed by another loan deal again in February 2002, when he joined Second Division club Bournemouth. He played seven times for the Cherries and scored once before finally joining Paul Sturrock's Plymouth Argyle at the end of season 2002/03 on yet another short-term loan. John Hughes stepped in at the beginning of last term to sign him.

## DAVID NICHOLLS

Davie returned to Brockville permanently from Dunfermline in August of 2003 following his loan deal. He was a former captain of the Bairns under Alex Totten and teamed up with Ian McCall for the second time in his career after the two helped guide Clydebank to promotion in 1997/98. David has a wealth of experience, having spent time at Hibernian, Cork City and Ayr.

## DEREK COLQUHOUN

A bustling, old fashioned type of centre forward, Derek has forced his way into the first-team squad with some great performances for the under-19 squad, where he was top scorer. Physically very strong, Derek is probably at his most dangerous in the air – his heading ability is first-rate. Looks certain to stay in the first-team squad for the immediate future despite only signing a six-month contract.

## DARRYL DUFFY

A former Rangers youngster who had a loan spell at Brechin City last season as he struggled to win a regular first-team start at Ibrox.

Darryl has an eye for a goal and made his first-team debut for Rangers in a 6-0 CIS Cup thrashing of Forfar at Ibrox in October 2003. His signature for Falkirk looks like being a shrewd piece of business.

## ALLAN FERGUSON

One of the most experienced keepers in the SFL, Allan starred at Hamilton Accies for many seasons before stepping up to the SPL with St Johnstone in 1998. A horror knee injury almost ended his career but he returned with Airdrie in 2002 before rejoining Ian McCall at Falkirk. He won a League Championship medal, just reward for many match-winning performances during that campaign.



**CRAIG MCPHERSON**

Fans' favourite Craig is a former Morton player whose travels took him to Clyde and Airdrie before joining the Bairns in 2002. A versatile and thoughtful performer, he can fill in anywhere on the left side but has settled into the wing-back position over the past few seasons. Supports the forwards at every chance and can score goals as well. Missed only one league game last season and netted once.

**JOHN HUGHES**

Another who has starred at Falkirk in previous seasons, Yogi gave the club outstanding service during the Jim Jefferies era. His senior career began at Berwick before he was sold to Swansea City in 1989. Failing to settle, he resumed the partnership with his former manager at Falkirk. Stirring defensive displays over the next few seasons made him a cult hero among the fans and he clinched a move to Celtic in 1995, and ultimately Hibs in 1997 before he saw a resurgence in his career at Ayr United in their successful cup runs of 2002. He has four First Division championship medals to his name and has moved into the first-team coach's role at the club.

**JAMES SHARP**

Tough-tackling centre-back who was a trainee at Reading between 1993 and 1995. He left Reading and after a brief spell in the United States, he featured at Wokingham, Marlow and Abbey Whitchurch before joining Andover in 1999/2000. His career took off at Hartlepool, where he swept the boards at the club's Player of the Year awards in his first season. A serious injury meant he missed most of 2002-2003 and he was freed during the summer break – but was quickly snapped up by Falkirk. As well as a commanding presence at the back, his long throw is a potent weapon.

**JOHN HENRY**

Classy midfielder who was at Brockville on loan from Kilmarnock prior to his permanent move in 1999. Financial restrictions meant no new contract for John and he joined Airdrie in September 2001. Ian McCall moved swiftly to bring the playmaker back to Brockville in 2002 and he was an important part of championship squad. John is another player who missed most of last season due to a serious injury. Also appeared for Aberdeen and Clydebank earlier in his career.

