EVAN WILLIAMS (goalkeeper):

Signed from Wolverhampton Wanderers in 1969, Evan has established himself as Celtic's regular last line of defence following the retirement of the great Ronnie Simpson. A player who first came into prominence with the now defunct Scottish club Third Lanark, he had an excellent 1971-72 season as Celtic powered to League and Scottish Cup triumphs.

DENNIS CONNAGHAN (goalkeeper):

Purchased from St. Mirren last season to add strength in depth to Celtic's goalkeeping ability. Dennis has proved a worthy rival to Williams and has acquitted himself excellently in his first-team games. He performs with consistency in any level of competition.

DAVID HAY (full-back/wing-half):

One of the most versatile players in Scotland, David has proved one of Jock Stein's most important discoveries. Despite his ability to play anywhere, full-back is considered his best position but he has played for Scotland as a forward. He was first capped in 1970 and has won 11 full international honours.

DANNY McGRAIN (full-back):

Originally a wing-half, Danny has been cleverly converted into a full-back and has been playing splendidly as such this season. Looks set for a distinguished career.

JIM BROGAN (full-back/wing-half):

Another player who shines just as brightly as a wing-half or full-back, Jim has proved a tower of strength in defence this term. Another international, he won four caps in 1971.

BOBBY MURDOCH (wing-half):

First capped by Scotland in 1966 and the holder of a dozen full international honours, Bobby is the man in charge of the Parkhead "engine room." Very strong in possession and a dynamic driving force, he made a spectacular return to the side last season. Specialises in hitting unexpected goals from long range.

BILLY McNEILL (centre-half)

Signed as long ago as 1957, Billy is the Celtic club's longest-serving player and seems — like good wine — to improve with age! He was first capped by Scotland in 1961 and has won 28 caps, his first-class leadership and play last season earning him a recall to the squad for the Home International series. He is Celtic's captain.

GEORGE CONNELLY (wing-half)

A superb reader of the game, George was one of the brightest stars of Celtic's European campaign last season. Also an international, he partners McNeill to perfection in the middle of Celtic's defence. He was signed from junior club Tulliallan Thistle in 1966.

TOM CALLAGHAN (wing-half/inside-forward)

Bought from Dunfermline Athletic for £35,000 in 1968, Tom had a long, quiet spell following his transfer but is now proving his worth in a big way. He is famed for his powerful running and ability to create goals.

JIMMY JOHNSTONE (winger):

One of the most brilliant ball-players and match-winners in British football, Jimmy first played for Scotland in 1965 and has picked up nearly 20 caps since then. Has the ability to turn any defence inside out with his superb talents and scores goals as well as makes them. A tremendously exciting player to watch.

JOHN 'DIXIE' DEANS (inside-forward):

Signed from Motherwell last season to get goals, 'Dixie' has done just that. He is exceptionally good in the air and chases everything. He crowned his first season with Celts by grabbing a hat-trick in the 6-1 Scottish Cup Final win over Hibernian.

LOU MACARI (inside-forward):

Yet another international, Lou had a great game against Denmark last month, scoring one goal and cleverly laying on another in Scotland's 4-1 victory. A veritable 'buzz-bomb,' the diminutive insideman who can also star on the left wing joined Celts in 1966 and has developed as a real personality of the Scottish scene.

KENNY DALGLISH (inside-forward):

Like so many of his team-mates, Kenny revels in a variety of roles but is best-known for his deadly finishing ability. He was carefully groomed for stardom by Celtic and when his chance came he seized it. Yet another international who should win many more caps.

BOBBY LENNOX (inside-forward/winger):

A Celt for 11 years, Bobby has been playing as well as ever this season. Pace and finishing power are the strong points of his game and they have won him 10 full Scottish caps.

HARRY HOOD (inside-forward):

A £40,000 purchase from Clyde three years ago, Harry has proved an exceptionally good buy, having scored many valuable goals. An adept player on the ball, he prefers the direct approach and is another lethal finisher.

PAUL WILSON (forward):

Paul functions mainly at outside-left and is one of the best players in Scottish reserve football. He has had a number of first-team appearances and has invariably acquitted himself well.

JIMMY QUINN (full-back):

Bearer of an illustrious Celtic name, Jimmy was formerly a forward. He is renowned for his speed and still loves to go into attack. Has had an extended first-team run this season, usually playing at left-back.

BRIEF HISTORY OF CELTIC F.C.

“ THE TIMS ”

Founded 1888. Colours: Green and white hooped shirts.

Address: Celtic Park, Glasgow, S.E.

Ground capacity and record attendance: 92,000.

Honours: Scottish Cup-winners on 22 occasions.

Scottish League Cup-winners on 7 occasions.

European Cup-winners: 1967. Finalists: 1970.

Cup Winners' Cup: Semi-finalists 1964 and 1966.

Scottish League Champions on 27 occasions and for the last seven years.

Founded in 1888 as The Celtic Football and Athletic Club, Celtic F.C. began their official life by beating Rangers 5-2, but at the time the famous Queen's Park were already well established as Scotland's leading club and Rangers had also been formed for some time. In 1889 Celtic were losing finalists in the Cup Final, but subsequently won the Cup Final in 1892, beating Queen's Park 5-1. Since that time, Celtic have never finished below 12th position in the League and winning 26 times.

The club, although strongly Catholic, has outlived its “ Catholic only ” tradition and the present manager, Jock Stein, is a Protestant. Incidentally, he is only the fourth manager of the Club since 1888.

Celtic have been Scottish champions for the last seven years and they were also champions for six years between 1904 and 1910.

In 1938 the Club won the Exhibition Trophy, involving Everton, Sunderland, Chelsea, Brentford, Hearts, Rangers and Aberdeen. However, after the Second World War, the Club did not perform up to the high standards expected and it was not until Celtic won the Coronation Trophy in 1953 against such opposition as Arsenal, Manchester United, Tottenham Hotspur, Newcastle, Rangers, Hibernian and Aberdeen that fortunes took an upward turn again. The captain of the team was Jock Stein and the side won the double in 1953-54. However, when the club next won the League, it was not until 1966 and Jock Stein was then manager, having returned to the Club after a short period as manager of Dunfermline and then Hibernian.

Then came the European Cup Final victory over Inter-Milan in Lisbon—the Club's greatest moment.

Under Jock Stein the record of the Club is greater than any other British club. The League has been won seven times; the Scottish Cup five times; the League Cup four times and the European Cup once.

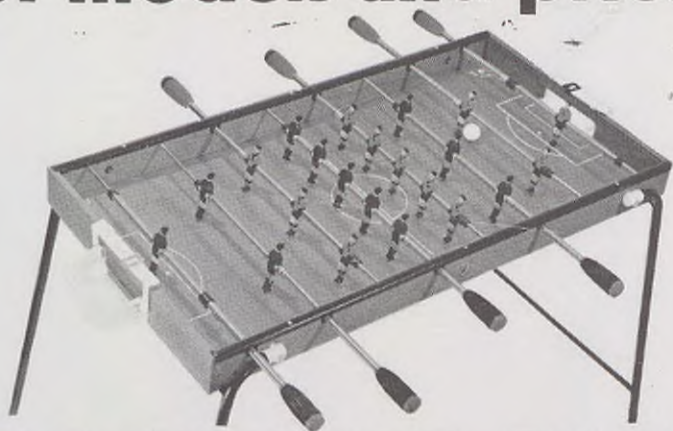
