It was good to see the goals being shared around the team again, but also pleasing that our strikers were able to prolong their recent hot streak in front of goal.

It was also great to reintroduce Alex Rae to the action. He always gives 100 per cent and is an important figure to have around the dressing room.

With Bob Malcolm suspended for tonight's game, it might be a big ask to throw Alex into

the starting line-up but, at the time of writing, it is one of our options.

It is a shame to lose Bob as he's been in excellent form. I would have liked to have seen him pit his wits against the opposition midfield tonight but it wasn't to be.

Dado Prso and Zurab Khizanishvili both missed last weekend's match but we hope both will be okay to play tonight if required.

We are all at a club where we want to win every game and always try to be positive in the way we play the game.

We know we won't win every match but we will give it our best shot each time we take to the field.

I know all of our fans and the players are craving a win over Celtic and I'm no different in that respect.

We have endured a poor run of results against them in recent times but we can put that right by earning a victory this evening.

SECONDS OUT...

THE immovable object meets the unstoppable force when the latest bout between Glasgow's two heavyweight giants gets under way at Ibrox tonight.

In the green corner, Celtic arrive in Govan tonight looking to avoid sinking to their first Old Firm defeat since the 2003 CIS Cup final when goals from Claudio Caniggia and Peter Lovenkrands paved the way for a 2-1 Rangers victory.

In the blue corner, Alex McLeish's side have yet to taste defeat in eight matches at fortress Ibrox this season, draws with Dundee United and CSKA Moscow the only blotches on an otherwise 100 per cent perfect record.

With a draw not an option in this cup quarter-final – extra-time and then penalties will settle it if necessary – one of these proud records will be shattered.

Despite bearing the mental burden of seven successive defeats in this fixture Gers will head into tonight's match full of confidence.

A sticky start to the season has been replaced in recent weeks with a golden autumn revival and, thanks largely to one of the most watertight defences in British football, it is now 11 matches since they last tasted defeat.

Celtic, on the other hand, have struggled in recent weeks, leaking goals to the likes of Livingston, Motherwell and Aberdeen domestically and slumping to the foot of their Champions League group in Europe.

The teams are due to meet twice in the space of 10 days, with Celtic returning to Ibrox on league duty next weekend, and defender Alan Hutton believes the signs look good for Gers as they aim to break that winless run over the old enemy.

"I think of late we've been playing really well and Celtic have struggled a bit and dropped a few points so our confidence is up," he said.

"This is probably the best time to play them and the double-header will be very exciting. The fact

both games are at Ibrox is a great help. We will have all our fans behind us and they will be fired up for it.

"We want to win the two matches as we still have our eye on four trophies this season.

"And, should both sides win on Sunday, if we beat Celtic in the league the week after then the gap at the top will be down to only one point and we would be right back in it.

"Celtic are obviously our most difficult opponents and we know they will both be hard games. But we are full of confidence right now."

After picking up an ankle injury in Scotland Under-21s' match with Slovenia, Hutton returned to competitive action as a substitute in the 5-0 thumping of Aberdeen.

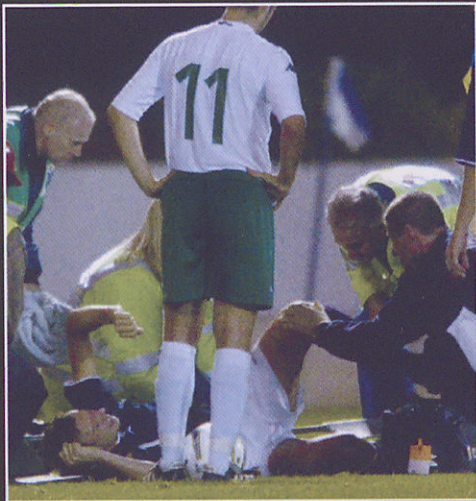
Having proved his fitness the 19-year-old started the game against Livi at the weekend and now aims to cement a regular place in McLeish's starting line-up.

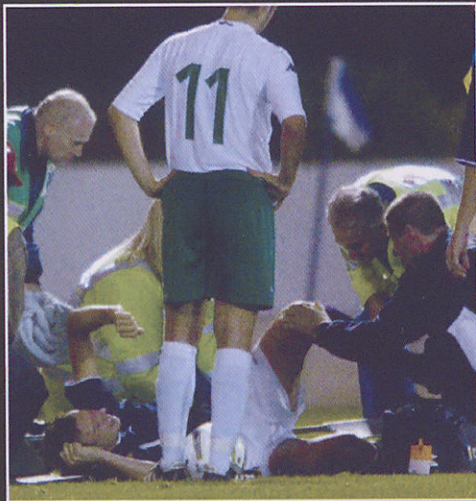

THE TIME IS NOW

BY the law of averages, it seems almost inevitable that Rangers will beat Celtic in the near future and boss Alex McLeish will be hoping that his side can halt a dismal run of results against their great rivals in the League Cup tonight.