**RUSSELL LATAPY**

Has represented Trinidad and Tobago at all levels, from under 14 to senior level, and has won over 100 international cups. He had been playing professionally in

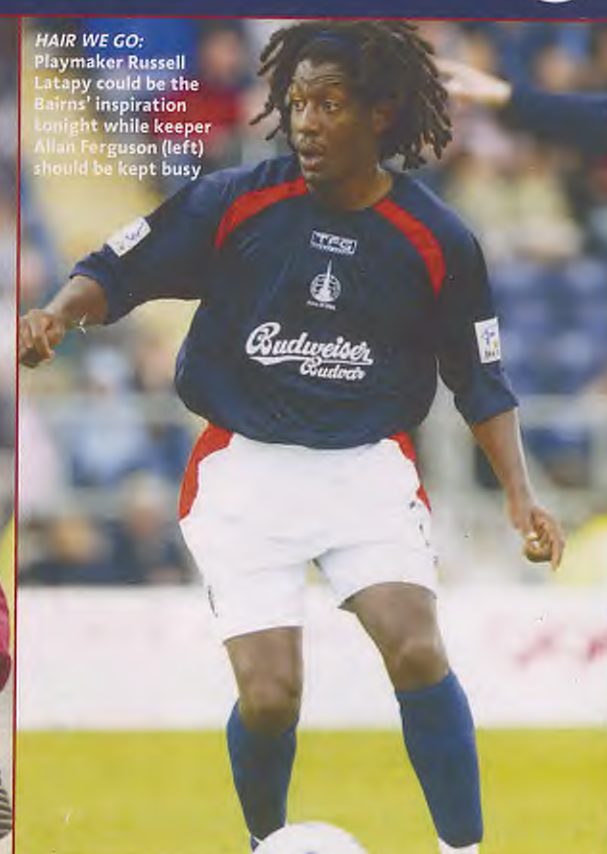
Portugal for five years, where he was a league winner with Porto and a cup winner with Boavista, prior to joining Hibernian in 1998. A dynamic midfielder and one who excites the crowd, Russell has a natural gift and is one of the rare things in the game today, a playmaker. He was named the Scottish Football League Division One Players' Player of the Year in 1999 before moving to Rangers in 2001 followed by a short spell at Dundee United, before joining Falkirk in 2003.

**DARREN BARR**

Another talented youngster who has made the transition from the youth squad to the first team. Darren is a manager's dream, able to play comfortably in several positions, although his best

performances have been reserved for the right wing-back slot. He was used sparingly last term but Hughes has noted his all-round ability and will have no qualms about playing the youngster from the start tonight.

**RYAN McSTAY**

Classy midfielder who made the breakthrough to first-team football late last season. The youngster has the ability to turn a game on his own, and if he performs to expectations, he could find himself as a regular starter.

**JOHN O'NEIL**

One of many "Jim McLean" players who blossomed at Dundee United before becoming unsettled and joining up with Paul Sturrock at St Johnstone in 1994. The hard-working, creative player

knows all about the Scottish game and has experienced many highs on the domestic scene – including scoring in the 1991 Scottish Cup final and being capped at Under-21 level. He has played in various cup ties with both St Johnstone and Hibernian and he was a Scottish Cup winner with Dundee United in season 93/94. John has one full cap for Scotland against Poland in 2001.

**ANDY THOMSON**

Started his career at Queen of the South, scoring 109 goals in just over 200 appearances and twice being voted Second Division Player of the Year. A move to Southend followed for a fee of £250,000 and he spent four years there, scoring 29 in 88 starts. Further moves to Oxford and Gillingham followed,

scoring the goal that got the Gills promoted to Division One. Andy moved to QPR in 2001 and although his spell there was hampered with injuries he still managed to net 30 times. A spell at Partick preceded his move to Falkirk in June 2004

**IAN MacSWEEN**

A recruit from Hutchison Vale BC, Ian forced his way into the first-team squad by virtue of some sterling performances in the under-18 team, where he notched a number of goals. The striker is quick off the mark and can be a lethal finisher. Had already made several first-team appearances from the bench before a serious injury ruled him out of a large chunk of last season.

TONIGHT marks the 158th meeting between Celtic and Falkirk, with the Bhoys winning 101 of the previous 157 while 30 were drawn and the former Brockville outfit coming out on top on 26 occasions.

