A Previous Highlight

WHEN St Mirren visited Celtic Park on February 26, 1955, they had played 21 games, recorded 28 points and were third in the league table.

Having played the same number of games, Celtic had three more points and were second in the league.

The teams lined up: CELTIC: Bonnar, Haughney, Meechan, Evans, Stein, Peacock, Smith, Walsh, Fallon, Fernie, Collins.

ST MIRREN: Lornie, Lapsley, Johnstone, Nelson, Telfer, Holmes, McCuigan, Wilson, Anderson, Gemmell, Callan.

In all seven goals were scored during the game, Celtic claimed full points with five goals scored by Smith, Walsh, Fernie, Collins and a Haughney penalty.

St Mirren's goals were scored by Wilson and McCuigan.

It's a fact ...

■ THIS is the 177th league meeting between Celtic and St Mirren. Of the previous 176, we have won 117, drawn 32 and lost 27, scoring 415 goals and conceding 172, collecting 266 points.

■ IN the Premier League we have met 32 times. We have won 19, drawn six and lost seven, scoring 72 goals and conceding 36, gaining 44 points.

■ THE last time St Mirren won at Celtic Park in the league was in 1980/81 when they won 2-1. They beat us 3-1 in a league cup section match here the following season.

■ THE first substitute ever used in a Scottish League match was former Scotland captain Archie Gemmell when he played for St Mirren. He replaced former Saints manager Jim Clunie in a match against Clyde on the 13th of August, 1966.

■ ST MIRREN are the only Scottish club ever to have won the new defunct Anglo-Scottish Cup. They beat Bristol City in the final in 1979/80.

Our visitors at a glance . . .

CAMPBELL MONEY: Apart from a spell of five games when he was absent through appendicitis, Campbell was a regular in the Saints team last season. He has emerged as a more than capable goalkeeper with fourteen shut-outs last season.

TOMMY WILSON: Having missed only one game in the number two jersey last season, Tommy is one of Saints' most consistent performers. An attacking full back, he loves to get forward.

DEREK HAMILTON: Derek was signed from Aberdeen, he has recently regained his place in the team after a long period of injury. He is a keen attacker, and likes nothing better than a shot at goal.

JIM ROONEY: Jim scored only three goals in the whole of last season! By the player's own standards, this is a low figure, and one which he has already equalled this term. A consistent hard-working midfielder player, he helps out in attack and defence.

NEIL COOPER: Neil featured on the injured list last season. A strong player in the air and on the ground, Neil is now fit again, but requested a transfer earlier in the season.

PETER GODFREY: Six foot tall Peter has already formed a steady partnership at the back with Steve Clarke. He scored his first goal for Saints in the vital home match against Dumbarton on 4 May, 1985 and

started this season with a bang, scoring against Hearts.

STEVE CLARKE: Under-21 International Steve is the cool head at the heart of the Saints' defence. A quick thinker in all situations, he is a good reader of the game. Steve also performs well at full back.

TONY FITZPATRICK: Tony is the club captain, and although he had only one goal to his credit last season, he has surpassed that total already, and his creative ability in the midfield has been one of the reasons for the improved consistency being shown by the Saints.

FRANK MCGARVEY: Frank is Saints' "new" hit-man and needs no introduction to Celtic fans, having left Saints several years ago for Liverpool, he returned to Scotland in the green and white of Celtic. A proven goal-scorer, his return to Love Street has seen a great start to the season for the Paisley club.

BRIAN GALLAGHER: Signed from Kilmarnock, Brian took a little time to settle in the Saints team, but he now shows the form which prompted his signing. Having seen him score ten goals last term, Saints' supporters are already enjoying the results of his partnership with Frank McGarvey.

GARDNER SPEIRS: Gardner only broke through into the first team last December, but it is an opportunity that he has taken with both hands.

I expect to be playing in the reserves at Love Street today. The second string haven't been having such a good season so far, but we'll be working hard to emulate the first team and get to the top of the League table.



