ON Saturday, April 8, 1978, Celtic travelled to Clydebank to play bottom of the League 'Bankies before a crowd which fell short of the 10,000 laid down by the local police. At the start of the game Celtic looked superior in every department of the game with the possible exception of fighting spirit.

Celtic got a warning after ten minutes when following a corner from the right, McCormack shot the home team into the lead. This spurred Celtic into action and seven minutes later they had taken a 2-1 lead.

The first goal was a gift when an ambitious passback went straight to the feet of George McCluskey to score from close range. Three minutes later and Tommy Burns ended a diagonal dribble deep into the home defence with a right foot grounder into the corner of the net.

Fifteen minutes after the interval Lumsden equalised for the home team. After both teams hit the bar with headers, a misunderstanding between Frank Munro and Peter Latchford enabled Colgan to grab the winner for Clydebank just four minutes from the end.

THIS story appeared on the front page of the 'Celtic View':

Jimmy Johnstone, the 10-minute star of the cup semi-final against Dundee, will almost certainly be in the line-up for the replay at Hampden tonight. Jimmy, under a cloud recently due to his ordering off against Aberdeen, celebrated his not guilty verdict with a late dazzling burst against the men from Dens Park.

Celtic had played well enough to win before then, against a team which had no intention of playing attacking football, but towards the end they were lacking in penetration and imagination.

The Johnstone magic worked wonders and this was surely one of manager Jock Stein's shrewdest strokes. Johnstone's presence infused new life into the entire side and within minutes of his arrival the Dundee goal had luckily survived fine scoring efforts by Dalglish, Lennox, Johnstone and Dalglish again.

CELTIC, pushing Rangers hard at the top of the League, travelled through to Tynecastle on April 6, 1968 for a League match which was vital to their hopes of retaining the League championship. The result and details of the game were as follows: HEARTS 0, CELTIC 2 — Celtic: Simpson; Craig and Gemmell; Murdoch, McNeill and Brogan; Johnstone and Lennox; Wallace; Gallagher and Hughes. Twelfth man: Cattanach.

Writing in the 'View' manager Jock Stein said: "We were frequently reminded before the match with Hearts at Tynecastle that the ground was no happy hunting ground for us. But Celtic don't pay much, if any, attention nowadays to what happened in the past, the bogies are almost all gone now.

"The team did not play with the great fluency displayed in our recent matches; nevertheless they had a good, convincing win and played some splendid football in difficult windy conditions."

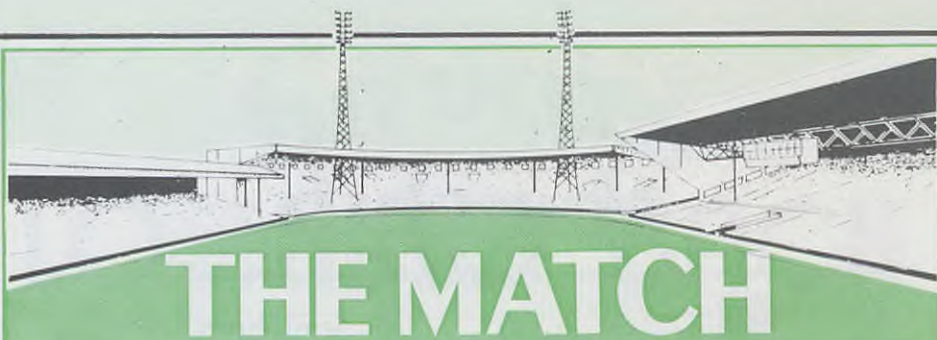

FLASHBACK

MORTON last visited Celtic Park on December 27, 1982 when Celtic won 5-1 in front of 14,953 people.

The opening goal came from Morton in the 30th minute. Murdo MacLeod tried to clear and the ball rolled past the keeper and into goal. In the 41st minute Charlie Nicholas levelled the scoring from a penalty and in the 53rd minute a Davie Provan cut-back was slotted home by Murdo MacLeod.

Tommy Burns then shot against Roy Baines and Frank McGarvey met the rebound to score. Frank scored yet again after he moved onto a Tommy Burns pass to shoot into an open net.

Two minutes later Mark Reid scored a tremendous goal.
