FIRHILL CHATTER

This season's League Cup is hotting up to an exciting climax and we make bold to say that our own section III is providing its quota of thrills. The long-awaited goal-scoring feats were much in evidence last Saturday, with Rangers way out in front with 9 goals; Hibs, Clyde and Morton several lengths behind with 5 goals each, and Celtic, Dundee, East Fife and Hamilton Accas. tying for third place with 4 goals each.

Narrow Victory

We just nosed home to victory in last Saturday's engagement with Hearts at Firhill. Harold Davis came back to his right-half position and Davie McParland took up his former position on the left wing.

The heavy pitch and greasy ball hindered the players somewhat in their efforts to play good football. After eleven minutes McParland beat two defenders and crashed the ball into the net. It was now full steam ahead.

Then followed two disputed goals. Hearts defenders stood still while a Davis free kick was chased by McParland, who then back-heeled it to Hainey and the centre thumped it home. Hearts' protests were in vain. Wallace from a seemingly off-side position got the ball past Niven and the referee awarded a goal. But after consulting a linesman he reversed his decision. Exciting stuff this!

Hearts fought back and centre White, from a Higgins pass, headed the ball past Niven. But worse luck was to follow. Captain Davie McParland fell to the ground following a heavy tackle and was carried off in great pain. He resumed after the interval but still suffering from the effects of his injury.

End to end thrills during the second half brought no more goals and thus the game ended 2—1 in our favour.

Opening League Game

A temporary break in the League Cup last Wednesday evening allowed the League proper to kick-off, and among the winning teams our eleven recorded a win at Tannadice Park, Dundee.

Centre-forward Hainey scored both goals in our 2—1 victory and Moran got United's goal. In an exciting finish George Niven put up the shutters on an over-eager forward line. This was United's first defeat this season.

Qualifying Decider

The result of today's game with Celtic will probably put the seal on which team goes forward to the quarter final. The Parkhead club, after a goalless draw in their opening game with our club, found their shooting boots versus Hearts and Kilmarnock, and at present lead our section by 5 points to our 4.

The meeting of these two clubs should be the highlight in to-day's League Cup programme. Football fans are calling out for goals and we hope that they won't be disappointed.

The scene is all set for a thrilling encounter. May it have a satisfactory ending with the better team taking a step forward to Hampden Park.

Following our 1—1 draw at Kilmarnock in which Rae scored our goal, we returned to winning form last Saturday at Tynecastle. Hearts were early in command and scored in five minutes from a penalty. Gray failed to hold Smart's spot-kick and the Hearts' player scored from the rebound.

We were upset by team changes and were lucky to be only 1 goal down at the interval. But five minutes after half-time we were level. A cross from Rae bounced off MacColl before entering the net. We were more in the game now yet it was Hearts who scored. A free-kick by Souness struck McKinnon and Gray had no chance.

We equalised in a lucky manner. Aitchison in attempting to clear placed the ball past his own 'keeper. Once again we went all out for the winning goal. It came 12 minutes from time and it was the best goal of the game. Gallagher took a ball knee-high and blasted it into the net. This was not one of our best displays. A big improvement is called for if we aim to beat Celtic Reserves to-day at Celtic Park.
