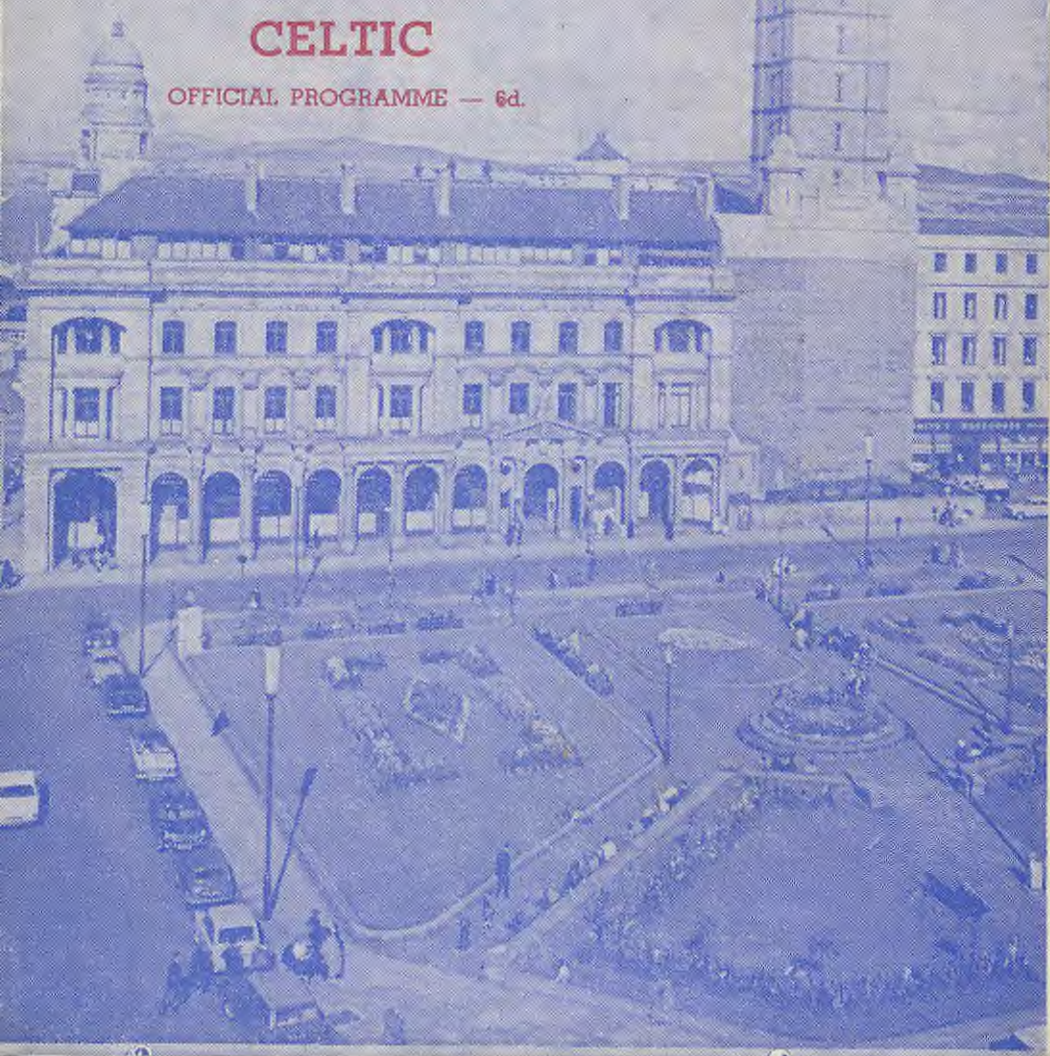

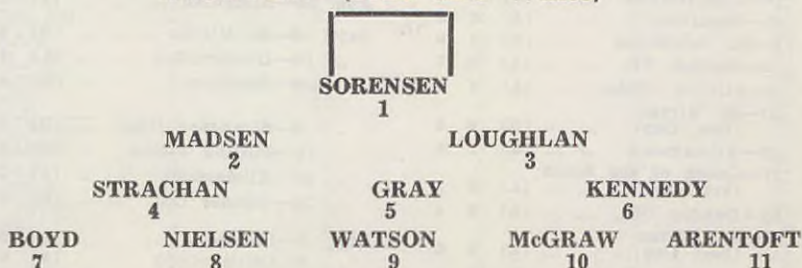

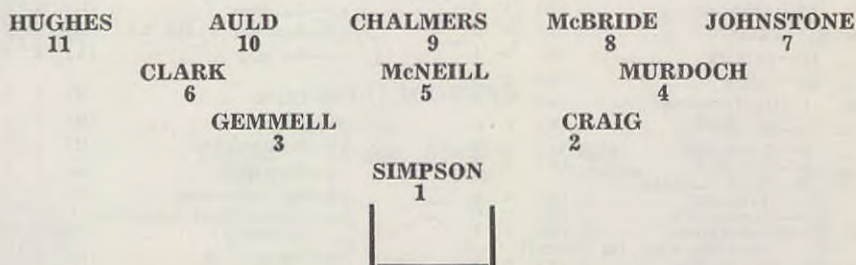

THE LAST CHANCE

VERY OFTEN the last league match of the season can be a rather tame affair without any particular importance — we wish that were so to-day. Instead we have the last chance to fight for our 1st Division life. Given ordinary opposition we could feel fairly confident of success but Celtic are by no mean ordinary opposition. Not only are they the league leaders but they are still fighting it out with Rangers for the championship and they must be all the more determined to land that honour after losing to their rivals in the Cup Final. Celtic have, without doubt, been the outstanding Club in Scotland this season and they have done a great service to the game in this country by their achievements in the European Cup Winners' Competition. It would be only fitting that they should emerge as this season's league champions and with greater experience behind them go forward into the European Championship. We wish them every success in this but for to-day we must do a whole lot of wishing for ourselves. The Morton team will do everything in their power to create a shock result this afternoon and football would not hold the attraction it does if there were no shock results. You can't expect them, but they sometimes happen — we can only wait and see.

OUR VISITORS THIS AFTERNOON

RONNIE SIMPSON—Goalkeeper. 5 ft. 10 in. 11st 13 lb. Signed from Hibernian 1964. Simpson has been all of 20 years in senior football. Starting with Queen's Park he had most of his career with Newcastle United and has an English Cup medal. He is having one of his best seasons this term with Celts.

JIM CRAIG—Right Back. 5 ft 7 in. 11 st. 4 lb.. Signed from Glasgow University football last year he has come to the fore very quickly and took over the right back position from Ian Young. Craig has excellent position sense, is very fast in recovery and a sharp tackler.

TOMMY GEMMELL—Left Back. 6 ft 11 st. Signed from Coltness Jrs. five years ago, he is an ever present for his club this season and the highest scoring full back in Scotland. He has played for the Scottish team and also the Scottish League team this year. Although he revels in the chance to move up to the left wing he is first and foremost a very sound defender.