The vast majority of those games were, of course, in the league, with relatively few cropping up in both the domestic cup competitions

They have met only 11 times in the Scottish Cup, with eight Celtic wins to a draw and two Falkirk victories, and tonight's League Cup tie will bring this tournament's total games to the same 11 tally.

Of the previous 10 League Cup matches, Celtic have won six and Falkirk twice, while the other two ended all square.

In those games Falkirk have only scored five goals against the Celts but since the start of this season, almost without exception, they have seemingly been scoring for fun in cup competitions.

In the Stirlingshire Cup they have racked up seven goals in two games, while in the Bell's Cup they have garnered 11 goals in three games. In tonight's competition

they have smacked in 10 goals in their two previous ties.

Goals, and plenty of them, have, from time to time, played a major part in games between tonight's teams – but historically Falkirk have been on the debit side of Celtic's net profit.

The clubs first met on league duty back in season 1905/06 and the Celts went on the rampage against the newly-promoted runners-up from the old Second Division.

On September 16 they clashed for the first time ever as the Bhoys

travelled to Falkirk and put the newcomers to the sword.

Jimmy Quinn and Alec Bennett hit a brace each, while a single counter from Willie Loney took the day's tally to five. And it didn't get any better for the Bairns on their first visit to Celtic Park a few months later.

On January 6, Falkirk trooped back along London Road after the Celts took seven goals off them, with Bennett grabbing a hat-trick to add to his double from the first game.

A total of 12 goals for and one against in the first season – Falkirk wouldn't actually record a victory over

Celtic until they won 2-1 in season 1910/11.

By that time, however, they were no longer regarded as newcomers and were generally battling it out with the big boys at the top of the table.

They had already finished second in the league twice and that particular season would finish third to Celtic's fifth – that 2-1 win proving to be the difference in league placings.

High-scoring games between Celtic and Falkirk aren't only in the domain of the far off dark and distant past, though.

In recent times, one particular encounter was extraordinary not only for the high goals tally, but the fact that Falkirk managed to score so many against the men from the East End of Glasgow.

Well, maybe not, as it was the early 1990s and the Tic, to put it diplomatically, were in what could be termed a transitional period. In other words, we were pure mince.

**A QUICK glance at the timesheet for the goals tells an amazing enough tale as it is – but that is only half the story of a truly astounding 90 minutes that had punters and players alike scratching their heads in disbelief.**

Apart from the nine goals and a magnificent Celtic comeback, there were two penalties, two sent off and play was stopped for three minutes as referee Martin Ward received treatment for a head wound after being hit with a coin thrown from the Falkirk end.

Falkirk scored three goals in 11 minutes, Celtic played for over an hour with only 10 men and were 4-2 down with just 20 minutes to go – then there was that last-gasp goal by John Collins.

Who said times were dull before

the McCann years? Well, quite a few as a couple of days after the Brockville bonanza, Aberdeen put us out of the League Cup then Partick Thistle beat us 2-1 at Celtic Park.

Amazingly though, that nine-goal thriller wasn't the highest scoring clash between the sides.

Celtic have scored seven against

Falkirk on four occasions – but in season 1934/35 a crowd of 5,000 were treated to a real goal feast.

The final score was 7-3 on the second last day of the season, when Celtic could still have won the league and Falkirk could have avoided relegation – neither achieved their goal.

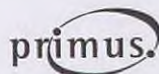

From the most humble of beginnings, Celtic has grown to become one of the biggest clubs in the world. Now supporters' groups have joined forces in a bid to have our founding father, Brother Walfrid, recognised with a memorial statue at Paradise – and you can now help by donating to the project

**CELTIC'S origins are unique in world football. The aim, set out in Marist Brother Walfrid's vision, was to form a football club to put food into the needy mouths of hungry Irish immigrants in Glasgow's East End.**

The club has come along way since its formation in November 1887, but it remains very much a unique institution, where every supporter feels part of the Celtic family.