Celtic have won the last seven Old Firm encounters and Gers supporters have to go back to the League Cup Final in March 2003 for their last victory over the Hoops.

However, although Celtic will be favourites, current form suggests it will be a close-run game. Martin O'Neill's side may be above Rangers in the league but in recent weeks they have struggled to recreate the form that took them to last season's double.

Celtic's defence has been leaking goals and in four Champions League games they have picked up only three points. It now looks likely that the

club will be battling it out with Shakhtar Donetsk for third spot and a place in the UEFA Cup.

Rangers fans, on the other hand, have been able to enjoy some great performances from their team of late including five-goal hauls against Amica Wronki in the UEFA Cup and Aberdeen in the league.

The Parkhead side, though, may have a psychological advantage going in to tonight's match after they were victorious at Celtic Park in the first Old Firm match this season.

In a typically nervy encounter, Alan Thompson snatched all three points for the home side with a fantastic late strike.



O'Neill's side had no problems making it through to the quarter-finals as they crushed Falkirk 8-1 in the third round. Goals from Bobo Balde, Stephen McManus, Aiden McGeady, Paul Lambert, Momo Sylla and a hat-trick from youngster Ross Wallace put an end to the Bairns' cup run.

It was never going to be easy for O'Neill to rebuild his side in the summer after losing Henrik Larsson to Barcelona, Liam Miller to Manchester United, Jamie Smith to Den Haag and Johan Mjallby to Levante.

Many people thought that the manager could make a couple of 'big-name' signings but the only players brought in to strengthen the squad were Henri Camara, on a season-long loan from Wolves, and Juninho.

The Brazilian won a World Cup winners medal in 2002 and his arrival bolstered Celtic's midfield. His signing was a gamble, as the player only returned to action in the summer after snapping a cruciate ligament, but it now looks as though he could become an inspired signing.

The loss of Larsson has put pressure on Chris Sutton, John Hartson and Camara but the attacking trio have coped admirably and will cause Rangers' defence a lot of problems at

Ibrox tonight.

Teenage goalkeeper David Marshall has retained the No.1 jersey ahead of Rab Douglas and Magnus Hedman so far this season. A heroic performance in the Nou Camp last term ensured that he became a firm favourite.

Although Celtic's defence has been under criticism of late, Jackie McNamara, Joos Valgaeren, Stan Varga and Didier Agathe have remained at the back in recent matches due to Balde's injury problems.

Since being snatched from Hibernian for a ludicrously low fee of £35,000, Agathe has risen to become one of Celtic's most influential players. The Frenchman's lightning pace makes him a danger to any defence, although his final ball occasionally lets him down.

Varga proved to be one of the success stories of last season. Recruited from Sunderland on a free transfer in January 2003, the Slovak waited patiently for opportunities then grasped his chance with some composed performances.

When O'Neill paid Roda JC £3.6 million to make Valgaeren his second signing, few Celtic fans knew much of the player who had so impressed their manager at Euro 2000. A tremendous first season in the Hoops changed

all that, with the big Belgian a standout as O'Neill's side stormed to a domestic treble.

The years since have been largely frustrating, with Valgaeren struggling to rid himself of a series of niggling injuries.

Thompson became O'Neill's first midfield signing when Celtic paid Aston Villa £2.75 million to take him north of the border.

In the years since, he has established himself as the No.1 pick on the left. His delivery in dead-ball situations is excellent and McLeish will be fully aware of his ability to shoot from distance.

Neil Lennon, meanwhile, has underlined why Celtic paid £6 million to take him from Leicester three-and-a-half years ago with a string of superb performances in the middle of the park.

Hailed in his homeland as the heir apparent to Hristo Stoichkov, Stilian Petrov had to endure sniggers at such comparisons during a miserable first season in Glasgow under John Barnes.

Since O'Neill's appointment, though, the Bulgarian, who now skips his national side, has blossomed into a powerful, box-to-box midfielder, and is considered one of the club's most influential and valuable players. He also chips in with his fair share of important goals.

