Now that's enough of that, Celtic—nine goals (almost 10) last week. The Parkhead boys are certainly on the crest again and although their annihilation of Airdrie was spectacular, the figure away from home at Dundee the previous week was perhaps better to make.

It's funny how it happens. A team which, with similar personnel, produce mediocre fare for quite some time, suddenly find each other, get confidence across, and they are quite terrific. So it is with Glasgow Celtic, 20 goals in four matches and all of them good ones.

With the modern technique of team football it is much more difficult for personalities to emerge, but somehow or other chaps like Frank Haffey, Big John Hughes, and Johnny Divers stick out like a sore thumb.

Not everything comes off for "Yogi" Hughes and so, unavoidably, he has had his critics. But who can deny that this bustling, ball-playing, soccer giant is the kind of player the fans come to see. We at Firs Park welcome Big John and his mates. To-day's match, which will be both televised and broadcast, should be a corker.

Some think that the gamble of inviting Chelsea to Firs Park was a risky one. The brush from the first-class Chelsea side could do the 'Shire's confidence no good whatsoever. On the terrible night, it turned out to be something approaching a classic and who can deny this Chelsea team will go places. Frank Sandeman was probably the best of 22 first-class footballers and practically no one left before the final whistle. The ever-increasing number of 'Shire enthusiasts are very knowledgeable indeed and praised the demonstrations of skill from both sides. The return match at Stamford Bridge in the spring should be well worth watching.

The visit from Partick Thistle last week was a nostalgic one for Neilly Duffy, and the writer for one thinks that Neilly was the outstanding player in the Thistle team. The Jags played well and indicated it could be that the return to form is on the way.