Now the descendants of those first Celtic supporters have come together to raise funds to erect a statue of Brother Walfrid at Celtic Park.

And the organisers of this project are calling on fans worldwide to contribute and help create a lasting memorial of our founding father.

As part of the fundraising campaign, a can collection is being held prior to the Dunfermline game at Celtic Park on Saturday, September 25 and it is hoped that supporters will make a contribution of a minimum of a £1 to the campaign.

A special badge has been designed with the head and shoulders of Brother Walfrid and this is a limited edition.

Later on this year, prior to Christmas, a special souvenir brochure will be available. More information will be announced soon.

The supporters' groups involved are: the Celtic Supporters' Association, the Celtic Trust, the Affiliation of Registered Celtic Supporters' Clubs, the Jock Stein Executive Club, the Association of Irish Celtic Supporters' Clubs, Association of Donegal Celtic Supporters' Clubs and North American Federation Celtic Supporters' Clubs.

Groups in Sligo have also been hard at work raising funds for their own statue to commemorate Brother Walfrid's contribution to the club, and will be taking part in events on September 25.

As part of the efforts to raise funds, Celtic fan Eugene McHale has given himself the challenge of walking from Brother Walfrid's village of Ballymote all the way to Celtic Park, finishing in front of 60,000 fans at our match against Dunfermline.

Eugene, a former Mayo county GAA footballer, is being supported in his venture by Jim Sheridan and Eddie McHale.

Eugene has already completed walks recently in support of the Irish Heart Foundation and the North West Hospice. His 200-mile trek to Celtic Park will take around 10 days and he will be raising funds towards the Sligo Brother Walfrid Appeal.

Money donated to this Appeal will be used to erect a statue in honour of the Marist Brother in County Sligo.

The memorial unveiling will take place on the weekend of October 23/24 as part of a Brother Walfrid Festival to mark the legacy and achievements of Celtic's founding father.



# CELTIC FORMED BY WALFRID'S VISION

**CELTIC Football Club was the brainchild of a Marist Brother who trundled the damp and bleak cobbled streets of the East End of Glasgow wracking his brain to come up with a way to raise money for the poor and needy of the area.**

The year was 1887 and there was manifest necessity for organised aid despite Glasgow being known as the Second City of the Empire.

Shipbuilding and heavy industry were the lifeblood of the ever-growing Victorian metropolis and thousands flocked to the city in search of work, housing and a life above the pitiful poverty line.

And a large percentage of the new breed came over the sea from Ireland, a country that was still feeling the effects of the potato famine that blighted the lives of millions.

Therein lay the problem though – the influx that crossed the Irish Sea were mainly Catholic and they quickly realised that the streets of Glasgow were not paved with gold and there weren't enough jobs to go round.

And, if there was employment available, it was low-paid, while the spectre of national and religious nepotism raised its ugly head in the job stakes.

Poverty was rife, disease was a daily obstacle, child mortality affected the lives of many and soup kitchens presented those afflicted with a vital foothold in their day-to-day existence.

It was to subsidise these soup kitchens that Brother Walfrid set the fundraising wheels in motion to drive poverty from the stricken streets of the East End.

Football was a fledgling sport at the time, but the simplicity of the basic essentials to play the game on the street and the relative ease of promoting it as a spectator sport made it a sure-fire winner with the public.

And so the seed was planted in Brother Walfrid's mind and at a

meeting with local Irish businessmen at St Mary's Hall in the Calton on November 6, 1887, the decision was made to found a football club – and from that acorn a giant oak grew with roots firmly embedded in Scotland and Ireland, but a trunk that developed so strong, the limbs and branches stretched and weaved their way throughout the world.

In the early days, football clubs generally drew support from the surrounding area, but Brother Walfrid could little have known that the pull

of Celtic would quickly outgrow the Parkhead area, interlace throughout the streets of Glasgow and mushroom all over Scotland and beyond as the appeal magnified beyond all comprehension.

