OUR VISITORS

With the new season only a fortnight away, it is our pleasure this afternoon to welcome as visitors Glasgow Celtic, the Scottish F.A. Cup winners, in the first of two friendly games which we are staging.

Relations between Sunderland and Celtic have always been cordial and supporters will remember over the years the many occasions on which their sides have provided attractive fare, starting with three friendly games in the 1889-90 season, all of which were won by Celtic.

Their last visit to Roker Park was on January 30th, 1960, when they kindly filled in a vacant Saturday arising from Sunderland's early dismissal from the F.A. Cup. Unfortunately, the weather took a hand that day, for the game was played in a rainstorm and on the flooded pitch Sunderland claimed a flattering 7-1 win.

Celtic, 7-0 winners over Shamrock Rovers in Dublin on Monday, are already into their stride and we look forward to seeing them turn on full power again this afternoon. We hope that the game itself is rewarding to both sides and to spectators, including the several thousand who have made the trip from Clydeside.

CELTIC PEN PICTURES.

John Fallon, G/K. Joined the club in 1958. Did not take long to gain his place in the first team and last year was included in Scotland's World Cup group.

Ronnie Simpson, G/K. Joined the club in 1964. Man of many clubs including Tyneside rivals Newcastle United, gaining cup medals. Very experienced and still retains his keenness and agility.

Ian Young, R/B. Signed 1961. A dependable defender who gets on with the game with no fuss. Strong tackler and represented Scotland last year in the Under 23's International.

Tommy Gemmell, L/B. Signed 1962. Very fast, two-footed player who likes to join in the attack and has scored a few goals. Keeps improving and this year should be challenging for International honours.

Bobby Murdoch, R/H. Joined the club in 1960, but still only 20 years of age. Last year took a step back from inside forward and is rapidly establishing himself as a real top-class wing-half. An attacking type who can supply his forwards accurately.

Billy McNeill, C/H. Captain of the Celtic side and also captain of the Scottish international team. Last season was chosen by the Scottish Sports Writer Association as the "Player of the Year."

Joined Celtic in 1958 and soon replaced Bobby Evans. A fast constructive type who has many caps and played in many countries.

John Clarke, L/H. Joined in 1958. A good solid steady type who is more inclined to the defensive role which he plays so well. Not showy, but effective.

Steve Chalmers, O/R. Joined in season 1958, and has played with distinction in the other forward positions. Very fast and direct, a potential goal-scorer who carries threat in either foot. Capped by his country both as a winger and at centre-forward.

Jim Johnstone, I/R. Joined in season 1962. An entertaining type of player, a good ball manipulator, very quick and elusive. Capped last season at outside-right and could be a really big name in the future.

Joe McBride, C/F. Joined the club during the close season from Motherwell F.C. and is to date Celtic's most expensive transfer. A prolific scorer with his last club, and if he continues should be an asset to the Glasgow club.

John Hughes, C/F. Joined Celtic as a boy in 1959. Is also a Scottish international player, and was very much in demand by a few English clubs last season. A controversial type who is a strong runner and very nimble on his feet for one so big. Would be a sensation in English football.

Robert Lennox, I/L. Joined the club in 1961 and last season suddenly burst into the team. Was steady goal scorer throughout Celtic's cup run last season. Forms a sparkling left wing with Bertie Auld.

Bertie Auld, O/L. Rejoined Celtic last season from Birmingham and soon showed home surrounds had done a lot for him. Two goals in the Scottish Cup Final added to the success the club has enjoyed since his return and makes him a big favourite with the Parkhead fans.
