We started off at a tremendous pace and John Hughes making his first appearance after nine weeks off with an ankle injury soon settled all doubts about his fitness by scoring a splendid goal which put us on the road to victory. The Partick boys fought with great endeavour but from this point the result was never in doubt and further goals by Frank Brogan clinched the issue. We now meet the winners of the Clyde v. Third Lanark game in the Final which is on at Hampden on December 24th.

The Celtic Supporters Association held their Annual Rally on Sunday evening. The guest of honour this year being one of the greatest Celt's in the person of James McMenemy. He was a shining light of perhaps the greatest team ever which was Adams, McLeod, Orr, Young, Loney and Hay, Bennett, McMenemy, Quinn, Somers and Hamilton. This team won the Scottish League for six years in succession and the Club were presented with a Shield to commemorate this wonderful achievement which has never been equalled. Johnny McMenemy won all the honour in the game and during his long career, he was in his forty-third year when he helped Partick Thistle to beat Rangers in the Scottish Cup Final. He endeared himself to all true lovers of the game by his superlative skill and his high sense of sportsmanship both in victory and defeat. Mr. Delaney, the Secretary, made the presentation on behalf of the supporters, and in his speech paid tribute to Jimmy, who in turn thanked the supporters for their thoughtfulness in remembering him after all these years. Although he is now 82 years old we are glad to say that he seldom misses a game at Celtic Park where he is an ever welcome and honoured guest.