BOBBY MURDOCH—Right Half. 5 ft. 9 in. 11 st. Spotted as a schoolboy with Our Lady's High he signed for Celtic five years ago when he was 16. He was capped at inside right in the Scotland Under 23 team. Murdoch is a splendid passer of the ball and has also scored 13 goals this season including 2 against Wales last November.

BILLY McNEILL—Centre Half. 6 ft. 1 in. 11 st. 4 lb. Signed for Blantyre Vics 9 years ago McNeill has 20 full international caps despite ill-luck through injuries. He is a superb player in the air and is a valuable asset in the attack when he comes upfield at corner kicks. Last season he was voted "Player of the Year."

JOHN CLARK—Left Half. 5 ft. 8 in. 11st. Signed from Larkhall Thistle in 1958 this is probably the season when he has really come to the fore. An extremely efficient player in all aspects of the game particularly in his tackling and distribution. Not one of Celts more spectacular players but he plays an important role in the form of sweeper behind the defence.

JIMMY JOHNSTONE—Outside Right. 5 ft. 4 in. 9 st. 8 lb. Although small and lightly built Johnstone is one of Celtic's most skillful players. He is a clever dribbler and a most difficult man to tackle. Signed from Blantyre Celtic in 1961. He has scored 11 goals this season, has 3 caps for Scotland. Age 21.

JOE McBRIDE—Inside Right. 5 ft. 8 in. 11 st. 8 lb. A man of many clubs, McBride signed from Motherwell last year. His particular skill is the vital one of goalscoring and he does this with great regularity being very quick to grab the slightest chance. He appears to have shaded off just a little at present. Has made several appearances for the Scottish League team.

STEVE CHALMERS—Centre Forward. 5 ft. 9 in. 10 st. 12 lb. Signed in 1959 from Ashfield, Chalmers has collected a number of Scottish and Scottish League Caps, mostly at outside right. He has a tremendous burst of speed which can take him through a defence in an instant. Essentially a striker.

BERTIE AULD—Inside Left, 5 ft. 8 in. 10 st. 7 lb. Returned to Celtic from Birmingham City last year Auld is usually an outside left. He has 6 Scottish and League Caps. He holds the ball well and at inside left he acts as a fine link man between defence and attack.

JOHN HUGHES—Outside Left. 6 ft. 12 st. 4 lb. Signed from Shotts Bon Accord in 1959. Hughes is a big powerful winger who is most difficult to dispossess when he sets off on a man-beating run up the left wing. Has been capped several times for Scotland and the Scottish League.