Celtic played their inaugural game on May 28, 1888 in a friendly 5-2 win watched by a crowd of 2,000 as the team of: Dolan, Pearson, McLaughlin, W Maley, Kelly, Murray, McCallum, T

Maley, Madden, Dunbar and Gorevin took to the field as the first ever Celtic XI.

Neil McCallum had the honour of scoring the first-ever Celtic goal 10 minutes into the match.

The opposition that day was team from the other end of the city known as Rangers and, ironically, the history of both clubs was to be forever intertwined in the years that followed.

But as Walfrid watched the club grow in its formative years, and noted the steady flow of Brake Clubs making their way to matches on horse-drawn coaches, he couldn't have envisaged that within 80 years the descendants of those same fans would be flying in a great iron bird at 30,000 feet to see the Bhoys in green and white lift the European Cup at Lisbon...

Or that in the year 2003, tens of thousands of supporters from all over the world – from Scotland, England, Ireland, Wales, Europe, United States, Canada, South Africa, Asia, Australia, and elsewhere – would gather in a southern Spanish city to cheer on the Bhoys in green and white and celebrate being part of the Celtic family.

# the YOUTH ACADEMY

I STARTED scouting in Dublin in 1994 while managing Stella Maris FC, who were founding members of the DDSL league in Dublin.

We had previously produced players of the calibre of Johnny Giles, David O'Leary and Gerry Daly before a lean period in the mid 80s.

My team produced Richie Partridge of Liverpool, Joe Murphy of WBA and Wolves' Keith Andrews. Stephen Carr had also just joined Spurs from an older age group.

We had plenty of experience dealing with British clubs and this stood in my favour when I started scouting for Tranmere Rovers.

It was an enjoyable time at Rovers and Joe Murphy, Alan Mahon, Alan Rogers and Shaun Thornton were signed on professional contracts.

Joe and Alan Mahon have since been capped at full international level. Shaun's with Sunderland and has been capped at Under-21 level.

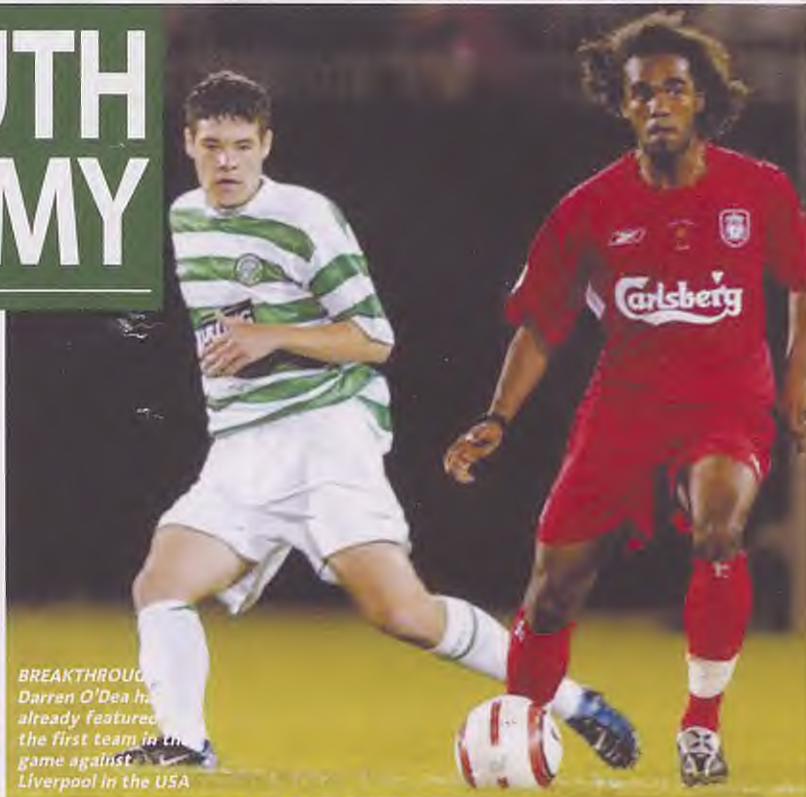
All of these players have been transferred from Rovers to various clubs for a total of £9million.

