Shawfield Snippets

Can Clyde throw the League Cup section open against Celtic at Shawfield this evening? It was no mean feat to go to Parkhead a week ago and score three goals against the holders. The team showed wonderful fighting spirit in keeping going against all the odds and finally reducing Celtic's four goal lead to two.

Even in defeat, Clyde had cause for elation. Two of the most outstanding players on our side were among the youngest on the staff. The pair? Right-back Eddie Anderson and right-half Willie Beattie both of whom are only beginning their second season in senior football. Their respective displays at Celtic Park were very favourably commented on and it is most encouraging not only to the two boys but to the club as well.

The accent-on-youth policy was given further scope against Hearts at Tynecastle where Manager Archie Robertson had young John McColligan from Ashfield making his debut. This boy also did splendidly. He was the brains behind our equaliser in the first half scored by Sam Hastings and made his contribution towards our heart-warming victory.

The older generation of Clyde fans will be hoping that young McColligan turns out every bit as good as another

famous left winger whom Clyde signed from Ashfield. His name? Tommy Ring. Tommy not only won a Scottish Cup and two Second Division championship medals with Clyde, he was capped for Scotland on no fewer than twelve occasions as well as turning out for the Scottish League in eight representative games.

Mention of crack left wingers brings out the point that Clyde's own Sam Hastings did a great job in the number ten spot against Hearts at Tynecastle. He has scored two goals in his last two games and seems set for a good season in the net-bulging line. Not so long ago, he finished one term as Clyde's leading marksman with 23 goals and his inside partner on that occasion was Jim McLean the present Dundee trainer. McLean scored 22.

Oddly enough, both were signed by Clyde from Hamilton Accies for modest fees and both turned out ideal captures. Incidentally, Sam has been 13 seasons in the senior grade and is reveling in his new role as a midfield player.

Clyde have been drawn at Shawfield in the semi-final of the Glasgow Cup. They will entertain the winners of the first round tie between Partick Thistle and Celtic at Firhill. The Parkhead club are of course, the current holders.

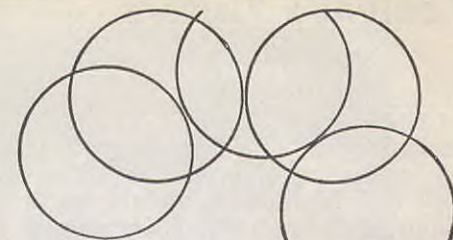

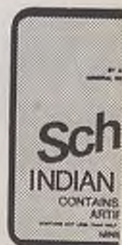

Celtic's first team pool includes former Clyde favourite Harry Hood now a full-time player at Parkhead. During his sojourn at Shawfield, Harry was a part-timer but he played full-time in England with Sunderland.
