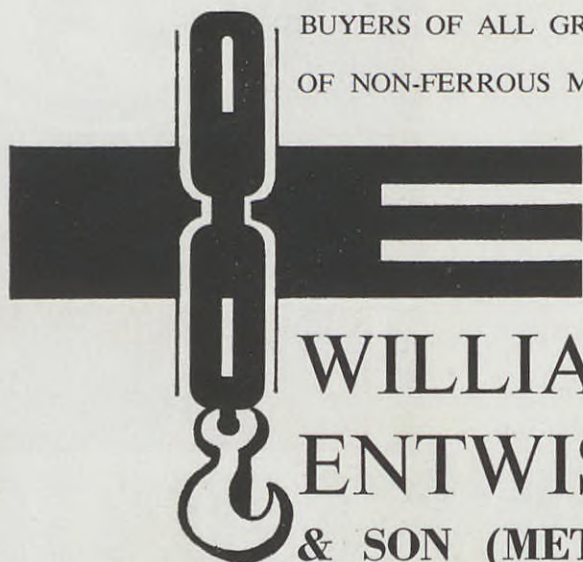

Tommy is after goal record

When it comes to talking about a goal-scoring full back with a power-house shot, who could possibly ignore Celtic's TOMMY GEMMELL.

In eight seasons at Parkhead "Tom" has found the net 66 times, and when one considers only three goals came in the first three seasons, it adds up to a fantastic record. It's reckoned he is the hardest hitter of a ball in the U.K. just now and the keepers who have faced a Gemmell spot-kick are least likely to argue.

At the moment Tom is chasing another four goals this season to break the record of 16 goals he collected in season 1966-67. Be warned Donald Mackay.

Making his first appearance at Tannadice in Celtic colours is keeper EVAN WILLIAMS, formerly with Third Lanark and

Wolves. Not so long ago, Francis Munro told us he rated Williams, then a reserve at Molyneux, as one of the best keepers in the land. Then Jock Stein stepped in to bring him back north and since then he has established himself as a player to watch.

No. 13 is usually regarded as one to be avoided. But as far as HARRY HOOD is concerned it's possibly his lucky number.

Soon after his return to Shawfield from Sunderland, Clyde adopted a numbering system for the first team pool of 18 players.

Harry landed No. 13 and was stuck with it for a season. "It didn't worry me in the slightest," he says. "It must have been lucky because we won promotion and in time I moved to Parkhead!"

Once the season ends in around six weeks time, Celtic will face another rigorous schedule across the Atlantic. At the moment the Parkhead men are lined up to meet Manchester United and Eintracht Frankfurt along with the lesser known Italian side Bari. Also in line to meet the Celts are Newcastle United.

for Tannadice Souvenir Fans

Next season will see the opening of a club shop in Tannadice for the sale of programmes and other football souvenirs. This season there has been a tremendous demand for this material and in recent weeks club officials have studied the "supermarket" set-up in English grounds.

At Newcastle Manager Jerry Kerr and club director Duncan Hutchison visited the St. James' Park shop, within the development offices, and it was later confirmed a similar kiosk would be set up at Tannadice.

At the moment a site has still to be selected and, as it's likely alterations will be made under the stand soon, the initial shop will probably be replaced with a more permanent one later.

It is intended the opening of the souvenir shop will coincide with the release of a 48-page, full colour Dundee United F.C. annual. In addition the shop will stock a comprehensive selection of club items such as scarves, ties, badges, team pictures, etc. Such items will be exclusive and only available from the Tannadice shop. It is also hoped to stock a wide selection of club programmes.

Such is the popularity of football souvenirs these days, we have heard at least three other Scottish clubs are to open shops in time for the new season.

A big talking point among United players during the recent visit to Newcastle concerned the bus, kindly loaned to the party by the St. James' Park Club. This enormous vehicle was kitted out with reclining seats, air conditioning, card tables, a food and drink cabinet and a television set.