I left in 1997 to become reserve team manager and Youth Development Officer at Bohemians FC.

In 2000 I finished up with Bohs and John Stephenson, who was working for Preston North End, called me to see was I interested in working again as a scout. I jumped at the chance to work with John and immediately set up a scouting network to cover the Republic.

We signed Dave Elebert, who is 19 now and has recently been on the bench for PNE first team.

Just before I left I organised for Alan McCormack to sign. He has

since played eight games. These players are all from Dublin, except Shaun Thornton, who is from nearby Drogheda.

John left PNE for Celtic and I joined him in 2002, taking my scouts with me and proceeding to broaden this network. In July of 2003

Celtic signed Darren O'Dea, Gary Walsh and Gareth Christie from Dublin club Home Farm, and Diarmuid O'Carroll from Killarney in Co. Kerry. Gary Dunphy joined us in

July of this year and he's from Co. Waterford. We've had players from Co.'s Donegal, Athlone, Tipperary and Galway on trial, proving our scouting system is working and not confined to cities.

Darren has already figured for the first team in friendlies against Fulham and Newcastle and has also appeared on the recent American tour. All of these players are making great progress and some are already first choice for the 21s.

When these lads come over on trial the first people they generally meet are Brian Meehan and Martin Clark, and they usually come back and say how well they have been treated and how they feel at home.

This is very important for a young lad destined eventually to

## The club steps up its efforts to ensure the best young talent arrives at Celtic Park by increasing the number of scouts country-wide

### FIXTURES

September weekend sees our squads in action against Hearts and Inverness Caley, for the younger kids, with the 19s playing Dunfermline. The 11s and 12s are at home to Hearts on Saturday. The Under 12s and Under 13s play Inverness Caley at the Science Park on Sunday, while the 15s and 17s make the long journey to Inverness for their games.

### RECRUITMENT PROGRAMME

Over the last few weeks we have added to the number of scouts in each area of the country, in order that we are fully aware of the talent available to us. The Scout Co-ordinators for each region have brought in new staff to enhance the coverage of the vast number of games taking place each week.

Every weekend we have approximately 40 scouts on touchlines throughout the country, identifying players who may be good enough to join our Academy. Kids under the age of 10 who are identified will be invited along to their local Development Centre, and assessed by our coaching staff over a six-week period. The assessment will include taking part in a number of seven-a-side festivals, where the

Centres from throughout Scotland play against each other, and continual assessment on a regular basis in the Centres. Our team of Scouts meet regularly at Celtic Park and we are constantly striving for standardisation. The Scouting Qualification, awarded by the English FA, is a means to assist in this area and will be completed for the majority of our Scouts in the near future. As we have increased the number of Scouts in the country we are confident of reducing the number of quality players who slip through the net. For the programme in the Academy, put in place by Tommy Burns and John Stephenson, to reap maximum benefit for the club, it is important that we identify the best young players in the country as soon as possible.

### SCOUTS

As well as the number of scouts in Scotland, we are also very active in Ireland and all over England, with a number of trialists already arriving at Celtic Park for assessment. Due to this, over the last couple of years we have stemmed the flow of schoolboys leaving Scotland for English clubs, and have signed a number of English boys who were being courted by the top clubs down south. As a club, we have always been active in Ireland in terms of recruitment, and again over the last couple of years we have made a number of significant signings from this area.

### TRIALISTS

Trialists have also been recommended from all over Europe and, as well as coming to Glasgow for assessment, a number have played for us in European Tournaments. During the summer we had our first trialist from Canada, who, after impressing Tommy Burns and the Academy Coaching Staff, will join the club when he finishes school.

move away from home at 16. I have lots of experience of seeing young players' digs in Premiership clubs in England, but I have never seen anywhere as good as Celtic's.