However, the main burden for goals falls on the shoulders of Sutton and Hartson.

Sutton became O'Neill's first signing when the Celtic boss shelled out £6 million to end a miserable spell at Chelsea.

Last season proved to be Sutton's best since joining the club. Having excelled in attack, midfield and sometimes even defence, the powerful and industrious utility man was rewarded with the PFA Players' Player of the Year award – and a two-year contract extension.

Sutton, however, strained a muscle in his chest in the recent 3-2 defeat to Aberdeen at Parkhead and is likely to be excluded from

O'Neill's squad tonight.

When the club took a £6 million gamble on Hartson in the summer of 2001, there were those who predicted it would all end in tears, but he has rewarded his

manager's faith with plenty of vital goals. With Larsson departed, Celtic have relied heavily on Hartson to put the ball in the net and so far the Welshman has delivered.

O'Neill will also be able to call upon talented youngsters like Wallace, McGeady and striker Craig Beattie if required tonight.

Which players did you idolise as a youngster?

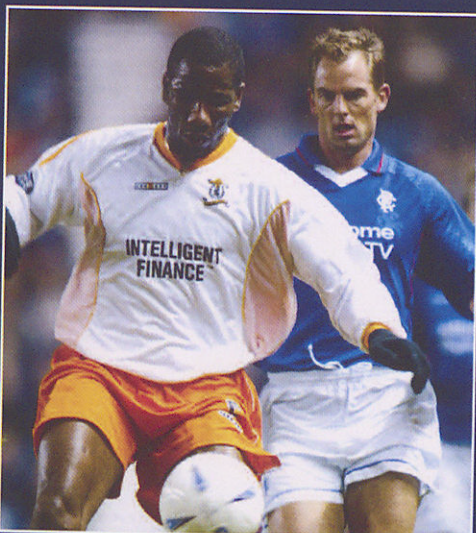
John Barnes. I watched Liverpool a lot when I was a young boy growing up. I remember when they won the FA Cup against Everton in 1989 and it was a fantastic match.

Can you name your favourite game?

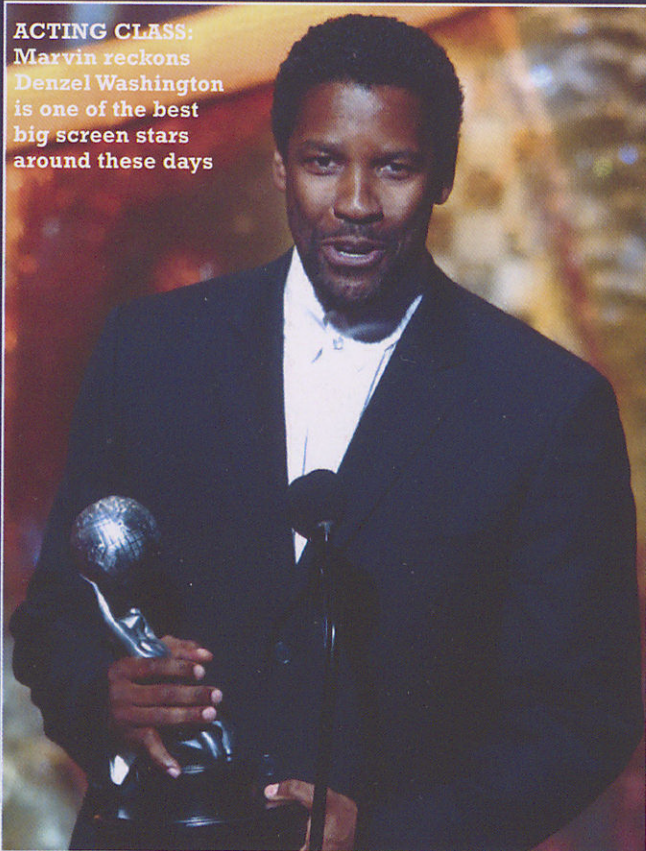

My all-time favourite is Denzel Washington. I think there is no better than him at the moment.