So impressed were the Tannadice men that, on arrival at the park before the game, a number of players sat tight watching one of their favourite programmes on T.V. — in the car park!

While the season has still some weeks to run, Tannadice fans are already guaranteed a real glamour start to the new season in August. Newcastle United have been fixed to open the new season and in return United will supply the opposition in a similar fixture on Tyneside.

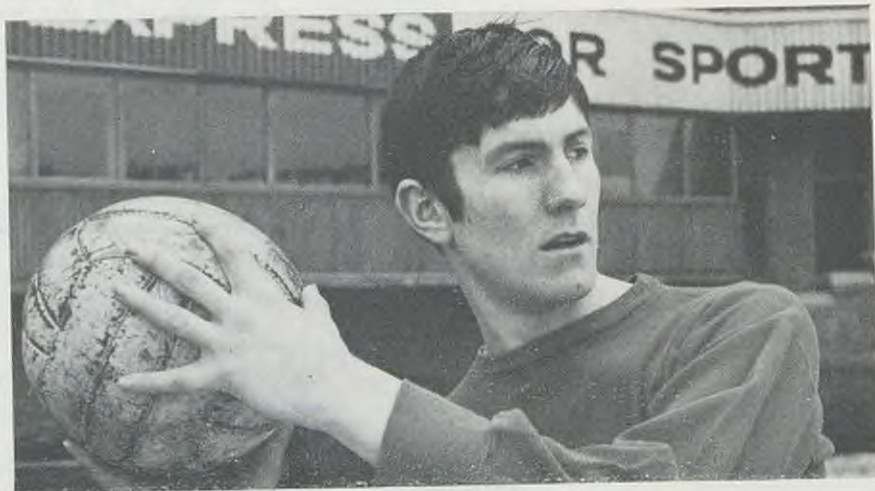

TANNADICE PROFILE No. 14

Hamish McAlpine



Came to Tannadice in 1966 from local amateur club Butterburn. After his first season, he was loaned to second division Montrose where he played for a season. "I really enjoyed my football at Links Park" says Hamish. "There are a lot of experienced players in the second division, and I picked up many useful tips." Although now in his fourth season as a United player, he has played in the first team only three times . . . against Millwall and Hartlepool in friendlies, and against Hearts in the league last season. And it was in a reserve League Cup tie at Tynecastle this season he sustained the bad leg injury which kept him out of action for over five months. But he is now back to full fitness again and will soon be challenging again for a first team place. As a youngster, Hamish supported both Dundee clubs and rarely missed a game at either ground. "Bill Brown was a man I really admired when he was at Dens Park. It was by watching him that I made up my mind I wanted to be a goalkeeper." Of present day goalkeepers, Hamish rates Gordon Banks as the greatest. "Nearly every goalkeeper has some weakness, but not him. For all round ability he's unbeatable."

Jerry Kerr's Column

THIS AFTERNOON we welcome Celtic to Tannadice Park and I feel certain today's game will be one of the most important clashes of the season. In the space of three months we have faced the Parkhead men twice away from home and, on both occasions, we fell rather heavily. After our 7-2 League defeat in December I put forward the view Celtic were probably the finest club side in the world and, following a Scottish Cup defeat I see no reason to alter this opinion.

As always Jock Stein's boys are deeply committed in several competitions and with the Championship still at a vital stage this afternoon's game promises to be full of interest. From our own point of view a high place in the table must be secured to have a chance of inclusion in the Fairs Cup next season, and after a good result at Ayr we go into today's clash with some confidence. At Somerset Park the entire side gave 100% effort and a repeat today could bring reward. Unhappily at Ayr Andy Rolland, Jim Henry and Ian Scott were booked for tame offences in the second half.

In the next two weeks we face three clubs who are in the lower half of the table, Clyde (h) and St. Mirren and Partick (a), and if a European place is to be won, we must go for — and get — full points.

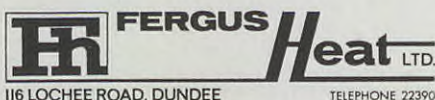