When they come over having signed I don't think it's possible to work for a better man than Tommy Burns. Apart from his coaching ability there are not many people in the cut-throat world of football as nice, committed and genuine as him. All of these factors make it very easy for me to convince these young lads and their parents to sign on the dotted line.

Dublin is regarded as the most 'scouted' city in the British Isles. It also has the youngest population in the EEC and is home to the DDSL - the largest boy's league in Europe, which regularly supplies players to various clubs in England.

Since the days of Jack Charlton, football is now played in every small town in the Republic and has started to produce players as good as any from the traditional areas of Dublin, Cork and Donegal.

I have recently started to compile a list of the best players in Northern Ireland and although it's nowhere as lucrative from a scouting perspective as the Republic, the time has come for them to produce another Best,

Jennings, Lennon or Whiteside.

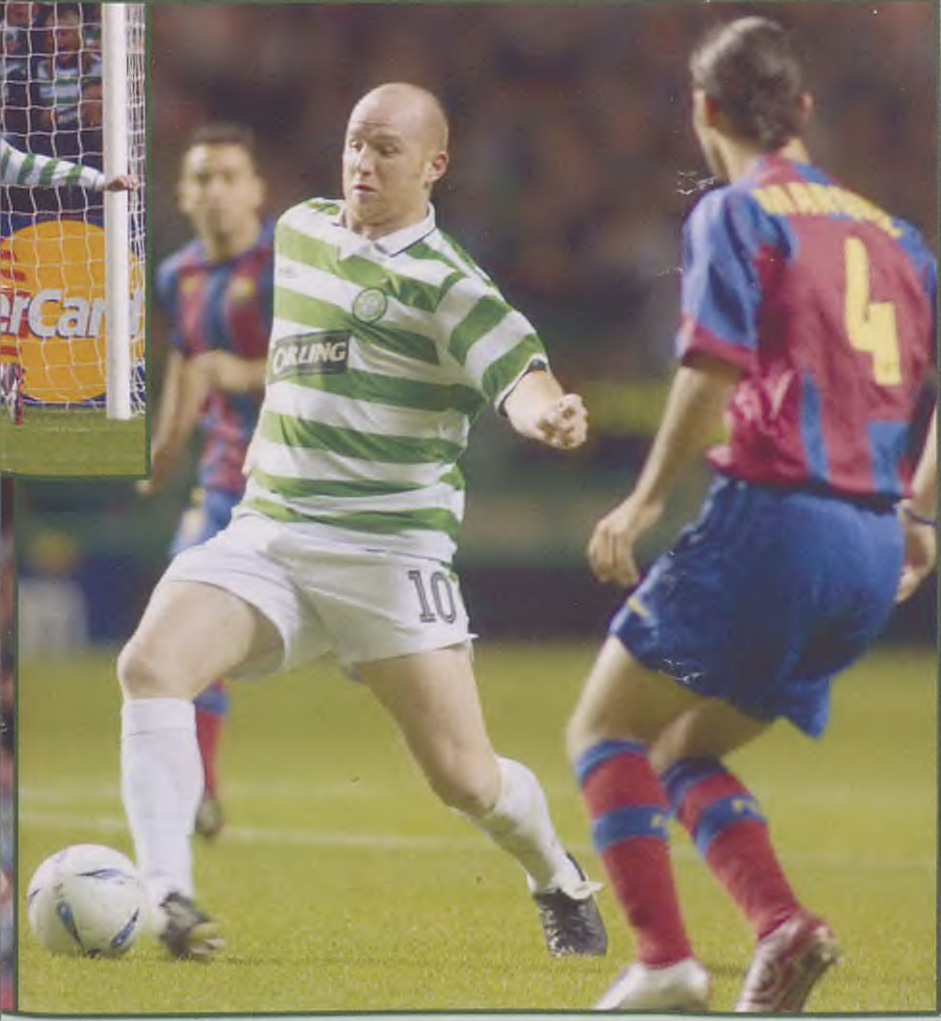