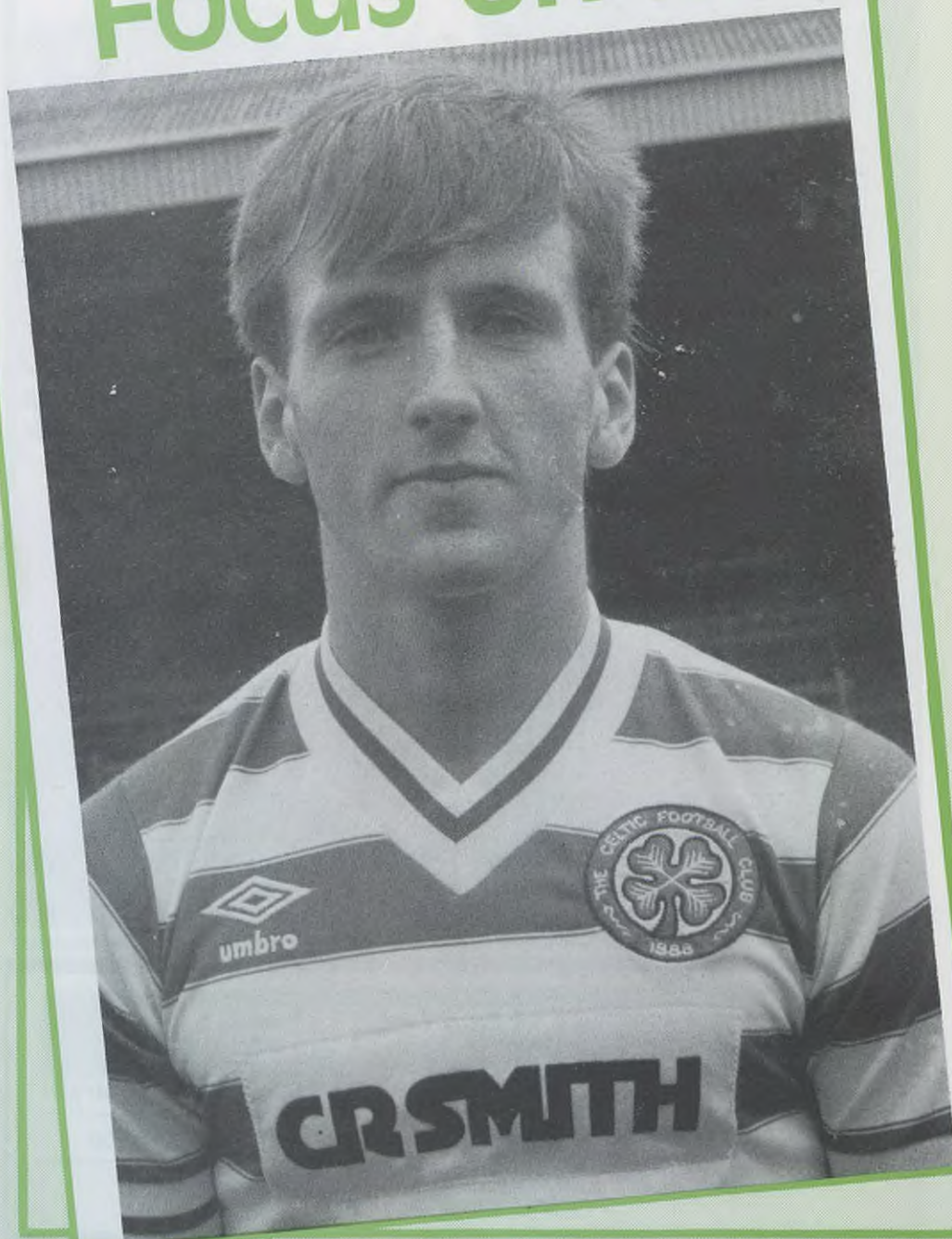

The Old Bhoys ...

JIMMY MCGRORY



353rd world-record breaking goal against Aberdeen with typical header on December 31, 1935.

A GOAL a game for 53 years is a heading often used for articles concerning the greatest ever Scottish striker. With a total of 410 goals in 408 league matches he averaged a goal a game in League football.

Between January 20, 1923 and October 16, 1937, the dates of his first and last matches for Celtic, he scored 410 goals in First Division games. His tally in cup-ties and internationals took the total to 550.

Jimmy was a broad-shouldered, barrel-chested, courageous player who had a mind for nothing but the goal. It is reckoned that he scored about a third of his goals with his head.

He liked to recall a Celtic v Dunfermline Athletic league match on January 14, 1928. In that game he scored three goals in nine minutes, then another before half-time, and in the second half added another four to

bring his total to eight. Yet none was achieved with his head.

James Edward McGrory was reared in the Garnkad district of Glasgow and played for the local junior team, St Roch, as an inside-forward. When he first joined Celtic there was for a while no place for him and he was loaned to Clydebank, as a winger. He returned to Celtic after scoring 13 goals in a season and, after a short spell at outside-left, established himself at centre-forward.

The total of goals mounted rapidly. Duncan Walker of St Mirren held the Scottish League record until McGrory passed it in February 1927 — on his way to 49 for the season — and in October 1935 he scored his 353rd goal to push Steve Bloomer out of first place in the record books. It was then discovered that Motherwell's Hugh Ferguson had scored 362; but McGrory was soon passing that total.

MY TOP THREE

When Brian was born on December 8, 1963, the Beatles were at number one with "She Loves You". Still in a sixties mood, there is an evening of hits of the sixties at Paisley Town Hall on October 15, with live music from the Searchers, Herman's Hermits and The Swinging Blue Jeans.

On October 27, those evergreens the Drifters play two shows at the Pavillion.