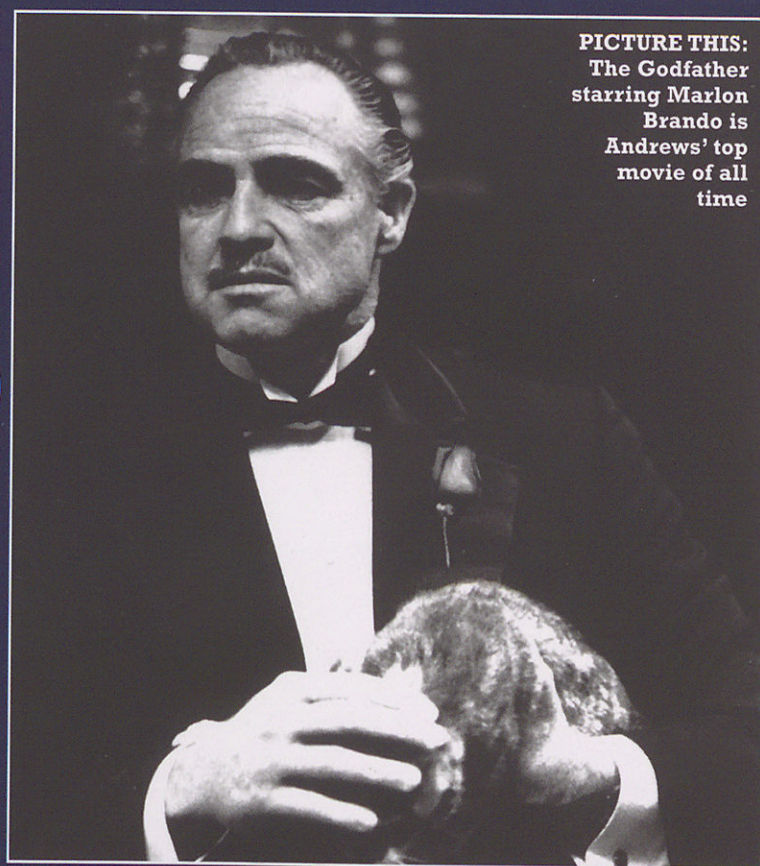
What kind of food do you like?

CLASSIC MATCH

THE last time Rangers played Celtic in a League Cup clash at Ibrox was back in September 1993 – but Gers fans that were lucky enough to be at the game will remember it as if it was yesterday

Hampden was normally used as a neutral venue for semi-final fixtures but, as the national stadium was being re-developed, Rangers won the toss of a coin and the match was played at Ibrox.

In what was a bizarre sight for the home support, Celtic fans took over the entire Govan Stand as well as their usual Broomloan Road end, creating a spine-tingling atmosphere.

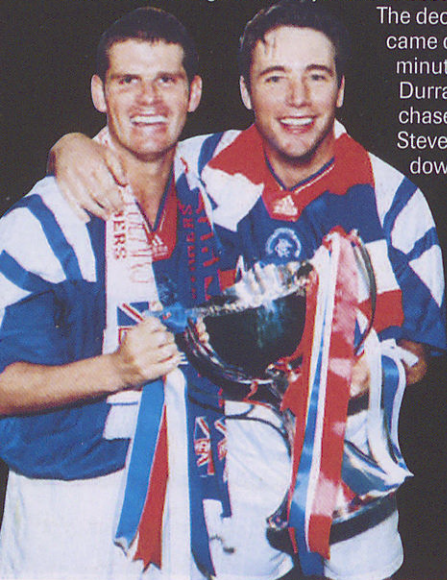
Walter Smith's side went in to the 1993/4 season having won five domestic trophies on the trot and the manager would have been hoping for six by beating Celtic and retaining the League Cup.

Gers had, however, endured a difficult start to the new season and had only picked up three victories from eight league matches.

However, as with any great side, Rangers managed to triumph in the face of adversity.

After going down to 10-men due to the controversial sending off of Peter Huistra four minutes after half-time, Gers legends Ian Durrant and Mark Hateley combined to break Celtic hearts and send the Light Blue legions in to ecstasy.

The decisive goal came on 66 minutes when Durrant chased a Gary Stevens pass down the

right and got round Mike Galloway before looking up and sending a perfect ball across the face of goal for Hateley to slam past Pat Bonner.

The goal – and the victory – was no more than the hosts deserved as Gers attacked from the start and were close to taking the lead in 11 minutes.

Ian Ferguson prodded through to Hateley, who beat the Celts offside trap. He touched the ball past Bonner and was sent crashing to the ground.

The ball was heading for goal, but it didn't have the pace to cross the line and Mark McNally got back to clear. Meanwhile, referee Douglas Hope amazingly waved away claims for a penalty.

Two minutes later Bonner held a Durrant shot and the keeper was happy to watch a Trevor Steven effort curl over the bar too.

