Today we depart from our normal custom in that the picture on the front page is not that of a Celtic player. It is Derek Dooley, former centre-forward of Sheffield Wednesday. Derek, as a young man, only played two Seasons in first-class football. In 1951-52 he scored 47 goals (a post-war record in England) from only 31 games, and thus enabled his team to gain promotion. The following Season he scored 16 goals from a few games when he broke his leg against Preston, and shortly afterwards it was, tragically, amputated, and so ended his brief and glorious career.

But Derek has not been lost to football and today he is actively engaged in running his former Club's Development Fund, which is, in many respects, similar to our own. Derek has volunteered to help us launch our Scheme and he will superintend the first draw at half-time today, which will be performed by Mrs. Robert Kelly, wife of our Chairman.

We thank, Derek, then for this spontaneous and sportsmanlike gesture.