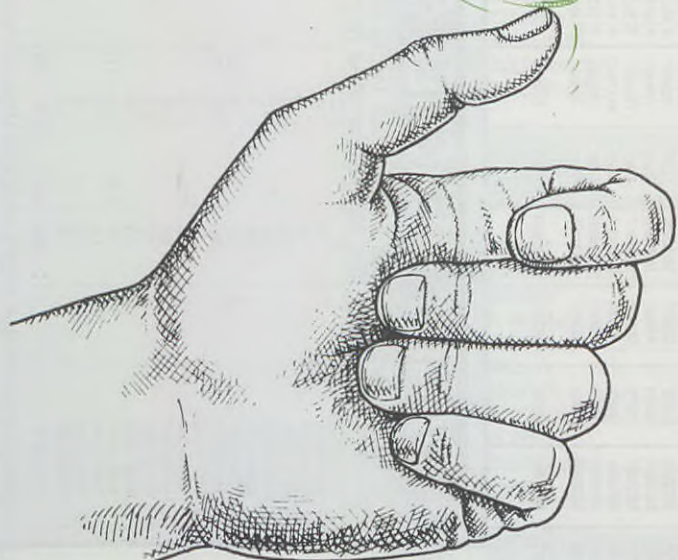

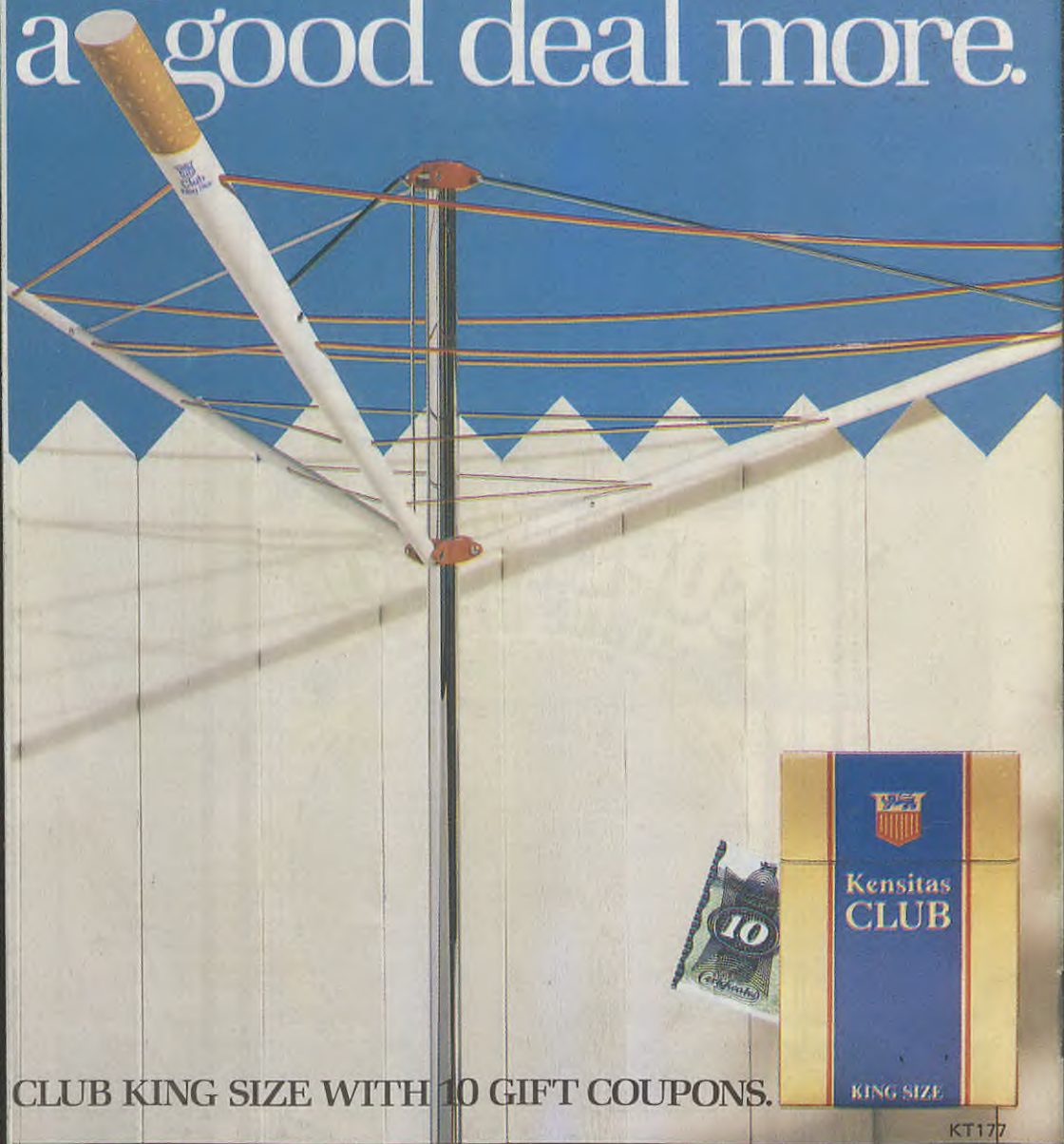