At the other end, Ally Maxwell did well to save a powerful Paul McStay drive on the half-hour.

There were half-time worries as Rangers had failed to convert their chances, and they grew in 49 minutes when Huistra was sent off.

The Dutchman aimed a kick at Celtic's Tom Boyd and although he missed, the intent was there and ref Hope – standing just a few yards away – was left with little option. Celtic upped the pace but couldn't find their way past a determined Gers defence and when Hateley struck, Liam Brady's men couldn't find a way back.

Rangers went on to beat Hibs 2-1 in the final which, ironically, was played at Celtic Park, Ally McCoist coming off the bench to score a sublime over-head kick and give the Light Blues their sixth consecutive domestic trophy.

Captain Richard Gough believes that Rangers'

performance typified the spirit in the squad and helped to kick-start the their season.

He said: "People had been giving us a bit of criticism before the Celtic game as our results had not been great, so we knew just how important it was to win this game. I thought our performance was fantastic.

"I've always believed games like that make or break your season. Had we lost, it would have been very hard for the lads to pick themselves up. But we won with 10-men and that gave us a lot of confidence for the remainder of the season."

Huistra admitted his kick on Boyd was out of character and he was relieved to see Gers win.

He explained: "I was pushed to one side when I tried to get to a cross ball. Then, when it was cleared away, Boyd hit me with his elbow and I reacted by taking a swipe.

"I lost my head completely for a second and unfortunately paid the price for it. I shouldn't have

done it as it put the team, as well as myself, in trouble - although happily for me and the boys they still managed to win.

"I had to listen to the rest of the game on the radio in the Dressing Room. When Mark scored the winner I realised I was a lucky man!"

Smith's team went on to win the double in 1993/94 as they also won their sixth successive league championship - but were denied the first-ever back-to-back treble in Scottish

football history when beaten 1-0 by Dundee Utd in the Scottish Cup Final.

ROBERT FLECK defied the odds to become an Ibrox hero, withstanding pressure to leave to help Gers restore glory days

TONIGHT Robert Fleck will be feverishly making his plans for Saturday's Ridgeons Eastern Counties Premier League clash away to Clacton Town.

However, you can be quite certain he will attempt to follow every kick of the ball at Ibrox as his former club bids to end an horrific run of results against their old rivals and increase the belief that success is returning to Rangers.

Fleck takes his job as manager of semi-pro outfit Diss Town in Norfolk very seriously, but is still a heavily committed Rangers supporter

and can look back and recall a number of great memories. The League Cup, in particular, was a special tournament for Fleck as he won the trophy in successive seasons.

He had a peripheral role in the 1986 final when the 'Souness Revolution' really gathered pace – but was a central character a year later in an epic game with Aberdeen.

Robert came on as a substitute for Ally McCoist in a terrific '86 showdown with Celtic, then bossed by Davie Hay.

Gers won the game 2-1, with Davie Cooper netting the winner from the penalty spot after Ian Durrant had given the Light Blues the lead and Brian McClair had equalised.

It was Fleck's first taste of success, although it wasn't long before he got more.

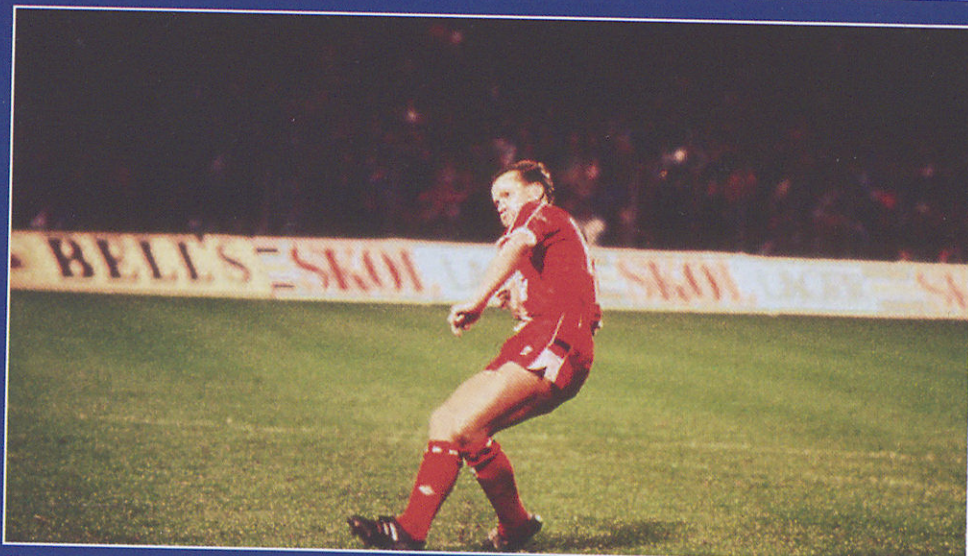
He recalled: "I have been lucky. I won two League Cup medals with Rangers and I was also involved in some great Old Firm games.

"The Aberdeen match in 1987, which finished 3-3, was amazing, and I managed to score the equaliser to take the game to penalties, even if I was about three yards offside!

"It was Graham Roberts who knocked the

ball down to me. Fortunately I didn't have too much time to think about it. I was tired and I said to myself, 'just get rid of this', and fortunately it ended up in the back of the net.

"Of course it went to spot-kicks. Peter Nicholas hit his over the bar and I was next up. I suppose it was a good time to take one but I was confident after scoring near the end of the match.

"We scored our next two kicks and the cup was ours. It was a great moment."

Fleck was undoubtedly a key man for Rangers in the early days of the Graeme Souness reign, even though the new boss tried to ship him out!

Robert proved he was a great foil for McCoist as the pair went on to score 52 goals between them as the title came back to Ibrox after nine long years.

The former Ibrox striker said:

"When he arrived I wasn't sure of my future because he made two or three signings and I felt it might be better for me to go.

"Graeme tried to offload me to Dundee, but after talking to people who had helped me when I was younger, like Peter McCloy and Davie Provan, I decided to stay and I'm glad I did.

"I got my chance against Clydebank and I scored a hat-trick, which was a tremendous feeling.

"To score three goals at Ibrox Stadium is something special, I can tell you.

"Things just took off from there and I managed to strike up a good partnership with Ally. I always tell him I made him

as a player because I did all the donkey work. I'm only joking, of course. He was a pleasure to play with and we did alright together.

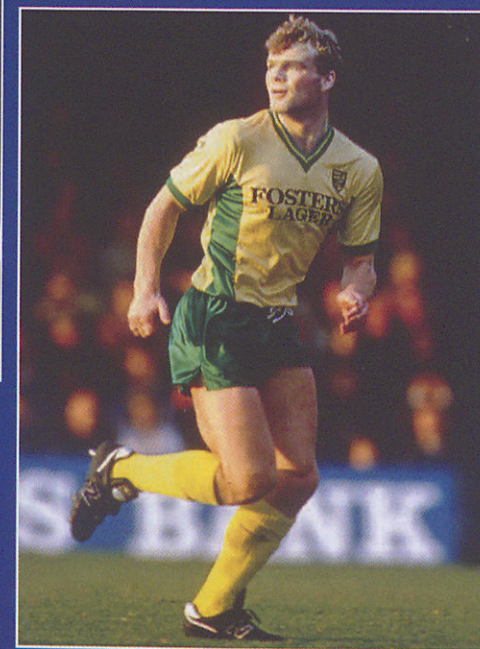
"I think anyone could have played beside him at that time. It was great fun and I think it was a time when we all enjoyed our football."

There was scarcely a more enjoyable moment than the New Year game with Celtic in season 1986/87, when Fleck and McCoist both scored in a match brilliantly orchestrated from midfield by Souness. It was the catalyst to a surging second half to the season, which eventually produced the ultimate prize when the league was won at Pittodrie.

Fleck recalled: "To win the championship in 1987 after such a long wait was amazing.

"However, I remember that Graeme was sent off and when you lose a man they usually always talk off a striker and on that occasion it was me. I made up for it the following week because I scored the winning goal against

St Mirren in the final game when we were presented with the championship.

"The league had been won, of course, but Graeme demanded we won that day in front of the fans and I was delighted to oblige."

Curiously, within a matter of months of winning the League Cup in 1987, Fleck was on his way out of Ibrox.

He said: "Graeme was bringing a few people in, like Mark Falco, and I felt I wasn't getting a fair chance so I decided I should move on.

"I was offered a new contract but turned it down so there was no way back, really. My mind was made up and I moved to Norwich.

"If I had to do it all again I don't think I would do it differently. I went on to enjoy a good career in England."



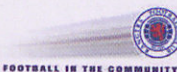

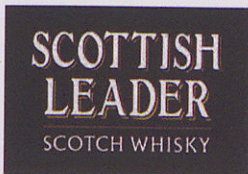
